Book Reviews



Tozer, A. W. (2013). *The essential Tozer collection: The pursuit of God, The purpose of man, The crucified life*. Minneapolis, MN: Bethany House. 220 pp. \$15.99. ISBN 9780764218910

The *Essential Tozer Collection* consists of three definitive books of A. W. Tozer in the order in which he wrote them: *The Pursuit of God*, *The Purpose of Man*, and *The Crucified Life*. This volume was compiled and edited by James L. Snyder, the author of *The Life of A. W. Tozer: In Pursuit of God*, and includes a 19 page biography of Tozer. There are a total of 43 chapters in these three books, and Snyder suggests reading one chapter each day slowly and meditatively in order to understand Tozer and appreciate his passion for God (p. 12).

The Pursuit of God is the beginning of the believer's journey. *The Divine Conquest* shows God taking residence in the believer. *The Knowledge of the Holy* encourages the reader to begin the practice of reverent meditation on the being of God (p. 13). Together these three titles will provide a good introduction to A. W. Tozer and good material for the spiritual growth of believers.
