Book Reviews



Gilden, L. (2018). *Articles, articles, articles!* Friendswood, Texas: Bold Vision Books. 188 pp. \$14.99. ISBN 9781946708182

If you are considering writing and publishing articles and want to learn more about the process, *Articles, Articles, Articles!* by Linda Gilden is a practical and encouraging resource that would be a good starting point. Linda Gilden is a writer, speaker and editor who has been working in the publishing world for many years and in her book, she draws on that experience by providing the reader with clear and concise steps and examples on how to get started and maintain a successful and profitable career. This book can be used as a reference guide for new or seasoned writers who want to refine their writing and publishing skills.

Articles, Articles, Articles! is clearly divided into chapters, which guide the reader chronologically from start to finish on the process of researching, writing, publishing and marketing articles. There is also a chapter on copyright, which explains the basics on the subject and provides useful links on where to search for more information. This could be especially helpful to new writers who may have many questions about copyright, copyright infringement and plagiarism. The author also provides tips on how to “write tightly” in order to make sure every word counts in your publication and offers sample emails and letters which the reader can actually use to contact editors and publishing companies. Gilden also draws on the expertise of others in the field with her “Expert Word” sections, which are strategically placed throughout the book. In these sections, Gilden provides helpful tips, advice and commentary from other authors, editors and professionals in the field. Overall, I found this book to be informative and user-friendly. The author clearly explains the process of writing and publishing articles and encourages her readers to immerse themselves into the world of articles. I would recommend this book for personal and public library collections.
