## Flexible Future

*Bruins hope to change cage fortunes in 2002-03 with change in style of play*

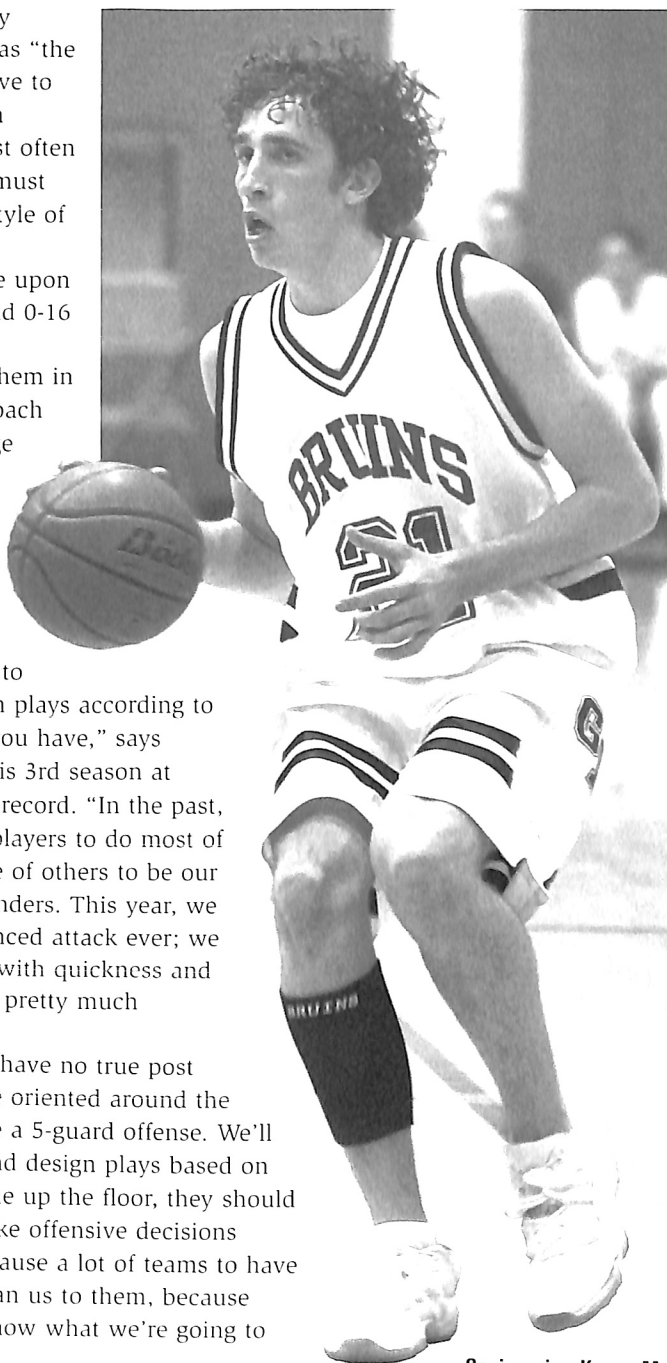
**F**lexibility is defined by *Webster's Dictionary* as "the quality of being responsive to changing conditions." In athletics, the term is most often applied to players, who must adjust to the particular style of the coaches.

In an effort to improve upon last year's 5-20 record and 0-16 finish in the Northwest Conference that landed them in the league cellar, head coach Mark Sundquist of George Fox University has decided to demonstrate his own flexibility and has revamped the style of play the Bruins will display in 2002-03.

"Sometimes you have to adjust the way your team plays according to the skills of the players you have," says Sundquist, who begins his 3rd season at George Fox with a 13-36 record. "In the past, we've looked for 1 or 2 players to do most of the scoring, and a couple of others to be our inside players and rebounders. This year, we may have our most balanced attack ever; we have a bunch of players with quickness and athleticism, and they are pretty much interchangeable.

"As a result, since we have no true post players, our game will be oriented around the perimeter, something like a 5-guard offense. We'll spread out the offense and design plays based on reads; as the players come up the floor, they should read the defense and make offensive decisions accordingly. This could cause a lot of teams to have to adjust to us, rather than us to them, because even we won't always know what we're going to run until we get there.

