## Men's Soccer Outlook 1996

Eighth-year head coach Manfred Tschan is hoping young talent and a change of strategy will be enough for George Fox's men's soccer team to defend its Northwest Conference title.

Repeating as champion — or even just earning George Fox's seventh consecutive NAIA playoff appearance — won't be a simple task. At the end of the 1995 season, George Fox had two senior All-Americans and five of the top 17 scorers in the conference. None return for the 1996 campaign. The youthful Bruin roster lists just one senior and four juniors.

Tschan — whose teams never have finished below second in their conference or district — has a history of turning young, inexperienced teams into winners.

"This is one of my youngest teams ever," said Tschan. "We have only one senior. The last time that happened (in 1993), we went to nationals. That was a team like this:

not much experience, one senior on the varsity, and we had changed our style dramatically. You never know."

Tschan plans to adapt his team style of play to fit the quality of players now on the roster, many who brought all-state credentials from high school.

"In terms of soccer skill, this is one of the most skilled teams we've ever had," said Tschan. "We want to take advantage of that. We're going to make a radical change from the high-pressure, fast-paced, attacking style we've been playing. It will take a little more patience and a lot more reading of situations and the intentions of teammates and opponents. We're going to give our skillful players much more opportunity to express themselves and show their stuff."

**Josh Turpen (So., Sammamish HS, Bellevue, Wash.)** and all-conference honorable mention **Wade Fleming (So., Lakeridge HS, Oregon City)** are talented center midfielders who should enjoy the new system.

"The two guys in the midfield are as good as we've ever had in the program," said Tschan. "They're a couple of great playmaker types. We're counting on them making a lot of good decisions and contributing heavily in the scoring column."

He's still deciding who will play the outside midfield positions.

"We're looking to replace (honorable mention All-American) Ian Reschke, and there are only so many guys that look like they fit the bill," said Tschan.

**Erik Sorensen (Jr., Bothell HS, Wash.)** and **Travis Johnson (Jr., Hidden Valley HS, Grants Pass, Ore.)** have varsity collegiate experience. Other choices could be

**Michael Moody (So., Inglemoor HS, Bothell, Wash.)**, one of the freshmen, or a converted defender.

Up front, the Bruins have to replace their top five scorers. **Joe Crown (So., Kent-Meridian HS, Kent, Wash.)** and **Justin Rivard (Sr., Bonanza HS, Las Vegas, Nev.)** are the only returning strikers, but Tschan says several of the freshmen have looked good in preseason.

Four freshmen likely will see time up front. **Allen Bullock (Fr., Roseburg HS, Ore.)** and **Jared Pearson (Fr., Bend HS, Sunriver, Ore.)** both bring 1995 Oregon 4A all-state honorable mention honors. **John Suehisa (Fr., Leilehua HS, Wahiawa, Hawaii)** was his high school team and league MVP, and **Aaron Elling (Fr., Lander Valley HS, Lander, Wyo.)** was named to the Wyoming all-state team.

Tschan expects defense should continue to be a team strength. The Bruins have recorded 32 shutouts over the last three seasons. Anchoring the defense will likely be an all-state tandem from Aloha High School: goalkeeper **Curtis Selby (So., Aloha HS, Beaverton Ore.)** and sweeper **Tommy Kolodge (So., Aloha HS, Beaverton, Ore.)**.

Also seeing time in the box will be goalkeeper **Chris Wood (So., Bothell HS, Wash.)**.

Tschan can call on three defenders who played man-marker last season: **Jeff Wells (So., Evergreen HS, Ridgefield, Wash.)**, **Ryan Gwaltney (Jr., Roseburg HS, Ore.)** and **Chad Pohlman (So., Shorecrest HS, Seattle, Wash.)**. New additions in the back will be Navy veteran **Scott Gordon (Jr., Olympic HS, Bremerton, Wash.)** and **Kris Sorensen (Fr., Bothell HS, Wash.)**, brother of Erik Sorensen.

Entering his eighth year as George Fox head coach, Manfred Tschan guides one of the most successful soccer programs in the Northwest and the nation.

His Bruins have won nearly three out of every four games they've played (103-35-5, .738) and have ranked in the NAIA national top 20 every season since 1992. Under his guidance, George Fox never has finished lower than second in its district or conference. In the Swiss coach's eight years on the George Fox coaching staff, his teams have received national exposure, winning two Christian College national championships and making one NAIA national tournament appearance. Seven of his players have earned NAIA All-American awards.

In 1993, he won NAIA District 2 and Area 1 Coach of the Year awards.

A former player in the Swiss First Junior and First Amateur divisions, the 40-year-old coach has 13 years of coaching experience. Prior to settling in Newberg, Tschan held head coaching positions at Concordia University in Portland and the University of Oregon. During his two seasons at Oregon, Tschan guided the fledgling women's program to a No. 4 Intercollegiate Soccer Association of America national ranking and into the 1981 AIAW national tournament.

