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## Wegley's "No true justice" (book review)

While this book is the second of a series, it can be read as a standalone novel. The main character, Jemma Saint, finds herself on the run from rogue FBI agents who wish to silence her. She meets a reporter, Lex James, who is well known for publishing the truth no matter the circumstances. With his help and the help of his genius four-year-old twin nephews, Jemma is able to eventually defeat the rogue government forces against her and prove the treason they were attempting to commit. The author does bring in a character from one of his previous novels, K. C. Daniels, which provokes interest in why no one would want to mess with her. This ties in a different series from this author to this book and makes the reader want to read her story. *No True Justice* is Christian romantic suspense in its purest form. The main characters fall in love with each other within hours of meeting under very trying circumstances. However, much of the action is difficult to believe especially with four-year-old Josh and Caleb being able to outwit the FBI no matter how smart they prove themselves to be in this book as well as the FBI being able to blow things up without the local police asking any questions. The misuse of a southern colloquialism was noticeable to this southern reader but it did not detract any from the story. It is a clean fast read that is fun and does not require deep thought.
