George Fox College, in its 105th year, is one of America's Best Colleges. Eight times it has been given that designation by *U.S. News & World Report* magazine. In 1995 GFC was ranked second in academic reputation among Western Regional Liberal Arts Colleges, including colleges and universities from Texas to Hawaii. The magazine also named George Fox to its list of "Top Teaching Schools," second among liberal arts colleges in the western region.

George Fox is one of the nation's fastest-growing colleges. Enrollment more than tripled from 549 in 1986 to 1,717 in the fall of 1995.

The College offers unique programs to its students. Every incoming freshman is given a Macintosh computer to use and keep upon graduation. When students reach their third year at GFC, they are eligible for the Juniors Abroad program, where the College pays transportation costs for a three-week overseas study tour.

GFC students come from 32 states, one U.S. territory and nine nations. More than 40 religious denominations are represented on campus.

George Fox College had its beginnings when early Willamette Valley Quaker settlers established Pacific Academy in 1885 for the Christian education of their children. The college division was organized in 1891 to provide more advanced instruction for students. In 1949, because of the many colleges in the Northwest with Pacific in their name, the College was renamed George Fox



in honor of the founder of the Friends (Quaker) Church.

The College is governed by a 42-member Board of Trustees elected by Northwest Yearly Meeting of Friends Church, which comprises nearly 8,000 members in approximately 50 churches in Oregon, Washington and Idaho.

Following a merger — to be complete no later than 1997 — with Western Evangelical Seminary (a graduate school of 350 students in

Tigard) the name will again change — to George Fox University.

George Fox is accredited by the Northwest Association of Schools and Colleges. The College is one of 13 members of the national Christian College Consortium. GFC's undergraduate program is administered through three schools: Humanities, Natural and Behavioral Sciences, and Professional Studies. The 15 departments offer 34 majors with more than 400 courses.

An off-campus degree-completion program in management and organizational leadership enrolls working adults in an evening program with classes in Portland, Salem and Eugene, Ore., and Boise, Idaho. Graduate programs offered are a Doctor of Psychology (Psy.D.) in clinical psychology, a Master of Arts in Teaching (M.A.T.), a Master of Education (M.Ed.), a Master of Business Administration (M.B.A.), and a Master of Arts in Christian Studies (M.A.C.S.).

The 74-acre tree-shaded campus a half-hour drive from Portland has undergone major expansion in recent years with 12 new buildings constructed. Part of a \$16 million Centennial Campaign, the \$5.3 million Edwards-Holman Science Center opened in the fall of 1994.

Alumni of George Fox are primarily in service-oriented vocations of Christian ministries, education, social work and medical fields. The College's most prominent alumnus is the late President Herbert Hoover, who attended Pacific Academy.

ATHLETIC AFFILIATION

It's a year of transition for George Fox athletics. The College is in its first season in the Northwest Conference of Independent Colleges (NCIC).

The NCIC is leaving the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) for the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division III. Currently a provisional member of the NCAA, George Fox and the NCIC will be eligible for national championship play in 1998-99. Until then, the NCIC will continue to compete nationally in the NAIA.

GFC's men's and women's basketball teams play in NAIA Division II, while the College's other 11 sports are not divided into divisions.

The NAIA is an autonomous association administering programs leading to 13 men's and 11 women's national championships. The NAIA includes 364 four-year colleges and universities in 49 states and Canada. They are grouped in nine regions and 44 conferences.

The NCAA administers 80 championships in 21 sports for its member institutions, involving nearly 21,000 men and women student-athletes. There are 363 men's basketball teams in NCAA Division III.

1995-96 POSTSEASON PLAY

Four teams will participate in the Northwest Conference semifinals played Feb. 21. Winner of the Feb. 24 championship game will advance to the 32-team NAIA Division II national tournament March 6-12.

There are 169 teams from 17 conferences aiming for the national tournament hosted by Northwest Nazarene College in Nampa, Idaho. National tournament berths not going to the conference champions will go to the host institution and at-large teams.

George Fox College maintains one of the Northwest's most successful small-college athletic programs.

The teams win. George Fox has earned district or conference titles in eight sports during the 1990s. The College's highest national team finish came in the fall of 1992 when the women's cross country team finished as national runner-up.

