1/10 – PACIFIC LUTHERAN 76, GEORGE FOX 67: Return of Anderson Enables Lutes to Overcome Bruins

NEWBERG, Ore. – Jonathan Anderson, playing in just his third game with Pacific Lutheran University after regaining his eligibility after Christmas, poured in 24 points, leading the Lutes past the George Fox University Bruins 76-67 in Northwest Conference men's basketball Saturday night here at Miller Gym in the Wheeler Sports Center.

The Bruins and Lutes exchanged leads four times in the first six minutes of the game, George Fox taking its final lead at 11-10 with 13:55 left in the half on a jumper by Mark Gayman. PLU then ran off 9 unanswered points to take a 19-11 lead on an Anderson layup at the 9:32 mark, and the Lutes never trailed again. It was 32-25 PLU at the half, and the Lutes maintained a lead between 7 and 16 points the rest of the way.

George Fox entered the game with all five of its starters averaging in double figures, and they all did it again, combining for 64 of the Bruins' 67 points. Scott Szalay and Ben Melvin had 15 each, Aaron Schmick scored 14, and Gayman and Bryan Wadlow had 10 apiece. Gayman grabbed 8 rebounds as the Bruins maintained a slight edge on the boards, 37-36, and Schmick had 3 assists.

Anderson, the Lutes' leading scorer last year, got help from Drew Cardwell with 18 points. Michael Jacobs came off the bench to pull down a team-high 8 rebounds, and Hazen Hyland passed out 9 assists.

George Fox dipped to 3-7 overall and 0-2 in the conference, while Pacific Lutheran climbed to 4-7 overall and 1-1 in the league.

The Bruins are back in conference action Tuesday (Jan. 13), hosting Pacific University. The Lutes are off until Friday (Jan. 16) when they will host Whitworth College. Both men's games are at 8:00 p.m., following women's games at 6:00 p.m.

1/17 – LINFIELD 92, GEORGE FOX 69: Wildcats Use 14-0 Start to Overpower Bruins for Second Time

McMINNVILLE, Ore. – Scoring 14 unanswered points in the game's first three minutes, the Linfield College Wildcats took early control and went on to a 92-69 win over their Yamhill County rivals, the George Fox University Bruins, in a Northwest Conference men's basketball game Saturday night here at Ted Wilson Gym.

After Linfield's initial outburst, the Bruins finally got on the scoreboard with three quick 3-point baskets by Bryan Wadlow, Aaron Schmick, and Mark Gayman to cut the deficit to 16-9. The Bruins twice got within 6 and had the ball with chances to cut it even more, but the Wildcats reasserted themselves late in the half and led by 10 at the break 45-35.

The second half belonged totally to Linfield as the Wildcats led by double digits the rest of the way. The largest gap was 28 at 81-53 with 7 minutes left. It was the second easy win by the Wildcats over the Bruins this season, the first a 105-72 win on Dec. 30 in the Cactus Jam Tournament in Phoenix, Ariz. The teams will meet a third time on Feb. 10 in Newberg for a second conference game.

Gayman led all scorers with 16 points, Schmick added 14, and Wadlow and Scott Szalay had 10 each. Szalay made it a double-double game with a game-high 10 rebounds, but the Bruins were out-boarded in a conference game for the first time this season, 50-37. Schmick had 6 assists, and Brett Yeager picked up a game-high 4 steals.

The Wildcats had six players in double figures in points: Chris Lewis and T.J. Middlesworth with 15 each, Nick Fusare and Blake Shelton with 12 apiece, and Sam Kreiger and John Broussard with 10 each. Broussard led Linfield with 9 rebounds, while Joe Neill passed out 7 assists.

The Bruins fell to 3-10 overall and 0-5 in the conference with their 7th loss in a row, while the Wildcats climbed to 8-4 and 3-0 in the league with their 8th straight win over the Bruins. It was only the 2nd time in the last 12 meetings that one of the two did not score 100 or more points.

George Fox returns home to play Willamette University Tuesday, Jan. 20, at 8:00 p.m., following a women's game at 6:00 p.m. Linfield visits Whitman College on Friday, Jan. 23.

11/25 – GEORGE FOX 87, WARNER PACIFIC 82: Double Double-Doubles and Triples Lift Bruins by Knights

NEWBERG, Ore. – Mark Gayman and Scott Szalay each posted double-doubles in points and rebounds and Bryan Wadlow hit three critical three-pointers in the second half, lifting the George Fox University Bruins to a come-from-behind 87-82 win over the Warner Pacific College Knights in men's basketball Tuesday night here in Miller Gym at the Wheeler Sports Center.

A 13-4 run lifted George Fox from a 12-11 deficit to a 24-16 lead midway through the first half, but the visiting Knights rallied behind the hot hand of Joe Hoover, who canned 6 of 7 shots and scored 17 first-half points, sparking Warner to a 47-41 halftime lead.

The Bruins battled back in the second half and regained the lead for good at 55-53 on a layup by Aaron Schmick with 15:48 left, but the Knights would not go away. Wadlow nailed his first triple with 10:47 left, upping a one-point Bruin lead to 62-58, hit again at 10:23 to make it 65-59, and then connected at 8:31 for a 71-63 margin. The Bruins built their largest lead at 80-68 with 5:36 left on two free throws by Schmick. Warner cut the lead to three twice in the final 80 seconds, but Gayman and Szalay hit big layups to keep the Knights at arms' length.

Gayman finished with 25 points and 13 rebounds for the Bruins, the 9th double-double of his career, while Szalay posted his first with 15 points and 11 rebounds. Schmick added 19 points and Wadlow totaled 10, while Ben Melvin handed out 7 assists.

Hoover had a game-high 27 for the Knights, with Wesley Powers adding 12, Lamar Tillman 11, and Kyle Wheeler 10. Wheeler had 8 rebounds and Nick Hudson passed out 3 assists.

The Bruins shot 50.8% for the game (33-65), including 55.2% (16-29) in the second half, and made 80.0% (16-20) on free throws. The Knights were hot in the first half, hitting 53.1% (17-32), but cooled considerably in the second half, making only 29.0% (9-31). The Bruins held a significant edge on the boards, out-rebounding the Knights 47-29.

George Fox (1-1) is off until Friday, Dec. 5, when the Bruins take on Northwest Christian College in the Concordia University-Portland Tournament at 5:30 p.m. Warner Pacific (2-5) visits NCAA Division I Weber State University Friday, Nov. 28, at 7:05 p.m.

record. There have been two years since then when there was no team: 1903-04, when smallpox forced cancellation of the season, and 1918-19, when an influenza outbreak wiped out the schedule. Insofar as records can be authenticated, the Bruins, counting this season's scores, have a 100-year cumulative record of 966-1,000-1 (.491).

1/20 – WILLAMETTE 75, GEORGE FOX 68: Bruins Lose Historic Game to Bearcats in OT Thriller

NEWBERG, Ore. – If it had to be the 1,000th loss in their men's basketball history, the George Fox University Bruins intended to make it a good one, and that they did, falling 75-68 to the visiting Willamette University Bearcats in a Northwest Conference overtime thriller Tuesday night here at Miller Gym in the Wheeler Sports Center.

Willamette raced out to a 12-0 lead to start the game before Mark Gayman's jumper at 17:09 got the Bruins on the scoreboard. Although they never caught up in the half, the Bruins did go into the break down by only a pair at 30-28. A 3-pointer by **Bryan Wadlow** with 18:13 to go in the second half gave the Bruins a short-lived 33-32 lead before David Force responded with a jumper to put the Bearcats back on top.

The Bearcats extended that lead to as much as 10 twice, the last on a Brennan Garrelts layup with 8:12 left to make it 55-45 Willamette. **Scott Szalay** responded with baskets on three consecutive trips down the court to spark the Bruins' comeback, and **Aaron Schmick** put the Bruins ahead with a 3-pointer with 2:13 to go. **Brett Yeager**'s two free throws at 1:27 made it 62-59, but Harold Sublett, Jr. hit a game-tying 3-pointer from the right corner with 6.7 seconds left to knot it, the only shot he hit in 9 tries. Schmick got off a 3-point shot as time expired, but it skimmed the front of the rim and fell to the floor, sending the game to overtime.

Szalay's layup 15 seconds into overtime gave the Bruins an early lead, but John Olinger made a steal and layup and Force hit a layup with 3:24 left, and the Bearcats never trailed again. Force later added a three and two free throws for 7 of his game-high 27 points to ice the win.

Szalay finished with a career-high 24 points and 12 rebounds for the Bruins, leading them to a 40-34 edge on the boards. Schmick added 12 points, and Gayman and Wadlow scored 10 each. Yeager had a game and career-high 7 assists.

In addition to Force's 27, Olinger had 14 points and Garrelts 12. Sublett grabbed 9 rebounds, and Olinger had a game-high 5 steals.

George Fox fell to 3-11 overall and 0-6 in the conference with its 8th loss in a row. The Bruins now have a historical record, in 100 seasons for which there are records, of 966-1,000-1. Willamette improved to 8-5 overall and 3-1 in the league.

1/16 – LEWIS & CLARK 73, GEORGE FOX 67: Pioneers Survive Bruin Scare Behind Three-Point Barrage

PORTLAND, Ore. – Putting a major scare into Northwest Conference perennial power Lewis & Clark College, the visiting George Fox University Bruins led the powerful Pioneers with less than four minutes to play before the home team squeezed out a hard-fought 73-67 victory in men's basketball action Friday night here at the Pamplin Sports Center.

George Fox led throughout the game's first 5 minutes before the Pioneers took a 16-13 lead on a three-pointer by John Mietus, and they held the advantage to the end of the period. The lead ballooned to as much as 16 at 41-25 with 5:26 to go before the Bruins rallied behind Scott Szalay and Mark Gayman, who combined for 27 of the Bruins' 38 points in the period. Szalay had 14 points on 7-9 shooting and grabbed 7 rebounds, while Gayman parlayed a 6-6 showing at the free throw line into 13 points.

