11/10 – ALL-CONFERENCE: Steinfeld Earns First Team All-NWC Honors, Cardwell Honorable Mention

NEWBERG, Ore. – Defender **Jill Steinfeld** has been named to the All-Northwest Conference First Team in women's soccer and goalkeeper **Jessica Cardwell** has received Honorable Mention, giving the George Fox University Bruins two all-league honorees for the 2004 season.

Steinfeld, an academic senior with junior eligibility from Portland, Ore., was a key to the Bruins' vastly-improved defense this season from her middle back position. She also proved to be a significant force on offense, contributing four goals and two assists for 10 total points during the season. With plans to graduate this year, she ends her career with seven goals and eight assists for 22 points, tying for 13th all-time in assists at George Fox.

Cardwell, a freshman from Fall Creek, Ore., stepped into the starting lineup at keeper in the fourth game of the season and wound up second in the NWC in saves (147) and saves per game (7.35). She also tied for fourth in shutouts (4) and sixth in shutouts per game (0.20). Her four shutouts equal the fourth-most for a George Fox goalie in one season, and her four career shutouts already rank as the fourth-best total for a Bruin keeper.

Both Steinfeld and Cardwell played major roles in the Bruins' 9-11 season in which they tripled the number of wins from the year before. The Bruins, under third-year coach Andy Hetherington, also climbed in the conference standings to 6th place with a 6-10 league record.

The University of Puget Sound, which won the NWC championship, took all three individual top honors, with Cortney Kjar getting Offensive Player of the Year, Bridget Stolee the Defensive Player of the Year, and Randy Hanson the Coach of the Year. 11/6 - PACIFIC LUTHERAN 1, GEORGE FOX 0: Corner-Kick Goal by Lutes Denies Bruins a .500 Season

NEWBERG, Ore. - A corner-kick goal by Alyssa Burleson with just over seven minutes left in the game gave the visiting Pacific Lutheran University Lutes a 1-0 victory over the George Fox University Bruins in a Northwest Conference women's soccer match in the season-ending game for both teams Saturday here at Morse Field.

The Bruins, hoping for their first break-even season since the 2000 squad went 13-5, had to settle for a final record of 9-11 overall and 6-10 in the conference. Nevertheless, the Bruins showed major improvement this year by tripling their number of wins from a year ago. The Lutes, meanwhile, were able to finish on the positive side of the ledger at 9-8-2, with a 9-6-1 mark in conference play.

The game was a defensive struggle throughout, with PLU getting 20 shots, but only 8 on goal, while George Fox managed 11 shots, but only 4 on goal. Burleson broke the scoreless deadlock with her 2nd goal of the season, hooking a corner kick to the mouth of the goal where it deflected off a Bruin defender just enough to skip past goalkeeper Jessica Cardwell into the left corner of the net at 82:55.

Kim Bosley made 4 saves in goal for the Lutes in posting the shutout, while Cardwell saved 7 for the Bruins.

George Fox honored its two graduating seniors, midfielder Jill Steinfeld and defender Jenn Tyhurst, in pre-game ceremonies at midfield.

11/5 - GEORGE FOX 5, LINFIELD: Welch and Stevens Combine for Five Goals as Bruins Rout Wildcats

McMINNVILLE, Ore. - A trio of goals by Mackenzie Welch and two goals and an assist by Amber Stevens boosted the George Fox University Bruins to a 5-1 Northwest Conference victory over the Linfield College Wildcats in women's soccer action Friday here at the Linfield soccer field.

An own goal by the Bruins in the 34th minute allowed Linfield to take a 1-0 advantage when the Wildcats' Nellie Reuland sent the ball off to the mouth of the goal off a corner kick, where a GFU defender unintentionally deflected the ball into the net. The Bruins needed a little more than two minutes to answer, however, as Welch took a Stevens crossing passing and booted the ball past Linfield goalkeeper Allison Cartmill at 36:45.