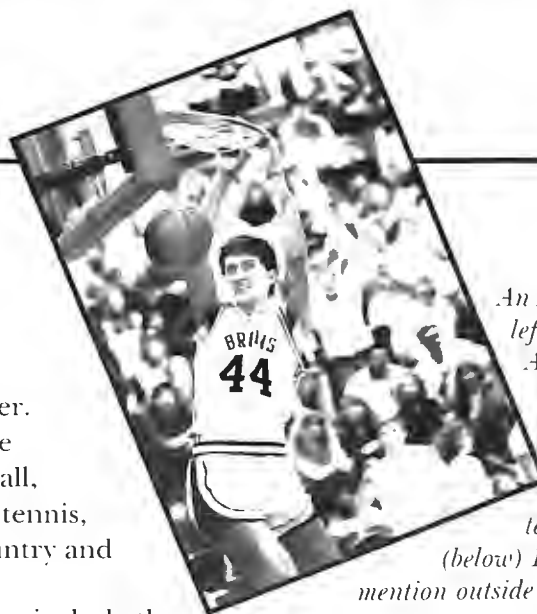
The athletes are successful. In the last six years, George Fox athletes have earned 69 NAIA All-American awards and 34 All-American Scholar-Athlete honors.

The coaches are award winners, as well. Every returning head coach has been named district or conference Coach of the Year at least once.

Intercollegiate athletics is an integral part of the overall education program at George Fox. About 15 percent of the student body participates in varsity athletics. Men's varsity athletics teams represent the College in baseball, basketball, track, tennis, cross

country and soccer. Women teams are fielded in volleyball, basketball, track, tennis, softball, cross country and soccer.

Athletic facilities include the Coleman H. Wheeler Center for Sports and Physical Education; Colcord Field, which received a new polyurethane surface in the fall of 1993; and the Curtis and Margaret Morse Athletic Complex containing baseball diamond, softball field and soccer field. In 1994, five tennis courts were installed in preparation for the addition of tennis as a varsity sport.

WHEELER SPORTS CENTER: a natural place for basketball

Entered by crossing a wooded canyon on a 200-foot bridge, the Coleman H. Wheeler Center for Sports and Physical Education is a natural place to play basketball.

The sports center was designed by noted architect Pietro Belluschi to sit unpretentiously alongside tree-shaded Hess Creek Canyon. Built using gifts from prominent lumbermen, the building features a two-level oak parquet lobby and a large window area overlooking the adjacent natural terrain.

Completed in June 1977, the \$2.7 million, 55,000-square-foot complex is the College's largest building. It contains the James and Lila Miller Gymnasium, the Bruin home court.

Three times larger than Hester Gymnasium, which it replaced, the Wheeler Center features a 116-by-174-foot gymnasium with three basketball courts and seating for 2,000 spectators. The gymnasium ceilings are 32 feet over the hardwood maple floor. The gym provides three volleyball courts and 10 badminton courts.

The building may be entered on two levels. The east-side ground level is accessible from the newly-paved parking lot by crossing the foot bridge. The on-campus community enters on the west-side second floor.

Contained on the upper level are a staff room, multipurpose room, classrooms, and athletic administration and faculty offices. A 1,500-square-foot weight room was remod-

eled in the summer of 1993. The lower level contains a concession area, dressing rooms, team rooms, laundry, equipment-issuing room, and storage space. An east wing of the building houses two racquetball courts.

The building is named for long-time Oregon lumberman Coleman H. Wheeler, former chairman of the board of Willamette Industries. The gymnasium is named for former GFC board member James Miller and his wife, Lila. He is the former president of Cascadia Lumber Co.

BACKGROUND ON THE BRUIN NICKNAME

George Fox College is represented by the "Bruin" nickname and mascot. But it has not always been so, even though it should have been.

The nickname comes from a real bear captured in 1887 just two years after Pacific Academy (the College's predecessor) was established. The small cub was found in the Coast Range foothills west of Carlton when its mother was shot. The young cub was brought to campus by a student and later lived with a faculty member.

