Talented Bruins Seek to Repeat

With seven all-conference players on its roster, George Fox University begins defense of its Northwest Conference of Independent Colleges baseball title.

Obviously, third-year coach Pat Bailey has some talent to work with.

"Athletically, this the best team I've had since I've been here," he says.

That's an impressive assessment since his first two teams both advanced to the NAIA Far West Tournament.

"The No. 1 possible problem," he says, "is when you have so many talented guys, sometimes teams can

be selfish. We need to do team types of things if we're going to win the conference. Complacency is not an option. I'm working this team the hardest I've worked any team in my three years here because I want to make sure we have a good season."

Another threat to the Bruins' ability to defend their title is injuries. Since the start of practice, six players have been sidelined for the season.

Scoring runs isn't expected to be a problem. The Bruins return eight offensive starters off their 29-14 team that led the league in hitting with a .336 average.

Bailey is more concerned about

giving up runs after losing his ace pitcher to graduation. NCIC first-team selection Troy Schrenk last year set the school season record with 71 strikeouts and threw the second no-hitter in George Fox NAIA history.

Despite the loss, Bailey says he now has more viable options.

"Top to bottom, the pitching staff is deeper," he says.

Three of the Bruins' top pitchers start in other positions.

If he can overcome a nagging shoulder injury, pitcher/first baseman **Nate Barnett (Jr., Arlington Christian HS, Wash.)** will be a key contributor on both offense and defense. Last year he was named NAIA Far West Region Player of the Year and First-Team All-American after setting school records with 72 hits, 69 RBI and 10 pitching wins.

NCIC first team outfielder/pitcher **Ryan Muñoz (Sr., Aloha HS, Ore.)** is battling a back injury. Bailey says the Bruins especially need **Muñoz**, one of the team's emotional leaders.

Kess Romano (So., Mountain View HS, Vancouver, Wash.) compiled an impressive 7-1 record in his first season and could be the Bruins' new No. 1 pitcher.

Bailey is expecting dramatic improvement in **Mike Shear (Jr., Junction City HS, Ore.)**, saying he looked like the Bruins' second-best pitcher in fall training.

The hardest throwing pitcher on the staff, **Ryan Alvis (So., Seattle Christian HS, Kent, Wash.)** likely will break into the rotation. His fastball has been clocked at up to 87 miles-per-hour.

The coach is also excited by the return of **Nate Fast (Sr., Clovis HS, Fresno, Calif.)**. After going 4-1 in 1996, he got married and took the 1997 season off.

The Bruin closers will be **Eric Beasley** (So., **The Dalles HS, Ore.**) and **Will Clark** (Jr., **Santiam Christian HS, Albany, Ore.**).

Marcus Muñoz (So., **Aloha HS, Ore.**), **Travis Tobin** (Jr., **Jesuit HS, Beaverton, Ore.**) and four freshmen recruits also will get their shot at earning time on the mound.

The Bruins might be even better at the plate than last season after adding the top third baseman in the conference. Northwest Conference first team pick **Ryan LeBreton** (Jr., **The Dalles HS, Ore.**) transferred from Pacific University where he set school records with 52 hits, three triples and a league-leading 35 walks. Bailey says he's the best athlete on the team and might be one of the team's top six pitchers.

George Fox's biggest offensive loss was its No. 9 hitter, **Buster Ford**, an honorable mention selection at

second base. He'll likely be replaced by **David Farrell** (So., **Foster HS, Seattle, Wash.**), **Matt Unis** (Sr., **Oregon City HS, Milwaukie, Ore.**) or **Sundar Cook** (Jr., **Juanita HS, Kirkland, Wash.**).

Farrell also can fit in at the shortstop position behind NCIC first team selection **Lance Gilmore** (Jr., **North Bend HS, Coos Bay, Ore.**), a .355 hitter. **Nate Swan** (So., **South Medford HS, Ore.**) also will provide depth at shortstop and third base.

Behind the plate will be honorable mention NCIC catcher **Mark Tyler** (Jr., **Bothell HS, Wash.**), who hit .389 with 15 doubles and seven home runs. He'll be spelled by **Jason Wieg** (So., **Shorecrest HS, Seattle, Wash.**).

On either side of Muñoz in the outfield will be two NCIC honorable mention picks: **Jason Seibel** (Jr., **Hillsboro HS, Ore.**) and **Chad Hollabaugh** (Jr., **Lakeridge HS, Lake**

Oswego, Ore.). Both hit better than .350 and led the team in doubles with 14 and 16, respectively. Hallabaugh also drove in 51 runs, second most in George Fox history.