"It's a whole new philosophy that [assistant] coach [Mitch] Ratzlaff and I wanted to try because we thought it fit our personnel, and the kids seem to really like it."

### *Loss of Gritters Leaves Only One Starter Back*

Part of the coaches' decision to rely on a more perimeter-oriented set was due to the loss of **Jered Gritters** on the team during the summer because of a heart condition that prevents him from strenuous exercise. A strong 6-5 inside presence, Gritters averaged 6.4 points and led the team with 5.9 rebounds a game, and was playing his best ball of the season at the end.

"Jered's loss was a major blow, no doubt, but it was best for his health," admits Sundquist. "We lost not only our best post player, but a lot of senior leadership, intensity, and competitiveness. We had some plays specifically for him, and his loss left us scrambling to find the best fit for our kids."

Also gone are All-Conference Honorable Mention wing **Travis Melvin** (14.5 ppg), 4-year starting point guard **James Macy** (7.1 ppg), sharp-shooting wing **Sean Linder** (8.7 ppg, .571 field goal pct.), and top reserves **Woodley Polynice** (9.0 ppg) and **Jeff Greene** (8.1 ppg).

Only **Mark Gayman** (6-5 So., Hillsboro, Ore.) returns to the starting lineup after averaging 8.3 points and 5.5 rebounds a game while shooting .518 from the field. "Mark is developing into our most consistent player, and we're counting on him for continued improvement and leadership," says Sundquist.



# Outlook

## Four Returning Letterwinners and Two Redshirts

Four other letterwinners are back for the Bruins, as well as 2 players who redshirted last season. **Brett Yeager** (6-3 Jr., Oakridge, Ore.) and **Bryan Wadlow** (6-4 Jr., Albany, Ore.) give the Bruins some leaping and rebounding ability and are strong candidates for starting positions. Yeager averaged 4.3 points and 3.3 rebounds while shooting .563 from the field, while Wadlow posted numbers of 3.7 points and 2.0 rebounds.

Outside shooting will be provided by brothers **Kenny Macy** (6-3 Sr., Culver, Ore.) and **John Macy** (6-3 So., Culver, Ore.), who together with oldest brother James became what is believed to be the first trio of brothers ever to play at the same time in the same game at the NCAA Division III level. Kenny averaged 3.3 points a game, John 2.8.

**Zach Hollin** (6-5 Jr., Salem, Ore.) sat out last season after shoulder surgery in the fall, but appears fully recovered and could be one of this year's most pleasant surprises, based on his recent strong play in the preseason. **Mark Johnson** (5-11 Fr., Tonasket, Wash.) also redshirted last season and will provide depth at guard.

## Newcomers Could Contribute Right Away

Sundquist expects the Bruins' lone junior college transfer, **Nate Tyler** (6-2 Jr., Sweet Home, Ore.) from Chemeketa Community College, to have an immediate impact on the team. "Nate has been outstanding in all areas of the game," remarks the coach, "and he brings us a tremendous amount of toughness, competitiveness, and leadership."

Among the 4 freshmen on the team, **Trevor Person** (6-1 Fr., Battle Ground, Wash.) has stood out as having the best chance to step into a starting role. "If anyone takes over at the point, it will most likely be Trevor," predicts Sundquist. "He's a smart player who doesn't make many mistakes."

Also new to the team this season are **Aaron Schmick** (5-11 Fr., Hillsboro, Ore.), **Dan Gugliotta** (6-3 Fr., Central Point, Ore.), and **Ben Melvin** (6-1 Fr., Pleasant Hill, Ore.), the younger brother of former Bruins Travis and Ryan Melvin. "A lot of these kids come from winning high school programs," notes Sundquist, "and as a result, they don't behave like you might expect of freshmen in college. All of them have shown a degree of maturity beyond

their years, and they don't seem intimidated by play at this level."

## Turning Tough Losses Into Tough Wins

"We were competitive most of the time last year, despite our final record, losing 7 games by 6 points or less," Sundquist points out. "In most of those, one little twist to the game here or there could have made a difference. It is our goal this year to make those little twists go our way so we can turn those tough losses into tough wins."