When it grew to adulthood it was kept in a pit in what is now known as Hess Creek Canyon south of the campus. It escaped one too many times and was turned into steak for the dining table and the hide preserved on a frame and displayed in an early

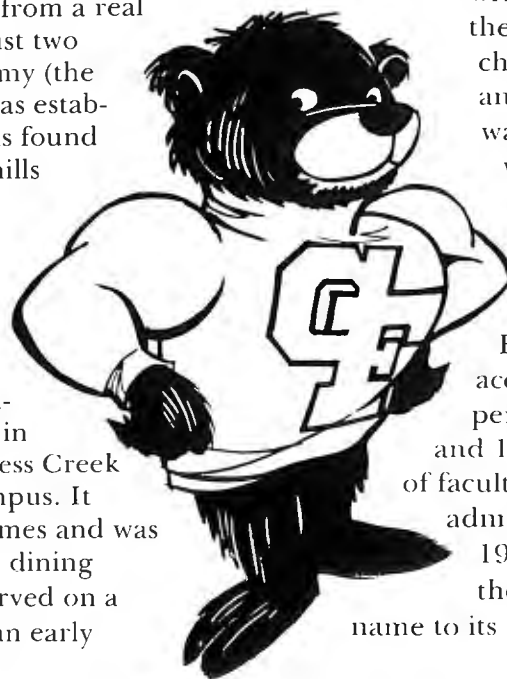
campus museum. When the hide deteriorated several years later, it was taken to a campus furnace room to be destroyed, but the framework proved a problem in dismantling so it was left sitting in a corner.

Students found the old Bruin skin later and began skirmishes over ownership, a tradition that continues today. "Bruin Junior," a replica, under a set of guidelines passed down for years, is fought over periodically in class competition, with the class able to physically drag the Bruin replica off campus declared the rightful owner until next "flashed."

Even with the Bruin tradition, somewhere along the line, the "Quaker" tag for athletic teams came

into popularity with sports-writers because of the College's church affiliation, and that nickname was used, along with the mascot "Foxy George," a little fox with a Quaker hat.

Both gained acceptance for a period in the 1950s and 1960s until a vote of faculty, students and administration in 1970 reinstated the Bruin nickname to its rightful place.

BASKETBALL AT GEORGE FOX

The game of basketball was invented by Dr. James Naismith in 1891, and it took just seven years for it to be brought to George Fox College (then called Pacific College).

College board member and community leader T. W. Hester and others first saw the game played at the Portland YMCA. They were captivated by the new game and secured a ball, which they brought back to the College. The first exhibition game was played shortly thereafter, in the winter of 1898. The first site was the third floor of the old Commercial Hotel on North Main Street because the College had no adequate space for the new sport.

The first gymnasium on the campus was the upper part of one wing of an old academy building (Hoover Hall), built in 1885 and torn down in the mid-1950s. A one-room wood gymnasium building was constructed in 1916 and served until 1946, when the College opened Hester Gymnasium, a concrete-block structure built partly by student/faculty labor at a cost of \$40,000. The building, with a single hemlock playing floor and seating for 1,100, served until the opening of the Wheeler Center in 1976-77.

College athletic affiliation in men's basketball has gone from independent status to membership in the old Willamette Christian College Conference, the Metropolitan Conference and the Oregon Collegiate Conference. From 1965 through 1993, George Fox was an independent member of NAIA District 2. In 1993 the NAIA voted to eliminate the district format for national tournament qualification and switched to affiliated conferences. After two years in the Cascade Collegiate Conference, George Fox joined the Northwest Conference of Independent Colleges in 1995-1996.

In 1973, George Fox won its first NAIA District 2 title. The Bruins have advanced to NAIA postseason play 20 of the last 25 years, including 11 of the last 12. The 1991-92 team produced GFC's highest national finish, advancing to the NAIA Division II quarterfinals with two national tournament wins.

"Our greatest basketball year," according to a College publication, *The First Fifty Years* (published in 1941), "was reached in 1917 when Pacific College won the [Willamette Valley] league championship and defeated Oregon State College 34-25." There have, of course, been many significant wins, seasons and players since 1898. Much of that history, however, has been lost because of the lack of available information and incomplete records prior to NAIA membership in 1965. Highlights and records since that time appear in the records section. Pre-NAIA statistics available show these marks: Bill Hopper with a 42-point game and 1,737 career points in 1954-1958, and Cub Grimm in the 1952-53 season with a 21.0-points-per-game average and 26 free throws in a contest with the Oregon Medical School.

Narrow Losses Story of 1994-95 Season

George Fox's men's basketball team made its 11th appearance in NAIA postseason play in the last 12 years, but the 1994-95 season was anything but typical.

It was a year of "what ifs?" and "almosts."

The Bruins collected their fewest wins since 1981-82, finishing 12-19.

The problem wasn't offense. George Fox finished as the No. 2 scoring team in its final year in the tough Cascade Conference and outscored its opponents by an average of almost two points a game.