Stevens broke the 1-1 tie in the second half with goals in the 66th and 71st minutes to put the contest out of reach. In a cruel twist of fate, however, she had to be helped from the field with 13 minutes remaining after suffering a severe ankle sprain when she and a Linfield player kicked the ball at the same time. Welch scored again at 77:50 and 86:08 to round out the scoring.

The Wildcats out-shot the Bruins 16-14 and held a 5-0 edge in corner kicks, but George Fox made the most of its opportunities, turning the table on the Wildcats. Jessica Cardwell made 7 saves in goal for the Bruins, with Amaris Tronson subbing for her over the final 5:50. Cartmill made 5 saves for the Wildcats.

In sweeping the season series from the Wildcats, the Bruins improved to 9-10 overall and 6-9 in the NWC. Linfield saw its record fall to 4-13-2, 4-10-1 in conference play.

The season ends for both teams Saturday as George Fox welcomes Pacific Lutheran University and Linfield hosts newly-crowned NWC champion University of Puget Sound. Both matches start at 11 a.m., followed by men's games at 1:30 p.m.

10/30 - WILLAMETTE 3, GEORGE FOX 1: Bearcats Overtake Bruins with Second-Half Scoring Spree

SALEM, Ore. - Bunching three second-half goals within a nine-minute span, the Willamette University Bearcats overcame a 1-0 halftime deficit to defeat the George Fox University Bruins 3-1 in a Northwest Conference women's soccer match Saturday afternoon here at Sparks Field.

Julie Alexander put George Fox on top at the 16-minute mark when she scored off an assist from Amber Stevens, tying her for the team lead in goals with Stevens at six apiece. The Bruins made that slim advantage stand up until the second half was 11 minutes old. Allie Tenold tied the game for Willamette in the 56th minute when she converted a Rachel Clevenger pass for her first goal of the season.

Three minutes later, Nicole Dahl scored the game-winner off an assist from Susan Butler. The Bearcats put the game away in the 67th minute when Butler scored a goal of her own, with Clevenger getting her second assist of the game.

Willamette out-shot George Fox 27-8, with Bruin goalie Jessica Cardwell recording 12 saves to keep the game from getting out of hand. Bearcat keeper Kari Woody had five saves.

George Fox slipped to 8-10 overall and 5-9 in the conference, while Willamette improved to 9-6-2 overall and 7-5-1 in league play. The Bruins are off until Friday, when they visit Linfield College for an 11:00 a.m. contest, followed by the men's game at 1:30 p.m. The Bearcats take on Lewis & Clark College Sunday afternoon at McCulloch Stadium in Salem at 11:00 a.m.

NEWBERG, Ore. – A first-half score by Bethany Zirschky and Mackenzie Welch's last-minute insurance goal enabled the George Fox University Bruins to secure a 2-0 win over the Lewis & Clark College Pioneers in a Northwest Conference women's soccer match Sunday afternoon here at Morse Field.

Zirschky recovered a loose ball on the left side of the goalkeeper's box and crossed it into the right corner of the net for her 3rd goal of the season at 25:34 to put the home team on the board. The Bruins made that stand up until there were 44 seconds left in the game, when Welch headed in a cross from the right by Kiersten Luginbill for her 2nd goal of the year.

Nora Germano kept the score close for the Pios by making 19 saves as the Bruins controlled the offense most of the game, taking 31 shots, 21 on goal, to 9 and 7 for Lewis & Clark. Jessica Cardwell made 7 stops for the Bruins in posting her 4th shutout of the season.

The win moved the Bruins within a game of .500 at 8-9 overall, and improved their conference mark to 5-8. The Pioneers dropped to 2-12-1 overall and remained winless in conference play at 0-12 in this, their first intercollegiate soccer season.

Both teams return to action Saturday, George Fox visiting Willamette University and Lewis & Clark traveling to Linfield College. Game times are at 11:00 a.m., due to the weekend daylight savings time changeover. The George Fox-Willamette women's match will be followed by a men's game at 1:30 p.m.

