WELCOME TO GEORGE FOX COLLEGE'S COLEMAN H. WHEELER SPORTS CENTER

CONTAINING THE JAMES AND LILA MILLER GYMNASIUM

George Fox College welcomes you to tonight's game. We're glad you're here. You're in the Coleman H. Wheeler Sports Center, designed by noted architect Pietro Belluschi to fit with the nearby wooded canyon setting. The building is a \$2.4 million, 51,000 square-foot complex featuring athletic administration and faculty offices, a staff room, class, weight, and multipurpose rooms on the upper level. On the lower level are concession and ticket areas, dressing rooms, six team rooms, and equipment and storage areas. The building also has upper and lower lobbies and two handball courts.

The Miller Gymnasium is 116 by 174 feet with three basketball courts and seating for up to 2,500 spectators in its 20,184 square feet. The floor is of hardwood maple and also provides three volleyball courts and five badminton courts.

Constructed over a period of 10 months, its building is George Fox's largest and one of the most used facilities. The entire center is three times larger than Hester Gym, which it replaced, and is the fourth gymnasium in the college's 86 years. It is named for Coleman H. Wheeler, former chairman of the board of Willamette Industries and a long-



time friend of the college. The gymnasium is named for James Miller, a George Fox board member and former owner of Cascadia Lumber Company, and his wife Lila. They were the original donors to the capital campaign that provided the new center, which was formally dedicated October 17, 1977.

ABOUT GEORGE FOX COLLEGE

George Fox College is the outgrowth of a desire by early Willamette Valley Quaker settlers who established Pacific Academy in 1885 for the Christian education of their children. The college division was organized in 1891 to provide more advanced instruction for students. In 1949, because of the many colleges in the Northwest with Pacific in their name, the college was renamed George Fox in honor of the founder of the Friends (Quaker) Church. The college is governed by a 42-member Board of Trustees elected by Northwest Yearly Meeting of Friends Church, which comprises more than 8,300 members in 56 churches in Oregon, Washington, and Idaho.

Today the 60-acre rural, tree-shaded campus a half-hour drive from Portland is undergoing a major expansion with four new buildings completed last year, including a new \$2.4 million sports complex, an \$800,000 academic building, and two new residence halls in a \$1.25 million project. A new \$1.3 million fine arts/religion center was opened in the fall of 1978, a new television production studio building is under construction to open in 1979, and a new athletic field complex, including baseball field, two softball fields, hockey field and archery range is being readied, to open in the fall of 1979. Enrollment is at a record 715. The college has grown 50 percent in five years.

Accredited by the Northwest Association of Secondary and Higher Schools, the college offers 20 majors in six divisions: Education, Fine and Applied Arts, Language Arts, Natural Science, Religion, and Social Science. George Fox is one of 14 members of the national Christian College Consortium. The college has student-faculty ratio of 16/1, with nearly 60 percent of faculty members having doctorates.

George Fox students come from 23 states and 5 foreign countries. Nearly 40 religious denominations are represented on campus.

GFC ATHLETICS

Intercollegiate athletics is an integral part of the overall education program at George Fox. Men's varsity athletic teams represent the college in baseball, basketball, track, soccer, and cross-country.

George Fox College competes as an independent on the varsity level. Its schedules are coordinated with both the Evergreen Conference and the Northwest Conference and with other independents in the Northwest. George Fox is a member of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA), District 2.

Women students compete in field hockey, volleyball, cross-country, basketball, tennis, track, and softball. The college is a member of the Women's Conference of Independent Colleges and the Northwest College Women's Sports Association.

For students not participating in the varsity program, GFC has a complete intramural program including flag football, basketball, volleyball, softball, and tennis.

Athletic facilities include the new Coleman H. Wheeler Center for Sports and Physical Education; Colcord Field, which includes a football/soccer field and track; and tennis courts. A new athletic field complex containing baseball diamond, two softball fields, hockey field, and archery range is under construction, to be completed by the fall of 1979.

Wheeler Center, completed in 1977 in a \$2.4 million project, includes the James and Lila Miller Gymnasium with three basketball courts and seating for up to 2,700; multipurpose, class, and weight rooms; faculty and administrative offices; handball courts; dressing and therapy rooms; and saunas.

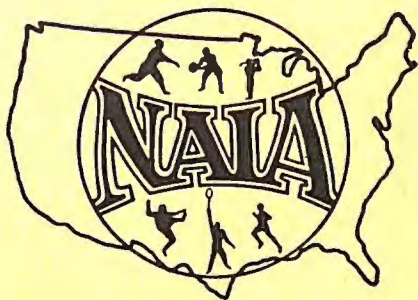

NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF INTERCOLLEGIATE ATHLETICS



Dear Basketball Fan:

Undoubtedly the goal of the more than 500 National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics institutions sponsoring varsity basketball programs is the 42nd NAIA National Championship Basketball Tournament to be held in Kansas City's Kemper Arena March 12-17, 1979. The NAIA tournament is the world's largest and oldest collegiate basketball tournament. Inaugurated in 1937 this week-long basketball marathon has been adopted by Kansas City area sports fans and annually attracts basketball devotees from across the United States and around the world.