Close games were the downfall for a team coach Mark Vernon felt could have won 20 games. The luckless Bruins dropped 11 games by six points or fewer last year, four in overtime.

Blame part of the misfortune on the schedule. George Fox was on the road for 13 of its first 16 games and played 19 of its 31 games away from home.

The Bruins' stomach-turning defeat in the first round of the Cascade Conference playoffs summarized the season. It was a replay of the last-minute tragedies that plagued GFC all season.

George Fox gave up a four-point lead in the final 40 seconds and fell 89-86 to Western Baptist College.

"A heartbreaking loss for a heartbreaking season," said Vernon. "None of us have gone through a season like this before, but we came through it with flying colors. I'm proud of my team for handling a tough situation well."

During the season, the Bruins averaged more than nine successful 3-pointers a game. Junior wing Nick Haij was GFC's lead bomber, averaging 17.5 points a game. He launched

and connected on more 3-pointers than anyone in the Northwest, hitting 109 of 292. In one game he sank nine, a school record. He won first-team conference honors and honorable mention Little All-Northwest kudos.

The Bruins began the season with a preseason ranking of 28th in the NAIA Division II poll. On some days they more than lived up to it. Four of George Fox's wins came against teams with top-25 rankings. Early in the season they won Willamette University's John Lewis Classic by stunning the No. 3-ranked

Willamette team 80-38. Another highlight was a 10-point road win over seventh-ranked Albertson College of Idaho. On the playoff bubble as the season wound down, the Bruins won their last two conference games to jump into the No. 5 position in the six-team playoffs.

Junior wing Travis Orick and senior guard Rick Gardea both won conference honorable mention. Conference honors eluded GFC rebound leader Nique Stewart of Los Angeles, Calif., but the senior post was named Most Valuable Player by his teammates.

High-Scoring Bruins in Shooting For Postseason Play

A veteran George Fox College men's basketball team with plenty of offensive firepower will be in the hunt for the Northwest Conference of Independent Colleges playoffs.

Scoring shouldn't be a problem for the Bruins, who last year averaged nearly 90 points a game. All four of GFC's returning starters scored in double figures, and three earned Cascade Conference honors. Mark Vernon, 14th-year head coach, says this year's team will be improved with the addition of six freshmen, including Oregon's class 2A Player of the Year. Unlike last season, Vernon says the Bruins have scoring threats at every position.

"We can score inside or outside and we're a good driving team," he says. "We should make a lot of trips to the foul line. We should be one of the higher scoring teams in the conference."

George Fox begins its first season in the Northwest Conference of Independent Colleges after last season winning a playoff berth in the tough Cascade Conference. The switch doesn't make things much easier for GFC to earn its 21st postseason appearance in the last 26 years. Both conferences have two teams ranked in the NAIA Division II top 25 preseason national poll.

"I believe the NCIC and Cascade Conference are the two strongest in the U.S.," says Vernon, whose Bruins last season went 4-3 versus teams ranked in the NAIA Div. II top 20.

Despite an inconsistent 1994-95 season, George Fox still is earning respect. The Bruins drew votes in this year's national preseason poll. Last minute losses cost GFC a winning season in 1994-95. The Bruins dropped 11 games by six points or less and finished 12-19.

"We want to win the close games this year," says Vernon. "We want to change the mindset. That's the psychological part of the game. Mainly, what we're trying to do is get better defense and rebound better."

Those were Vernon's main concerns last season and again will determine whether GFC is successful.

"We're not extremely big and our posts are young," he says. "We're going to have to work hard every night on rebounding."

Vernon expects the defensive situation will be improved by the addition of assistant coach Bart Valentine. Valentine takes over GFC's defense after eight seasons at West Linn High School, where he headed one of Oregon's most successful programs.

George Fox has an unusual combination of six seniors, one sophomore and six freshmen on the roster.

The Bruins' depth is at the perimeter positions, but their potential future All-Americans play down low. GFC's go-to guy inside will be Jared Gallop (So., Roseburg HS, Ore.), last year's Cascade Conference Freshman of the Year. During the summer, the 6-foot-7 post got stronger and added 20 pounds.

"The improvement of Jared Gallop in the post will give us a strong inside presence we haven't had for three years," says Vernon. "Even as a sophomore, Jared will be one of the best post players and leading scorers in the conference."

