Reversal of Fortune

Bruins seek to turn their game around under new coach Hetherington

For the first time in the history of women's soccer at George Fox University, someone besides Byron Shenk will be patrolling the sidelines as the Bruins' head coach. Andy Hetherington takes over the program as the Bruins begin their 12th season of competition, facing an admittedly difficult task as he tries to reverse the Bruins' fortunes (or misfortunes) that resulted in 11 straight losses to end the season and a final record of 4-14. The Bruins were also 8th in the Northwest Conference with a 1-13 record.

"If we can avoid the injuries that hit last year's team, I believe we have the talent with this year's players to at least be competitive," comments Hetherington, "although this is admittedly a transition year for us." The new coach came on board in July, leaving very little time to recruit, and will rely primarily on holdovers from last year's team (the Bruins return 9 letterwinners and 7 starters).

The biggest change for the Bruins this season will be one of strategic philosophy as Hetherington adheres to an offensive-minded approach to the game.

"We're going to utilize pace to play 'attacking' soccer," says Hetherington. "We have pace along the flanks, and will have a little more punch up front, but we must get the right shape and balance to our team if we're to do that."

Seven Starters Returning

"We're actually a very young team, for the most part, so all our seniors will be key," Hetherington confesses. Primary among them will be goalkeeper **Cori Wulf** (Sr., Salem,

Ore.), an Honorable Mention All-Conference selection last year after leading the NWC in saves (184). "Cori gives us a platform on which to build our defense, and she's such a positive, aggressive player that she inspires confidence in her teammates."

Mindy Venable (Sr., Newberg, Ore.) returns at midfield and will play a major offensive role with her passing and scoring ability. Two other seniors who are juniors eligibility-wise, **Sarah Jones** (Jr., Lake Oswego, Ore.) and **Anna Russell** (Jr., Beaverton, Ore.) will also be important to the Bruin cause this season. Jones brings stability to the defense as a returning starter in the backfield, while Russell, who sat out last season to marry and start a family,

returns after scoring 4 goals as a part-time starter in 2000.

"Anna is a an aggressive forward who is very direct in her attacking role and will cause a lot of problems for defenders this year," predicts Hetherington.

Sara Oates, the team's top scorer from a year ago (3 goals, 6 assists) did not return after her sophomore year, choosing to remain home in California and get married, but **Gloria Blackwell** (So., North Bend, Ore.) does return at forward after tying for the team lead in goals with 3. **Brooke Pitner** (Jr., Vancouver, Ore.), a Second Team All-NWC selection as a freshman, was the Bruins' 2nd-leading scorer (3 goals, 2 assists) despite missing almost half the season with a stress fracture in her foot, but she is back, healthy, and ready to play a pivotal role as a playmaker at midfield. "Brooke has a roving commission to play where she wants to, creating chances for our forwards with her passing and dribbling skills," says Hetherington.

Jenn Tyhurst (So., Oregon City, Ore.) returns to the right side on defense and Sarah Stark (So., Ontario, Ore.), another starter, is a speedy sweeper who reads the game well. They will be joined by starter **Kristen Gooch** (Jr., Taylorsville, Utah) and **Andee Trader** (So., Merlin, Ore.), who was hampered by injuries most of the season, as midfielders to create a defense that "will at least make life difficult for our opponents," Hetherington professes.

Carice Fell (So., Astoria, Ore.), who can play both defender and goalkeeper, and **Dessa Bingley** (So., Woodburn, Ore.) at midfield give the team some depth and a bit of returning experience.

Coaches

Newcomers to Contribute

Hetherington expects rookie forwards **Shannon Miles** (Fr., Salem, Ore.) and **Danielle Bowie** (Fr., Spokane, Wash.) to “give us a lot of pace up front along with Gloria.”

Versatility is the word to describe both **Pilar Walker** (Fr., Kalispell, Mont.) and **Karli Saathoff** (Fr., Ridgefield, Wash.). “Both players have exceptional ability and I expect to use them anywhere, from forward to midfield, at any time,” says

Hetherington. Rounding out the squad and providing depth at midfield is **Anne-Marie Kendall** (Fr., Longview, Wash.).

Rebuilding a Foundation

The Bruins in 2001 set several records, most of them rather dubious, including the most losses (14), most consecutive losses (11 and counting), most times shut out (10), and fewest goals scored (14). Hetherington,

however, admits that he is “cautiously optimistic” that the Bruins will show considerable improvement over those numbers this season.

“This is a rebuilding year for us and it will need a lot of hard work,” says Hetherington, “but I also expect this to be a foundational year as we try to build something for the future. We’re going to surprise some teams who may have written us off as an easy mark, however.”

