George Fox College, in its 105th year, is one of America's Best Colleges. Eight times it has been given that designation by *U.S. News & World Report* magazine. In 1995 GFC was ranked second in academic reputation among Western Regional Liberal Arts Colleges, including colleges and universities from Texas to Hawaii. The magazine also named George Fox to its list of "Top Teaching Schools," second among liberal arts colleges in the western region.

George Fox is one of the nation's fastest-growing colleges. Enrollment more than tripled from 549 in 1986 to 1,717 in the fall of 1995.

The College offers unique programs to its students. Every incoming freshman is given a Macintosh computer to use and keep upon graduation. When students reach their third year at GFC, they are eligible for the Juniors Abroad program, where the College pays transportation costs for a three-week overseas study tour.

GFC students come from 32 states, one U.S. territory and nine nations. More than 40 religious denominations are represented on campus.

George Fox College had its beginning when early Willamette Valley Quaker settlers established Pacific Academy in 1885 for the Christian education of their children. The college division was organized in 1891 to provide more advanced instruction for students. In 1949, because of the many colleges in the



Northwest with Pacific in their name, the College was renamed George Fox in honor of the founder of the Friends (Quaker) Church. The College is governed by a 42-member Board of Trustees elected by Northwest Yearly Meeting of Friends Church, which comprises nearly 8,000 members in approximately 50 churches in Oregon, Washington, and Idaho.

George Fox is accredited by the Northwest Association of Schools and Colleges. The College is one of 13 members of the national Christian College Consortium. The College's undergraduate program is administered through three schools: Humanities, Natural and Behavioral Sciences, and Professional Studies. The 15 departments offer 34 majors with more than 400 courses.

An off-campus degree-completion program in management and organizational leadership enrolls working adults in an evening program with classes in Portland, Salem and Eugene, Ore., and Boise, Idaho. Graduate programs offered are a Doctor of Psychology (Psy.D.) in clinical psychology, a Master of Arts in Teaching (M.A.T.), a Master of Education (M.Ed.), a Master of Business Administration (M.B.A.), and a Master of Arts in Christian Studies (M.A.).

The 74-acre rural, tree-shaded campus a half-hour drive from Portland has undergone major expansion in recent years with 12 new buildings constructed. Part of a \$16 million Centennial Campaign, the \$5.3 million Edwards-Holman Science Center opened in the fall of 1994.

Alumni of George Fox are primarily in service-oriented vocations of Christian ministries, education, social work and medical fields. The College's most prominent alumnus is the late President Herbert Hoover, who attended Pacific Academy.

Short-Handed Volleyball Squad Scrambles for Winning Record

The George Fox volleyball team maintained its winning tradition with an untraditional lineup.

For the 11th straight year, the Lady Bruins finished at or above .500. By going 15-7 through the middle stretch of its season, George Fox went beyond expectations to compile a 16-15 record.

GFC did it with a small jury-rigged lineup. Just two starters and five letterwinners from the 1993 team were back on the roster, giving 13-year head coach Steve Grant his smallest crop of returners in a decade.

The Lady Bruins — whose starting lineup likely was the smallest in the Cascade Conference — lacked a true middle blocker and made due early with junior outside hitter Joanna Lofgren from Vancouver, Wash. Lofgren, a transfer from Montana State University, jumped to the top of

the Cascade Collegiate Conference statistics in blocks per game for three weeks.

To fill the other starting middle blocker position, Grant called on senior Rena Sitz, a 5-8 senior outside hitter from Drewsey, Ore., who in two years on the varsity squad had played in less than 13 college matches. Sitz adjusted to the position and finished third on the team in blocks per game.

Two-thirds of the way through the season, Lofgren slid over to the outside hitter position. When the final conference statistics came out, she ranked fourth with 3.74 kills a game and won conference first-team honors.

With Lofgren's middle blocker position vacated, freshman Lori Peterson of Grass Valley, Calif., became a starter. The move often put two or more freshman in the

game at the same time. Kari Guyer, a 4A third-team all-state selection from Medford, Ore., shared setting duties with junior Christina Monckton of Portland.

Post-season honors also went to two other GFC outside hitters. Kari Bashford-Cline, a 5-6 leaper from Gillette, Wyo., was named to the conference second team. Cline finished her four years second on the George Fox career kill list with 1,164. She set the season kill record last year. Olympia, Wash., native Michelle Nelsen received honorable mention after leading the team in digs.

