What makes you feel like you belong here, and how do you help others feel like they belong here, too?

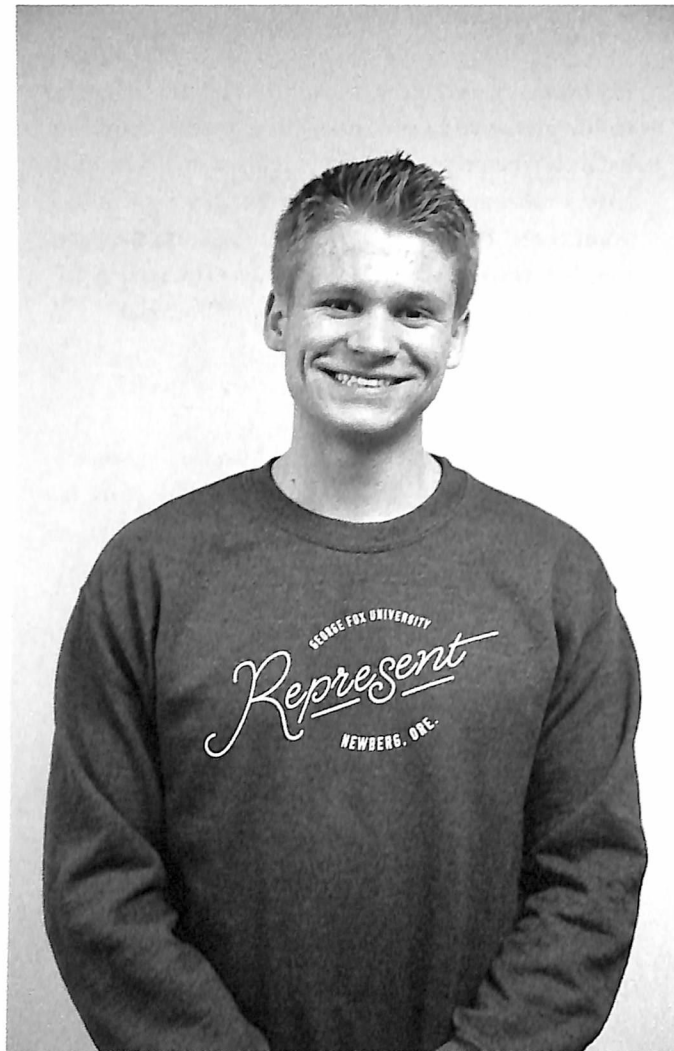
I feel like people are so helpful at Fox that it helped me feel like I belonged right off the bat when I was a student, and then again coming back as a faculty

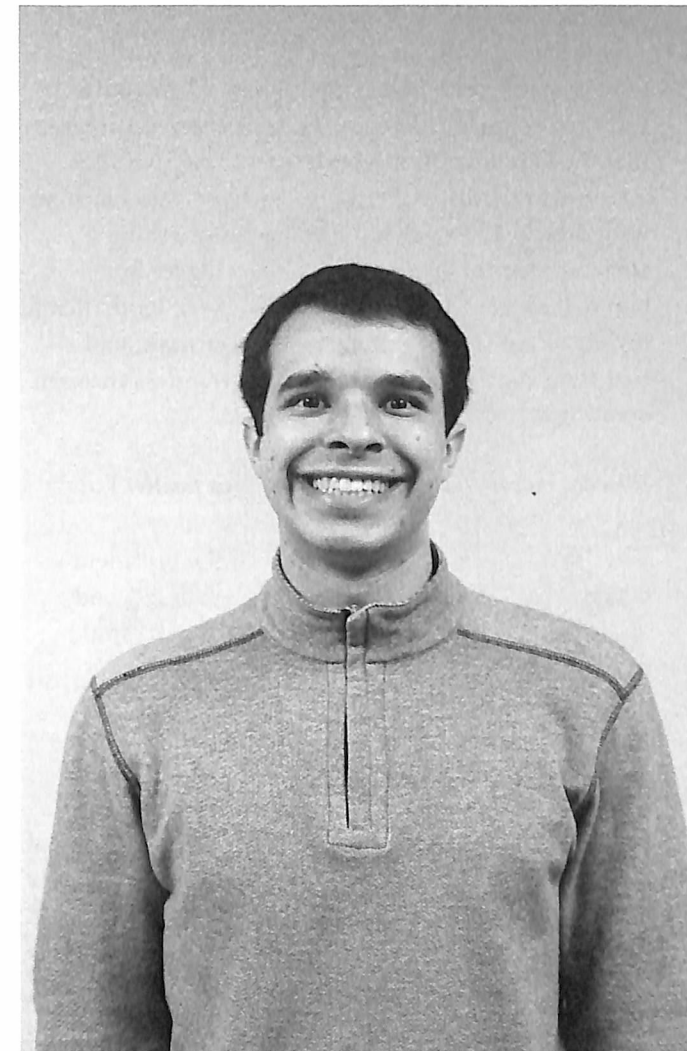
What makes you feel like you belong here, and how do you help others feel like they belong, too?

