# No More Surprises

*Five returning starters and five seniors bolster the Bruins’ chances in the Northwest Conference*

With 5 starters returning and 5 seniors to provide experienced leadership, the George Fox University Bruins have every expectation of another fine women’s volleyball season in 2002 — but veteran coach Steve Grant knows that nothing comes easy in the rugged Northwest Conference.

“We caught some people by surprise last year,” admits Grant, whose Bruins were picked to finish 7th in the league, but wound up at 19-5 overall and 3rd in the NWC at 11-5. “With the players we have returning, that won’t happen this year.”

George Fox was picked to finish 4th in the conference this season behind defending league champion Whitworth, nationally ranked Puget Sound, and Pacific Lutheran, but the Bruins expect to at least be competitive with the upper crust again.

### All-Conference Returnees

Last year, the Bruins ranked 9th nationally in digs (24.34), 20th in assists (13.36), and 22nd in kills (14.85), and most of the key players who produced those statistics are back, including 3 who received All-Conference honors of one sort or another.

Leading the list of returnees is setter **Mindi Cotner** (Sr., Keizer, Ore.), a First Team All-Conference selection who finished 21st nationally in assists (11.88) and 22nd in digs (5.03). The team’s Most Valuable Player, she also earned Verizon/CoSIDA Academic All-District VIII Second Team honors.

“Any team relies on its setter, and with Mindi, we have one of the very best in the conference and certainly one of the best ever at George Fox,” says Grant. “She is a gifted athlete whose leadership skills — which have improved every year — are superb; she

inspires confidence in the others on the court.”

Middle blocker **Shelly Schultens** (Sr., The Dalles, Ore.) was a Second Team All-Conference pick while leading the NWC and placing 23rd nationally in blocks (1.53), and won the team’s Best Offensive Player award while averaging 3.23 kills per game. Says Grant, “Shelly is another key for us this season. She increased her offensive productivity significantly last year by cutting down on her errors, and we look for her to turn it up another notch this year.”

Outside hitter **Nicole Bostic** (Jr., Lake Stevens, Wash.) received All-Conference Honorable Mention after finishing 19th in the nation in digs (5.13), a figure that both led the conference and set a new George Fox single-season record, with a team-leading 3.56 kills per game. Grants admits that “she’s a little short for an outside hitter, but makes up for it with outstanding jumping ability and good control. Plus, she is really fast and an excellent defender.”

### Other Veterans

**Brandy Mailer** (Sr., Honolulu, Hawaii) returns as a right-side hitter with numbers of 2.36 kills and 4.32 digs per game. “At 5-9, she’s probably a little short for that position, but she is such a smart player with an excellent eye for the holes on the opponents’ court. She is also a great decision maker and ball handler.”

**Angie Frank** (Sr., Antelope, Ore.) is also back as a defensive specialist who averaged 2.20 digs per game. “Angie’s defense and serving ability will keep her starting, although her time on the court may decrease somewhat because of the new libero rule,” says Grant, “but she’s a team player and is willing to do whatever it takes to help the team win.”

The team’s 5th senior, **Lacey Langmade** (Sr., Camas, Wash.), appears ready to take over at left-side hitter after averaging 1.57 kills and 1.88 digs a game off the bench. “Lacey is hitting with more pace and better location, and has good height (5-10) for

that position,” notes Grant.

Also returning is middle blocker **Jeni Nelson** (Jr., Seattle, Wash.), whose stint as a summer missionary in Tibet drained her physically and will limit her court time until she regains full strength.

Eight Freshmen Join Squad

**Angela Burright** (Fr., Brooks, Ore.) and **Haley Stapleton** (Fr., Dallas, Ore.) should see the most action among the team’s 8 incoming freshmen. Burright, at 6-2, will be the tallest middle blocker the Bruins have ever had, and could challenge for a starting role with her surprising mobility and good arm swing. Stapleton will also see plenty of playing time with her quickness, ball control, excellent passing ability, and good back-row attacking skills.

**Ashley Glisson** (Fr., Gresham, Ore.), an excellent outside hitter and passer with an unusual level of understanding of the game, took time off from the

game last year after playing for one of the state’s elite programs at Sam Barlow High. Considered by Grant to be one of the program’s most important recruits, he says “I fully expect her to be either a starter or major contributor this season.”