10/23 - PUGET SOUND 7, GEORGE FOX 0: Kjar Jars Bruins with Four Goals as Loggers Roll

TACOMA, Wash. - Northwest Conference scoring leader Cortney Kjar tallied four goals, raising her season total to 16, as the University of Puget Sound cruised to a 7-0 women's soccer victory over the visiting George Fox University Bruins here Saturday afternoon.

The seven goals is a season high for Puget Sound, which entered the game ranked 8th in the latest NSCAA/NCAA Division III national poll. Kjar moved into second place on the Puget Sound all-time single-season scoring list behind Shelly Simmons' record of 20 set during the 1986 campaign.

Kjar got things going early, finishing a penalty kick just 2:41 into the first half after Puget Sound forward Adrienne Folsom was taken down in the box. Folsom would strike herself later in the half, putting the Loggers ahead 2-0 at 17:42. Kjar finished at 38:12 from the top of the penalty box to make the score 3-0.

After the break, Puget Sound put together a scoring burst, scoring four goals in just over five minutes to put the game out of reach. Alex White took an Elizabeth Pitman feed and slotted home her first goal of the season at 47:22. Two minutes later, Victoria Trotta dribbled down the left side and beat Bruin goalkeeper Jessica Cardwell to the lower left corner. Trotta assisted on Kjar's 3rd goal at 52:30. Kjar capped her day 17 seconds later, collecting a Bridget Stolee pass and beating Cardwell for her 4th goal of the day at 52:47.

Cardwell made 11 saves in goal for George Fox, while Erin Williams made two in goal for the Loggers. Amy Quandt took over for Williams with 19:48 remaining and completed Puget Sound's 13th shutout of the season.

George Fox fell to 7-9 overall and 4-8 in the conference, while Puget Sound is now 14-1 overall and remains atop the NWC standings at 11-1. The Bruins return home Sunday, hosting Lewis & Clark College at 12:00 noon. There is no men's game afterward because the Pioneers have no men's soccer team. The Loggers host Whitman College next Saturday at 11:00 a.m.

*** Bruins Come Out of "Hinge of Fate" with 3-2 Record**

Concluding the "hinge of fate" on a high note, the Bruins stunned 6th-ranked Whitworth 4-1 on Oct. 17.

At 7-8, the Bruins have the most wins in a season since going 13-5 in 2000.

NEWBERG, Ore. – Freshman forward Julie Alexander set a new George Fox University single-game record for assists with three, lending a helping foot on each of the Bruins' first three goals in a 4-1 upset of the 6th-ranked Whitworth College Pirates in Northwest Conference women's soccer action Sunday afternoon here at Morse Field.

Alexander crossed from the right corner of the keeper's box to Katlynn Tuttle, who shot the ball into the left corner of the net for the Bruins' first score at 29:52 in the first half. Three minutes later, Alexander passed from the right sideline to Bethany Zirschky coming down the middle for another goal. At 41:36, Alexander sent a long pass from the right side to the front of the net, where Emily Atkinson headed it home, giving the Bruins an insurmountable 3-0 lead.

The league-leading Pirates got one score back at 42:03 on a long goal off an indirect free kick from Marissa Williams, but the Bruins countered with a second-half goal by Jill Steinfeld on a similar play from the center of the field at 49:11. From that point on, it was a matter of the Bruin defense holding on as the Pirates peppered the goal line with 44 shots in the game, 23 of them on goal. Bruin rookie keeper Jessica Cardwell rose to the challenge, making a career-high 21 saves to preserve the victory.

The Bruins offensively were a model of efficiency. Of their 14 shots, 6 were on goal, and they scored on the first four of them.

George Fox improved to 7-8 overall and 4-7 in the conference with its surprise win. Whitworth suffered its first league setback of the season, slipping to 10-3-1 overall and 9-1-1 in the league.

10/13 – GEORGE FOX 2, PACIFIC 0: Bruins Blank Boxers as Stevens Scores Two Goals Again

NEWBERG, Ore. – For the second straight game, freshman forward Amber Stevens scored a pair of goals, leading the George Fox University Bruins to a 2-0 win over the Pacific University Boxers in a Northwest Conference women's soccer match Wednesday afternoon here at Morse Field.