The girls on my floor are definitely my George Fox family, and I love the track family too.

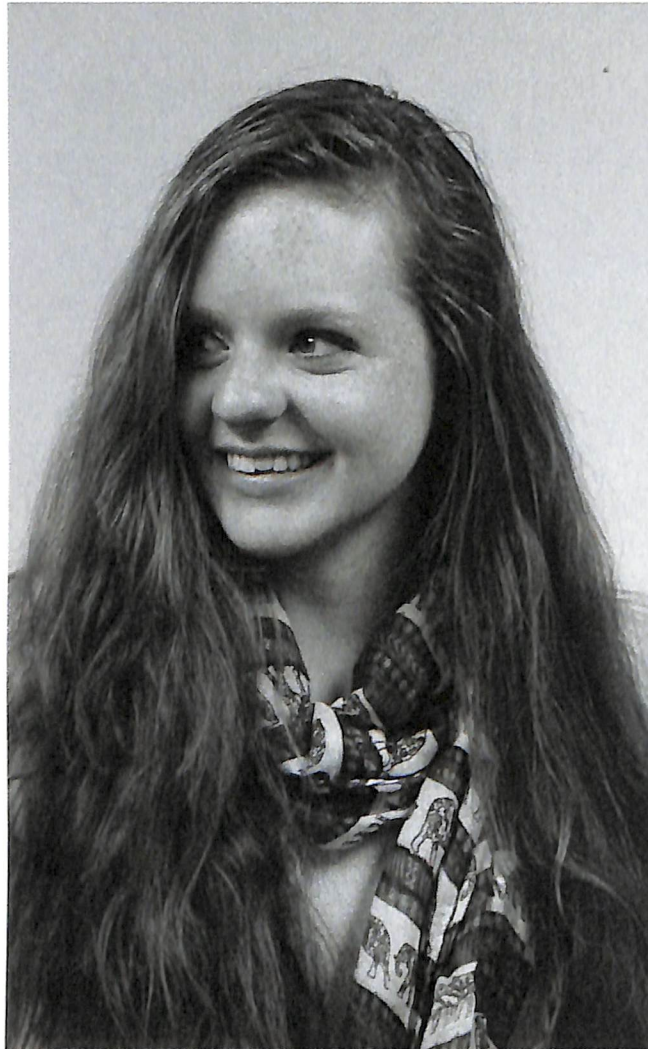
What makes you feel like you belong here, and how do you help others feel like they belong here, too?