Giving the Pios a 46-38 halftime edge were 8 three-pointers in the half, including 3 by Danny Winchester, who had 14 points, while Mietus, the conference's leading scorer, had 10 in the half. The Pios made 8-19 from three-point range but only 8-20 from two-point range in the period.

Another trey by Winchester gave the Pios their largest lead of the second half at 56-45 with 16:18 to go, but the Bruins again bounced back and actually regained the lead 66-65 on a three by Aaron Schmick with 4:07 left. Ryan Wells answered with a corresponding three at the 3:47 mark to make it 68-66 for the Pioneers, Mietus hit two free throws at 3:01 to make it 70-66, and Brett Yeager's free throw for the Bruins cut it to 70-67 with 2:20 left.

The Bruins had a chance to tie the game with a minute left, but were victimized by the fact that the gym's shot clock had malfunctioned with five minutes left in the game, forcing the officials to use a stop watch and the PA system to inform teams of the time left to shoot. However, the Bruins did not hear the announcement while playing for a game-tying shot and were called for a shot-clock violation with 49 seconds left. Danny Winchester's two free throws with 19 seconds left and one by Tommy Magnuson with 9 second left clinched it.

Szalay and Gayman each finished with 19 points for the Bruins, while Gayman made it a double-double by adding a game-high 11 rebounds. The Bruins, as they have in all four of their conference games, out-rebounded their opponents, this time 44-38. Ben Melvin had a game-high 4 assists. The Bruins held Lewis & Clark to a 34.8 shooting percentage (23-66) and made more field goals (25-23) than the Pioneers, but were hurt by the Pios' 13 three-pointers and 13 turnovers to only 7 for the hosts.

Winchester finished with 27 points, including 6 from long range, and Mietus had a double-double with 20 points and 10 rebounds, though he was held to just 6-20 shooting from the field. Wells added 11 points.

The Bruins dipped to 3-9 overall and 0-4 in the conference while suffering their 6th straight loss. The Pioneers improved to 9-3 overall and 2-1 in the league.

George Fox goes to McMinnville Saturday night to play Yamhill County rival Linfield College, while Lewis & Clark visits Willamette University in Salem Saturday. Both Northwest Conference games begin at 8:00 p.m., following women's games at 6:00 p.m.

1/13 – PACIFIC 77, GEORGE FOX 67: Charity Doesn't Work at Home as Boxer Free Throws Burn Bruins

NEWBERG, Ore. – Making four times as many free throws as the home team, the visiting Pacific University Boxers sank 20 of 28 from the charity stripe, including 9 of 12 in the final 5 minutes, to hold off the George Fox University Bruins 77-67 in Northwest Conference men's basketball Tuesday night here at Miller Gym in the Wheeler Sports Center.

The first half was a tight one with 4 ties and 5 lead changes, Pacific eking out a 32-30 advantage at the intermission. The Boxers' Joe Van Domelen, last week's NWC Player of the Week, took over in the second half, however, scoring 17 of his game-high 25 points to keep the Boxers in front.

Pacific had 11-point leads three times in the second half, the last coming with 4:39 to play on a pair of free throws by Van Domelen that gave the Boxers a 70-59 advantage. The Bruins began to foul in an effort to catch up, but the Boxers, defeating the Bruins for the 9th straight time, rose to the challenge at the line, and George Fox was able to get no closer than 6 points at any time thereafter.

The field goal totals were equal – 27 each – and the Bruins made 8 3-pointers to only 3 for the Boxers, but while Pacific was having a good time at the line, George Fox managed to make only 5 of 10, and therein lay the difference. Both teams had good nights from the field, Pacific hitting 51.9% (27-52) and George Fox slightly under that at 49.1% (27-55). George Fox controlled the boards 34-28 but made more turnovers, 17-10.

Mark Gayman led the home team with 18 points, and Scott Szalay and Aaron Schmick had 15 each. Szalay had 7 rebounds, while Gayman and Brett Yeager had 6 assists each.

In addition to Van Domelen's big game, Erin Gram scored 14 and Branden Kawazoe added 12. B.J. Anderson led the Boxers with 7 rebounds and 4 steals, while Gram had 9 assists.

George Fox dropped its 5th in a row and fell to 3-8 overall and 0-3 in the conference, while Pacific climbed to 3-6 overall and 1-1 in the league.

2/10 – LINFIELD 70, GEORGE FOX 64: Late Rally Lifts Linfield Past Bruins in Yamhill County Clash

NEWBERG, Ore. – A 13-4 run in the final five minutes enabled the Linfield County Wildcats to foil a spirited upset bid by the George Fox University Bruins and notch a 70-64 win that was not settled until the final few seconds in Northwest Conference men's basketball Tuesday night here at Miller Gym in the Wheeler Sports Center.

The homestanding Bruins held as much as a six-point lead in the first seven minutes of the game before the bigger Wildcats began to assert themselves. Blake Shelton's 3-pointer gave Linfield a 15-14 edge with 12:31 left in the half, and the visitors stretched it to 38-29 at the break.

Two free throws by T.J. Mark Gayman led the Bruins with 18 points and 7 rebounds, while Ben Melvin scored 17 and Schmick 12. Schmick and Melvin each had 3 assists, and Gayman picked up 4 steals.

Shelton paced the Wildcats with 18 points, followed by Fusare and Chris Lewis with 13 each and Middlesworth with 10. Fusare's 7 boards led the Wildcats to a 43-35 rebounding edge. Joe Neill had 6 assists. Fusare canned 9-10 free throws as the visitors outscored the home team at the line, making 23-25 to 9-11 for the Bruins.

1/30 – WHITWORTH 88, GEORGE FOX 84 (OT): Bruins Fall to Pirates in Second Straight NWC OT Game

NEWBERG, Ore. – For the second straight time in Northwest Conference play, the George Fox University Bruins pushed one of the league's top teams to the very edge but could not complete the upset in overtime, falling 88-84 to the visiting Whitworth College Pirates in men's basketball Friday night here at Miller Gym in the Wheeler Sports Center.

Down 8-6 five minutes into the game, Bryan Wadlow hit back-to-back 3-pointers to ignite a 20-5 George Fox run that gave the Bruins a 13-point lead midway through the first half. The Bruins were still up 13 at 34-21 after Mark Gayman hit a pair of free throws with six minutes left, but the Pirates out-scored the home team 18-11 to cut the margin to 45-39 at the break.

A 14-4 run, capped by two free throws by Jon Young, enabled Whitworth to take a 57-56 lead with 9:43 to play, and from that point until the end of regulation, there were five ties and five lead changes, with neither team leading by more than three. After Bryan Depew hit a free throw with 32 seconds left to knot it at 72-72, the Bruins had two shots to win it, but Aaron Schmick's 3-pointer hit the rim and Chris Parker's shot from 12 feet away after collaring the rebound was short.

With three of their starters fouling out – Scott Szalay and Wadlow in regulation, Schmick midway through the overtime – the Bruins fell behind 83-75 with 57 seconds left in the extra period, but fought back within two points twice as Ben Melvin scored 7 points in the last minute. However, Depew and Scott Bierlink hit two free throws each with 13 and 4 seconds left to protect the Whitworth win.

Melvin finished with a career-high 19 points and added 7 assists, and he was joined in the George Fox scoring column by Gayman with 16, Schmick with 14, and Wadlow with 13. A career-high 9 rebounds by Parker and 8 each by Gayman and Brett Yeager led the Bruins to a 37-33 edge on the boards. The Bruins suffered from 17 turnovers, however, to only 8 for the Pirates.

Depew and Bierlink each posted double-doubles for Whitworth, Depew with 28 points and 11 rebounds and Bierlink with 23 points and 12 boards. Depew led the Pirates with 3 assists as the visitors took a large number of one-on-one shots.

George Fox, which lost to league-leading Willamette University on Jan. 20 in overtime before snapping an 8-game losing streak Tuesday with a non-conference win over Multnomah Bible College, slid to 4-12 overall and 0-7 in the conference with yet another tough-luck loss. The Bruins have three overtime losses and three other setbacks by a total of 10 points this year. Whitworth, the pre-season NWC favorite, kept its hopes of repeating as conference champion alive by improving to 12-5 overall and 5-3 in the league.

The Bruins return to Northwest Conference action Saturday (Jan. 31), hosting Whitman College in the school's Homecoming game. The Pirates are off until next Friday (Feb. 6) when they visit Lewis & Clark College. Both games are at 8:00 p.m., following women's games at 6:00 p.m.

1/31 – GEORGE FOX 78, WHITMAN 71: Bruins Have Happy Homecoming with NWC Win over Whitman

NEWBERG, Ore. – Mark Gayman and Scott Szalay posted double-doubles and the George Fox University Bruins nailed 84.6% of their free throws, many of them late in the game to protect a lead, as the Bruins picked up their first Northwest Conference men's basketball win of the season 78-71 over the Whitman College Saturday night here at Miller Gym in the Wheeler Sports Center.

With their largest crowd of the season on hand – some 1,300 for Homecoming – the Bruins finally got the proverbial conference monkey off their backs by doing the not-so-little things needed for a win, such as cutting down the turnovers (only 12 to 14 for Whitman), hitting the boards (a 44-35 rebound advantage, including 16 offensive), and sinking the freebies (22-26, including 10-11 in the final three minutes).

Doing those things was necessary in a game that was close throughout, neither team holding a double-digit lead until the final minute. There were 11 lead changes in the first half alone, which ended, appropriately enough, in 36-36 deadlock.

There were three more lead changes early in the second half before the Bruins took the lead for good 46-45 on a Mark Gayman layup with 16:37 to play. Scott Szalay's layup with 7:46 to go gave the home team its biggest lead to that point at 61-53 before the Missionaries battled back, cutting the gap to a single digit at 63-62 on a pair of Greg Ricker free throws with 5:12 to go.

Aaron Schmick answered with a 3-pointer for George Fox, Szalay hit two free throws, and Chris Parker's three-point play with 1:43 left put the Bruins up 71-64, and then the Bruins' free-throw shooting took over to seal the win. Ben Melvin's free throw with 13 seconds left gave George Fox the largest lead of the game at 78-68 before Will Cale hit a 3-pointer with two ticks left.

