JEAN BENNINGHOFF is a member of New York Yearly Meeting Ministry and Counsel Coordinating Committee. In 1986, following a career as a professor of physics, she earned a master of divinity degree from Union Theological Seminary.

WILMER COOPER is dean emeritus of Earlham School of Religion, and the author of *A Living Faith: An Historical Study of Quaker Beliefs* (FUP, 1990). He was one of the founders of the Quaker Theological Discussion Group, and is a frequent contributor to *QRT*.

ROBERT HESS taught philosophy and religion at Malone College. Beginning in 1952 he served many years as a missionary educator in India, and later as superintendent of the Evangelical Friends Church—Eastern Region. In 1978 a cooperative inter-yearly meeting agency, the Evangelical Friends Mission, was initiated under his directorship.

DAVID LLOYD JOHNS is periodicals librarian at the Everett Cattell Memorial Library, Malone College, Canton, Ohio.