**Melissa Farrens** (Fr., Vancouver, Wash.) is another middle blocker and intelligent hitter who would have pushed for starting time, but an ankle injury will put her out for the first 6 to 8 weeks of the season. **Libby Rietze** (Fr., Kodiak, Alaska), the lone lefty on the team, is a strong and aggressive right-side hitter who only needs to develop defensively to contribute.

**Jamie Schantin** (Fr., West Linn, Ore.) will back up Cotner at setter, but Grant calls her a “fiery, determined, leader type whom I have a lot of confidence in, and will make it a point to provide her with playing time as she develops for the future.”

**Amy Roseberg** (Fr., Central Point,

Ore.) is an outside hitter who has shown dramatic improvement in pre-season workouts but is still a ways off from major court time. Rounding out the roster and providing defense depth is defensive specialist **Mikey Roberts** (Fr., Pacific Palisades, Calif.)

Solid Nucleus but Difficult Schedule

“With the veterans we have, we’re pretty solid as a unit and experienced,” says Grant, “but we’re probably a bit shorter than we need to be, especially among the outside hitters. However, that hasn’t stopped us in the past. We’ll be fine in the middle and defensively. We will rely heavily, of course, on our returning players, and if we can decrease our unforced errors, we have a chance against the top teams. I also like this group of freshmen, which is the largest freshman class we’ve had in a while.

“The preconference portion of our schedule is very, very difficult, however, and I don’t think we can realistically expect to match last year’s start (the Bruins opened with a 7-0 run). We open up in the Gettysburg Tournament and will face the No. 3 team in the nation (Juniata), then go to Whitworth the next weekend, where we will play several strong NAIA and Division II and III teams. If we focus strictly on winning, we may be disappointed, but if we can concentrate on getting better from game to game, we should be ready once the conference season starts.”

Grant enters his 21st season at George Fox with a record of 450-271 (.624), having won his 450th match with a 3-0 win over Lewis & Clark at home on the last night of the season. He enters the 2002 campaign among the top 20 in career wins among active NCAA Division III coaches.

## Coaches

## Steve Grant

Head Coach

**S**teve Grant, whose tenure at George Fox University is the longest of any current coach, begins his 21st season with the Bruins volleyball team, having established the program as one of the most consistent winners in the nation during that time.

In Grant's 20 years at George Fox, the Bruins have ended the season on the winning side of the ledger 17 times, including last year's 19-5 record with a 3rd-place finish in the Northwest Conference at 11-5. He guided the program to a string of 13 straight winning records from 1987 through 1999.

With a career record of 450-271 (.624), all at George Fox, Grant ranks 16th on the list for victories among active NCAA Division III coaches, and 24th on the all-time list of D-III coaches. He recorded his 450th career win when the Bruins defeated Lewis & Clark on the final night of the 2001 season.

Grant's teams have made their mark in postseason play as well. While a member of the National Christian College Athletic Association, George Fox won NCCAA national championships in 1984 (30-10) and 1987 (33-22), and each time he was named NCCAA National Coach of the Year. While holding dual membership in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics at the same time, he was named NAIA District 2 Coach of the Year for leading the Bruins to outstanding seasons in 1984 and 1990 (31-13).

Two Grant-coached teams have won conference championships. His very first team in 1982 (17-14) captured the crown in the Women's Conference of Independent Colleges, the predecessor to the Northwest Conference. In 1998, while a dual member of both the NAIA and the NCAA, the Bruins went 31-8, won the Northwest Conference regular season and tournament titles, and reached the NAIA National Tournament in Kankakee, Ill., for the only time in team history. Grant was named NWC Coach of the Year for that success.

During the 1990s, 5 of his athletes won NAIA All-American awards, and 5 were named NAIA All-American Scholar-Athletes.

In addition to his volleyball duties, Grant serves as an associate professor in the health and human performance department, and was a men's basketball assistant coach at George Fox until 1995.

Grant is a 1969 graduate of Biola University, where he was a 3-sport athlete. As a guard for the basketball team, he was named team MVP both his junior and senior years. He earned First Team All-Conference, All-District, and All-Far West hon-



ors as an Eagles' defender on the soccer team, and played baseball his freshman and junior years. He remained at his alma mater upon graduation for 2 years as a basketball and soccer assistant coach.