Gayman finished with 16 points and a career-high 17 rebounds, and Szalay chipped in with 15 points and 10 boards. Melvin helped the cause with 17 points and Schmick tallied 15. Bryan Wadlow and Szalay had 3 assists each.

Ricker scored 21 points and had 6 assists to lead the Missionaries, while Cale scored 16 and Casey Nelson added 10. Cale was 6-6 from the field, including 4 3-pointers – but missed his only free throw. Jacob Pounds was the top rebounder for Whitman with 11.

George Fox improved to 5-12 overall and 1-7 in the conference, while Whitman slipped to 6-11 overall and 2-6 in the league.

The Bruins head for Tacoma next weekend to start the second half of conference play, first visiting the University of Puget Sound on Friday (Feb. 6). The Missionaries travel to Salem to take on Willamette University Friday. Both games are at 8:00 p.m., following women's games at 6:00 p.m.

1/20 – WILLAMETTE 75, GEORGE FOX 68: Bruins Lose 1,000th in History to Bearcats in OT Thriller

NEWBERG, Ore. – If it had to be the 1,000th loss in their men's basketball history, the George Fox University Bruins intended to make it a good one, and that they did, falling 75-68 to the visiting Willamette University Bearcats in a Northwest Conference overtime thriller Tuesday night here at Miller Gym in the Wheeler Sports Center.

Willamette raced out to a 12-0 lead to start the game before Mark Gayman's jumper at 17:09 got the Bruins on the scoreboard. Although they never caught up in the half, the Bruins did go into the break down by only a pair at 30-28. A 3-pointer by Bryan Wadlow with 18:13 to go in the second half gave the Bruins a short-lived 33-32 lead before David Force responded with a jumper to put the Bearcats back on top.

The Bearcats extended that lead to as much as 10 twice, the last on a Brennan Garrelts layup with 8:12 left to make it 55-45 Willamette. Scott Szalay responded with baskets on three consecutive trips down the court to spark the Bruins' comeback, and Aaron Schmick put the Bruins ahead with a 3-pointer with 2:13 to go. Brett Yeager's two free throws at 1:27 made it 62-59, but Harold Sublett, Jr. hit a game-tying 3-pointer from the right corner with 6.7 seconds left to knot it, the only shot he hit in 9 tries. Schmick got off a 3-point shot as time expired, but it skimmed the front of the rim and fell to the floor, sending the game to overtime.

Szalay's layup 15 seconds into overtime gave the Bruins an early lead, but John Olinger made a steal and layup and Force hit a layup with 3:24 left, and the Bearcats never trailed again. Force later added a three and two free throws for 7 of his game-high 27 points to ice the win.

Szalay finished with a career-high 24 points and 12 rebounds for the Bruins, leading them to a 40-34 edge on the boards. Schmick added 12 points, and Gayman and Wadlow scored 10 each. Yeager had a game and career-high 7 assists.

In addition to Force's 27, Olinger had 14 points and Garrelts 12. Sublett grabbed 9 rebounds, and Olinger had a game-high 5 steals.

George Fox fell to 3-11 overall and 0-6 in the conference with its 8th loss in a row. The Bruins now have a historical record, in 100 seasons for which there are records, of 966-1,000-1. Willamette improved to 8-5 overall and 3-1 in the league.

The Bruins are off for a week, hosting Multnomah Bible College in their final non-conference game of the season on Tuesday, Jan. 27, at 7:30 p.m. The Bearcats host the University of Puget Sound Friday, Jan. 23, at 8:00 p.m., following a women's game at 6:00 p.m.

The Bruins began to foul in an effort to catch up, but the Boxers, defeating the Bruins for the 9th straight time, rose to the challenge at the line, and George Fox was able to get no closer than 6 points at any time thereafter.

The field goal totals were equal – 27 each – and the Bruins made 8 3-pointers to only 3 for the Boxers, but while Pacific was having a good time at the line, George Fox managed to make only 5 of 10, and therein lay the difference. Both teams had good nights from the field, Pacific hitting 51.9% (27-52) and George Fox slightly under that at 49.1% (27-55). George Fox controlled the boards 34-28 but made more turnovers, 17-10.

Mark Gayman led the home team with 18 points, and **Scott Szalay** and **Aaron Schmick** had 15 each. Szalay had 7 rebounds, while Gayman and **Brett Yeager** had 6 assists each.

In addition to Van Domelen's big game, Erin Gram scored 14 and Branden Kawazoe added 12. B.J. Anderson led the Boxers with 7 rebounds and 4 steals, while Gram had 9 assists.

George Fox dropped its 5th in a row and fell to 3-8 overall and 0-3 in the conference, while Pacific climbed to 3-6 overall and 1-1 in the league.

1/16 – LEWIS & CLARK 73, GEORGE FOX 67: Pioneers Survive Bruin Scare Behind Three-Point Barrage

PORTLAND, Ore. – Putting a major scare into Northwest Conference perennial power Lewis & Clark College, the visiting George Fox University Bruins led the powerful Pioneers with less than four minutes to play before the home team squeezed out a hard-fought 73-67 victory in men's basketball action Friday night here at the Pamplin Sports Center.

George Fox led throughout the game's first 5 minutes before the Pioneers took a 16-13 lead on a three-pointer by John Mietus, and they held the advantage to the end of the period. The lead ballooned to as much as 16 at 41-25 with 5:26 to go before the Bruins rallied behind **Scott Szalay** and **Mark Gayman**, who combined for 27 of the Bruins' 38 points in the period. Szalay had 14 points on 7-9 shooting and grabbed 7 rebounds, while Gayman parlayed a 6-6 showing at the free throw line into 13 points.

Giving the Pios a 46-38 halftime edge were 8 three-pointers in the half, including 3 by Danny Winchester, who had 14 points, while Mietus, the conference's leading scorer, had 10 in the half. The Pios made 8-19 from three-point range but only 8-20 from two-point range in the period.

Another trey by Winchester gave the Pios their largest lead of the second half at 56-45 with 16:18 to go, but the Bruins again bounced back and actually regained the lead 66-65 on a three by **Aaron Schmick** with 4:07 left. Ryan Wells answered with a corresponding three at the 3:47 mark to make it 68-66 for the Pioneers, Mietus hit two free throws at 3:01 to make it 70-66, and **Brett Yeager's** free throw for the Bruins cut it to 70-67 with 2:20 left.

The Bruins had a chance to tie the game with a minute left, but were victimized by the fact that the gym's shot clock had malfunctioned with five minutes left in the game, forcing the officials to use a stop watch and the PA system to inform teams of the time left to shoot. However, the Bruins did not hear the announcement while playing for a game-tying shot and were called for a shot-clock violation with 49 seconds left. Danny Winchester's two free throws with 19 seconds left and one by Tommy Magnuson with 9 second left clinched it.

Szalay and Gayman each finished with 19 points for the Bruins, while Gayman made it a double-double by adding a game-high 11 rebounds. The Bruins, as they have in all four of their conference games, out-rebounded their opponents, this time 44-38. **Ben Melvin** had a game-high 4 assists. The Bruins held Lewis & Clark to a 34.8 shooting percentage (23-66) and made more field goals (25-23) than the Pioneers, but were hurt by the Pios' 13 three-pointers and 13 turnovers to only 7 for the hosts.

Winchester finished with 27 points, including 6 from long range, and Mietus had a double-double with 20 points and 10 rebounds, though he was held to just 6-20 shooting from the field. Wells added 11 points.

The Bruins dipped to 3-9 overall and 0-4 in the conference while suffering their 6th straight loss. The Pioneers improved to 9-3 overall and 2-1 in the league.

1/17 – LINFIELD 92, GEORGE FOX 69: Wildcats Use 14-0 Start to Overpower Bruins for Second Time

McMINNVILLE, Ore. – Scoring 14 unanswered points in the game's first three minutes, the Linfield College Wildcats took early control and went on to a 92-69 win over their Yamhill County rivals, the George Fox University Bruins, in a Northwest Conference men's basketball game Saturday night here at Ted Wilson Gym.

After Linfield's initial outburst, the Bruins finally got on the scoreboard with three quick 3-point baskets by **Bryan Wadlow**, **Aaron Schmick**, and **Mark Gayman** to cut the deficit to 16-9. The Bruins twice got within 6 and had the ball with chances to cut it even more, but the Wildcats reasserted themselves late in the half and led by 10 at the break 45-35.

The second half belonged totally to Linfield as the Wildcats led by double digits the rest of the way. The largest gap was 28 at 81-53 with 7 minutes left. It was the second easy win by the Wildcats over the Bruins this season, the first a 105-72 win on Dec. 30 in the Cactus Jam Tournament in Phoenix, Ariz. The teams will meet a third time on Feb. 10 in Newberg for a second conference game.

Gayman led all scorers with 16 points, Schmick added 14, and Wadlow and **Scott Szalay** had 10 each. Szalay made it a double-double game with a game-high 10 rebounds, but the Bruins were out-boarded in a conference game for the first time this season, 50-37. Schmick had 6 assists, and **Brett Yeager** picked up a game-high 4 steals.

The Wildcats had six players in double figures in points: Chris Lewis and T.J. Middlesworth with 15 each, Nick Fusare and Blake Shelton with 12 apiece, and Sam Kreiger and John Broussard with 10 each. Broussard led Linfield with 9 rebounds, while Joe Neill passed out 7 assists.

The Bruins fell to 3-10 overall and 0-5 in the conference with their 7th loss in a row, while the Wildcats climbed to 8-4 and 3-0 in the league with their 8th straight win over the Bruins. It was only the 2nd time in the last 12 meetings that one of the two did not score 100 or more points.

The Bruins next face Wartburg College from Iowa, an overtime winner over Clark University of Massachusetts, on Monday at 12:15 p.m. (Mountain Time). The Roadrunners will take on Clark on Monday at 10:00 a.m. In later games Saturday, Ohio Northern University met Illinois College at 2:30 p.m. and Colorado College squared off against another Northwest Conference team, Linfield College, at 4:45 p.m.

