PAUL ANDERSON serves as Professor of Biblical and Quaker Studies at George Fox University, where he has taught since 1989, serving also as Extraordinary Professor of Religion at North-West University, Potchefstroom, South Africa. Author or editor/publisher of thirty books and over 250 essays, his most recent books include Following Jesus: The Heart of Faith and Practice; From Crisis to Christ: An Introduction to the New Testament; The Riddles of the Fourth Gospel: An Introduction to John; and John and Judaism: A Contested Relationship.
