STEPHEN ANGELL is the Leatherock Professor of Quaker Studies at the Earlham School of Religion. He is author of *Bishop Henry McNeal Turner and African-American Religion in the South*, and co-editor of *Social Protest Thought in the African Methodist Episcopal Church, 1862-1939* and *The Quaker Bible Reader*.

TIMOTHY SEID is Associate Dean & Assistant Professor of New Testament Studies at the Earlham School of Religion.