1/9 – PUGET SOUND 107, GEORGE FOX 79: Just Your "Average" Game as Loggers Overrun Bruins

NEWBERG, Ore. – It was just your "average" Northwest Conference men's basketball game Friday night here at Miller Gym in the Wheeler Sports Center as the University of Puget Sound Loggers, averaging 107 points a game, defeated the George Fox University Bruins, averaging 79 points a game, by a score of -- 107-79!

Playing a free-wheeling helter-skelter style of basketball, the Loggers put up 37 3-pointers and sank 15 of them, forced 25 turnovers with 40 minutes of full-court pressure, and turned a game that was close after 30 minutes into a blowout in the final 10 minutes.

The Loggers led 54-46 at the break, and stretched it to 13 at 72-59 on a trey by Vincent Buehler with 14:01 left. The Bruins then scored 8 points on four baskets by four different players, and with 11:19 to play, it was only a 5-point game at 72-67. Over a 4-minute span, however, the Loggers ignited to hit 9 of 12 shots while the Bruins were missing 8 in a row and scored 21 unanswered points, taking an insurmountable 97-69 lead with 5:42 left.

For the Bruins, Mark Gayman scored 19, Ben Melvin and Chris Parker had 12 each (a career high for Parker), and Bryan Wadlow added 10. Scott Szalay had a career-high 13 rebounds as the Bruins led on the boards 41-38. Aaron Schmick had a game-high 6 assists.

Curtis Medved led a quintet of Loggers in double figures with 22 points, followed by Zack McVey with 13, Jeremy Cross and Matt Glynn with 12 each, and Chris O'Donnell with 11. Mario Mendoza was the top rebounder for UPS with 8, while Mendoza and Josh Walker had 3 assists each.

George Fox is now 3-6 overall and 0-1 in the conference after dropping its 3rd in a row, while Puget Sound is 9-1 overall, 1-0 in the league, and has won 5 straight.

The Bruins host Pacific Lutheran University while the Loggers go to Pacific University Saturday (Jan. 10), both games at 8:00 p.m. following women's games at 6:00 p.m. The Border Collies International trained dog show is scheduled for the halftime at both George Fox games Saturday.

3/2 – ALL-CONFERENCE: Gayman First Team All-Northwest Conference, Szalay Honorable Mention

NEWBERG, Ore. – Mark Gayman has been accorded First Team All-Northwest Conference honors and **Scott Szalay** received Honorable Mention for All-Conference in voting by the league's nine coaches for their performances during the 2003-04 George Fox University men's basketball season, according to a release from NWC information director Steve Flegel at Whitworth College.

Gayman became the 31st player in George Fox University history to score over 1,000 career points and now has 1,007 in his first three years. The 6-4 junior wing from Hillsboro, Ore., who was an Honorable Mention All-Conference selection last year, was a major component in the Bruins' increased competitiveness this season despite a final 7-18 overall record and 3-13 NWC mark that tied them for 7th.

Gayman ranked among the league leaders in several categories, including scoring (17.0, 4th), rebounding (8.5, 2nd), blocked shots (0.68, 11th), field goal pct. (.487, 13th), and free throw pct. (.670, 15th). He had double figures in points 23 times, seven times scoring 20 or more, and in rebounds 8 times, with 7 double-doubles. He had career highs of 28 points at Whitman on Feb. 28 and 17 rebounds vs. Whitman in the Bruins' Homecoming game on Jan. 31. He was the Bruins' leading scorer in 11 games and the top rebounder in 14.

Szalay, a 6-7 sophomore post from Everett, Wash., and a transfer from North Seattle Community College, gave the Bruins some strength inside that they have not had in several seasons. He, too, was among the league leaders in several statistics, including scoring (11.9, 18th), rebounding (7.5, 3rd), field goal pct. (.546, 8th), and blocked shots (0.92, 4th). He reached double figure in points 16 times and in rebounds 6 times, with 5 double-doubles. His season highs included 24 points vs. Willamette on Jan. 20 and 13 rebounds vs. Puget Sound on Jan. 9. He led the Bruins in scoring 3 times and in rebounds 11 times.

Wing Matt Glynn and coach Eric Bridgeland of league champion Puget Sound received the NWC's Player of the Year and Coach of the Year awards. Other First Team All-Conference choices were Bryan Depew of Whitworth, John Mietus of Lewis & Clark, David Force of Willamette, and Blake Shelton of Linfield.

2/28 – WHITMAN 72, GEORGE FOX 69: Gayman Scores 1,000th Point but Bruins End Season with Loss

WALLA WALLA, Wash. – Mark Gayman scored a career-high 28 points and became the 31st player in George Fox University men's basketball history to score over 1,000 career points, but the Bruins ended their season with another narrow defeat, this one 72-69 to the Whitman College Missionaries in a Northwest Conference contest Saturday night here at the Sherwood Center.

George Fox maintained a lead throughout most of the game, going on an 11-0 run five minutes into the game to take a 20-10 lead with 13:03 left in the first half on a 3-pointer by Bryan Wadlow. The Bruins led at the break 37-32, and went up by 10 again at 50-40 on a layup by Aaron Schmick with 14:19 to play.

The Missionaries gradually climbed back into it, however, and went ahead 65-64 on a 3-pointer by Greg Ricker with 3:41 left. The Bruins regained the lead three times after that, only to have Whitman tie it each time and finally go up for good 70-69 on a layup by Casey Nelson with 1:28 left. The Bruins missed a go-ahead 3-pointer with a minute left and made a critical turnover with 9 second to go, and Will Cale's layup with 2 seconds left sealed the win for the Missionaries.

Gayman, who also recorded a double-double with a game-high 13 rebounds, ended his junior season with 1,007 career points, 29th on the all-time list. Schmick scored 14 points and Ben Melvin added 10 with 3 assists.

Ricker led Whitman with 21 points and Nelson added 11 with a team-high 8 rebounds. The Missionaries out-rebounded the Bruins for one of the few times in conference play this season, 33-30.

George Fox ended its season 7-18 overall, the same as last year, but tripled its number of conference wins by going 3-13. Whitman finished with identical marks of 7-18 and 3-13.

2/27 – WHITWORTH 82, GEORGE FOX 66: Gayman Closes in on 1,000 Points as Bruins Fall at Whitworth

SPOKANE, Wash. – Mark Gayman moved within 21 points of becoming the 31st member of George Fox University's 1,000-point club, but his 16 points on the evening could not save the Bruins as they fell to the Whitworth College Pirates 82-66 in a Northwest Conference men's basketball game Friday night in the Whitworth Fieldhouse.

George Fox jumped to an early lead which reached six points at 11-5 on a basket by Chris Parker. The Bruins led 17-13 when the Pirates used an 11-0 run, capped by a Bryan Depew basket, to grab a 24-17 lead. Whitworth upped its advantage to 35-25 on a lay-up by Scott Bierlink before George Fox closed to within 37-31 at halftime on a basket by Gayman just before the horn.

Whitworth only led 46-44 after two free throws by Scott Szalay with just under 15 minutes to play. The Pirates' Jon Young caught fire, sinking the first of his 7 three-pointers in the half. By the time he made his 7th with 3:17 to go, Whitworth had taken a 77-58 lead.

Aaron Schmick led the Bruins with 19 points and 3 assists, Gayman totaled 16 points and 7 rebounds, and Szalay added 15 points and 6 boards. The Bruins shot well, hitting 53.2% from the field and 76.9% from the line, but were outrebounded for one of the few times this season, 30-27.

Young scored all of his game-high 23 points in the second half, draining 7 of 11 from three-point range to set a new Whitworth record for three-pointers in a season with 80 which broke the record of 79 held by Ryan Nelson. The seven treys made also tied the Pirate record for makes in a game, also held by Nelson, Gabe Jones, and Brian Myers, who originally set the record.

Nelson and Myers were each in attendance among 12 out of 14 former Pirates who scored 1,000 or more points in their careers. The 1,000-point scorers had gathered in honor of out-going senior Depew, whose 22 points gave him 2,013 for his career, the all-time high at Whitworth. Bierlink finished with 19 points and 6 assists.

George Fox is 7-17 overall and 3-12 in the conference, while Whitworth concludes its season with a 19-6 season and a 12-4 mark in NWC play.

The Bruins finish up at Whitman College on Saturday night (Feb. 28), game time at 8:00 p.m. following the women's game at 6:00 p.m.

Aaron Schmick scored 20 or more in both games as the Bruins went 1-1 on the road swing to Tacoma, earning Honorable Mention for Northwest Conference "Player of the Week" for Feb. 2-8. In a 111-92 loss at Puget Sound on Friday, he scored 20 points on 5-9 from the field (1-3 on 3's) and 9-10 from the line, with 2 rebounds, 5 assists, 1 block, and 3 steals. In an 82-72 win at Pacific Lutheran on Saturday, he scored a game-high 27 points on 6-11 from the field (4-9 on 3's) and 11-11 from the line, with 3 rebounds, 3 assists, and 2 steals. In 2 games during the week, he scored 47 points (23.5), hitting 11-20 (.550) from the field (5-12 on 3's, .417) and 20-21 (.952) from the line, with 5 rebounds (2.5), 8 assists (4.0), 1 block (0.5), and 5 steals (2.5).

NWC "Player of the Week" went to Matt Glynn of Puget Sound for leading the Loggers to sole possession of first place in the league with 52 points, 12 rebounds, and 14 assists in their 2 home wins.

*** Schmick Falls Two Free Throws Short of Bruin Record**

Aaron Schmick's 11-11 from the free throw line were instrumental in the Bruins' 82-72 win at Pacific Lutheran on Feb. 7, but his perfect night fell just short of the Bruins' best ever. Justin Paola hit 13-13 vs. Western Oregon on Feb. 12, 1994, to set the record. The George Fox record for most free throws made in a game is 16 by Kenny Stone vs. the College of Idaho (now Albertson) on Jan. 28, 1987.

*** Bruins' Win at PLU Recalls Last NWC Road Win in '01**

Continuing their fine play of the last two weeks and getting yet another "monkey" off their backs, the Bruins snapped a 23-game road losing streak in Northwest Conference play with their 82-72 win at Pacific Lutheran on Feb. 7. The Bruins' last NWC road win was a 75-73 victory at Whitworth on Jan. 6, 2001, a game in which the Bruins trailed by 23 with 17 minutes left before rallying behind Travis Melvin's 29 second-half points. It was the largest deficit a George Fox team had ever overcome on the road. The Bruins are 3-3 in their last six games, but two of those losses have been in overtime.

