Eugene F. Roof has been Associate Professor of Old Testament at Earlham School of Religion since 1970. A graduate of Manchester College and of Bethany Theological Seminary, he received his Ph. D. from Claremont Graduate School. An ordained minister in the Church of the Brethren, he has served in the pastoral ministry in Fort Wayne and Delphi, Indiana, Baltimore, Maryland, and Elizabethtown, Penna. He has been moderator of the Richmond, Indiana, Church of the Brethren and Secretary of the Ministry Commission of the South/Central District of the Church of the Brethren. He is author of a number of books and articles in professional and church publications.

Douglas Gwyn is pastoral minister of First Friends Church, Noblesville, Ind. He is a graduate of Union Theological Seminary, New York City, where he specialized in Old Testament studies. Since 1975 he has been carrying responsibility for the promotion of *Quaker Religious Thought*.

Arthur O. Roberts has taught philosophy and religion at George Fox College since 1953. From 1968 to 1972 he was Dean of Faculty at George Fox College, and since 1972 he has served there as Charles Replogle Memorial Professor. He is a recorded minister in Northwest Yearly Meeting of Friends and a member of the Executive Committee of the Quaker Theological Discussion Group and of the national Faith and Life panel. He is the author of several books, including *Through Flaming Sword: A Spiritual Biography of George Fox*. He is co-editor (with Hugh Barbour) of *Early Quaker Writings: 1650-1700*. His most recent book, *The Quakers in Alaska*, is to be published in 1977.