Head Coach

After 7 months of coast-to-coast searching, George Fox University finally found its new women’s soccer coach, Andy Hetherington, just a few miles away.

Hetherington comes to the Bruin program from Aloha (Ore.) High School, replacing Byron Shenk, the only coach the program had known since its inception in 1991. Shenk led the Bruins to a 96-87-11 record in 11 years before resigning at the end of the 2001 campaign, citing a need to concentrate on his roles as an assistant athletic trainer and a professor in the health and human performance department.

Hetherington brings 10 years of high school coaching experience to his new job in Newberg, having served as assistant men’s head coach at Catlin Gabel High School from 1991–92, head men’s coach at Corbett High School from 1993–96, and head women’s coach at Valley Catholic High from 1998–2001. He had taken the head women’s position at Aloha in March of this year when the opportunity to get into college coaching knocked.

“I hated to leave Aloha after such a short time,” Hetherington admitted, “but with the timing on this chance to get into college coaching, I just couldn’t pass it up.

Hetherington’s 2 Catlin Gabel teams went 20-0 in 1991 and 19-0 in 1991, both teams winning District 1 and state championship titles. Establishing and developing the program at Corbett, he guided the team to a 31-11-3 overall record and made the playoffs in each of his 3 years there. At Valley Catholic, where he was 53-9-2 in 4 years, his 1998, 2000, and 2001 teams each won the Tri-Valley League and reached the quarterfinals of the state Class 3A playoffs, while the 1999 squad was league runner-up and reached the 2nd round of the state tournament.

Altogether, Hetherington’s teams have a cumulative record

of 123-20-5, and he hopes to continue that winning trend at George Fox. He inherits a Bruin team that posted a 4-14 record in 2001 due to youthful inexperience and several injuries to key starters.

The Bruins struggled to score last year, with only 14 goals in 18 games, and Hetherington aims to change that, confessing that “I’m an offensive-minded coach. I want our team to be attractive and entertaining, and offense does that. You can play what I call ‘dull’ soccer and win with it, but I believe in attacking the net and putting pressure on the defense. I like ‘total soccer,’ where even the defenders are a threat.”

Hetherington, 43, is a native of Manchester, England, where he attended St. John’s College and played soccer from 1975–77, leading the conference in goal scoring in 1976 with a league record that still stands. He played semi-professionally for Leigh Town in the Northern Premier League (1978–82), Lymington in the Southern Alliance League, now the Vauxhall Conference (1982–84), and F.C. Massy Paliseau in the Paris Central League (1985–86). In England, he set a Northern Conference goal scoring record, and represented the North of England vs. the South in the Nationwide Cup.

Becoming a permanent resident of the United States in 1987, Hetherington pursued a master of arts in pastoral studies at Multnomah Biblical Seminary in Portland and completed the degree in 2000. He, his wife, Kimberly, and their 3 children reside in Gladstone, Ore.

Sue Mak, who worked for the last 4 years as an assistant coach with the varsity program at Valley Catholic High School under Andy Hetherington and as the junior varsity coach, comes along with the new Bruin women’s soccer coach as an assistant this

season.

Born in Fresno, Calif., but growing up in Seattle, Wash., Mak was a 3-sport star in high school in basketball, softball, and swimming. She attended Eastern Washington University for 2 years before meeting and marrying her husband of 32 years, Stan.

Mak got her coaching start in 1979 with her children’s city league teams in Redmond, Wash., eventually volunteering to coach soccer, fast-pitch softball, swimming, and downhill skiing. She spent 1 year in Hong Kong coaching at LaSalle High School, which was run by the local Catholic church.

The Maks came to Portland in 1996, where she went to work with the Tualatin Hills Sports Association. She is currently the youth programs director for the River Place Athletic Club in downtown Portland.

Mak has 2 grown children, one daughter still in college playing soccer as a freshman at the University of Wyoming, and 2 grandchildren.

Todd Williams begins his 6th season as an assistant coach of both the men’s and women’s soccer teams at George Fox this year, with primary responsibilities instructing the goalkeepers. He himself was a talented goalkeeper for the George Fox men’s

soccer team from 1990–93, with a career goals-against average of 1.69 and 3 shutouts, numbers which rank as the 4th-best in those categories in team history.

Williams is a 1990 graduate of Churchill High School in Eugene, Ore. He earned a bachelor’s degree in biology at George Fox in 1994, and now works for Country Insurance. He is married to former GFU women’s soccer player Lisel Goertzen, and they live in Dundee, Ore.

2001 Review

It's Good to Have Goals ...