Jason Schilperoort (So., **W.F. West HS, Chehalis, Wash.**), **David Rasmussen** (So., **Immanuel HS, Selma, Calif.**) and three freshmen also will be available to put in time in the outfield.

Matt Saltmarsh (Sr., **Oregon City HS, Ore.**) will handle most of the designated hitting duties and back up first base.

Bailey is using a difficult preseason schedule to toughen his squad for the conference race. Two of the opponents are in the NAIA top-10 and another is 26th in the preseason poll. The Bruins' first 16 games are on the road in Idaho and California.

Young Bruins Capture Conference Crown

A late-season winning streak earned George Fox's youthful baseball team the 1997 Northwest Conference of Independent Colleges championship.

George Fox finished the regular season with a 14-game win streak—the longest in school history—clinching the conference title on the final day of the regular season. Included in the streak was a no-hitter thrown by senior pitcher Troy Schrenk against then-league-leading Willamette University—the first Bruin no-hitter in 16 years.

Sophomore first baseman/pitcher Nate Barnett put himself into the NAIA record book by tying three national records, hitting four home runs—two of them grand slams—and driving in 13 runs in one game versus University of Puget Sound. He was voted NAIA Far West Region Player of the Year and First-Team All-American, the highest awards ever given to a George Fox baseball player.

George Fox's NCIC title gave it eight conference or district titles in the last 10 years. Its 29-14 record was the Bruins' second-highest win total in school history. The Bruins finished 16-1 in Newberg and are 30-2 at home over the last two seasons.

Along with eight of his players who earned all-conference honors, coach Pat Bailey was named conference Coach of the Year. With just one senior among the starting position players, the Bruins set eight team or individual records, and their .336 team batting average was just off the school record of .337 set in 1975.

The season ended in the NAIA West Regional Tournament with losses to the NAIA's No. 2 and No. 25 ranked teams.

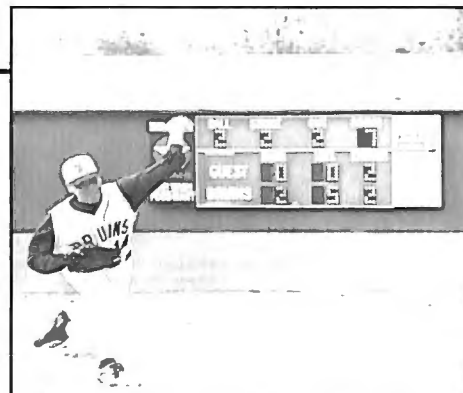

ATHLETIC AFFILIATION

The landscape of small-college athletics in the Pacific Northwest is undergoing sweeping changes, and George Fox University is in the midst of the transformation.

In the fall of 1994, the University joined the Northwest Conference of Independent Colleges (NCIC), a league of 10 strong academic institutions in Oregon and Washington. That winter, the NCIC applied for membership in the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division III. The move meant leaving the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA), an association George Fox had held membership in since 1965.

George Fox has provisional membership in the NCAA but will continue to compete in NAIA national championships until 1999-2000, when it expects to be eligible for NCAA Division III national championships.

George Fox's men's and women's basketball teams compete in NAIA Division II, while the 11 other sports the University competes in are not divided into divisions by the NAIA.

The NAIA is an autonomous association administering programs

leading to 13 men's and 11 women's championships. The NAIA includes about 350 four-year colleges and universities in 49 states and Canada. They are grouped in nine regions and 44 conferences.

The NCAA administers 80 championships in 21 sports for its 1,201 member institutions, involving nearly 21,000 men and women scholar-athletes. There are more than 350 schools in Division III.

1998 POSTSEASON PLAY

Six teams will play in the NAIA Far West Region Tournament held May 8-12 in Boise, Idaho.

The champions of the Northwest Conference of Independent Colleges, Cascade Collegiate Conference, Golden State Athletic Conference, and Pacific Northwest Athletic Conference each will earn an automatic berth. Two at-large berths will be awarded based upon regional rankings to remaining conference and independent teams.

The champion of the regional tournament will advance to the NAIA National Tournament held May 18-23 in Tulsa, Oklahoma.

Third-year Head Coach Pat Bailey has carried on the winning tradition of George Fox baseball.

Last year, he was named Northwest Conference of Independent College's Coach of the Year after guiding the Bruins to their eighth conference or district title in the last 10 years. After winning the conference title, they advanced to the NAIA Far West Regional Tournament for the second-straight year, finishing the season with eight school hitting and pitching records. The Bruins' 29-14 record was the second best in George Fox history.