*** 100th Year of Bruin Basketball in 2003-04:**

The 2003-04 season marks the 100th year for which there are records in which there has been men's basketball at the institution now known as George Fox University. While the school did have basketball on the campus of then-Pacific Academy prior to the 1901-02 season, that is the first year for which there is an official record. There have been two years since then when there was no team: 1903-04, when smallpox forced cancellation of the season, and 1918-19, when an influenza outbreak wiped out the schedule. Insofar as records can be authenticated, the Bruins, counting this season's scores, have a 100-year cumulative record of 969-1,002-1 (.492).

2/6 – PUGET SOUND 111, GEORGE FOX 92: Glynn Grounds Bruins with All-Round Show for Logger Win

TACOMA, Wash. – Matt Glynn scored a game-high 35 points, grabbed 6 rebounds, and passed out a game-high 9 assists, leading the high-scoring University of Puget Sound Loggers to a 111-92 win over the George Fox University Bruins in Northwest Conference men's basketball Friday night here at Memorial Fieldhouse.

The Bruins battled the high-octane Loggers on almost even terms for the first 30 minutes, but with Puget Sound clinging to a 6-point lead and 10:30 showing on the clock, Glynn took over. In a span of 2:19, he scored a basket with an impressive stop and start move, nailed a pair of 3-pointers, and hit the back end of two foul shots. About the only thing he did wrong in the stretch was miss the front end of his trip to the line, breaking his season-high streak of 36 straight free throws made.

A Bruin timeout stopped the run, but the damage had been done, as the Loggers were up 95-80 with 8:27 to play. The Bruins would get no closer than 12 down the stretch before a final push gave the Loggers the 19-point victory.

Bryan Wadlow led a quartet of George Fox players in double figures with 21, a career high for him. Mark Gayman was also impressive from the floor, scoring 19 on 9-13 shooting and grabbing a team-high 8 rebounds. Aaron Schmick had 20 points, while Ben Melvin contributed 12 points and a team-high 5 assists. Puget Sound forced 29 Bruin turnovers on the night, however, and won the battle on the glass, 40-38, one of the few times the Bruins have not won the struggle for rebounds in a conference game this year.

Jeremy Cross and Chase Curtiss each added 14 points to Glynn's total for the Loggers. Chris O'Donnell was a rebound short of a double-double, grabbing 9 boards to go with 10 points on 4-7 shooting.

2/7 – GEORGE FOX 82, PACIFIC LUTHERAN 72: Hot Night at Charity Stripe Lifts Bruins by Lutes

TACOMA, Wash. – Burning the nets from the free throw line to the tune of 88.6%, including 7-8 in the final 1:18, the George Fox University Bruins held off the Pacific Lutheran University Lutes 82-72 in a Northwest Conference men's basketball game Saturday night here at Olson Auditorium.

George Fox scored 12 points to PLU's 2 in the final 2:32 of the first half to take a 44-37 advantage at halftime, but the Lutes battled back to tie the score at 61-61 on Hazen Hyland's jumper with 9:25 left in the game. Mark Gayman connected on a jump shot to give the Bruins back the lead, but Sudon DeSuze answered with a lay-up for a 63-63 tie. Scott Szalay made 1-2 from the line for a 64-63 George Fox lead, then DeSuze made another lay-up for a 65-64 PLU advantage with 5:59 to play.

Gayman's 3-pointer with 5:31 left regained the lead for the Bruins and ignited a 13-3 run that put the Bruins in front 75-68. DeSuze made a lay-up and Kurt Oliver sank two free throws to bring the Lutes close at 75-72 with 1:22 remaining, but George Fox made their foul shots down the stretch to secure the win.

Aaron Schmick tallied 27 points, including 11-11 from the charity stripe, to lead George Fox, while Ben Melvin chipped in 17, and Gayman and Szalay both had 13. Szalay grabbed 8 rebounds as the Bruins held a 35-27 edge on the boards, and Schmick had a team-high 3 assists. The Bruins sank 31-35 from the free throw line for the game to only 12-20 for PLU.

Drew Cardwell led the Lutes with 20 points, 6 rebounds, and 3 assists, and Jason Pasquariello scored 15.

George Fox improved to 6-13 overall and 2-8 in the conference with its first league win on the road after 23 straight setbacks. The Bruins' last NWC road win was a 75-73 decision at Whitworth College on Jan. 6, 2001, in which the team rallied from 23 points down with 17 minutes to play. Pacific Lutheran fell to 4-15 overall and 1-9 in the conference.

The Bruins return home to host Yamhill County rival Linfield College Tuesday (Feb. 10) at 8:00 p.m., following the women's clash at 6:00 p.m. The Lutes visit Whitworth Friday (Feb. 13).

2/7 – GEORGE FOX 82, PACIFIC LUTHERAN 72: Hot Night at Charity Stripe Lifts Bruins by Lutes

TACOMA, Wash. – Burning the nets from the free throw line to the tune of 88.6%, including 7-8 in the final 1:18, the George Fox University Bruins held off the Pacific Lutheran University Lutes 82-72 in a Northwest Conference men's basketball game Saturday night here at Olson Auditorium.

George Fox scored 12 points to PLU's 2 in the final 2:32 of the first half to take a 44-37 advantage at halftime, but the Lutes battled back to tie the score at 61-61 on Hazen Hyland's jumper with 9:25 left in the game. Mark Gayman connected on a jump shot to give the Bruins back the lead, but Sudon DeSuze answered with a lay-up for a 63-63 tie. Scott Szalay made 1-2 from the line for a 64-63 George Fox lead, then DeSuze made another lay-up for a 65-64 PLU advantage with 5:59 to play.

Gayman's 3-pointer with 5:31 left regained the lead for the Bruins and ignited a 13-3 run that put the Bruins in front 75-68. DeSuze made a lay-up and Kurt Oliver sank two free throws to bring the Lutes close at 75-72 with 1:22 remaining, but George Fox made their foul shots down the stretch to secure the win.

Aaron Schmick tallied 27 points, including 11-11 from the charity stripe, to lead George Fox, while Ben Melvin chipped in 17, and Gayman and Szalay both had 13. Szalay grabbed 8 rebounds as the Bruins held a 35-27 edge on the boards, and Schmick had a team-high 3 assists. The Bruins sank 31-35 from the free throw line for the game to only 12-20 for PLU.

Drew Cardwell led the Lutes with 20 points, 6 rebounds, and 3 assists, and Jason Pasquariello scored 15.

George Fox improved to 6-13 overall and 2-8 in the conference with its first league win on the road after 23 straight setbacks. The Bruins' last NWC road win was a 75-73 decision at Whitworth College on Jan. 6, 2001, in which the team rallied from 23 points down with 17 minutes to play. Pacific Lutheran fell to 4-15 overall and 1-9 in the conference.

The Bruins return home to host Yamhill County rival Linfield College Tuesday (Feb. 10) at 8:00 p.m., following the women's clash at 6:00 p.m. The Lutes visit Whitworth Friday (Feb. 13).

2/6 – PUGET SOUND 111, GEORGE FOX 92: Glynn Grounds Bruins with All-Round Show for Logger Win

TACOMA, Wash. – Matt Glynn scored a game-high 35 points, grabbed 6 rebounds, and passed out a game-high 9 assists, leading the high-scoring University of Puget Sound Loggers to a 111-92 win over the George Fox University Bruins in Northwest Conference men's basketball Friday night here at Memorial Fieldhouse.

The Bruins battled the high-octane Loggers on almost even terms for the first 30 minutes, but with Puget Sound clinging to a 6-point lead and 10:30 showing on the clock, Glynn took over. In a span of 2:19, he scored a basket with an impressive stop and start move, nailed a pair of 3-pointers, and hit the back end of two foul shots. About the only thing he did wrong in the stretch was miss the front end of his trip to the line, breaking his season-high streak of 36 straight free throws made.

A Bruin timeout stopped the run, but the damage had been done, as the Loggers were up 95-80 with 8:27 to play. The Bruins would get no closer then 12 down the stretch before a final push gave the Loggers the 19-point victory.

Bryan Wadlow led a quartet of George Fox players in double figures with 21, a career high for him. Mark Gayman was also impressive from the floor, scoring 19 on 9-13 shooting and grabbing a team-high 8 rebounds. Aaron Schmick had 20 points, while Ben Melvin contributed 12 points and a team-high 5 assists. Puget Sound forced 29 Bruin turnovers on the night, however, and won the battle on the glass, 40-38, one of the few times the Bruins have not won the struggle for rebounds in a conference game this year.

Jeremy Cross and Chase Curtiss each added 14 points to Glynn's total for the Loggers. Chris O'Donnell was a rebound short of a double-double, grabbing 9 boards to go with 10 points on 4-7 shooting.

The Bruins fell to 5-13 overall and 1-8 in the conference with the setback, while the Loggers, ranked 20th in the nation, maintained at least a share of first place with Willamette University in improving to 16-2 overall and 8-1 in the league.

George Fox visits Pacific Lutheran University while Puget Sound returns to action at home against the Boxers of Pacific University Saturday. Tip-off for both games is at 8:00, following women's games at 6:00 pm.

In a 97-66 win over Multnomah Bible on Tuesday, he had 25 points on 11-17 from the field (0-2 on 3's) and 3-4 from the line, with 12 rebounds, 2 assists, and 4 steals. In an 88-84 overtime loss to Whitworth on Friday, he had 16 points on 6-14 from the field and 4-5 from the line, with 8 rebounds, 1 assist, and 3 blocks. In a 78-71 win over Whitman on Saturday, he had 16 points on 7-13 from the field (0-1 on 3's) and 2-4 from the line, with a career-high 17 rebounds, 2 assists, 1 block, and 1 steal. For the week, in 3 games, he scored 57 points (19.0), hitting 24-44 (.545) from the field (0-3 on 3's) and 9-13 (.692) on free throws, with 37 rebounds (12.3), 5 assists, 4 blocks, and 5 steals.