Sundquist admits the team is not likely to be one of those "worst-to-first" success stories this season, but he sees no reason why the Bruins should not be part of an expected logjam in the middle of the pack.

"The Northwest Conference is very even this year, in my assessment," Sundquist predicts. "Whitworth and Linfield will be strong, and even though Lewis & Clark lost some top-notch players, they'll be right in there. But after those top 3-4 teams, the rest of the league could be really jumbled."

"To be in the midst of it, we will have to play hard every night. We'll try to create mismatches when we can, but we must emphasize our quickness over size. We must also continue to work hard on defense and rebounding. If our ability to read the defenses is as good as I think it's going to be, it ought to be a fun year."

The season begins for the Bruins at home against Concordia University-Portland on Wednesday, Nov. 27, at 7:30 p.m., the team's only home contest before the New Year.

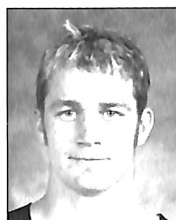

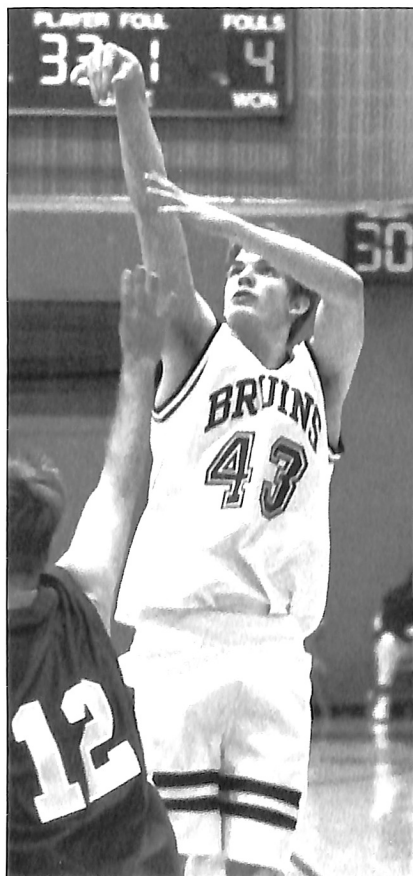

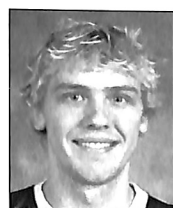

## Head Coach

## Mark Sundquist

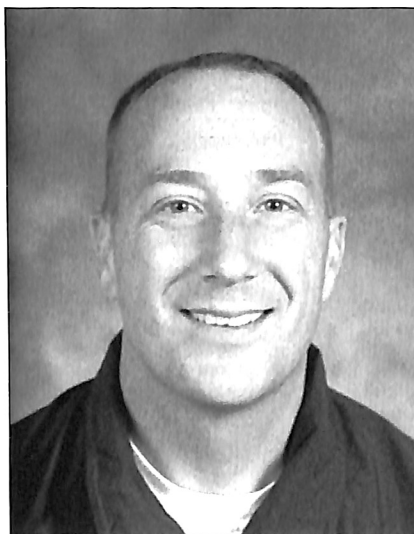
After two trying seasons in the rugged Northwest Conference, Mark Sundquist begins his third year as head men's basketball coach at George Fox University with a renewed belief the Bruins are about to begin heading in the right direction.

Sundquist was named to the George Fox post August 1, 2001, leaving him little time to recruit. Playing the hand that was dealt him, the Bruins fashioned an 8-16 record against bigger, more talented opponents with a hustling brand of basketball and some incredible outside shooting, finishing 2nd in the nation in 3-point field goals per game (9.92). Still overmatched in size and skills in his 2nd year, Sundquist's troops went 5-20 as a number of new players got their feet wet at the college level.

With the experience gained from last year's efforts, however, and several talented newcomers on hand, the Bruins expected to begin climbing back toward the top of the conference standings this season under Sundquist's leadership.