In 1971, Grant moved to Salem, Ore., to become head boys' basketball coach and head baseball coach at Salem Academy. In 1975, he switched from baseball to volleyball. From 1981 to 1982, Grant coached the women's basketball team and was head men's soccer coach at Western Baptist College in Salem.

Grant, who also earned a master's degree in education at Linfield College in 1985, lives in Newberg with his wife, Kathy, an admission counselor for the Department of Professional Studies at George Fox. They have 2 children: Jeff, 30, and Bryan, 27.

## Scott Cornwall

Assistant Coach

**S**cott Cornwall, who teaches a youth Sunday school class and assists with the youth ministry at Newberg Friends Church, brings that same passion for helping young people to the George Fox University volleyball program this year as one of the Bruins' new assistant coaches.

Cornwall, 27, replaces longtime Bruin assistant Mike McConaughy, who decided after 11 years of assisting head coach Steve Grant to concentrate on his duties as an English and drama instructor at Newberg's C.S. Lewis Community School and Chehalem Valley Academy.

A baseball and basketball player at Nampa (Idaho) High School, from which he graduated in 1993, Cornwall got his





exposure to volleyball when he played in a tournament for Friends churches at George Fox and was captivated by the game. With no team at his high school, he became involved in Nampa city league volleyball.

Upon graduation, Cornwall worked for a year with Micron Computers in Idaho, then moved to Oregon and worked for a year at the Twin Rocks Friends Camp on the Oregon coast. He coached at Mountain View Middle School in Newberg for 3 years and worked with volleyball club teams at Newberg High School for 5 years. Two years ago, he assisted George Fox players Mindi Cotner and Angie Frank, who were also working with club teams at the high school. This past year, he served as an educational assistant and coached the Junior Varsity Two team for sophomores at NHS.

The 1999-2000 year saw Cornwall enrolled at George Fox, and he hopes eventually to complete his education at the university, possibly in biblical studies.

Amy Forbes, who played for the Bruins 1998-2000, is back for her 2nd year as an assistant volleyball coach while continuing graduate studies at her alma mater.



In her 3-year career at George Fox, Forbes totaled 291 kills, 284 digs, and 27 blocks while hitting .107 as an outside hitter. As a senior, she earned Honorable Mention All-Northwest Conference honors while finishing 12th in the conference in kills per game (2.64). She led the Bruins in kills per game and total attacks (662), was 2nd in kills (185) and

attack pct. (.137), and had 164 digs and 15 blocks.

Forbes also starred for the Bruins in track, winning the NWC high jump in 2000 and 2001.

A native of Jackson, Wyo., Forbes was a 3-sport star in volleyball, basketball, and track at Jackson Hole High, earning All-Wyoming West Conference honors in volleyball and winning the state high jump as a senior. She received a psychology degree from George Fox in 2001. She is single and lives in Tigard, Ore.

Bree Stairs

Assistant Coach

Bree Stairs, a former volleyball player for the Bruins, returns this year to begin her college coaching career.

Stairs competed for the Bruins during the 1999 and 2000 seasons, appearing in 43 matches and sparkling on defense



with 165 digs in her career. She also recorded 15 kills, 4 assists, 4 blocks, and a pair of service aces during that time.

A native of McMinnville, Ore., Stairs played volleyball and softball at McMinnville High, earning Honorable Mention All-Pacific 8 honors in volleyball as a senior.

Stairs, 23, comes from an athletics background. Her mother, Kathy, played volleyball at Western Oregon, while her father, Craig Taylor, played basketball and baseball at George Fox and has been the school's director of athletics for 14 years.

Having earned a degree in elementary education from George Fox in 2001, she now works as a substitute teacher. She is single and resides in Beaverton, Ore.

From Out of Nowhere

The Bruins surprised the Northwest Conference with a third-place, 19-5 finish

Picked to finish 7th in the Northwest Conference preseason coaches' poll, the George Fox University volleyball team stunned the conference with a 19-5 record and 11-5 league mark in 2001, finishing 3rd. It was an 11-game improvement over the previous year's 7-15 mark and was the 17th winning season in Steve Grant's 20 years as the Bruins' coach.