That is how you help others feel connected: being

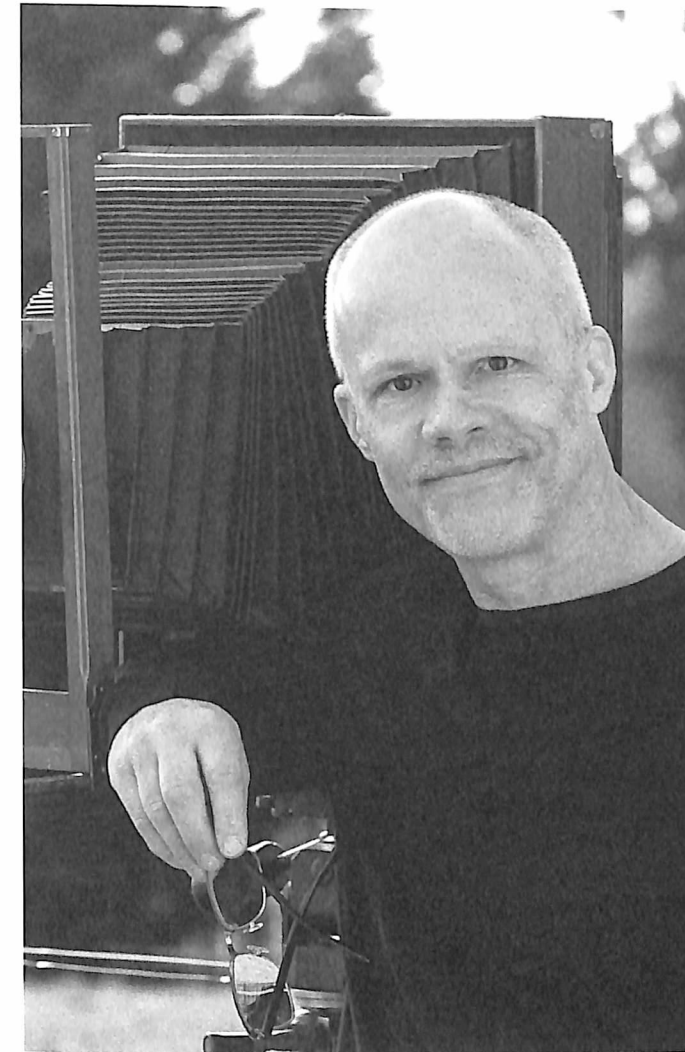

What makes you feel like you belong here, and how do you help others feel like they belong here, too?

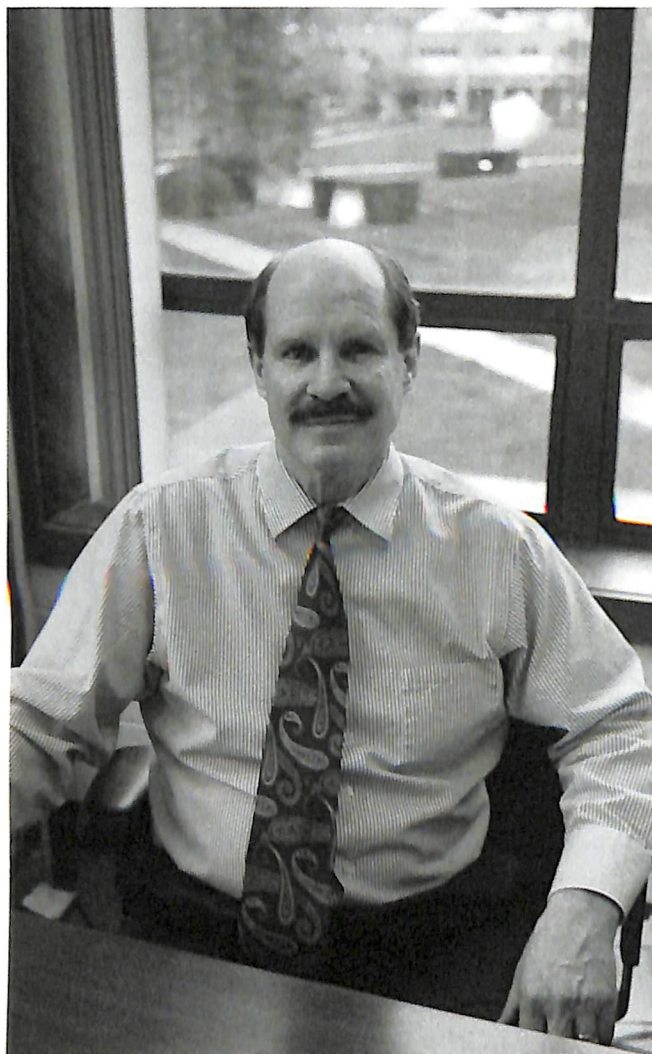

I have learned a lot of postal information. Being so new, I did not have any postal knowledge, and since I have been the head of it I have learned a lot. It is