Sundquist took over the Bruin program, replacing 18-year veteran Mark Vernon, the winningest coach in school history, after a national search that ended ironically in the Bruins' backyard. During the 1999-2000 season, he had served as the boys' basketball coach at Newberg High School, only 8 blocks from George Fox, where he led a very young team that had only one returning player to a 5-18 record. Prior to that, he had spent 2 seasons as the boys' basketball coach at Woodburn (Ore.) High School.

Born Nov. 24, 1965, in St. Helens, Oregon, Sundquist grew up in Hillsboro, Ore., where he attended Glencoe High School. He was recruited

by George Fox but elected to attend Seattle Pacific University (SPU), his mother's alma mater.

Sundquist earned 4 letters for the Falcons from 1984-88, playing shooting guard for 3 seasons alongside point

guard Ritchie McKay, ex-Oregon State University coach and now the head coach at the University of New Mexico. He led the team in free-throw percentage as a junior (.818) and a senior (.817), with his career mark of .819 ranking 7th all-time at SPU. He was team captain and MVP as a senior, averaging 14.1 points a game while shooting a team-best .514 from the field and .482 from 3-point range, a school record at the time. In an 83-78 overtime loss at Division I Stanford that season, he scored a career-high 33 points while setting new records, since broken, for 3-pointers made (7) and attempted (12) in a game. He was named All-Great Northwest Conference and All-NCAA Division II District VIII as a senior.

Sundquist graduated from Seattle Pacific in 1989 with a bachelor's degree in social sciences/secondary education. During his last year at SPU, he served as assistant women's basketball coach. After 3 years coaching in the junior high ranks, he spent the 1992-97 seasons as an assistant for the boys' basketball program at Glencoe before taking the Woodburn job.

Selected from among 30 applicants from as far away as Massachusetts, Sundquist fulfilled one of his fondest dreams when he stepped into a college coaching role. "It (the George Fox job) was a 'win-win' situation for me, because I enjoyed it at Newberg High and I was beginning to develop some wonderful relationships with the kids there, but this is a great fit for me. I like the comfortable Christian atmosphere, in a good conference, with wonderful facilities."

Sundquist is married to the former Sara Thompson of Bellevue, Wash., and they have one son, Jake, age 5 1/2, and a daughter, Kaitlyn, age 2. The Sundquists attend Newberg Free Methodist Church.

## Mitch Ratzlaff

### *Assistant Coach*



Former George Fox cager Mitch Ratzlaff, who returned to his alma mater to begin his coaching career, is now in his 3rd

season with the Bruins as an assistant coach.

Ratzlaff, 28, was a 4-sport athlete at Salem Academy in Salem, Ore., earning all-league honors in soccer, basketball, and track while also running cross

country. He was named Senior Christian Athlete of the Year, and was a finalist for the Salem Sports and Breakfast Club Athlete of the Year after winning 2 gold medals in the state track and field meet and being selected for the Senior All-Star Game in soccer.

After a year at Chemeketa Community College, where he played basketball and was the Most Outstanding performer on the track team, he transferred to George Fox and played for 3 seasons (1993-96). A part-time starter as a sophomore, his top game was a 10-point, 9-rebound, 5-assist effort against Concordia-Portland, but his last 2 years were injury-

plagued. He broke a finger midway through December of his junior year, and as a senior he tore an ACL in his knee before the season started, then broke his foot with only 4 games left after returning. For battling against all odds, he received the Coaches' Award for Outstanding Attitude and Commitment.

Ratzlaff graduated cum laude from George Fox in 1996 with a bachelor's degree in business and economics, and now works at Integrated Services Inc. He and his wife, Kelleigh, reside in Newberg.

**Craig Taylor***Athletics Director*

**C**raig Taylor is in his 15th year as the director of Athletics at George Fox, but has been associated with the Bruins for 29 years as player, coach, and professor. He came to George Fox in 1971 as a junior forward for the men's basketball team, and during the 1972-73 season, he helped the Bruins to their first-ever NAIA District 2 title.

Taylor graduated from George Fox in 1974, receiving honors as the Outstanding Man in Teacher Education and Outstanding Physical Education Major. He received a master of science degree in education from Linfield College in 1975. While enrolled in graduate courses, he was a George Fox residence hall director.

