Outlook

Bailey on Bruin Baseball in 2001: "We're not Rebuilding – We're Reloading!"

By all accounts, the 2000 George Fox University baseball season was a rousing success: a 31-10 overall record, second-best in team history; a Northwest Conference championship at 18-6 in league play; a first-time trip to the NCAA Division III West Region playoffs, where the team was seeded No. 1; a No. 19 final national ranking; and the No. 6 staff earned run average in the country.

But six players from that team who earned All-Conference honors of one kind or another are gone. The question has to be asked – can the Bruins come anywhere close to those numbers again while trying to replace so many quality players?

"We had the same question at the start of last year, when we lost so much offense from our record-setting 1999 team," recalls Pat Bailey. The 2000 NWC Coach of the Year, Bailey enters his sixth season as the Bruins' coach with a 142-61 record. "Now we've lost two key pitchers, most of our strength up the middle, plus the leading base-stealer in the conference. There's no doubt we have major holes to fill.

"But I watch our pitching staff in practice, and they've really bought in to the concept of throwing strikes and giving up very few walks. We've been playing good defense. And this is our best recruiting class ever as far as a combination of junior college and freshman prospects goes. But no one individual has the superior talent some of our best players from the past have had.

"Others might want to call this a 'rebuilding' year – but I say we're 'reloading'!"

Pitching

The 2000 staff, whose 2.96 ERA was sixth-best in the nation, was anchored by Third Team All-American Ryan Alvis, who was 11-3 with a league-leading 1.87 ERA and 93 strikeouts. Kess Romano, another First Team All-Conference hurler, was 9-1 with a 2.49

ERA and won a school-record 25 games in his career. Both are gone, but ready to take over is southpaw **Paul Andrewjeski (Sr., Vancouver, Wash.)**, who was 6-1 with a 2.51 ERA and 67 strikeouts, and could have been a No. 1 starter on almost any other team in the conference.

"Paul got serious in the off-season about increasing his strength," says Bailey. "He hit the weight room and has put on about 15 pounds, all muscle, so he's added at least three miles an hour to his fastball. I wouldn't be afraid to send him out there against anybody."

After Andrewjeski, the rotation is a question mark – but only because there

are so many choices! Says Bailey with a smile, "We go eight deep; there are eight guys I believe can go out there and give us a chance to win. There's no Alvis who can blow the ball by people, but we'll have a hard time deciding on our top four."

Among the returning hurlers vying for spots in the rotation are right-handers **Matt Sievers (Jr., Albany, Ore.)**, who was 0-0, 4.19 in 19+ innings, and **Brody Wilson (Jr., Eugene, Ore.)**, who was 2-2, 5.88 with a record-tying four saves, along with lefty **Damon Lorenz (Sr., Gaston, Ore.)**, who was 0-0, 6.23 in 8+ innings.

"Sievers is a three-pitch guy who has thrown well in the fall," says Bailey. "Lorenz could give us two lefties in the rotation. Wilson, who ought to be in our top four with his good slider, needs only consistency."

Mike Beck (Fr., Livermore, Calif.), a medical redshirt after injuring his arm early last season, and **Mitch Sheppler (So., Portland, Ore.)**, who made only one mound appearance in '00, are right-handers who could also help, as could newcomers **Glenn Boss (Jr., Beaverton, Ore.)**, a righty, and southpaw **Cory Dixon (Fr., Springfield, Ore.)**.

"Boss comes from a strong tradition at Beaverton High, where he was a Second Team All-Stater, and Dixon has impressed me with his outstanding maturity for a freshman," says Bailey.

Rounding out the staff and providing occasional bullpen help will be returnee **Jake Johnson (So., Newberg, Ore.)** and newcomers **Seann Hammon (Fr., Port Orchard, Wash.)**, **Logan Evjen (Jr., Aurora, Ore.)**, and **Luke Wolf (Jr., Boise, Idaho)**. Johnson is the only lefty in the group.

Outlook

Catching

Derek Birley, a First Team All-Conference backstop who tied a team and NCAA Division III record when he became the 10th player in D-III history to hit four home runs in a game against Whitworth on May 12, is back – but only as an assistant coach. Three candidates are bidding to replace the slugger: returnee **Michael Halverson (So., Redmond, Wash.)**, who had two hits in three at-bats, redshirt **Bryce Anderson (So., Makawao, Hawaii)**, and newcomer **Greg Dombek (Fr., Vaughn, Wash.)**.