George Fox's No. 1 recruit was 6-8 Mike Faber (Fr., Salem Academy, Ore.). The top player from Oregon's class 2A schools, Faber has a 7-foot wing span and will be a force inside as a shot blocker. He's expected to start and play extended minutes.

"He is one of our best passers,

rebounders and one of the top shot blockers in the country," says Vernon.

The coach is tinkering with GFC's offense to utilize his talented post players.

"We'll be changing our philosophy to being an inside team first and outside team after we look inside. We will still shoot our share of 3s, but, hopefully, after the ball has gone inside first."

A lack of depth at the post position is a major concern.

The backups are two 6-5 freshmen and Mitch Ratzlaff (Sr., Salem Academy, Ore.), a 6-foot-3 spark plug who's forte is rebounding.

Kevin Long (Fr., Nooksak Valley HS, Everson, Wash.) — whose brother Toby was an academic All-American for Vernon in 1986-87 — will give the Bruins aggressive defense and solid rebounding.

A track sprinter, Luke Ankeny (Fr., Homedale HS, Idaho), is quick and can score around the basket.

Vernon has a strong group of outside shooters. Three senior starters, point guard Grant Hartenstein (Sr., Colton HS, Ore.), wing Nick Haij (Sr., Columbia River HS, Vancouver, Wash.) and wing Travis Orick (Sr., Parkrose HS, Portland) last season combined to hit more than 200 3-pointers.

"Our three perimeter players are as good as any other three in our conference," declares Vernon.

A Cascade Conference honorable mention pick, Orick is the team captain and emotional leader. A tough defender, he ranked among conference statistical leaders in 3-point accuracy, free throw percentage and assists.

Four-year starters Hartenstein and Haij have been dependable, combin-

ing to miss just four games in three seasons. They will leave their mark on the George Fox record book.

Haij led GFC in scoring last year with 17.5 points a game and was a conference first-team selection. Already the owner of George Fox's game, season and career records for 3-points made and attempted, Haij is gunning to become the fifth-leading career scorer in GFC history. When he returns in late November from a shoulder injury suffered in fall baseball practice, he'll need 374 points to pass 1984 Portland Trail Blazer draft pick Randy Dunn.

A solid season should assure Hartenstein a spot in the GFC career scoring top 10 as well. The 1990-91 Oregon 2A Player of the Year already is sixth on the school career assist list. He returns to the point guard position after playing wing last year.

Behind the three seniors, most of the playing time will go to point guard Kyle Valentine (Fr., West Linn HS, Ore.), wing Aaron Newkirk (Fr., Crater HS, Central Point, Ore.) and wing Aaron Downs (Sr., West Linn HS, Ore.).

Downs is a team co-captain, and Vernon expects he'll be the first off the bench. He's improved his outside shot and always plays tough defense.

Newkirk and Valentine redshirted last season and are projected as future starters.

Two other wings round out the roster. James Homolka (Sr., North Idaho Christian HS, Hayden Lake, Idaho) returns for his second season with the team. Jeremy Beddingfield (Fr., Philomath HS, Ore.), an Oregon class 3A all-state honorable mention selection, has been a pleasant surprise for Vernon, but probably will have to wait for next season for much playing time.

Vernon picks Willamette University as the Northwest Conference team to beat. Last season, one of GFC's biggest wins came against the NCIC co-champion Bearcats. After a double round-robin regular season conference schedule, the top four teams will earn NCIC playoff berths.

"Our goal is to make the playoffs and see what happens after that," says Vernon. "Our league is so tough, making the playoffs is no easy chore. A lot depends on how the freshmen develop."

The preseason schedule calls for George Fox to play seven games against Cascade Conference and Pacific Northwest Athletic Conference teams and includes a two-game Christmas break trip to Southern California.

MARK VERNON not only is the winningest men's basketball coach in George Fox College history, but he also ranks among the winningest men's basketball coaches in NAIA Division II.

In 1992, after George Fox returned from its second trip to an NAIA national tournament in three years, his career winning percentage ranked fifth among active Division II coaches. That year, the Bruins ranked No. 2 in the nation.

He's one of the nation's youngest coaches to surpass the 250-career-win milestone, eclipsing it last year at the age of 40. His 13-year record is 263-151.

Vernon's teams have averaged more than 20 wins a season and produced four NAIA All-Americans and one academic All-American. He's become the only GFC coach to post a winning road record.