From 1974-79, Taylor was the Bruins baseball coach, posting a 47-91 record in 6 seasons, while also serving as assistant basketball coach. He worked at a sporting goods retailing firm in 1979-81, but returned to George Fox as coach of the women's basketball team from 1981-93, producing a 12-year record of 162-155. He also coached the softball team from 1981-88 and again in 1990, compiling a 77-99-1 record in 9 seasons. In 1985 he was named NAIA District 2 Softball Coach of the Year.

Taylor, 51, is responsible for all athletics department functions, including eligibility and compliance with George Fox, Northwest Conference, and NCAA regulations, budgeting, and department and sports center management. In 1992, he was named NAIA District 2 Administrator of the Year.

Taylor and his wife, Kathy, live in McMinnville and have 3 children: Leah, 28; Bree, 23, a 2001 George Fox graduate who played volleyball for the Bruins; and Casey, 13.

**Pat Bailey***Associate Athletics Director*

**P**at Bailey begins his 8th year as George Fox's baseball coach and 5th year as associate director of athletics, with primary responsibility for all athletics fund raising.

Bailey is also director of the Bruin Club, George Fox's athletics booster organization, chairs the Sports Hall of Fame Selection Committee, and assists in game management for fall and winter sports. His baseball teams have compiled a 191-97 record, making him the winningest coach in Bruin diamond history, and have won or tied for 4 Northwest Conference titles.

## Wheeler Sports Center

Entered by crossing a wooded canyon on a 200-foot bridge, the Wheeler Sports Center, home of the George Fox Bruins volleyball and men's and women's basketball teams, is a natural place to place sports of all sorts.

The sports center was designed by noted architect Pietro Belluschi to sit unpretentiously on the northeast side of the campus alongside tree-shaded Hess Creek canyon. Built using gifts from prominent lumbermen, the building features a 2-level oak parquet lobby and a large window area overlooking the adjacent natural terrain. Completed in June 1977, the \$2.7 million, 55,000-square-foot complex is the university's largest building.

Wheeler's main feature is the James and Lila Miller Gymnasium, home court for Bruins volleyball and men's and women's basketball, with a total seating capacity of 2,750. Measuring 116' x 174', the gym contains 3 full-length basketball courts, 3 volleyball courts, and 10 badminton courts. The ceilings are 32 feet above the hardwood maple floor.

Adjacent to the gym on the upper level are a staff room,



multipurpose room, classrooms, and athletics administration and faculty offices. The building's weight room was remodeled and expanded during the summer of 2002 and now contains 1,800 square feet of floor space. On the lower level are a concessions area, dressing rooms, team rooms, laundry facilities, an equipment-issuing room, and storage space. An east wing of the building houses 2 racquetball courts.

## Why the "Bruins"?

*GFU's nickname is derived from an unruly pet, and battles over its symbolic remains continue to this day*

George Fox University's Bruin nickname comes from a real bear captured in 1887, just 2 years after Pacific Academy (the university's predecessor) was established. The small cub was found in the Coast Range foothills near Carlton, Ore., about 15 miles west of Newberg, after its mother had been shot. The young cub was brought to the campus by a student and later lived with a faculty member.

When the bear grew to adulthood, it was kept in a pit in Hess Creek canyon south of the campus. It escaped one too many times, however, and was turned into steak for the dining table, while the hide was preserved on a frame and displayed in an early campus museum. When the hide

deteriorated several years later, it was taken to a campus furnace room to be destroyed, but the framework proved a problem in dismantling, so it was left sitting in a corner.

Students later found the old bearskin and began skirmishes over ownership, a tradition that continues today, even though the original is long gone. "Bruin Junior," a replica, is fought over periodically in class competition under a set of guidelines passed down for years, with the class that is able to physically drag the Bruin replica off campus declared the rightful owner until the next time it is "flashed" on campus.

Even with the long Bruin tradition, the "Quaker" tag for athletic teams came into popularity with sportswriters

during the 1950s and 1960s because of the school's affiliation with the Friends denomination. That nickname, along with a mascot named "Foxy George," a little fox with a Quaker hat, was used for a while until a vote of faculty, students, and administration in 1970 reinstated the Bruin nickname to its rightful place.