Bailey took over the Bruin program immediately after guiding West Linn High School into the Oregon Class 4A state championship game. At West Linn, his teams advanced to the Class 4A state playoffs seven times and in his final season were edged 2-1 in the 1995 state championship game.

Four times Bailey was named Three Rivers League Coach of the Year. He was at West Linn for 10 years as head baseball coach and assistant football coach. His baseball teams won five league titles and reached the Oregon semifinals in 1989, 1991 and 1995. From 1989-95, his combined record as a high school and American Legion baseball coach was 315-105 (.750).

Previous to West Linn, Bailey taught and coached at Willamette High School, Eugene, Ore., for six years.

He has worked at various baseball camps and served as a pitching coach at the University of Portland in 1992.

"George Fox really matches up with me personality-wise and philosophically," says Bailey. "As a coach, I want to make sure every kid is making the most of his God-given talent. I want them to be a class act in the classroom and the community. I want the kids to match the school and my personality. I stress to my team, we're a family. Family members are more important than themselves. If you're going to be a leader, you must be a servant first."

Bailey is a 1974 graduate of Moscow High School in Idaho, where he played football, basketball and was the baseball team's MVP.

A two-year baseball letterwinner at the University of Idaho, Bailey was a starting outfielder and team captain as a senior. He completed his business education degree in 1978. Bailey also lettered two years in baseball at North Idaho College in Couer d'Alene, Idaho.

Bailey continued playing semiprofessionally until age 28.

He earned a master of education degree in educational administration from the University of Oregon in 1983.

At West Linn, Bailey was a business instructor and in 1994 was named to "Who's Who Among America's Outstanding High School Teachers." In 1995, he was one of 30 outstanding educators honored with a 1995 Education Excellence Award, given by Associated Oregon Industries.

At George Fox, Bailey is an assistant professor of health and human performance.

Bailey and his wife, Susan, live in Newberg with their children, Alex, 14, and Ann, 11.

GEOFF LOOMIS

1992 Pacific-10 Northern Division Player of the Year Geoff Loomis is in his third year on the George Fox staff as an assistant coach.

He was the University of Portland's MVP in 1992 and was drafted by the Oakland Athletics organization. He

played two seasons for the Southern Oregon Athletics and was team MVP in 1993.

A third baseman, he was a two-time first-team All-Pacific-10 Northern Division selection. His .376 career batting average set a school record at UP, as did his 80 hits, 22 doubles and 33 extra base hits in a season.

At UP he played under Pat Bailey during Bailey's one-year stint as assistant coach.

Loomis had a stellar prep career at Oregon City High School, where he was named 1989 first team Class 4A all-state and Player of the Year in the Three-Rivers League. He had a .610 batting average and led the state with 57 RBI.

Loomis earned a bachelor's degree in marketing and management from Portland in 1994 and a master of arts degree in teaching from Pacific University in 1997. He currently teaches business education at David Douglas High School in Portland. He and his wife, Anna, live in Wilsonville.



JIM REICHENBACH

Former Cleveland High School and Portland State University player Jim Reichenbach will assist with George Fox's outfielders this season.

The second-year assistant coach was a two-time all-city selection at Cleveland and set the school RBI record with 53.

He graduated in 1987 and played at Portland State for two seasons.

He has coaching experience at Cleveland High and with Newberg's American Legion and Babe Ruth teams.

He currently works with the JUGS pitching machine company in Tualatin. He and his wife, Diane, have three children, Katrina, Nathaniel and Andrew. They live in Newberg.

ALEX DOBSON

The former head baseball coach at Lake Oswego High School, Alex Dobson has taken an unusual route to becoming the Bruins' pitching coach.

After playing for the 1990 Metro League champions at Beaverton High School, he joined the Chemeketa Community College team for the 1991 season. He was hired at Lake Oswego as a junior varsity coach in 1993 and stepped up to the head coaching position in 1994 and 1995. During those two seasons, he was the youngest class 4A head coach in Oregon.

Dobson decided to continue his undergraduate degree at George Fox, where he joined the pitching staff as a spot starter and middle reliever. In 1996, he went 2-0 with a save and a 2.6 ERA. His 1997 season was limited to 12 innings because of an elbow injury.

Dobson, 26, is completing his health education degree at George Fox and lives in Newberg.



CRAIG TAYLOR is in his 10th year as George Fox University Athletic Director, but he has been associated with the Bruins for 24 years as player, coach and professor.

Taylor, 46, came to George Fox in 1971 as a junior baseball pitcher and basketball forward. In 1972-73, he helped the basketball Bruins to their first-ever NAIA District 2 title.