Stevens, who had the Bruins' final two goals in a 4-1 win over Linfield College on Sunday, put the home team on the scoreboard early in the game with an unassisted goal at the 5:20 mark. Pacific goalkeeper Shannon Tillman dove for a free ball near the outer left corner of the keeper's box just before Stevens arrived, but could not control the ball. Stevens made a steal, dribbled around the prone keeper, and shot the ball, which was slightly deflected by another Boxer defender, into the left back of the net.

The Bruin defense made the tenuous one-goal lead stand up, George Fox keeper Jessica Cardwell making 4 saves, until Stevens iced the game with her 2nd score of the game and 6th of the season at the 83:59 mark. Lindsay Jacobs, on a fast break down the right side of the field, passed to Stevens near the outer right corner of the keeper's box. Tillman came out to intercept the pass but again could not get a handle on the ball, and when it rolled free, Stevens had a wide-open shot into the empty net.

Other than the score, the game was evenly played, Pacific getting 13 shots and 4 on goal to 11 and 6 for George Fox. Tillman likewise had 4 saves for the Boxers. Pacific had a 3-2 edge in corner kicks.

In winning two straight conference games for the first time since the 2000 season, the Bruins improved to 6-7 overall, doubling last year's total for wins, and 3-6 in the league. The Boxers dropped to 3-7-1 overall and 2-6-1 in the NWC.

Both teams play at home again Saturday, George Fox hosting Whitman College and Pacific entertaining league-leading Whitworth College at 12:00 noon. Men's games follow at 2:30 p.m.

9/25 – GEORGE FOX 1, LEWIS & CLARK 0: Atkinson's Goal with 11 Seconds Left Lifts Bruins by Pios

PORTLAND, Ore. – Just 11 seconds away from overtime, Emily Atkinson knocked home a shot after a corner kick from Kiersten Luginbill, giving the George Fox University Bruins a 1-0 win over the Lewis & Clark College Pioneers in a Northwest Conference women's soccer match Saturday afternoon here at Griswold Stadium.

The Bruins maintained control virtually throughout the game, the offense taking 22 shots, 10 of them on goal, while the defense held the Pioneers to only five shots total and one on goal. Lewis & Clark keeper Nora Germano fended off nine shots on goal by the Bruins – but not the last one.

Luginbill's corner came with 20 seconds left, and the ball was batted around in front of the goal for several seconds before Atkinson corralled the ball and sent it over Germano's head at 89:49. It was Atkinson's 4th goal of the season, tying her with Julie Alexander for the team lead, and Luginbill's team-high 4th assist of the year. Jessica Cardwell went the distance and recorded the shutout in goal for the Bruins.

The game was the first-ever meeting between the two schools in women's soccer, as this is the first year of intercollegiate competition in the sport for the Pioneers. George Fox evened its overall record at 4-4, surpassing the Bruins' win total for all of last year when they went 3-15-1, and climbed to 1-3 in the NWC. Lewis & Clark fell to 2-3-1 overall and 0-3 in the league.

The Bruins host 3rd-ranked University of Puget Sound and the Pioneers host Pacific University Sunday, both games at 12:00 noon. The GFU-UPS game will be followed by the men's matchup at 2:30 p.m.

9/3 – PREVIEW: Bruins Enter '04 Season with Most Depth and Talent in Hetherington Era

NEWBERG, Ore. – With seven returning starters and 15 new players, all of whom are expected to see considerable playing time, third-year George Fox University women's soccer coach **Andy Hetherington** is more excited than ever about the direction his program is headed.

"We just didn't have much depth my first two years, and that sometimes put us at a competitive disadvantage," recalls Hetherington. "This season, we are two-deep at almost every position, and we have some utility players who can play anywhere. I am quite pleased with our overall quality; we are going to be young, though."

The Bruins return seven letterwinners, all starters, from last year's team that went 3-15-1 overall and 1-13, finishing 8th, in the Northwest Conference. The biggest loss for the Bruins was First Team All-Conference forward **Brooke Erickson**, who tied for the league lead in goals scored (15) while tying the George Fox record for most goals in a season.

