27 Feb 93 Kampala 1485 U.S. Meeting with RPF  
Military Commander

7. Stated in clear terms that RPF believes the apparent U.S. inaction and silence in Jan 93 in the face of Haby's disavowal and denunciations of 7 January protocols and MRND + CDR Massamu's flouting and opposition in Kigali encouraged Haby in his intransigence and violence

8. Failure to maintain an observer in Kigali led many Rwandan to fear that U.S. had withdrawn from Peace Process  
demanded intentional killing, burning, curfew - use of Ugandan military equipment  
wants negotiated settlement but would resume control operation if required did not demand French withdrawal content with NAM 66 but does not object to UN monitors

1. PM requests U.S. assistance to persuade RPF to accept the principles of non exclusion and reconciliation for the formation of the next govt meaning he is now prepared to accept entrance of CDR

2. reject at party mtg Dec. 20

asked Cohen Dec 31 to help persuade RPF to accept CDR

8. We should reiterate to RPF <sup>recommendations of</sup> Cohen to Kanyangire that next govt should be non exclusionary & key purposes in national reconciliation date/1/94

Amshahy Talks Deadlocked on CDR issue

- Tanzanians will suspend discussion January 6 if No agreement by the RPF adamant in its refusal to include CDR
- 3. Govt. no agreement can work if significant forces are excluded from participation
- 4. RPF hinted privately that they would be willing to accept CDR part in T A provided CDR pressure reduce sectarianism etc.
- 7. Govt accept our thesis that <sup>however</sup> no settlement unpalatable. Re CDR may be, no settlement will work if they are kept outwards