# About the University



**G**eorge Fox University, an evangelical Christian liberal arts college, is expanding, both in size and reputation. ## H. David Brandt

**D**avid Brandt, George Fox University's 11th president, came to the university in August 1998 after three years as president of Tabor College in Hillsboro, Kan.

Brandt has experience at 4 other Christian colleges and describes himself as "a 'lifer' in Christian higher education." He has been vice president and provost at Bethel College in St. Paul, Minn.; dean and vice president for academic affairs at Messiah College in Grantham, Pa.; a physics instructor and chairman of the Division of Natural

*World Report.* In 2000, George Fox ranked first in academic reputation and second overall among Western regional liberal arts colleges. The magazine also named the university one of the best values among schools in its category.

George Fox offers unique programs to its students. Every incoming freshman is given a computer to use and keep upon graduation. When students reach their 3rd year, they are eligible for the Juniors Abroad program, in which the university pays

Science and Mathematics at Gordon College in Wenham, Mass.; and a physics instructor at Wheaton (Ill.) College.

Brandt did his undergraduate work in physics at Wheaton. He earned a master of science degree in physics in 1962 and a doctorate in physics in 1971, both at the University of Oklahoma.

Brandt taught physics 1962-63 at the University of Omaha in Nebraska; was

transportation costs for an overseas study tour.

The school's history began in 1885, when Willamette Valley Quaker settlers established Pacific Academy. It was during those early days that George Fox's most prominent alumnus attended the school — Herbert Hoover, who later became the 31st president of the United States.

The college division was organized in 1891 to provide more advanced instruction, and the name was changed to Pacific College. In 1949, because of the many schools in the West with "Pacific" in their titles, another change was made, this time to George Fox College, honoring the founder of the Friends (Quaker) church.

In 1996, with the addition of Western Evangelical Seminary, George Fox became a university, offering students a Christ-centered education and the choice of more than 40 undergraduate majors and 12 graduate degrees. On Jan. 1, 2000, the seminary was renamed George Fox Evangelical Seminary.

George Fox is located in Newberg, Oregon (pop. 18,280), 25 miles southwest of Portland, the state's largest metropolitan center of 1.7 million, and 32 miles north of Salem, the state capital.

# Short on "W"s

*Small size and inexperience showed as Bruins struggled to 5-20 season*

Although the George Fox Bruins' final 2001-02 season record of 5-20, with an 0-16 mark in Northwest Conference play, was disappointing, the team showed improved play as the season progressed and several promising newcomers supplied hope for the future.

The Bruins began the season with 4 straight losses, including 2 to Cascade that were forfeited to George Fox as wins after the season due to the use of an ineligible player. The string was snapped with an upset win at Northwest, which had beaten the Bruins in Newberg in the 2nd game of the season.

The Bruins managed a split in the adidas D3 Desert Shootout in Las Vegas, Nev., when Woodley Polynice scored on a rebound basket for a 50-48 win over the State University of New York-Utica/Rome in the consolation game of the tournament. Their final win came at home against Northwest

Christian, but the season ended with 10 straight losses, all in conference play. The final game was a heartbreaking 100-98 overtime loss to NWC-Tournament-bound Whitworth on homecoming night, after the Bruins had led by as many as 21 points.

