## Contributors

Professor of Religion and chairman of the department at St. Lawrence University, Canton, N. Y., *J. Calvin Keene* was graduated from Lebanon Valley College and received his doctorate from Yale. A member of Florida Avenue Friends Meeting, Washington, D. C., he has taught abroad at Izmir, Turkey, and Beirut, Lebanon, and in this country at Colgate University and for fifteen years at Howard University before moving to his present post in 1958. Editor of one book and author of *Meditations on the Gospels*, he currently serves as editor of *The Journal of Religious Thought*. He has been a member of the Steering Committee of the Quaker Theological Discussion Group since 1958, and served for five years as the first editor of *Quaker Religious Thought*.

Born and reared in Dayton, Kentucky, *John R. Yungblut* is currently director of program at Quaker House in Atlanta, Ga. He received his B. A. from Harvard College, studied one year at Harvard Divinity School, and received his B. D. degree from Episcopal Theological School in Cambridge, Mass. After twenty years in the ministry of the Episcopal Church, he is now a member of the Religious Society of Friends. The chairman of the National Conference of Friends on Race Relations, he will presently go to England and South Africa on a special mission for the Friends World Committee.

Probably more than any other person, *Lewis Benson*, of Brielle, N. J., has been the chief prophetic exponent and guiding spirit of the Christ-centered Quaker theological concern to which this journal gives voice. A world authority on George Fox and the early Friends, Lewis Benson spends most of his time in Quaker research. He is a member of Manasquan, N. J., Meeting, and a frequent contributor to these pages.

*T. Vail Palmer, Jr.*, the author of a previous lead article in this journal, is now teaching Religion and Philosophy at Kentucky Wesleyan College, Owensboro, Ky. Recently he received his Ph. D. in Social Ethics from the University of Chicago. Vail and his wife Candida have been active members of the Quaker Theological Discussion Group, and he is now a member of its executive committee, serving as treasurer and circulation manager. He and his family are members of Philadelphia, Pa., Monthly Meeting.