*** Snake-Bit? Bruins Oh-So-Close to Winning Ledger:**

The Bruins' 5-12 record after 17 games doesn't tell the whole story of how improved the 2004 team actually is. "Sometimes I feel like we're under some sort of dark cloud; we've been so close and just can't seem to catch a break," bemoaned head coach Mark Sundquist after a tough overtime loss to a strong Whitworth team on Friday. Of the Bruins' 12 losses, 3 have been in overtime, and 3 others have been by a combined total of 10 points; reverse those misfortunes, and the Bruins could very easily be 11-6. The Bruins hope their Homecoming 78-71 victory over Whitman in another close one on Saturday signals some good things to come for the season's final 8 games.

*** 100th Year of Bruin Basketball in 2003-04:**

The 2003-04 season marks the 100th year for which there are records in which there has been men's basketball at the institution now known as George Fox University. While the school did have basketball on the campus of then-Pacific Academy prior to the 1901-02 season, that is the first year for which there is an official record. There have been two years since then when there was no team: 1903-04, when smallpox forced cancellation of the season, and 1918-19, when an influenza outbreak wiped out the schedule. Insofar as records can be authenticated, the Bruins, counting this season's scores, have a 100-year cumulative record of 968-1,001-1 (.492).

1/27 – GEORGE FOX 97, MULTNOMAH 66: Bruins Administer a Royal Thrashing to Ambassadors

NEWBERG, Ore. – Scoring 41 points in the first 10 minutes of the game, the George Fox University Bruins rushed out to a 20-point lead and never looked back en route to a 97-66 win over the visiting Multnomah Bible College Ambassadors in non-conference men's basketball Tuesday night here at Miller Gym in the Wheeler Sports Center.

The Bruins scored the game's first nine points 100 seconds into the game, took their first 10-point lead at 13-3 with 17:39 left, and Aaron Schmick nailed a 3-pointer to give the home team a 41-21 lead with 10:19 to go in the half. It was 57-34 at the break, with three Bruins already in double figures in points: Mark Gayman with 19, Schmick with 16, and Bryan Wadlow with 11.

The Ambassadors out-scored the Bruins 11-5 to start the second half, getting within 17 at 62-45 with 15:47 left on a 3-pointer by Adam Smith before the Bruins righted themselves and took off again. The Bruins twice led by as many as 36 in the final two minutes of the contest, the last at 97-61 with 1:08 left.

Gayman finished with a game-high 25 points, Schmick tallied 21, Wadlow had 16, and Ben Melvin chipped in with 13 as well as a game-high 7 assists, all in the first half. Gayman made it a double-double night, his 4th of the season and 12th of the junior's career, with a game-high 12 rebounds, leading the Bruins to a 53-37 edge on the boards, and added 4 steals.

Smith scored 18 to lead the Ambassadors, with Samuel Duke adding 15 and David Carpenter 13. Seth Manthei was the top Multnomah rebounder with 8, while Duke had 5 assists.

George Fox snapped an 8-game losing streak with the victory and improved to 4-11 in its final non-league game of the year. Multnomah slipped to 5-19.

The Bruins return to Northwest Conference action with two games on Homecoming weekend, hosting Whitworth College Friday (Jan. 30) and Whitman College Saturday (Jan. 31). Games both nights are at 8:00 p.m., following women's games at 6:00 p.m. The George Fox Sports Hall of Fame Class of 2004 will be introduced to the crowd at halftime of Friday's game, with the 2004 Homecoming Court to be presented at halftime of Saturday's game.

The Ambassadors host Columbia Bible College Friday (Jan. 30) at 7:00 p.m.

Scott Szalay (So., Everett, Wash. / North Seattle CC) had two good games as the Bruins went 0-2 in their NWC openers, earning a nomination for Northwest Conference "Player of the Week" for Jan. 5-11. In a 107-79 loss to Puget Sound on Friday, he scored only 6 points on 3-7 shooting, but grabbed a game-high 13 rebounds and had 2 assists and 4 blocked shots. In a 76-67 loss to Pacific Lutheran on Saturday, he had 15 points, hitting 6-7 from the field and 3-6 from the line, with 7 rebounds and 2 steals. For the week, in 2 games, he scored 21 points (10.5), hitting 9-14 from the field (.642) and 3-8 from the line (.375), with 20 rebounds (10.0), 2 assists, 4 blocks, and 2 steals. Szalay is among the league leaders in scoring (11.6), rebounding (7.8), field goal pct. (.549), and blocked shots (1.2).

*** Bruins Have Five in Double-Figure Scoring:**

After 9 games, all 5 George Fox starters are averaging double figures in points. Puget Sound is the only other team in the Northwest Conference with five double-figure scorers. With 667 of the Bruins' 784 points, that represents 85.1% of all the points scored by the Bruins; the bench averages only 11.7 points per game.

*** 100th Year of Bruin Basketball in 2003-04:**

The 2003-04 season marks the 100th year for which there are records in which there has been men's basketball at the institution now known as George Fox University. While the school did have basketball on the campus of then-Pacific Academy prior to the 1901-02 season, that is the first year for which there is an official record. There have been two years since then when there was no team: 1903-04, when smallpox forced cancellation

of the season, and 1918-19, when an influenza outbreak wiped out the schedule. Insofar as records can be authenticated, the Bruins, counting this season's scores, have a 100-year cumulative record of 966-996-1 (.492).

1/9 – PUGET SOUND 107, GEORGE FOX 79: Just Your “Average” Game as Loggers Overrun Bruins

NEWBERG, Ore. – It was just your “average” Northwest Conference men's basketball game Friday night here at Miller Gym in the Wheeler Sports Center as the University of Puget Sound Loggers, averaging 107 points a game, defeated the George Fox University Bruins, averaging 79 points a game, by a score of -- 107-79!

Playing a free-wheeling helter-skelter style of basketball, the Loggers put up 37 3-pointers and sank 15 of them, forced 25 turnovers with 40 minutes of full-court pressure, and turned a game that was close after 30 minutes into a blowout in the final 10 minutes.

The Loggers led 54-46 at the break, and stretched it to 13 at 72-59 on a trey by Vincent Buehler with 14:01 left. The Bruins then scored 8 points on four baskets by four different players, and with 11:19 to play, it was only a 5-point game at 72-67. Over a 4-minute span, however, the Loggers ignited to hit 9 of 12 shots while the Bruins were missing 8 in a row and scored 21 unanswered points, taking an insurmountable 97-69 lead with 5:42 left.

For the Bruins, Mark Gayman scored 19, Ben Melvin and Chris Parker had 12 each (a career high for Parker), and Bryan Wadlow added 10. Scott Szalay had a career-high 13 rebounds as the Bruins led on the boards 41-38. Aaron Schmick had a game-high 6 assists.

Curtis Medved led a quintet of Loggers in double figures with 22 points, followed by Zack McVey with 13, Jeremy Cross and Matt Glynn with 12 each, and Chris O'Donnell with 11. Mario Mendoza was the top rebounder for UPS with 8, while Mendoza and Josh Walker had 3 assists each.

George Fox is now 3-6 overall and 0-1 in the conference after dropping its 3rd in a row, while Puget Sound is 9-1 overall, 1-0 in the league, and has won 5 straight.

1/10 – PACIFIC LUTHERAN 76, GEORGE FOX 67: Return of Anderson Enables Lutes to Overcome Bruins

NEWBERG, Ore. – Jonathan Anderson, playing in just his third game with Pacific Lutheran University after regaining his eligibility after Christmas, poured in 24 points, leading the Lutes past the George Fox University Bruins 76-67 in Northwest Conference men's basketball Saturday night here at Miller Gym in the Wheeler Sports Center.

The Bruins and Lutes exchanged leads four times in the first six minutes of the game, George Fox taking its final lead at 11-10 with 13:55 left in the half on a jumper by Mark Gayman. PLU then ran off 9 unanswered points to take a 19-11 lead on an Anderson layup at the 9:32 mark, and the Lutes never trailed again. It was 32-25 PLU at the half, and the Lutes maintained a lead between 7 and 16 points the rest of the way.

George Fox entered the game with all five of its starters averaging in double figures, and they all did it again, combining for 64 of the Bruins' 67 points. Scott Szalay and Ben Melvin had 15 each, Aaron Schmick scored

14, and Gayman and Bryan Wadlow had 10 apiece. Gayman grabbed 8 rebounds as the Bruins maintained a slight edge on the boards, 37-36, and Schmick had 3 assists.

Anderson, the Lutes' leading scorer last year, got help from Drew Cardwell with 18 points. Michael Jacobs came off the bench to pull down a team-high 8 rebounds, and Hazen Hyland passed out 9 assists.

George Fox dipped to 3-7 overall and 0-2 in the conference, while Pacific Lutheran climbed to 4-7 overall and 1-1 in the league.

Aaron Schmick (So., Hillsboro, Ore. / Century HS) played perhaps the finest game of his career in the Bruins' 95-94 double-overtime loss at Northwest on Saturday, earning Honorable Mention for Northwest Conference "Player of the Week" for Dec. 8-14. He scored a career-high 29 points, hitting 9-18 from field, including 7-11 from 3-point range, and 4-4 from the line. He hit a 30-foot 3-pointer at the end of regulation to send the game into overtime, and hit another trey with 16 seconds left in the second overtime that gave the Bruins a 94-92 lead before they lost on a 3-pointer with 6 seconds left. He also had 5 rebounds and 2 assists in 46 minutes of playing time.

NWC "Player of the Week" went to John Mietus of Lewis & Clark for the 2nd straight week after he had his 6th double-double in 7 games with 34 points, 12 rebounds, 2 blocks, 2 steals and 2 assists in a win over Cascade.