George Fox won 7 straight to start the season, including 4 in a row to win the Whittier (Calif.) Tournament. That hot start enabled the Bruins to advance as high as 16th in the nation in the early going. The Bruins were undefeated (8-0) in nonconference play. In conference play, their biggest win came in a 3-1 victory at home over nationally-ranked Puget Sound, ending the Loggers' 26-game winning streak in conference play.

Junior setter Mindi Cotner of Keizer, Ore., was NWC Player of the Week for Sept. 17-23 and was a First Team All-Conference selection, finishing 21st nationally in assists (11.88) and 22nd in digs (5.03). She was named the team's Most Valuable Player, and also earned Verizon/CoSIDA Academic All-District VIII Second Team honors.

Junior middle blocker Shelly Schultens of the The Dalles,



(14.85). Bruin coach Steve Grant completed his 20th season as the Bruins coach with a record of 450-271 (.624), winning his 450th match with a 3-0 decision over Lewis & Clark at home on the last night of the season. He entered the 2001 campaign with the 16th-most wins among active NCAA Division III coaches (431).

Ore., was a Second Team All-Conference pick while leading the NWC and placing 23rd nationally in blocks (1.53), and won the team's Best Offensive Player award.

Sophomore outside hitter Nicole Bostic of Spokane, Wash., (Honorable Mention All-Conference) finished 19th in the nation in digs (5.13), a figure that both led the conference and set a new George Fox single-season record.

Other individual honors went to junior hitter Brandy Mailer of Ashland, Ore., as Best Defensive Player, sophomore middle blocker Jeni Nelson of Seattle, Wash., as Most Improved Player, and senior hitter/defensive specialist Heidi Vander Stoep of Woodland, Wash., as Most Inspirational Player.

As a team, George Fox was 9th nationally in digs (24.34), 20th in assists (13.36), and 22nd in kills

field) and 6 for men (soccer, cross country, basketball, baseball, tennis, and track and field). More than 15 per-cent of George Fox’s traditional under-graduate students participate in these sports. I ntercollegiate athletics are an important part of George Fox University, home to one of the Northwest’s most successful small-col-lege sports programs. Winning pro-grams, of course, are accompanied by a proper balance between academics and athletics. Accordingly, George Fox teams are members of the Northwest Conference and compete in Division III of the National Collegiate Athletic Association, in which need and aca-demic ability, not athleticism, deter-mine scholarships and financial aid.

A t George Fox University, student-athletes compete for conference and national titles at a Christ-centered university where professors and coach-es help them grow in mind, body, and

spirit. Intercollegiate athletics competi-tion provides for practical application of what is learned in the classroom and at practice. At George Fox, the values of athletics are integrated with the goals of Christian higher education in a process that includes

Wheeler Sports Center

E ntered by crossing a wooded canyon on a 200-foot bridge, the Wheeler Sports Center, home of the George Fox Bruins vol-leyball and men’s and women’s basketball teams, is a natural place to place sports of all sorts.

The sports center was designed by noted architect Pietro Belluschi to sit unpreten-tiously on the northeast side of the campus alongside tree-shaded Hess Creek canyon. Built using gifts from prominent lumber-men, the building features a two-level oak parquet lobby and a large window area overlooking the adjacent natural terrain.

Completed in June 1977, the \$2.7 mil-lion, 55,000-square-foot complex is the uni-versity’s largest building. The building may be entered on two levels. The east-side ground level is accessible from the parking lot by crossing the footbridge. The on-campus community enters on the west-side 2nd floor.

The Wheeler Sports Center’s main feature is the James and Lila Miller Gymnasium, home court for Bruins volleyball and



men’s and women’s basketball, with a total seating capacity of 2,750. Measuring 116 x 174, the gym contains three full-length bas-ketball courts, three volleyball courts, and 10 badminton courts. The ceilings are 32 feet above the hardwood maple floor.

Adjacent to the gym on the upper level are a staff room, multipurpose room, class-rooms, and athletics administration and fac-ulty offices. The building’s weight room was remodeled and expanded during the summer of 2002 and now contains 1,800 square feet of floor space. On the lower level are a concessions area, dressing rooms, team rooms, laundry facilities, an equipment-issuing room, and storage space. An east wing of the building houses two racquetball courts.

The center is named for longtime Oregon lumberman Coleman H. Wheeler, former chairman of the board of Willamette Industries. The gymnasium is named for James Miller, a former George Fox board member and president of Cascadia Lumber Co., and his wife, Lila.
