*Paul A. Lacey* is associate professor of English at Earlham College and lecturer in religion and the arts at the Earlham School of Religion. He received his Ph. D. from Harvard this June. He is the Friends World Committee, American Section's representative to the Christian Peace Conference, which meets in Prague, and a member of the executive committee of the American Committee for the C. P. C. He is editor of the *Earlham Review* and contributing editor of *Religious Theatre*. This summer he will direct and teach in Earlham's "Upward Bound" program in compensatory education for high school students.

*Chris Downing* is assistant professor of Religion at Douglas College of Rutgers University. A Swarthmore graduate, she received the Ph.