Of George Fox's 15 losses, 10 came against nationally ranked teams.

Midway through the season, Grant surpassed a coaching milestone, winning his 300th game as George Fox coach. His record stands at 310-207.

Bigger and deeper than a year ago, the George Fox College volleyball team begins its first season in the Northwest Conference of Independent Colleges.

GFC head coach Steve Grant has nine freshmen and one transfer to bolster last year's 16-15 team that finished fourth in the Cascade Collegiate Conference. Two starters graduated.

"We have far more depth than any team I've coached," Grant says. He plans to divide his 19 players between the varsity team and the College's first-ever junior varsity squad.

Five of the Lady Bruins' top six hitters return, including Joanna Lofgren (Sr., Evergreen HS, Vancouver, Wash.), who put up near-All-American numbers last season. Lofgren set GFC's single-match record with a 32-kill night against Albertson College of Idaho. She's joined at the left-side outside hitter position by four-year starter Michelle Nelsen (Sr., Olympia HS, Wash.).

Grant hopes his newcomers can keep the pressure off of the two.

"Because of the addition of so many better middles and a couple of good right-side players, we can do more offensively to keep players from focusing on Joanna and Michelle," says Grant.

George Fox grows by four inches at the middle-blocker position, where 6-0 Amy Schultens (Fr., The Dalles HS, Ore.) replaces converted outside hitter Rena Sitz, who graduated last year. Returning starter Lori Peterson (So., Nevada Union HS, Grass Valley, Calif.) will hold the other middle-blocker position. Playing time also could go to Amy Redenius (Fr., Douglas HS, Tenmile, Ore.) and Monica Fox (Junction City HS, Ore.).

On the right side, 6-1 Chemeketa Community transfer Michelle Harper (So., Central HS, Monmouth, Ore.) will be the tallest

outside hitter in George Fox history. She started last season on a Chemeketa team that won 29 straight matches.

"She will provide a good offensive threat with solid blocking," says Grant.

Jen Schultens (Fr., The Dalles HS, Ore.), twin sister of Amy; Jenny Baird (So., Dayton HS, Ore.); and team captain Kristi Filley (Sr., North Eugene, Ore.) give additional outside-hitter depth.

Other outside hitters on the roster are Amy Quarles (Jr., McKay HS, Salem, Ore.) and Dena Smith (So., West Valley HS, Yakima, Wash.).

Defensive specialists Hanna Maplesden (So., Crater HS, White City, Ore.), and Janette Monckton (So., David Douglas HS, Portland) will benefit from the additional size up front.

"Defensively, because of our height, we should be better than the last few years," says Grant. "If we're a better blocking team, it'll make our defensive players better."

Returning starter Kari Guyer (So., North Medford HS, Ore.) will handle the setting duties. Jennie Rennie (Fr., Curtis HS, Tacoma, Wash.) will push her for playing time.

Grant expects parity in the NCIC. The conference will play a double round-robin schedule and holds its tournament Nov. 11.

The Lady Bruins will play five non-conference matches and participate in two tournaments. George Fox hosts its 12-team tournament Sept. 22-23 and will attend the Western Oregon State College Tournament Oct. 6-7.

Head Coach Steve Grant

George Fox volleyball under head coach Steve Grant has been a steady winner. Just once in his 13 seasons has a Lady Bruin squad finished with a losing record.

Since his arrival in 1982, George Fox has compiled a 310-204 overall record. In 1984 and 1987, the Lady Bruins won National Christian College Athletic Association national championships. Each time he was named NCCAA National Coach of the Year. NAIA District 2 Coach of the Year honors came his way in 1984 and 1990.

Grant, 49, is a 1969 graduate of Biola University, where he was a three-sport athlete in basketball, soccer and baseball.

Grant earned a master's degree in education at Linfield College in 1985.

He and his wife, Kathleen, live in Salem. They have two children: Jeff, 23, and Bryan, 20.

McConaughy begins his fifth season as volleyball assistant coach.

McConaughy, 24, played club volleyball in Washington and Oregon and coached the GFC men's volleyball club team. He earned a language arts teaching degree from GFC in 1993 and was selected to "Who's Who Among Students in American Universities and Colleges."

McConaughy and his wife, Adina, live in Newberg, where he teaches at C.S. Lewis Community School. The McConaughys have a daughter, Amanda, born May 5, 1995.