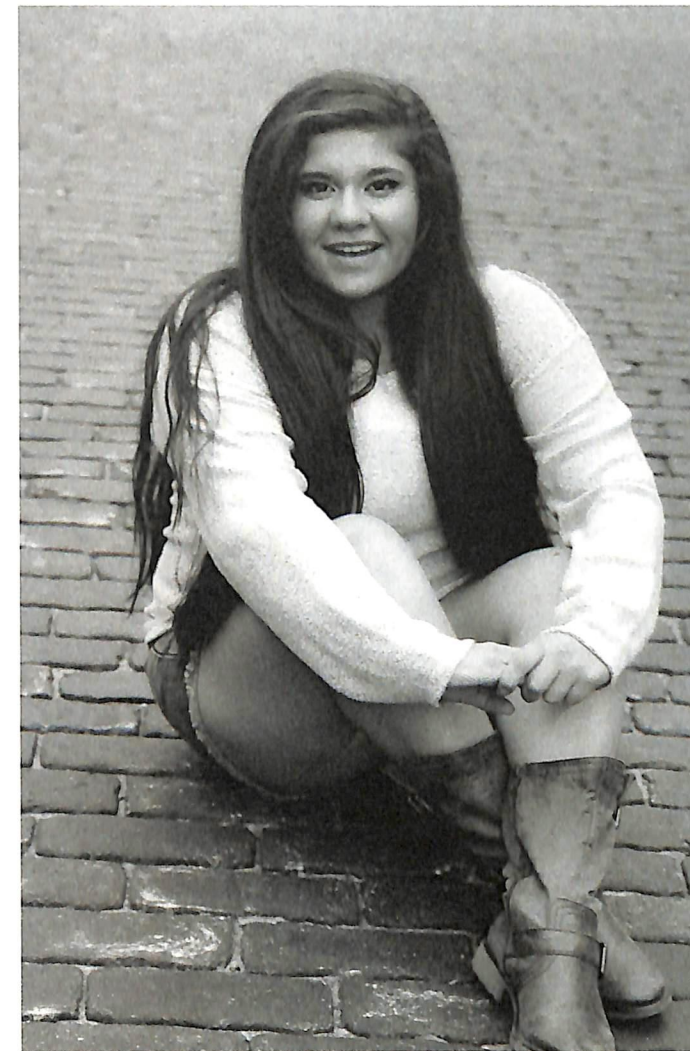
always changing; every day, week, month, or year there are new things such as regulations.

