The Arusha Accord embodies the basic principle of
power-sharing which will facilitate national reconciliation
in Rwanda.

The implementation plan may have to be changed to reflect
considerable change in circumstances since August 1993 when
the accord was signed. How that plan changes is a lesson for the
parties in Rwanda to make.

We continue to urge all parties in Rwanda to find
a means to implement the principle of the Arusha Accord
in order to bring about national reconciliation.