*** Bruins Have Five in Double-Figure Scoring:**

When George Fox point guard Ben Melvin (So., Pleasant Hill, Ore. / Pleasant Hill HS) scored 16 points at Northwest on Dec. 13, he became the 5th Bruin to reach double figures in points per game scoring average for the season. The University of Puget Sound is the only other team in the Northwest Conference with five double-figure scorers, and the Loggers are running away with the league scoring title thus far, averaging 108.3 ppg to 83.6 for the runner-up Bruins. The Bruins' "big five", their scoring averages, and where they rank in the league through Dec. 13: Mark Gayman (Jr., Hillsboro, Ore. / Glencoe HS) - 20.6 (3rd), Aaron Schmick - 18.2 (4th), Scott Szalay (So., Everett, Wash. / North Seattle CC) - 13.8 (9th), Bryan Wadlow (Sr., Albany, Ore. / West Albany HS) - 11.2 (18th), Ben Melvin - 11.0 (22nd).

*** 100th Year of Bruin Basketball in 2003-04:**

The 2003-04 season marks the 100th year for which there are records in which there has been men's basketball at the institution now known as George Fox University. While the school did have basketball on the campus of then-Pacific Academy prior to the 1901-02 season, that is the first year for which there is an official record. There have been two years since then when there was no team: 1903-04, when smallpox forced cancellation of the season, and 1918-19, when an influenza outbreak wiped out the schedule. Insofar as records can be authenticated, the Bruins, counting this season's scores, have a 100-year cumulative record of 965-992-1.

12/13 - NORTHWEST 95, GEORGE FOX 94: Eagles Nip Bruins in Double OT on Late Three (Again!)

KIRKLAND, Wash. - For the second time this season, a three-point field goal in the waning seconds, this one in the second overtime, enabled the Northwest College Eagles to pull out a 95-94 heart-stopper over the George Fox University Bruins in a non-conference men's basketball game Saturday night here at the Northwest Pavilion.

In the Bruins' season opener on Nov. 21, it was a three-pointer by Patrick Hillis with 2.5 seconds that sank the Bruins 89-88. This time, it was Andrew Gard who connected with 6 seconds left, overcoming a three-pointer by the Bruins' **Aaron Schmick** that had given the visitors at 94-92 lead with 16 seconds to play.

Northwest raced out to a 10-0 lead to start the game and stretched it to 16 at 26-10 before settling for a 36-25 lead at the break. The Bruins trailed by 17 at 50-33 with 13:30 to play when they began their comeback, closing within one at 70-69 on a goal by **Scott Szalay** with 12 seconds left. Joel Wildeboer hit a pair of free throws with 6 seconds left for a 72-69 Northwest lead, but Schmick connected on a three-pointer to send the game into overtime as the clock expired.

Each team scored 10 points in the first overtime, sending it to a second one knotted at 82-82. In the second overtime, unanswered baskets by **Ben Melvin** and **Mark Gayman** and Schmick's three in the final two minutes managed to rally the Bruins from a 92-87 deficit to a 94-92 lead, setting up Gard's late heroics.

Schmick finished with 29 points, a new career high, that included 7 3's, while Gayman added 20. Melvin and **Bryan Wadlow** had 16 apiece, Melvin establishing a new career high. Wadlow with 9 rebounds and Gayman with 8 enabled the Bruins to play almost evenly on the boards, trailing only 39-38. Melvin had 9 assists.

Northwest had 6 players in double figures, led by Wildeboer with 18. He was followed by Gard with 16, Grant Enloe and Aaron Sawyer with 15 each, Tyson Dodd with 13, and Hillis with 10. Dodd led the Eagles with 8 rebounds, while Hillis and Gard had 8 assists apiece.

The Bruins dipped to 2-3 with the setback, while the Eagles evened their season record at 6-6.

12/13 – NORTHWEST 95, GEORGE FOX 94: Eagles Nip Bruins in Double OT on Late Three (Again!)

KIRKLAND, Wash. – For the second time this season, a three-point field goal in the waning seconds, this one in the second overtime, enabled the Northwest College Eagles to pull out a 95-94 heart-stopper over the George Fox University Bruins in a non-conference men's basketball game Saturday night here at the Northwest Pavilion.

In the Bruins' season opener on Nov. 21, it was a three-pointer by Patrick Hillis with 2.5 seconds that sank the Bruins 89-88. This time, it was Andrew Gard who connected with 6 seconds left, overcoming a three-pointer by the Bruins' Aaron Schmick that had given the visitors at 94-92 lead with 16 seconds to play.

Northwest raced out to a 10-0 lead to start the game and stretched it to 16 at 26-10 before settling for a 36-25 lead at the break. The Bruins trailed by 17 at 50-33 with 13:30 to play when they began their comeback, closing within one at 70-69 on a goal by Scott Szalay with 12 seconds left. Joel Wildeboer hit a pair of free throws with 6 seconds left for a 72-69 Northwest lead, but Schmick connected on a three-pointer to send the game into overtime as the clock expired.

Each team scored 10 points in the first overtime, sending it to a second one knotted at 82-82. In the second overtime, unanswered baskets by Ben Melvin and Mark Gayman and Schmick's three in the final two minutes managed to rally the Bruins from a 92-87 deficit to a 94-92 lead, setting up Gard's late heroics.

Schmick finished with 29 points, a new career high, that included 7 3's, while Gayman added 20. Melvin and Bryan Wadlow had 16 apiece, Melvin establishing a new career high. Wadlow with 9 rebounds and Gayman with 8 enabled the Bruins to play almost evenly on the boards, trailing only 39-38. Melvin had 9 assists.

Northwest had 6 players in double figures, led by Wildeboer with 18. He was followed by Gard with 16, Grant Enloe and Aaron Sawyer with 15 each, Tyson Dodd with 13, and Hillis with 10. Dodd led the Eagles with 8 rebounds, while Hillis and Gard had 8 assists apiece.

The Bruins dipped to 2-3 with the setback, while the Eagles evened their season record at 6-6.

George Fox next goes against Ramapo College in the opening round of the Cactus Jam Tournament at Phoenix College in Phoenix, Ariz., on Saturday, Dec. 27, at 12:15 p.m. The Bruins will also play the following Monday and Tuesday. Northwest takes on Cascade Collegiate Conference foe Albertson College Friday, Dec. 19, at 7:30 p.m. in Caldwell, Idaho.

*** Gayman Named NWC "Player of the Week":**

Mark Gayman (Jr., W, Hillsboro, Ore. / Glencoe HS) led the Bruins to their first victory of the season, an 87-82 win at home over Warner Pacific on Tuesday in their only game of the week, earning Northwest Conference "Player of the Week" honors for Nov. 24-30. Against the Knights, he scored 25 points, hitting 11-16 (.688) from the field and 3-5 (.600) from the line, with 13 rebounds, 3 assists, and 1 steal. It was the 9th double-double in points and rebounds of his career. The big game vaulted him into the NWC lead in scoring average (24.5 ppg). He also ranks 1st in blocked shots (2.00 bspg), is 3rd in rebounding (.5 rpg), field goal pct. (.704), and steals (2.00 spg, and is 5th in 3-point field goal pct. (.667). He was an Honorable Mention All-Conference player and won NWC Player of the Week once last year.

*** 100th Year of Bruin Basketball in 2003-04:**

The 2003-04 season marks the 100th year in which there has been men's basketball at the institution now known as George Fox University. The first year that the school sponsored a team was the 1901-02 season, but there were two years since then when there was no team: 1903-04, when smallpox forced cancellation of the season, and 1918-19, when an influenza outbreak wiped out the schedule. Insofar as records can be authenticated, the Bruins, counting this season's scores, have a 100-year cumulative record of 964-990-1.

*** Bruins on the Rebound:**

With a 47-29 edge in rebounds in their 87-82 win over Warner Pacific on Nov. 25, the George Fox Bruins took over the Northwest Conference lead in rebound margin with a +3.0 differential (41.0 to 38.0). George Fox coach Mark Sundquist chuckled and said, "I knew we'd be a better rebounding team this year, but not THAT good! Take a look at it now; you may not see it again for a long time, despite our definite improvement."

Gayman finished with 25 points and 13 rebounds for the Bruins, the 9th double-double of his career, while Szalay posted his first with 15 points and 11 rebounds. Schmick added 19 points and Wadlow totaled 10, while **Ben Melvin** handed out 7 assists.

Hoover had a game-high 27 for the Knights, with Wesley Powers adding 12, Lamar Tillman 11, and Kyle Wheeler 10. Wheeler had 8 rebounds and Nick Hudson passed out 3 assists.

The Bruins shot 50.8% for the game (33-65), including 55.2% (16-29) in the second half, and made 80.0% (16-20) on free throws. The Knights were hot in the first half, hitting 53.1% (17-32), but cooled considerably in the second half, making only 29.0% (9-31). *** Gayman Honorable Mention for NWC "Player of the Week":**

Mark Gayman (Jr., W. Hillsboro, Ore. / Glencoe HS) scored the Bruins' first 7 points of the game, 13 in the first half, and 24 in all, in the Bruins' season-opening 89-88 loss to Northwest at home on Nov. 21, earning Honorable Mention for Northwest Conference "Player of the Week". *** 100th Year of Bruin Basketball in 2003-04:**

The 2003-04 season marks the 100th year in which there has been men's basketball at the institution now known as George Fox University. The first year that the school sponsored a team was the 1901-02 season, but there were two years since then when there was no team: 1903-04, when smallpox forced cancellation of the season, and 1918-19, when an influenza outbreak wiped out the schedule. Insofar as records can be authenticated, the Bruins, counting this season's scores, have a 100-year cumulative record of 963-990-1.

*** Hot Hands All Around:**

The final 10 minutes of the George Fox-Northwest game on Nov. 21 saw both teams blistering the nets. The Bruins scored 25 points in the final quarter of the game, a pace that would have resulted in 100 points for an entire game – but the Eagles were even hotter. After scoring only 47 points in the first 30 minutes, the visitors from Kirkland, Wash., scorched the cords for 42 points and pulled out an 89-88 win.

