Stephen Allott, Irish by birth, is Keeper of the Friends Meeting at 12 Jesus Lane, Cambridge, England, and was until recently Editor of *The Friends' Quarterly*.

An evangelical Friends minister, Dorlan Bales is a member of the Ministry Team at University Friends Church, Wichita, KS.

Hugh S. Barbour is Professor of Religion at Earlham College and teaches Quakerism at the Earlham School of Religion, Richmond, IN.

A founder of both the Earlham School of Religion and the Quaker Theological Discussion Group, Wilmer A. Cooper retired two years ago but keeps his hand in at teaching and editing.