His efforts have not gone unnoticed. In 1985 he was the youngest coach in NAIA District 2 when he was named men's basketball district Coach of the Year for the first time. In 1987 and 1991 he received the same honor. He was named National Christian College Athletic Association National Coach of the Year in 1987.

Vernon, 42, has his entire collegiate coaching career at George Fox, but the tie with the Bruins is longer. He came to the College in 1975 as a student and basketball player. He transferred from Seattle's Highline Community College, where he received both Best Defense and Hustle awards. While at West Seattle High School, he was named Outstanding Athlete of the Year as a senior.

As a GFC guard, he established what was then the Bruins' highest career assist average (3.9). He was named Most Inspirational Player by his teammates his senior year, a year the Bruins were 20-9. In his two years in a GFC uniform, the Bruins were 39-17.

A 1977 graduate, Vernon was named GFC's Outstanding Physical Education Major and Outstanding Young Person in Teacher Education. He remained with GFC basketball as an assistant for three years (1977-78, '79-80 and '81-82) while working toward a 1982 master's degree in physical education at Linfield College.

In the fall of 1981, he joined the GFC physical education faculty as volleyball coach and women's tennis coach.

He became head coach in 1982 after a nationwide search that began with 70 names.

Vernon currently teaches physical education classes in addition to his coaching.

Vernon and his wife, Denise, have three sons: Brett, 4; Brady, 2; and Barry, born Aug. 4, 1995.

Q & A WITH MARK VERNON

Q. Your teams average more than 20 wins a season, are playoff regulars, and your career record at George Fox is 263-151. What reasons can you give for that kind of success?

Mark: "I believe we have had talented players over the years. But maybe just as important as talent, we have had players with character and heart. I have been fortunate to have coached very good players as well as very good people."

Q. Describe your coaching philosophies. How do you coach your teams to play?

Mark: "First and foremost, we want our team to be just that—a team—with team goals placed well above any personal goals players may have. We want to play hard, smart and together every time we step on the floor. I really believe the game is for the players and the fans, and so I believe in playing an up-tempo game that is enjoyable for everyone. Winning is fun no matter what, but winning and putting a lot of points on the board is even more fun."

Q. What do you enjoy most about coaching?

Mark: "I enjoy my players the most. The everyday interaction that goes on between my players and myself makes my job fun. I also like the camaraderie with my fellow coaches. We compete hard against each other during the season, but are friends otherwise. I would be remiss if I didn't mention I love the competition. Anyone who knows me knows I compete at everything I do. I have the best job in the world. I really can't think of anything else I would like to do and still get paid."

Q. You are entering your 14th year as George Fox head coach. What is it about the College that has kept you here all these years?

Mark: "I believe in the values and Christian education that students receive at GFC. I believed in the College enough to come as a student-athlete, and I still believe in it after 13 years of coaching. George Fox College stands up for its convictions, and I like being associated with a college that has integrity and a Christ-centered foundation."



BART VALENTINE gave up his head boys' basketball coaching job at West Linn High School to become George Fox College's assistant men's basketball coach.

He leaves one of the state's most successful programs. The Lions have reached the state playoffs seven consecutive seasons. Just three other Oregon class 4A schools boast longer streaks. His teams have made the tournament final-16 at the Memorial Coliseum four of the last six years. His eight-year record at West Linn is 120-66.

Valentine has 12 years of varsity head coaching experience at West Linn and Colton High School. He took both teams into the Oregon state finals and both times was named state Coach of the Year. He guided Colton High School to the then-class 1A championship game in 1983-84 and West Linn to the title game in 1989-90.

Valentine and GFC head coach Mark Vernon are Seattle natives and longtime friends.

Valentine assisted the Bruins during the 1994-95 preseason, before beginning the high school season. Two current players came out of West Linn: his son, Kyle, and Aaron Downs. Five West Linn grads have joined the GFC program since 1989.

Valentine continues to teach mathematics at West Linn High School.

He graduated from Warner Pacific College in 1975 with a bachelor's degree in biology and earned a master's degree in biology from Lewis & Clark College in 1980.

Valentine replaces 13-year assistant coach Steve Grant, who will spend more time on his teaching and head volleyball coaching duties.

Valentine and his wife, Becky, live in West Linn and have three children: Kyle, 19; Jared, 16; and Krista, 12.



CRAIG TAYLOR is in his eighth year as George Fox College Athletic Director, but he has been associated with the Bruins for 22 years as player,

coach and professor. Taylor, 44, came to George Fox in 1971 as a junior forward on the men's basketball team. In 1972-73, he helped the Bruins to their first-ever NAIA District 2 title.