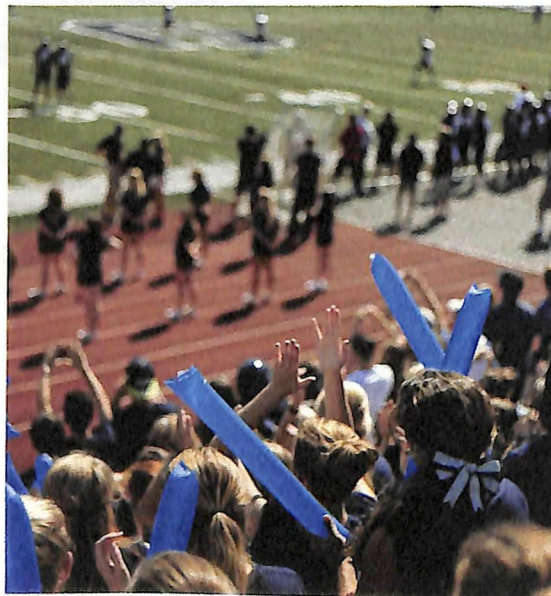

FALL CARNIVAL

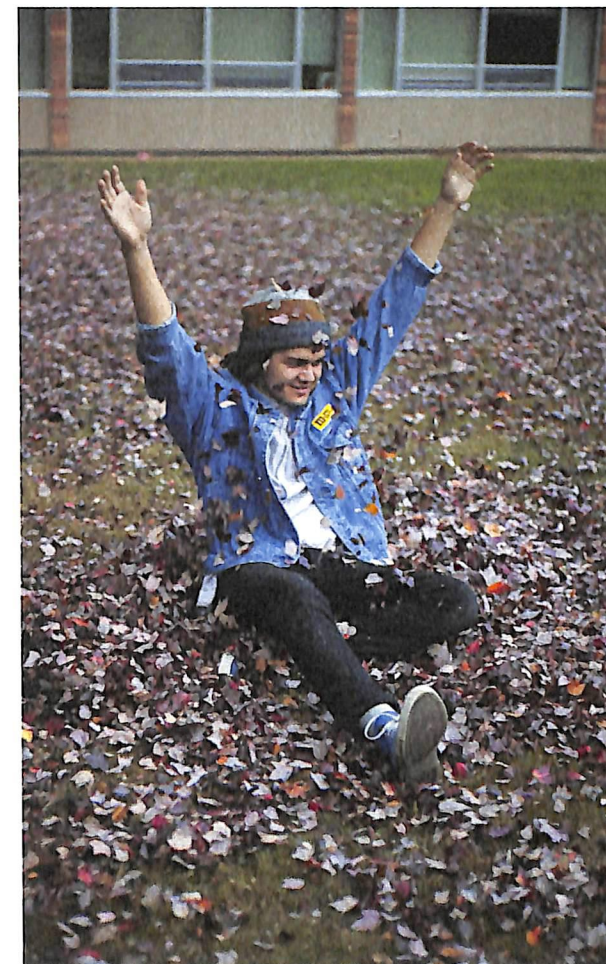
October brought the George Fox Fall Carnival to campus. The quad was filled with an assortment of yard games to play as students got to know each other a bit better.

Ultimately, this was a wonderful evening to showcase the musical talent we have on campus, as well as fostering a sense of belonging and community for potential and current Fox students.

