PAUL N. ANDERSON is Professor of Biblical and Quaker Studies at George Fox University (Newberg, Oregon) and Extraordinary Professor of Religion at North-West University (Potchefstroom, South Africa). Paul edited *Evangelical Friend* (1990–1994) and *Quaker Religious Thought* (2000–2011) and serves as editor of three book series: Quakers and the Disciplines (FAHE), the Biblical Interpretation Series (E.J. Brill), and the Johannine Monograph Series (Wipf & Stock).