Taylor graduated from George Fox in 1974, named both Outstanding Man in Teacher Education and Outstanding Physical Education Major. He received a Master of Science degree in education from Linfield College in 1975. While enrolled in graduate courses, he was a residence hall director at GFC.

From 1976 through 1979, Taylor was the Bruin baseball coach while also serving as assistant basketball coach. He worked at a sporting goods retailing firm from 1979 to 1981.

Taylor was the coach of the women's basketball team from 1981 to 1993, producing a 162-155 record. He also coached GFC softball from 1981 to 1988, and again in 1990. His teams compiled a 77-99-1 record, and in 1985 he was named NAIA District 2 Coach of the Year.

At George Fox, the athletic director is responsible for athletic department functions, including eligibility and compliance with GFC, NAIA and NCAA regulations, budgeting, and department and sports center management.

Taylor has three children: Leah, a 21-year-old senior at GFC; Bree, 16; and Casey, 6. Taylor and his wife, Kathy, live in McMinnville.



HAL ADRIAN became Associate Director of Athletics at George Fox in 1994. In that position he is responsible for the Bruin Club and

general fundraising, as well as for special projects such as the George Fox Athletic Hall of Fame and sports banquet.

A 1956 graduate of Lewis & Clark College, Adrian taught and coached in the Beaverton School District until 1961, when he joined North Pacific Insurance. In 1994 he retired as Vice President of Human Resources. For more than 40 years he has been involved in church music leadership, chairing the Billy Graham Crusade music committee in 1992. Adrian also has been active in United Way leadership.

Hal and his wife, Audrey, have three sons: Jay, Greg and Dave, who currently is George Fox's Vice President for Development.



Statistician Mike Wirta will work his 300th consecutive GFC game this season.



ROB FELTON is in his fourth year as Sports Information Director for George Fox's 13 athletic teams. A 1992 GFC graduate with a degree in communication

arts, Felton was a GFC sports information student assistant for three years.

The GFC Sports Information Office has produced 32 national award-winning publications in the last 14 years. Most recently, the 1994-95 women's basketball guide earned second in a national contest sponsored by the College Sports Information Directors of America.

Felton, 25, also has additional responsibilities as Assistant Director of Public Information.

A magna cum laude graduate, he was named Outstanding Student in Communication Arts and to Who's Who Among Students in American Colleges and Universities. He was sports editor for the student newspaper, The Crescent, for two years and editor as a sophomore.



MIKE WIRTA is in his 25th year as George Fox basketball statistician. Called "Biggs" by his friends, Wirta is a 1974 George Fox graduate and one

of the most loyal Bruin fans. At the end of the 1994-95 season, he had kept stats for 298 straight GFC men's basketball contests and 315 in a row

at home. The last game he missed was in 1985. A member of the College's plant services staff, Wirta, 46, has the upkeep of the sports center as his major responsibility. He devotes many volunteer hours to compiling statistics and records for the players and teams recorded in this book.

In 1988 the College's alumni association named Wirta its Volunteer of the Year, just the second person to receive the designation. In 1994 he received an NAIA District 2 Meritorious Service Award.



DALE ISAAK joined the George Fox staff in 1995 as head trainer and assistant professor in the Health and Human Performance Department.

He previously was the head athletic trainer for Hopkins High School in Minnetonka, Minn., and athletic trainer for the Institute for Athletic Medicine in Minneapolis. Isaak is a 1990 graduate of Willamette University. He holds a master of science degree in physical education/athletic training from Indiana State University and a master of education degree in physical education from the University of Minnesota. He and his wife, Marin, live in Wilsonville.



BYRON SHENK serves as George Fox's assistant trainer, but that's just one of the many duties he's handled since coming to the College in 1990.

He serves as Chairperson of the Department of Health and Human Performance where he also teaches as associate professor. Shenk also has coached George Fox's five-year-old varsity women's soccer team from infancy, building up a 36-35-8 record.

In 1992 he was named NAIA District 2 Coach of the Year.

The same year, he earned a national meritorious service award from the National Christian College Athletic Association for previous service and leadership.

Shenk has an undergraduate degree from Goshen College, a masters from University of Oregon and a doctorate in education from the University of Virginia.

Shenk and his wife, Ina, were married on Dec. 17, 1995, and live in McMinnville, where he is active in the Mennonite church.