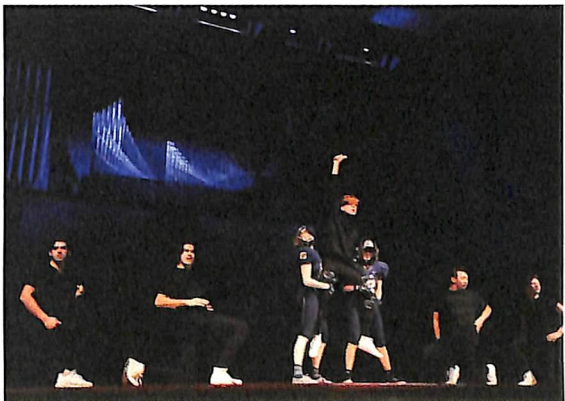


LIP SYNC BATTLE

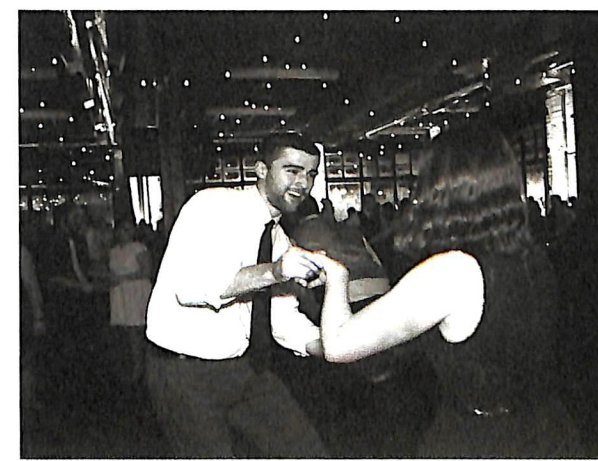

CLUB-A-DUB-DUB

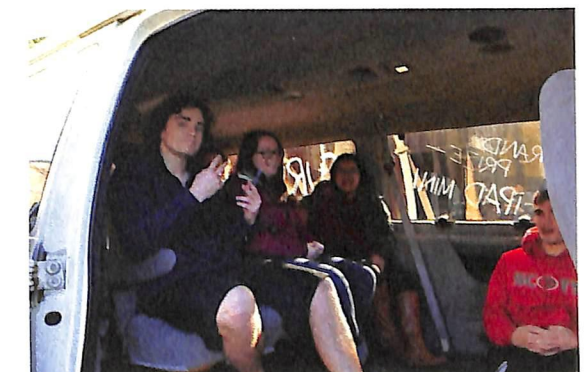

The Polar Bear Swim is a strange yet well-loved event that brings students together and is talked about the rest of the year.