“Until someone takes charge, we’ll probably use a two-man rotation,” predicts Bailey. “Each has his own strength, although they all throw well. Defensively, I like Dombek best. Halverson hits well and gives us a lefty bat; Anderson probably throws the best and has the most power potential.”

Infield

The Bruins led the Northwest Conference with a .957 fielding average last year, a stellar defensive infield being a large part of that. Three-fourths of that infield is back, with only second baseman David Farrell, a career .362 hitter and Honorable Mention All-NWC last year, not returning.

The left side of the diamond is in the excellent hands of **Aaron Bliss (Sr., Hillsboro, Ore.)** at third and **Paul Gramenz (Jr., Sequim, Wash.)** at shortstop. Bliss batted .285 with 24 RBI while Gramenz was a .269 hitter and knocked in 20. “Both bring us leadership and mental toughness,” says Bailey. “They are consistent on offense, are good clutch hitters, and are outstanding defensively. Bliss is one of the best I’ve seen at throwing on the run.”

Over at first, **Kyle Langeliers (Jr., Pleasant Hill, Ore.)** led the NWC in putouts and is exceptional on throws in the dirt. A .280 hitter with 24 RBI, he should provide even more offense this year as he develops consistency and cuts down on his strikeouts. **Eric Bell (So.,**

Spokane, Wash.), a transfer from Spokane Falls Community College, is a talented batter who will back up Langeliers with a left-handed bat, while **Joshua Sargent (Fr., Oak Harbor, Wash.)** will also get a shot.

A huge battle to fill Farrell’s shoes at second is taking place between returnees **Kevin Tucker (So., Forest Grove, Ore.)** and **Matt Petersen (Jr., Eagle, Idaho)**, and newcomer **Ryan Dearing (Jr., Vancouver, Wash.)**. Tucker hit .207 and Petersen .250 in limited action last year.

Says Bailey, “Tucker is a former First Team All-Stater who gives us a lefty bat. Dearing is hitting the best of the three, but the other two are better defensively. Petersen is our top utility man; he can help out anywhere on the infield if he doesn’t earn the starting spot. We have tremendous versatility there and could wind up platooning like we do at catcher.”

Hammon, Wolf, **Jeff Otis (Fr., Redmond, Wash.)**, and **J.D. Russell (Fr., Mountlake Terrace, Wash.)** are others Bailey can call on for infield duty in a pinch.

Outfield

Fans won’t be able to recognize the Bruin outfield without a scorecard. Gone are right fielder Garrett Bates, a .324 hitter who led the team with four triples and was second with 33 RBIs; center fielder Jason Schilperoort, who batted .349 with a team-leading 12 doubles and 30 RBIs; and left fielder Russell Johnston, who batted .326 and led the NWC with 19 stolen bases as a freshman. Bates and Schilperoort, who were Honorable Mention All-Conference selections, have graduated, and Johnston enrolled in junior college.

“I hated to lose Russell; he would have stolen at least 30 bases for us,” says Bailey ruefully. “It was a matter of economics for him this year, but I’m hopeful we can get him back.”

Expected to take over in center is

Travis Maffey (Jr., Boise, Idaho), a transfer from Blue Mountain Community College. He is an outstanding defensive flychaser, an excellent runner, and is improving as a hitter. The outfield corners are up for grabs, with the top candidates being returnee Shepler, a .167 hitter in part-time duty, and rookies **Grady Shaver (Fr., The Dalles, Ore.)** and **P.J. Pardee (Fr., Central Point, Ore.)**.

“Shepler is playing well defensively, while Shaver and Pardee could give us two starting freshmen in the outfield,” says Bailey. “Right now, we’re just trying to figure out who goes best where!”

Johnson and **Stephen Donohue (So., Gresham, Ore.)** are letter winners who can play outfield; **Ryan Brown (Fr., Kingston, Wash.)** is a newcomer who provides outfield depth.

