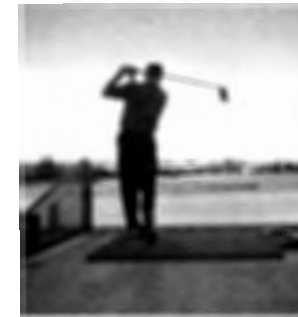

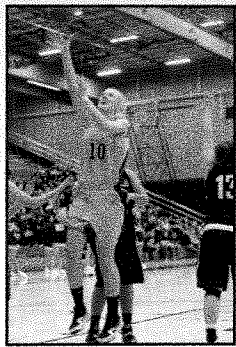

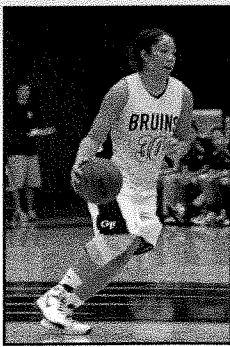

MICHAEL MEEK - Head Coach

Michael Meek is now in his second season as the head coach of the George Fox women's basketball program, having successfully transitioned to the college ranks after leading Southridge High School of Beaverton, Ore., to five Oregon large-school classification state titles in a six-year span from 2005-10.

Replacing 14-year veteran Scott Rueck, who took over the women's program at his alma mater, Oregon State, Meek kept the wheels spinning smoothly in 2010-11 as he guided the Bruins to a 25-6 overall record and a 14-2 Northwest Conference mark that earned the team a share of its fifth straight conference crown. After winning the NWC Tournament, the Bruins made their fifth straight appearance in the NCAA Division III National Tournament, reaching the "Elite 8" round for the third consecutive year. George Fox was sixth in the final *USA Today*/ESPN/WBCA poll and 12th in the D3hoops.com poll.

Meek inherited a perennial national power that has now won or shared eight NWC crowns in the past 12 years, made eight NCAA Tournament appearances, reached the 'Sweet 16' six times, the 'Elite 8' four times, and won the national title in 2008-09 with a perfect 32-0 record.

Meek began his coaching career at La Grande (Ore.) High School, where he went 51-21 (in three years (1997-2000)). In 10 seasons at Southridge (2000-10), he was 213-58 for a career record of 264-79.

Southridge captured state titles under Meek in the Oregon 4A classification in 2005 and 2006, the highest level in the state at that time, and in the new 6A level in 2007, 2008, and 2010. The Skyhawks were regularly listed in the *USA Today* and MaxPreps national rankings, and this past spring were recognized by MaxPreps as one of the top 10 high school programs in the nation.

Meek earned a slew of coaching awards during his time at Southridge, including the 2006 MaxPrep National Girls' Basketball Coach of the Year. He was named the Oregon Athletic Coaches Association Coach of the Year four times ('05, '06, '07, and '10), and State Coach of the Year by the Oregonian newspaper twice ('05 and '10). He was league Coach of the Year six times ('00, '04, '05, '06, '09, and '10). Nineteen of his players have gone on to play college basketball.

Meek also developed the Nike Northwest Girls' Basketball Invitational, which attracts some of the top high school teams on the West Coast. He has published articles in *Women's Basketball* magazine, developed three basketball coaching instructional videos, and was a speaker at the Best of the West Coaches Clinics in Seattle, Wash., for three years (2006-08).

A native of Puyallup, Wash., Meek played basketball at Tacoma Community College and Eastern Oregon, where he earned a bachelor of science degree in physical education and health in 1999. He earned his master of arts in teaching from Grand Canyon University in 2004. He and his wife Lisa reside in Beaverton with their daughters McKelle and Audrey. The Meeks attend Beaverton Foursquare Church.

### MARK SUNDQUIST Head Coach

Mark Sundquist enters his 12th season as the George Fox head coach after re-establishing the Bruins as one of the most competitive teams in the rugged Northwest Conference.

Sundquist was named to the George Fox post on August 1, 2000, replacing 18-year veteran

Mark Vernon, the winningest coach in school history, after a national search that ended ironically in the Bruins' backyard! During the 1999-2000 season, he had served as the boys' basketball coach at Newberg High School, only eight blocks from George Fox. Prior to that, he had spent two seasons as the boys' basketball coach at Woodburn (Ore.) High School.

After four years of rebuilding, Sundquist's efforts bore fruit in 2004-05 as the Bruins posted their best season in 14 years. With an 18-7 record, the Bruins won the most games since the 1991-92 team went 24-11, and posted the best winning percentage (.720) since an .800 mark (24-6) in 1990-91. They were second in the conference at 13-3, their highest finish since joining the NWC in 1995, equaled their record for NWC wins, and had the best winning percentage (.813). George Fox led the league in attendance, averaging 1,145 per home game, and set a single-game crowd record with 2,400 for a Homecoming win over Whitworth on Feb. 5. Sundquist was named NWC Coach of the Year for the Bruins' incredible turnaround.

In 2005-06, the Bruins went 16-9 record and finished fourth in the NWC at 9-7. Led by Second Team All-West Region guard Aaron Schmick, George Fox ranked third nationally in free throw percentage (.782), 15th in three-point field goal percentage (.407), 37th in scoring (81.1 ppg), and 38th in field goal percentage (.484). They led the NWC in three-point and free throw shooting and blocked shots (3.24).

Over the past five seasons, George Fox has remained a team that cannot be counted out of any game. During that time, the Bruins have knocked off two nationally-ranked NCAA Division III teams and won four games against NAIA powers. In 2009-10, the Bruins went 13-14, tied for third in the NWC, and made only their second appearance in the NWC Tournament since joining the league for the 1995-96 season. In the NWC playoffs, the Bruins scored a thrilling win at Linfield in the semifinals before being eliminated just one win away from their first NCAA National Tournament berth by the 5th-ranked Whitworth Pirates on the road. Last year, the Bruins were only 8-17, but eight of their setbacks were by five points or less or in overtime.

Sundquist takes an 11-year record at George Fox of 111-165 (.402) into the 2011-12 season. He is the second-winningest coach in Bruins history, trailing only Mark Vernon's 318-218 record (1982-2000).

Sundquist was born in St. Helens, Ore., and grew up in Hillsboro, Ore., attending Glencoe High School. At Seattle Pacific, he earned four letters from 1984-88 as a shooting guard. He led the Falcons in free throw percentage as a junior (.818) and a senior (.817), with his career mark of .819 ranking 7th all-time at SPU. He was team captain and MVP as a senior, averaging 14.1 points a game while shooting a team-best .514 from the field and .482 from three-point range, a school record at the time. In an 83-78 overtime loss at Division I Stanford that season, he scored a career-high 33 points while setting new records, since broken, for three-pointers made (7) and attempted (12) in a game. He was named All-Great Northwest Conference and All-NCAA Division II District VIII as a senior.

Sundquist graduated in 1989 with a bachelor's degree in social sciences/secondary education. During his last year at SPU, he served as assistant women's basketball coach. After three years coaching in the junior high ranks, he spent the 1992-97 seasons as an assistant for the boys' basketball program at Glencoe before taking the Woodburn job.

Sundquist is married to the former Sara Thompson of Bellevue, Wash., and they have one son, Jake, age 14 1/2, and a daughter, Kaitlyn, age 11. The Sundquists attend Countryside Community Church in Sherwood.