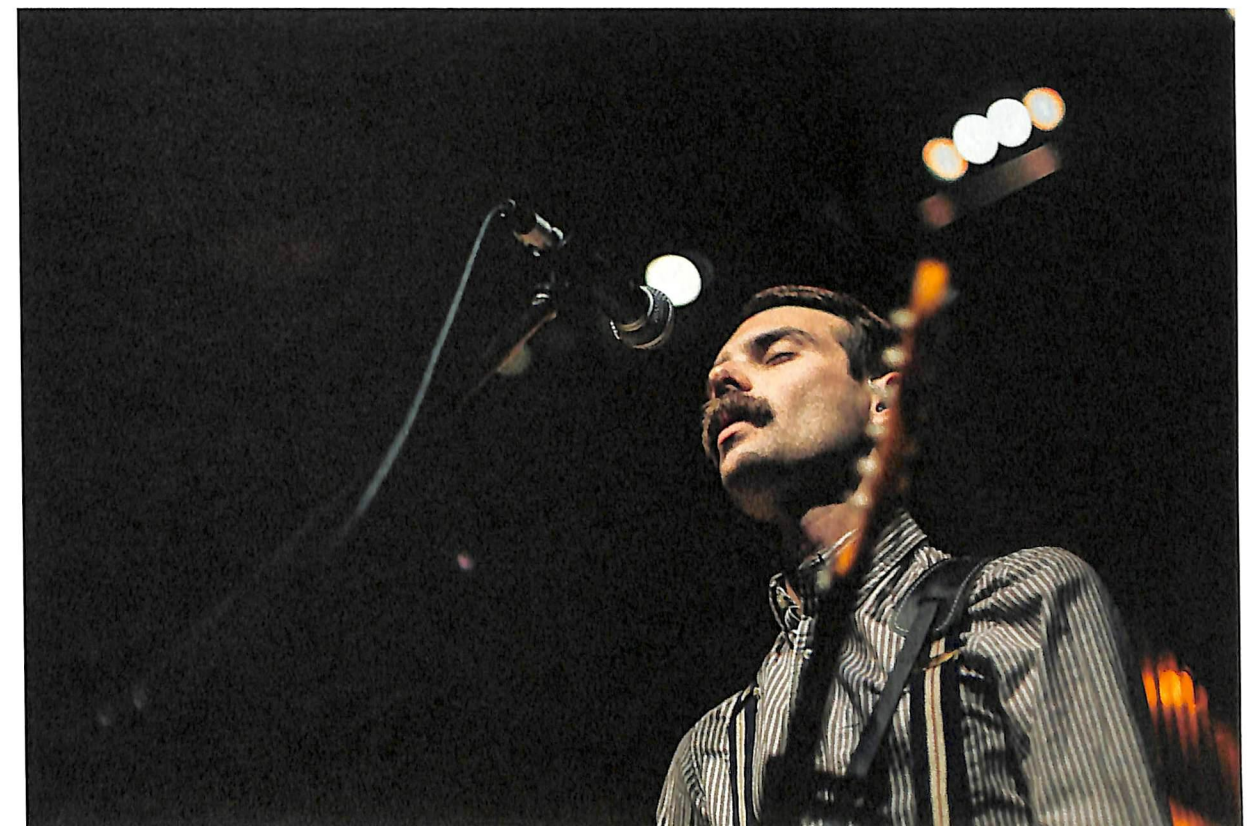
THE OH HELLOS

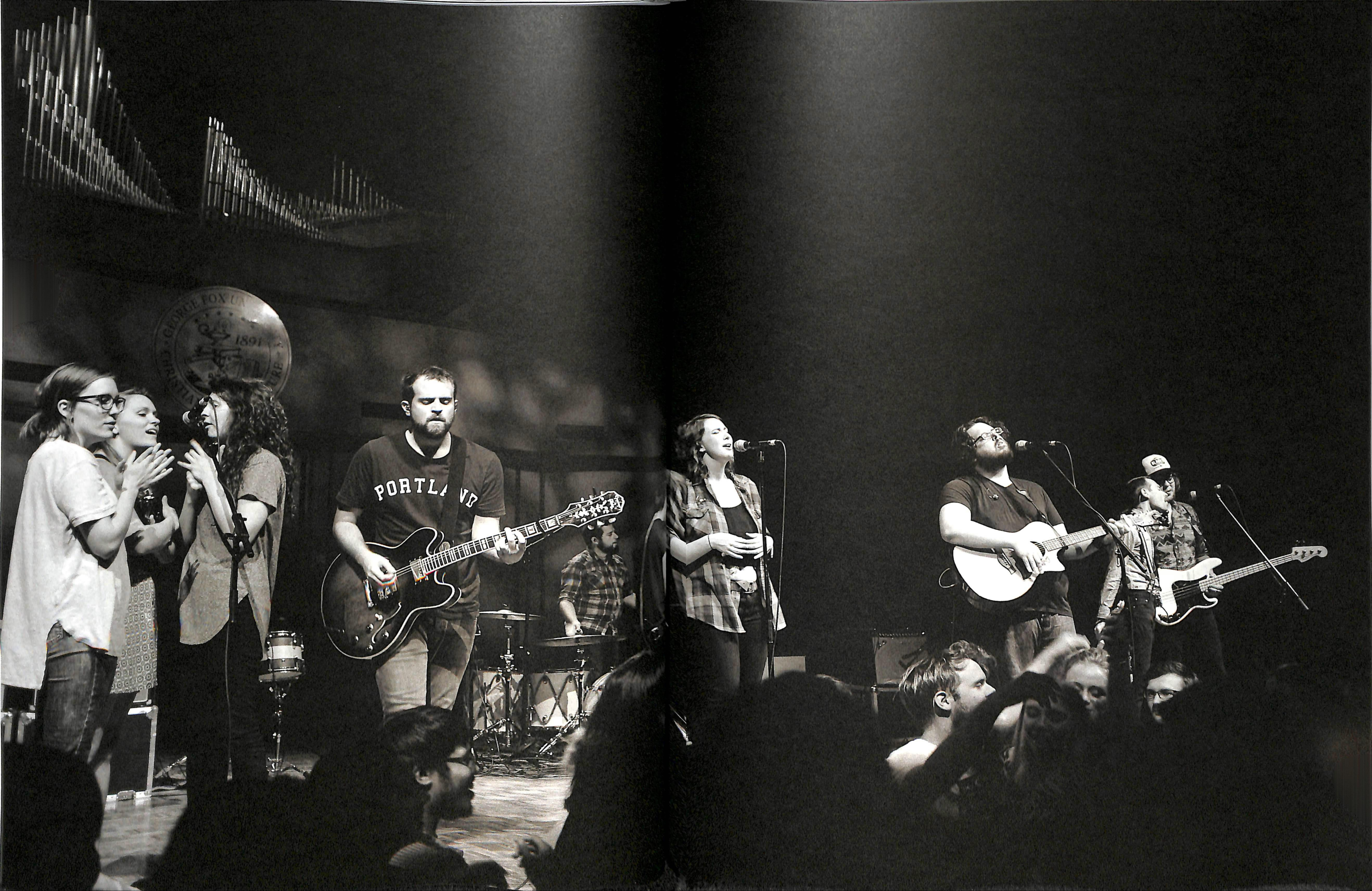