An assistant professor of health and human performance, Tschan earned a bachelor of science degree in education in Switzerland, received a master of science degree in motor learning from Oregon, and has completed Ph.D. course work in sports psychology. He is fluent in German, French and English and has been published in numerous journals and newspapers in Switzerland and the U.S.

He and his wife, Vicki, have two children: Twila, 6, and Heidi, 4.

## Tim Tsohantaridis

Tim Tsohantaridis brings professional soccer experience and a ministerial background to the Bruins.

A Greek-born U.S. citizen, he has played with the Rhode Island Oceans of the American Soccer League; the New England Teammen of the North American Soccer League; the Rhode Island

Rangers of the Coastal Soccer League; and the U.S. select team.

As a high school senior, he was selected for an exhibition game in which he was matched up against soccer legend Pelé. He later played and coached soccer at Barrington College in Rhode Island.

Tsohantaridis has worn plenty of hats during his nine years at George Fox. On the soccer coaching side, the 42-year-old mentor has held three different titles. He came aboard in 1985 as an assistant, was named head field coach the next season, and in 1989 shared the co-coach title with Tschan. While under his tutelage, the Bruins made three National Christian College Athletic Association national tournament appearances and won the 1988 national title. His four-year record totaled 50-23-4. After a two-year stint as pastor of a Greek Evangelical Church in Massachusetts, Tsohantaridis returned to George Fox as an assistant coach.

In the academic field, he is an assistant professor of religion with a bachelor's degree from Barrington and a master's from Ashland Theological Seminary. From 1986 to 1990 he served as George Fox's chaplain.

Tim and his wife, Valerie, have two children: Demetrius, 16, and Thaddeus, 14.



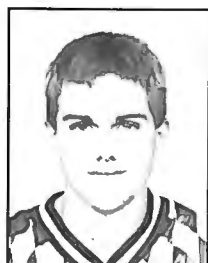
## Jeff Nelson

None have better credentials to be George Fox's goalkeeper coach than Jeff Nelson. A 1995 George Fox grad, he was named NAIA National Goalkeeper of the Year by the Intercollegiate Soccer Association of America. Three different national associations have labeled him an All-American.

A North Medford High School graduate, Nelson holds George Fox season and career records for most shutouts, fewest goals allowed, and best goals-per-game average.

Nelson has played two seasons with the Cascade Surge professional soccer team in Salem, Ore. He and his wife, Christy, live in Newberg.

## Bruins Claim Northwest Conference Crown

George Fox's 1995 season contained an unexpected championship in the Northwest Conference of Independent Colleges.

The Bruins entered their first season in the NCIC minus seven graduated seniors — including three All-Americans — off of the previous season's nationally ranked 15-3 squad. Head coach Manfred Tschan began his seventh season predicting it would be tough for the Bruins to earn their sixth consecutive NAIA playoff berth.

But his talented young squad finished 25th in the final NAIA national poll and secured a playoff spot in style, winning the Northwest Conference title with a 10-2 conference record. It was a balanced offensive approach. George Fox got goals from 15 different players, believed to be a school record.

When the Bruins won their NCIC semifinal contest over Whitworth College, the surprising 1995 team had totalled one more win than its predecessor.

"We did a lot better than anybody expected us to do," said Tschan. "We proved we could win with a young team."

For the sixth consecutive year, the Bruins advanced to the championship game of their district or conference. A 2-1 upset loss to third-seeded Pacific Lutheran University in the Northwest Conference tournament championship game left George Fox with a 16-5 overall record.

As the team with the highest ranking and best record among teams eligible for the two Pacific Northwest Regional Tournament at-large berths, George Fox didn't think its season was over. The regional soccer committee decided otherwise and awarded at-large berths to other teams — one which the Bruins had beaten earlier in the season. It was the second time in

two years George Fox was passed over for an at-large berth despite holding the best record and ranking.

The Bruins put three seniors on the Northwest Conference first team and had the only freshman award winner. Two of the seniors — midfielder Ian Reschke and defender Steve Sterhan — won NAIA All-American honorable mention awards.

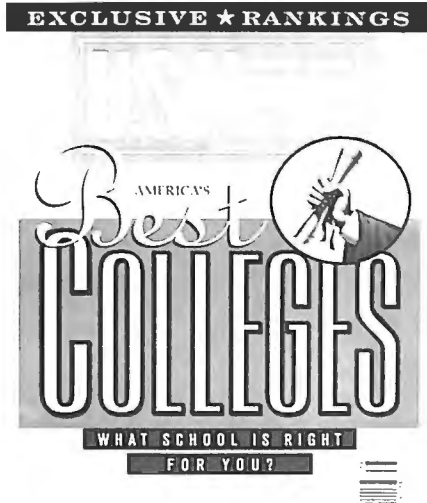
## About George Fox

George Fox University enters its 106th year as one of America's Best Colleges. Nine times it has been given that designation by *U.S. News & World Report* magazine. Founded in 1885 by Quaker settlers as Pacific Academy, George Fox is one of the nation's fastest-growing universities. Enrollment has nearly quadrupled from 549 in 1986 to 2,150 in the fall of 1996. About 1,300 are traditional undergraduates.