"They just couldn't miss," admitted Bruin coach Mark Sundquist, pointing to the Eagles' 8 2nd-half 3-pointers, 5 in the final 3 minutes. The Bruins open the 2003-04 season at home in the Wheeler Sports Center / Miller Gym against the Northwest Eagles from Kirkland, Wash ... Northwest is an NAIA school in the Cascade Collegiate Conference and affiliated with the Assemblies of God ... The Eagles are 2-2 in the early going, all on the road, and play at Western Washington on Nov. 17 before visiting Newberg ... The Bruins are 4-2 vs. Northwest (4-2 home, 6-2 road) ... The teams last met during the 2001-02 season, with Northwest winning in Newberg 93-78 before the Bruin returned the favor in Kirkland, winning 79-65 ... The Eagles' lineup features a pair of 6-9 post players, Jon Tipps and Brian McCormack, the latter who played his freshman year at Division I Lamar ... The Eagles next play at Pacific on Saturday, Nov. 22, at 7:30 p.m. ... The Bruins host Warner Pacific on Tuesday, Nov. 25, at 7:30 p.m.

COACH MARK SUNDQUIST (Seattle Pacific '89) is 20-54 (.270) in his 4th season as a men's basketball head coach, all at George Fox. He was the boys' basketball coach at Woodburn (Ore.) High for two years and at Newberg (Ore.) High for a year before taking the George Fox position. Against this week's opponent, he is 1-2 vs. Northwest (0-1 home, 1-1 road).

George Fox University 2003-04 Men's Basketball Preview ---

BRUINS EXPECT TO BE MORE COMPETITIVE IN '03-04 WITH MORE HEIGHT AND MORE SIZE

NEWBERG, Ore. --- Things are looking up for the George Fox University men's basketball program in 2003-04 – literally.

"This will be the biggest team since I've been here," said head coach **Mark Sundquist**, who enters his fourth season with the Bruins. "I like our front line; we've added some bigger bodies, a little more height and a little more size. Rebounding has been our Achilles' heel, but now I think we'll be able to rebound with anybody in our league."

If that holds true, the Bruins just might begin to rebound record-wise after going 20-54 in Sundquist's first three seasons with lineups that were decidedly-mismatched, size-wise, against almost all their opponents.

Six Returnees Provide Experience

Six letterwinners return from last year's squad that went 7-18 overall and finished 9th in the Northwest Conference with a 1-15 league mark. That group will provide much-needed experience, but as Sundquist points out, "I still consider us a young team - we're young in age, old in experience!"

Leading the returnees is Honorable Mention All-Conference wing **Mark Gayman (6-4, Jr., Hillsboro, Ore. / Glencoe HS)**, who ranked 7th in the league in scoring (15.7) and 6th in rebounding (7.1).

"The biggest change this season could be having Gayman in a different role," says Sundquist. "Mark often had to play post for us last year and teams keyed on him, but with our larger size this year, we can move him to a true wing position. We won't be as reliant on him alone as we were last year, so there won't be as much pressure on him. He may not get as many points or rebounds as last year, but having him at his more natural position will make us better team-wise, and he has accepted that role as best for the team."

The team's only two seniors, **Bryan Wadlow (6-4, Sr., Albany, Ore. / West Albany HS)** and **Brett Yeager (6-3, Sr., Oakridge, Ore. / Oakridge HS)** are also predominantly wing players who have been known to mix it up inside as well. Wadlow averaged 8.6 points and 3.4 rebounds a game, Yeager 6.7 points and 4.0 rebounds, and both will be counted on to take up some of the scoring slack vacated by Nate Tyler, the team's No. 2 scorer (12.8 ppg) who did not return for his senior season due to financial constraints.

"Bryan and Brett stuck with the program through some lean years, and now they're about ready to reap the benefits of a better team," predicts Sundquist. "I expect them both to play a lot and provide us with some outstanding senior leadership."

Aaron Schmick (5-11, So., Hillsboro, Ore. / Century HS) takes over at a shooting guard after averaging 10.0 points a game, 22nd in the NWC, and shooting .503, 9th in the league, off the bench. "Aaron has been terrific in the pre-season," notes Sundquist, "and should continue to be one of the better shooters in the conference this year with his range, ability, and consistency."

Schmick can also run the point, although one of the team's most improved players, **Ben Melvin (6-1, So., Pleasant Hill, Ore. / Pleasant Hill HS)** will be the likely starter there. He replaces Trevor Person, who led the league in assist/turnover ratio (1.71) and was 3rd in assists (4.44) as a freshman but was unable to return, again for financial reasons.

"Ben really hit the weights hard during the summer, has come back stronger, and is gaining confidence every day," Sundquist remarks. "Trevor did an outstanding job at point in protecting the ball and getting it to the open man, but Ben is actually quicker than Trevor and I am confident that he will do a fine job for us."

Rounding out the list of returnees is **Mark Johnson (5-11, So., Tonasket, Wash. / Tonasket HS)**, who averaged 0.8 points a game in 10 appearances and will provide some quality backup minutes at either wing or point.

Sizeable Newcomers to Help on Boards

It is the newcomers who supply Sundquist with his growing optimism about this year's Bruins. Tops on the list is **Scott Szalay (6-7, So., Everett, Wash. / Kamiak HS)**, a transfer from North Seattle Community College, whose 220-pound bulk should enable him to hold his own among the better rebounders in the league.

"Scott can run the floor, he's a great passer and free throw shooter, and he has the ability to be a very good player for us," says Sundquist. "He is also a smart player who will provide us with some good inside defense."

Chris Parker (6-6, Fr., Aloha, Ore. Aloha HS) is a fundamentally-sound player who "worked harder than anyone else on the team, according to his high school coach," Sundquist comments. "He's trying hard to add some muscle (Parker is 178 pounds), and we'll get him in the weight room next summer, but he should give us some good inside play off the bench even this year."

Ryan Rockwood (6-5, Fr., Silverlake, Wash. / Toutle Lake HS) is another strong 220-pounder with loads of potential. Says Sundquist, "Like Parker, his upside is huge; he has a good mind for the game, and just needs experience."

Providing depth will be wings **Matt Hagen (6-4, Fr., Chewelah, Wash. / Jenkins HS)** and **Jordan Gama (6-3, Fr., Troutdale, Ore. / Corbett HS)**. Hagen is a fine shooter who "just needs experience", notes Sundquist, while Gama, who was invited to try out for the team after being spotted in intramurals, is "a good athlete and a great kid, a team-oriented guy who will see minutes here and there."

Summary

"Our versatility could cause other teams some matchup problems this year," comments Sundquist. "We have post players who can also play on the perimeter if we're up against a bigger lineup, or they can post up against smaller teams. Hey, when was the last time we talked about some teams actually being smaller than us?"

"We are also trying to become a better defensive team than in the past, and that's what we concentrated on this fall. Last year, we were among the top four or five teams in scoring, but we were dead last in defense, and we want to change that this year."

"Offensively, we are fairly athletic, so we would like to continue to play an up-tempo style. But I think we'll be versatile enough to adjust to whatever the defense throws at us."

The season commences for the Bruins on Nov. 21 with a home contest against Northwest College of Kirkland, Wash., at 7:00 p.m. in the Wheeler Sports Center's Miller Gym. The Bruins, who were picked to finish 9th in the Northwest Conference but aim to surprise, will play their usual slate of 16 league games, as well as two tournaments: the Concordia University-Portland Tournament on Dec. 5-6, and the Cactus Jam, featuring eight Division III teams, in Phoenix, Ariz., on Dec. 27-30.

11/17 – NWC POLL: Bruins Hope to Surprise After Being Picked 9th in NWC Pre-Season Coaches' Poll

SPOKANE, Wash. – After recruiting some increased height and size for his lineup, **George Fox University** coach **Mark Sundquist** expects the Bruins to confound the predictions and finish higher than the 9th-place finish they are tabbed for in the 2003-04 pre-season Northwest Conference men's basketball poll as voted on by the league's nine coaches.

Whitworth College, the 2002-03 conference champion, is forecast to repeat its title after picking up 5 first-place votes and 81 total points to finish ahead of the University of Puget Sound in the poll. The Pirates only return two starters from last season, but one of those is 2003 NWC Player of the Year and three-time first team All-NWC forward Bryan Depew. Last season's title was the Pirates' first since 1998, and 2003 NWC Coach of the Year Jim Hayford's first at Whitworth.

Puget Sound picked up 3 first-place votes and 69 points in the poll. The Loggers anticipate making a big jump up the standings from last season's 6th-place tie with the return of all five starters, including Second Team All-NWC guard Matt Glynn.

Lewis & Clark College, which finished 3rd in the conference last season, is 3rd in the poll with 56 points and the final first-place vote. Senior All-NWC guard Danny Winchester returns, as well as 2002 First Team All-NWC forward John Mietus, who studied abroad last season.

Pacific University surprised many last season by finishing 5th in the NWC with an 8-8 record after getting picked to finish 8th. The Boxers finished 4th in this season's poll with 54 points. Three starters, including honorable mention All-NWC guard Erin Gram, return.

Linfield College finished 5th in the poll with 45 points. The Wildcats hope for a full season of health from guard O.J. Gully, who was a Second Team All-NWC selection last season despite battling persistent injuries.

Willamette University, last season's runner-up, finished 6th in the poll with 43 points. The Bearcats must replace a pair of First Team All-NWC honorees (Marques Johnson and Ryan Hepp), but will get help from senior wing Miles Sandgathe, a Second Team All-NWC pick in 2003.

Pacific Lutheran University (31) was 7th in the poll, followed by Whitman College (23) 8th and George Fox (12) 9th.

The Bruins have three returning starters, led by Honorable Mention All-Conference wing **Mark Gayman**, who averaged 15.7 points, 7th in the league, and 7.1 rebounds, 6th in the league. Also back are starting wings **Bryan Wadlow** (8.6 ppg) and **Brett Yeager** (6.7 ppg), as well as sharp-shooting guard **Aaron Schmick**, who is expected to move into the starting lineup after averaging 10.0 ppg off the bench. The Bruins have five new faces, including 6-7 juco transfer **Scott Szalay**, who should help immensely with the Bruins' rebounding game, a lack of size being a problem that has plagued the team for the last few years.

This season, for the first time, the Northwest Conference will not use a conference tournament to decide the automatic (Pool A) bid to the NCAA tournament. That bid will go to the conference champion and winner of the regular season.