"Replacing Brooke is obviously a considerable task, but if it takes three good players to replace one of her caliber, I think we've done it," says Hetherington, pointing to newcomers **Amber Stevens** (Fr., Medford, Ore. / South Medford HS), **Mackenzie Welch** (Fr., Bend, Ore. / Bend HS), and **Julie Alexander** (Fr., Salt Lake City, Utah / Brighton HS) as probable starters at forward. "Amber is extremely quick, one of the quickest I've ever coached, and the other two have shown an excellent ability to get the ball into the goal when given the opportunity."

Honorable Mention All-Conference midfielder **Emily Atkinson** (So., Fircrest, Wash. / Henry Foss HS) is back to anchor the middle, flanked by returning starters **Kiersten Luginbill** (So., Caledonia, Ill. / Christian Life HS) and **Lindsay Jacobs** (So., Bend, Ore. / Mountain View HS). Atkinson scored 4 goals and had 1 assist, Luginbill a goal and 7 assists, and Jacobs 4 assists in their rookie seasons.

The entire defensive line is also back, led by **Jenn Tyhurst** (Sr., Oregon City, Ore. / Canby HS), the team's lone senior, in the middle. Joining her are **Jill Steinfeld** (Jr., Portland, Ore. / Sunset HS), **Melissa Noyd** (So., Salem, Ore. / Sprague HS), and **Lacey Holman** (So., Yakima, Wash. / Naches Valley HS).

"With so many returnees, we have maintained our strength at midfield and on defense while adding to our depth," notes Hetherington. "Our outside mids have been reinforced with **Bethany Zirschky** (Fr., Gig Harbor, Wash. / Gig Harbor HS), **Kelli Roots** (Fr., Grants Pass, Ore. / Grants Pass HS), and **Katie Tuttle** (Fr., East Wenatchee, Wash. / Eastmont HS). At center mid, we can use **Heidi Meador** (So., Jacksonville, Ore. / South Medford HS), a transfer who played at Colorado Christian last year, and **Ali Reti** (Fr., Keizer, Ore. / McNary HS)."

For defensive depth, Hetherington can call on high school teammates **Stephanie DeGraff** (Fr., Aloha, Ore. / Aloha HS) and **Melanie Wagner** (Fr., Aloha, Ore. / Aloha HS). Also available are several versatile new players who can play almost anywhere, including **Cherie Beck** (Fr., Renton, Wash. / Liberty HS), **Rachael Skjelstad** (Fr., Springfield, Ore. / Thurston HS), and **Brittany Anselmi** (Fr., Bothell, Wash. / Bothell HS).

"Cherie will be a tremendous asset to us; she is so versatile that we can use her anywhere on the field," Hetherington remarks. "Rachael will probably play on defense, although she can also handle midfield. I see Brittany as an outside mid, but she has played both on offense and defense in the past."

Hetherington is particularly pleased with his two new goalkeepers, **Amaris Tronson** (So., Cashmere, Wash. / Cashmere HS), a starter as a freshman last year at California Baptist University, and **Jessica Cardwell** (Fr., Fall Creek, Ore. / Thurston HS). "Amaris has the experience and will probably start," the coach predicts, "but Jessica will definitely see a lot of playing time."

In summarizing his team's prospects for the coming year, Hetherington says, "The key to this season is our improved depth and flexibility. We are more than capable of playing or adjusting to any system or formation, but it will be a great challenge to get our players to meld, to find that right shape and balance while they are on the field.

"We'll be very young, of course, with 19 of our 22 players either freshmen or sophomores. Our skill and enthusiasm must make up for our lack of experience. I am cautiously optimistic that we can make as big a jump in our competitiveness from last year to this year as we did from my first season to my second."

The 2004 season opens Saturday, Sept. 4, with a visit to Western Baptist College in Salem, Ore., for a 1:00 p.m. contest. The Bruins' first home game is Friday, Sept. 10, against Cascade College, the last of four non-conference games before the Northwest Conference lidlifter at Pacific University on Sept. 15.