The University offers unique programs to its students. Every incoming freshman is given a Macintosh computer to use and keep upon graduation. When George Fox students reach their third year, they are eligible for the Juniors Abroad program, where the University pays transportation costs for a three-week overseas study tour.

George Fox switched from college to university in 1996 when it merged with Western Evangelical Seminary (a graduate school of about 350 students in Tigard, Ore.). The University offers students a Christ-centered education and the choice of 35 undergraduate majors and 12 graduate degrees.

George Fox's most prominent alumnus is the late President Herbert Hoover, who attended Pacific Academy.

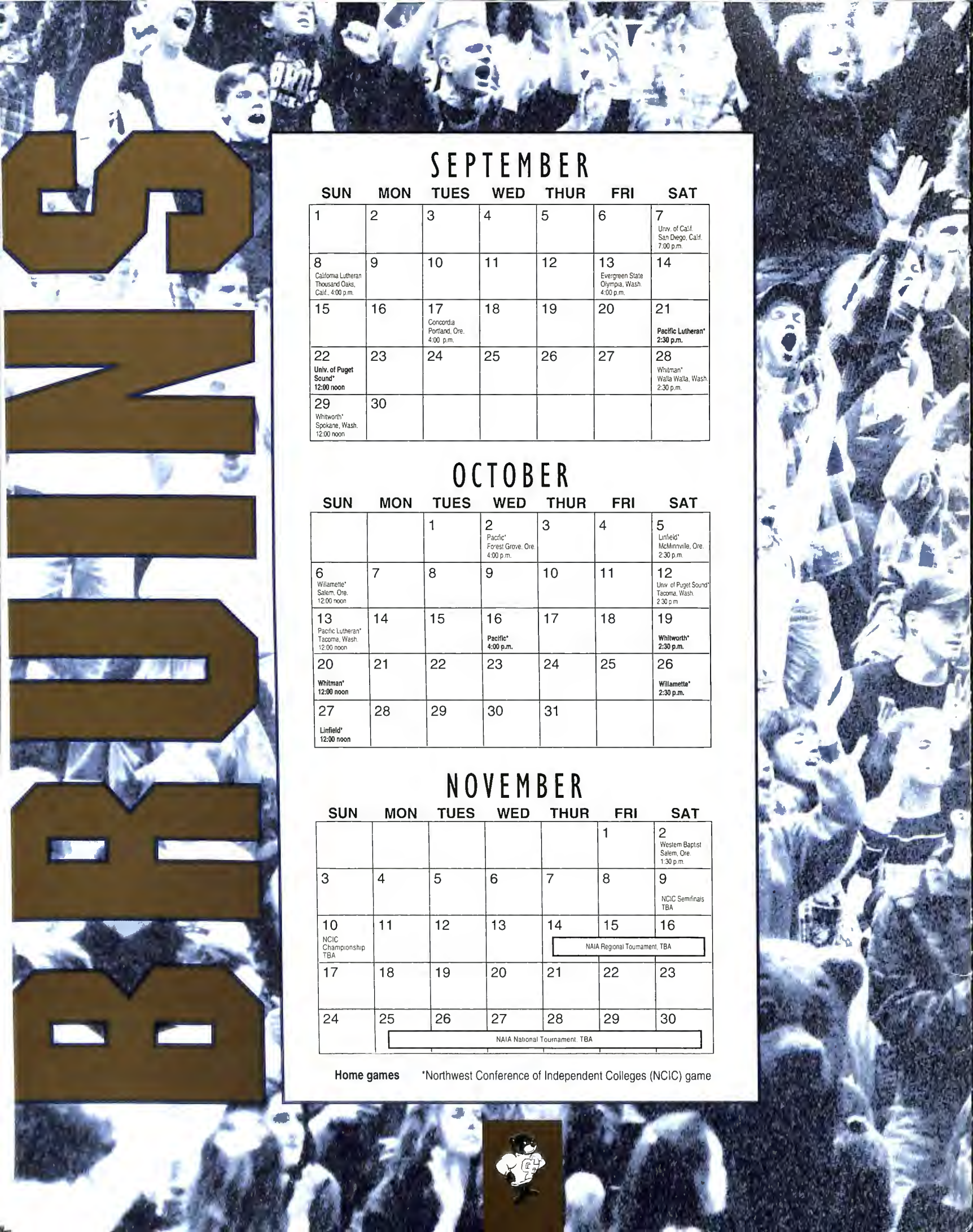


## Athletic Affiliation

George Fox is a member of the Northwest Conference of Independent Colleges (NCIC). The NCIC is leaving the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) for the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division III. Currently a provisional member, George Fox and the NCIC will be eligible for NCAA national championship play in 1998-99. Until then, the NCIC will continue to compete nationally in the NAIA.

The NAIA is an autonomous association administering programs leading to 13 men's and 11 women's national championships. The NAIA includes about 350 four-year colleges and universities in 49 states and Canada. They are grouped in nine regions and 44 conferences.

The NCAA administers 80 championships in 21 sports for its member institutions, involving nearly 21,000 men and women student-athletes.