Injuries and Inability to Score Goals Doom Bruins to Disappointing 4-14 Season

A season that began with a promising 3-0 start concluded in disappointment for the George Fox University women's soccer team as injuries struck several key offensive players, resulting in 11 straight losses to end the season and a final record of 4-14. The Bruins finished 8th in the Northwest Conference with a 1-13 record.

The Bruins began the season with wins over The Master's College in the Western Baptist Classic and home wins over California-Santa Cruz and California State-Hayward. After 3 straight losses, the team got back on track with a 2-1 win over Pacific Lutheran, but then the injury bug took its toll and the team did not win another as the offense sputtered. The Bruins dropped 7 games by 1 goal, including 5 by 1-0.

Among the dubious records set by the 2001 team were most losses (14),

lowest winning pct. (.222), most consecutive losses (11), most times shut out (10), fewest shutouts (1, tie), and fewest goals scored (14).

Nevertheless, there were some positive notes that should signal a brighter future. The Bruins were strong on defense, with defender Beth Liljenberg, a senior from Portland, Ore., and goalkeeper Cori Wulf, a junior from Salem, Ore., earning All-Conference recognition. Liljenberg, who started 74 of 76 games in her career, was Second Team, while Wulf, who led the NWC in saves (184), was Honorable Mention. Liljenberg also garnered NCAA All-West Region Third Team honors.

Sophomore forward Sara Oates of Grover Beach, Calif., despite struggling with a pulled muscle most of the season, led the team in scoring

with 12 points (3 goals, 6 assists). Sophomore midfielder Brooke Pitner of Vancouver, Wash., was 2nd with 8 points (3 goals, 2 assists), but missed nearly half the season due to a stress fracture. Oates moved into 12th on the all-time Bruin points list with 29 and Pitner took over at 15th with 26.

Byron Shenk, the only coach in the 11-year history of the George Fox women's program, announced his resignation at the end of the season to devote more time to his duties as chair of the health and human performance department and as an assistant athletic trainer. He ended his coaching career with a 96-87-11 (.523) record at George Fox, and a 200-200-37 (.500) record in 32 years total.

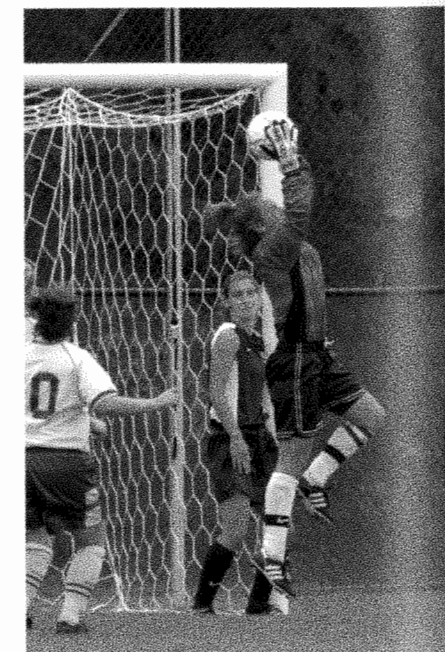

Intercollegiate athletics are an important part of George Fox University, home to one of the Northwest's most successful small-college sports programs. Winning programs, of course, are accompanied by a proper balance between academics and athletics. Accordingly, George Fox teams are members of the Northwest Conference and compete in Division III of the National Collegiate Athletic Association, in which need and academic ability, not athleticism, determine scholarships and financial aid.

At George Fox University, student-athletes compete for conference and national titles at a Christ-centered university where professors and

coaches help them grow in mind, body, and spirit. Intercollegiate athletics competition provides for practical application of what is learned in the classroom and at practice. At George Fox, the values of athletics are integrated with the goals of Christian higher education in a process that includes

- Physical conditioning
- Managing emotions
- Courage
- Teamwork
- Cooperation
- Graciousness in winning and losing

The university fields teams in 13 varsity sports, 7 for women (volleyball, soccer, cross country, basketball, softball, tennis, and track

and field) and 6 for men (soccer, cross country, basketball, baseball, tennis, and track and field). More than 15 percent of George Fox's traditional undergraduate students participate in these sports. Their records over the years serve as shining testimonies to the administration's conviction that an institution can play for the glory of God, follow the rules and ethics of its governing organizations, and be successful on the fields and courts of competition at the same time. Consider the growing legacy:

- George Fox has earned district or conference titles 15 times in 8 different sports during the last decade.
- George Fox athletes have earned more than 300 All-America and All-America Scholar-Athlete honors.
- 7 of the 11 coaches on staff have been named Coach of the Year at various levels a total of 35 times.
- George Fox coaches have held their positions for an average of almost 9 years, and together have accumulated more than 1,300 collegiate wins.