TONIGHT: GEORGE FOX, LINFIELD TANGLE IN REMATCH

George Fox College opens its 1978-79 home stand tonight. And the Bruins are hoping the confines of Miller Gymnasium bring better results than the first four games, all on the road. The 0-4 Bruins have not had such a bad start since the 1969-70 season, and they're hoping tonight's the turnaround as Yamhill County rival Linfield College visits.

It won't be easy, however. The Bruins and Wildcats, both with new looks following the losses via graduation of NAIA All-Americans, tangled Wednesday night in McMinnville. George Fox took a 107-84 loss, the worst at the hand of the Wildcats since 1972, when the two schools first met in NAIA competition. Over the years George Fox still has the advantage, however, winning 12 of the 20 contests. Linfield brings a 3-1 record into tonight's game, having finished third in the NAIA District 2 Tip-Off Tournament last weekend with a 91-70 win over Warner Pacific, a 98-78 loss to Southern Oregon, then a 105-102 triumph over Western Baptist.

Meanwhile, without the services of senior captain Dave Adrian, the Bruins were stumbling, losing in order to Southern Oregon (98-82), Warner Pacific (73-68), and Pacific (85-83). Adrian, a 6-4 forward and the team's leading scorer among the expected starters (17.1 last year), has been missing from the lineup with a severe knee strain and also will miss tonight's action.

Coach Sam Willard says Adrian "will make a difference" when he's back, but sees the early-season experiences with some benefits. "I'm far from being displeased with what I'm seeing," he says. "If we take this [season beginning] for what it has been—a learning experience—I think we'll find it was very good for us."

After four games the Bruins have a 79.3 scoring average and opponents 90.8. In rebounding, GFC is averaging 40.3 and opponents 44.3. The scoring leadership is being taken by senior guard Gary Chenault at 17.3, followed by freshman guard Tim Adrian (pictured) at 13.8. Freshman center Mike Peregrin is the rebounding leader with an 8.18 average.

Following tonight's contest the Bruins have a week's layoff before meeting Willamette in Salem Dec. 16. George Fox hosts its first "Bruin Classic" Dec. 21-22, an eight-team affair featuring four high schools and four colleges, in two days of basketball action in Miller Gymnasium.

COACH SAM WILLARD

Sam J. Willard is in his third season at the George Fox basketball helm. And it's been a winning first two years. In his first year Willard took the Bruins to a 20-9 record, the best ever in the school's history and the first time a 20-win season had been reached. And last season the Bruins posted a 15-14 record (16-13 on the court, but one game forfeited with an ineligible player). Both seasons under Willard the Bruins have been in the NAIA District 2 playoffs.

The new Willard era began May 15, 1977, as he was named head basketball coach and athletic director to replace Lorin Miller. He officially began those duties three months later. The dual role is not unfamiliar to Willard: he held similar duties at Big Bend Community College in Moses Lake, Wash., for seven years before being chosen for the George Fox positions.

Willard's selection in itself is a measure of his qualities: he was the top choice for the post after a screening committee considered dozens of candidates from across the nation. Maintaining a winning tradition was a strong factor, but equally important were the personal attributes and characteristics reflecting the George Fox objectives.

Coaching has been Willard's background for the last 17 years. It's been impressive with an overall coaching record of 310 wins and 184 losses. In 1966 the Bruin mentor was Coach of the Year on the prep level in Idaho while he coached at Caldwell High. Willard guided basketball at Middleton from 1960 through 1965, then spent four years, until 1969, at

Caldwell. His teams were in the state tournaments seven of those nine years, placing at least third each year. He coached his team to the state championship title twice, one year with an undefeated 27-0 mark.

Willard, 43 (June 4, 1935), has his own personal basketball mark, too. A graduate of Northwest Nazarene College in 1959 Willard, in a guard slot, helped the Crusaders to the NAIA national championship playoffs in 1957. A "preacher's kid," Willard played high school ball in Williston, North Dakota, where he was an All-State guard.

With a real concern for the individual as a person as well as a player, Willard, basically a quiet person, says he has only "total excitement and optimism" about the Bruin program.

Academically, Willard holds a master's degree from Central Washington State following summer sessions at Oregon State and Arizona State. That knowledge is used now as an associate professor of physical education.

Willard has coached summer basketball camps and clinics in Washington, Oregon, and California. He has his own Mt. Shasta Camp in Northern California and assisted last summer with Portland Trail Blazer Coach Jack Ramsay's summer camps held on the George Fox campus.

Willard is an active Kiwanian and a member of the Nazarene Church. He and his wife Myrna, a Newberg kindergarten teacher, have four children: Shereyn, 15, Samantha, 12, Buntly, 11, and Whitney, 10.