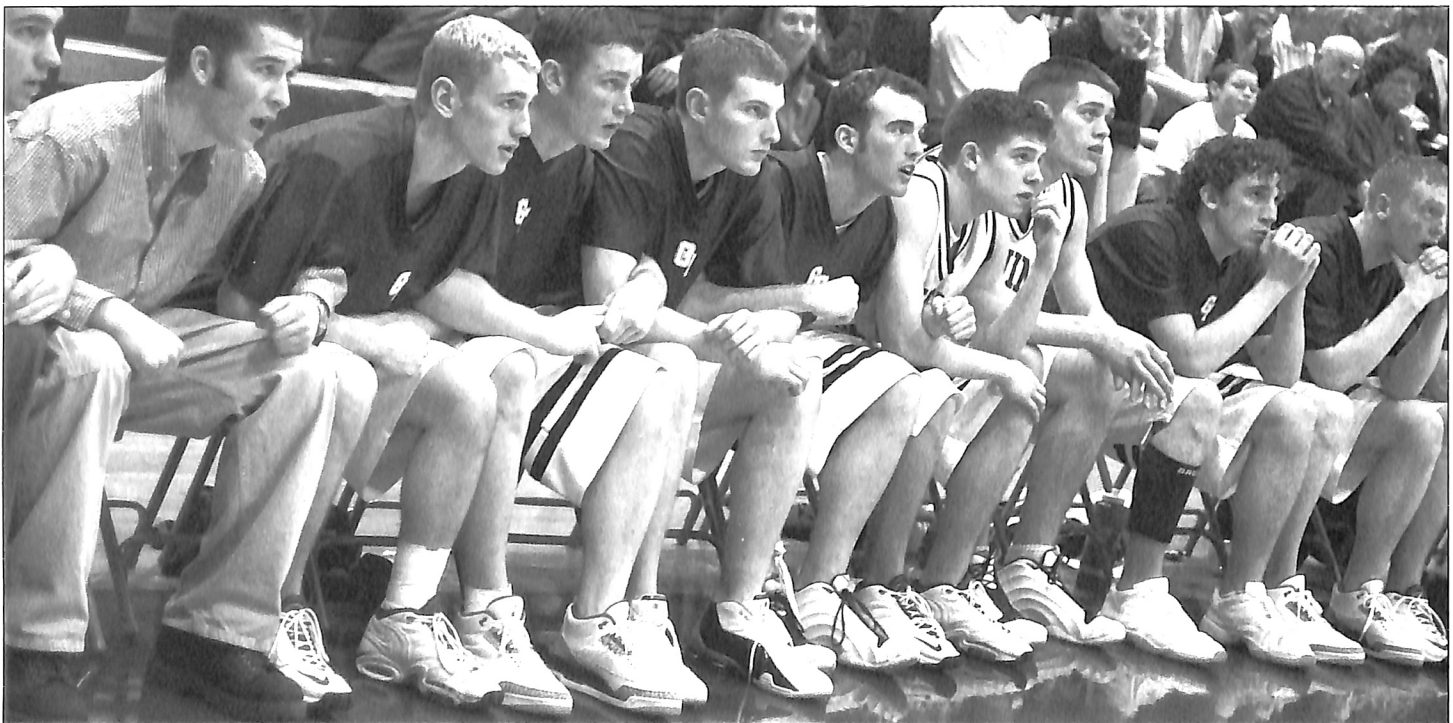
Senior wing Travis Melvin of Pleasant Hill, Ore., provided many exciting moments with his outside shooting, averaging 14.5 points per game and pouring in 29 in the homecoming loss to Whitworth. Melvin received honorable mention for the All-Conference team, and finished his career as the No. 13 all-time scorer in Bruin history with 1,268 total points.

Brothers James, Kenny, and John Macy of Culver, Ore., became only the 3rd authenticated trio of brothers and 1st in Division III history to play together at the same time in the same game, getting in all at once against Northwest Christian on Jan. 15 and at Whitman on Jan. 19. In the Whitman

game, all 3 scored 3-point baskets. James, a 4-year starter, just missed the 1,000-point club as he finished his career with 936 points.

Senior Sean Linder of Azalea, Ore., was 3rd in the conference in field goal percentage (.571), while junior Jered Gritters of Oregon City, Ore., and freshman Mark Gayman of Hillsboro, Ore., finished among the league leaders in field goal percentage, rebounds, and blocked shots. Gritters shot .546 with 5.9 rebounds and 0.84 blocks per game, while Gayman shot .518 and had 5.5 rebounds a game.

Mike "Biggs" Wirta, the Bruins' statistical guru for 31 years, witnessed his 900th George Fox men's game against Whitman on Feb. 15. He has now seen 901 games total, has been courtside for 471 straight men's games, home and away, and has worked 384 straight home games. The last home game he missed was in 1972.