Taylor graduated from George Fox in 1974, named both Outstanding Man in Teacher Education and Outstanding Physical Education Major. He received a master of science degree in education from Linfield College in 1975. While enrolled in graduate courses, he was a George Fox residence hall director.

From 1976 through 1979, Taylor was the Bruin baseball coach while also serving as assistant basketball coach. He worked at a sporting goods retailing firm from 1979-81.

The A.D. was the coach of the women's basketball team from 1981-93, producing a 162-155 record. He also coached George Fox softball from 1981-88 and again in 1990. His teams compiled a 77-99-1 record, and in 1985 he was named NAIA District 2 Coach of the Year.

At George Fox, the athletic director is responsible for athletic department functions, including eligibility and compliance with George Fox, conference, NAIA and NCAA regulations, budgeting, and department and sports center management.

Taylor has three children: Leah, 23, Bree, 18, and Casey, 8. Taylor and his wife, Kathy, live in McMinnville.

CURTIS AND MARGARET MORSE COMPLEX

George Fox University baseball, soccer and softball teams have played home games on the Curtis and Margaret Morse Athletic Complex since 1989.

Across from Wheeler Sports Center on Fulton Street and Villa Road, the complex was renovated using a donation from Curtis and Margaret Morse. Using labor from Volunteers on Wheels, new dugouts and a press box were constructed for the baseball field.

The Morse family has a long association with George Fox. Four generations have attended the Newberg school. The baseball diamond was moved to the current

location in the early '80s when construction on Bauman Auditorium displaced the old field.

The baseball facility continues to improve. In 1991, Smurfit Newsprint Corp., Newberg, donated all lumber for an indoor hitting facility located in the northwest corner of the complex.

The baseball Bruins are tough to beat at Morse Field. In the last two years, they've gone 30-2 in Newberg.

Field dimensions are 335 feet down the left-field line, 375 in the left-center-field alley, 400 to straight-away center, 370 in right center and 330 down the right-field line.

THE UNIVERSITY

Founded in 1885 as Friends Pacific Academy, George Fox University is a Christian liberal arts university growing in size and reputation.

In the last 10 years enrollment has quadrupled to more than 2,200 students and *U.S. News and World Report* in 1997 ranked the school second in academic reputation in its western regional liberal arts colleges category.

The magazine also has listed the university in its "Top Teaching Schools" and "Most Efficient" categories.

George Fox offers innovative programs. Each freshman undergraduate is provided a computer to use and keep upon graduating. Students reaching their junior year are eligible for an international study trip for which the university pays transportation costs.

George Fox offers 36 undergraduate and nine graduate degree programs, as well as a degree-completion program for working adults. Classes also are offered in Portland, Salem, Eugene and Boise, Idaho. George Fox became a university in 1996 when it merged with Western Evangelical Seminary in Portland.

The school is named in honor of the founder of the Friends (Quaker) Church.

The University's most prominent alumnus is the late President Herbert Hoover, who attended Friends Pacific Academy.



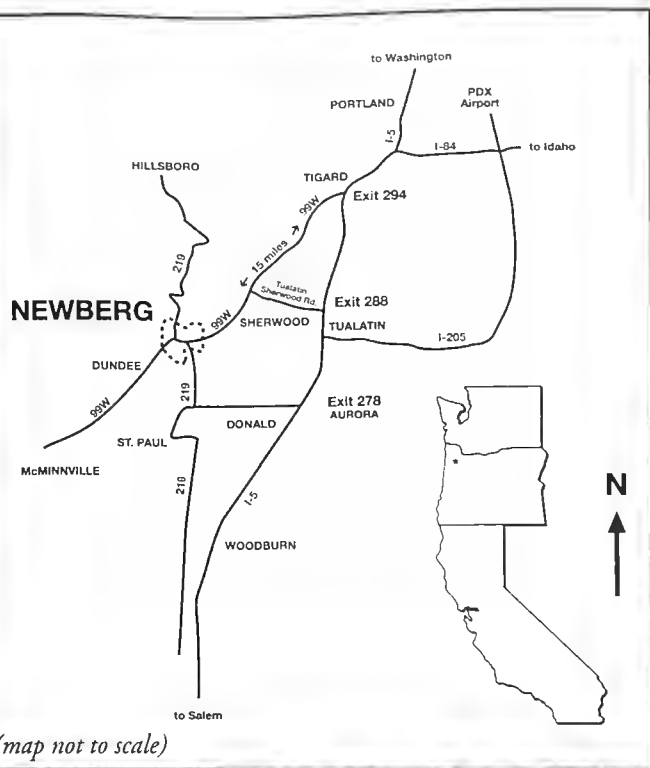
ROUTES TO THE CAMPUS
