Elliott Hood River, Oregon. Graduate of Pacific College and Smith College School of Social work, sister of Paul and Mead Elliott, wife of physician, social worker.

Ralph W. Hester, U.S. Weather Bureau, ceattle, Washington. Son of Dr. Thomas W. Hester who was long president of Pacific College board, graduate of Pacific College, former teacher, now years in U.S. Govt. work.