Summary

“I like offense – everyone does – but pitching and defense win games, and those will be our strong points this season,” Bailey summarizes. “Offensively, we don’t have a lot of power – but we didn’t last year, either. We will be more of a ‘contact’ team, bunting, hit-and-run, that sort of thing. One of our slogans is ‘the little things make a big difference,’ and we will be a fundamentally-sound team.”

“Each year, our senior captains lead the team in an exercise to come up with a motto for the season, and this time they’ve chosen FIGHT:

“F is for Focus – every pitch, every at-bat, every play will have purpose;

“I is for Intensity – we will play hard and bear down on every play;

“G is for Glory – we will play for the glory of our team and our school, not ourselves;

“H is for Honor – we will honor God in our conduct on and off the field;

“T is for Tradition – we want to continue the tradition of baseball excellence that George Fox is known for.”

2000 in Review

Powerful Pitching Propelled Bruins to NWC Title, NCAA Tournament

Adaptability pays. In 1999, the George Fox Bruins bludgeoned people to death with a record-setting offense. In 2000, it was a record-setting pitching staff that carried the Bruins to a 31-10 record, the Northwest Conference championship, and a No. 1 seed in the NCAA West Regional in their first year of eligibility for the NCAA Tournament.

The Bruins opened the 2000 season with the hottest start in team history, going 15-1 with a 12-game winning streak. They vaulted to a No. 13 national ranking on April 3, the highest ranking ever for a George Fox baseball team. Included in that stretch was a 3-0 sweep of preseason conference favorite Linfield that boosted the Bruins into first place in the Northwest Conference.

The Bruins also stretched their winning streak at their home field, Morse Field, to 29 games, going back to 1998, before that string ended with a 13-9 loss to Western Oregon.

A midseason batting slump caused the team to split its next 14 games and fall out of the rankings, but the Bruins rebounded to win their last nine games, clinching their third conference title in the last five seasons. They finished with

a 31-8 regular-season record.

Because the Northwest Conference did not have an automatic bid to the NCAA Tournament until the 2001 season, the Bruins were hoping just to get an at-large bid. Instead, they were surprised with a No. 1 seed in the West Regional by virtue of having the best won-lost percentage in the region (.795), an impressive 9-0 record against teams in California, which are usually considered very strong, and the red-hot finish.

The season came to an end in the Regional with losses to California Lutheran and the host team, Southwestern University in Georgetown, Texas, leaving the team with a 31-10 final record and a No. 26 national ranking. The Bruins claimed back-to-back 30-plus wins for the first time in their history, and, combined with the 32-8 record in 1999, (their last year in the NAIA), were 63-18 over the last two seasons.

The Bruins' main strength was in the pitching department. Third Team All-American and First Team All-Conference ace **Ryan Alvis** was 11-3 with a league-leading 1.87 ERA, setting new season records for wins, strikeouts (93), innings (91.1) and complete games (9). First Team All-Conference pick **Kess Romano** was 9-1 with a 2.49 ERA, walked only 11 in 86.2 innings to set a new standard for fewest walks per nine innings (1.14), and ended his career with a record 27 wins. The third man in the rotation, southpaw **Paul Andrewjeski**, was 6-2 with a 2.51 ERA. **Brody Wilson** tied a season record with four saves.

As a staff, the Bruins set new records for lowest ERA in a season (2.96), sixth-best in the nation, fewest walks per nine

innings (1.96) and complete games (16). The defense backed the pitching staff with the conference's best defense, fielding .957.

On offense, the team batted .306 and had five regulars over .300. First Team All-Conference catcher Derek Birley hit .343 and led the NWC with 10 home runs and 47 RBI. He tied a George Fox and NCAA Division III national record by belting four home runs in one game (vs. Whitworth on May 12). Three Bruins were Honorable Mention All-NWC: second baseman **David Farrell**, the team's leading hitter at .356; center fielder **Jason Schilperoort**, who batted .349 and led the team with 12 doubles; and right fielder **Garrett Bates**, who hit .324 with a team-best four triples. Left fielder **Russell Johnston** batted .326 and led the conference in stolen bases with 19.

Fifth-year coach **Pat Bailey**, who made all the pieces of the puzzle fit together for a record-setting year, was named Northwest Conference Coach of the Year.

The Curtis and Margaret Morse Athletic Fields

George Fox University baseball, soccer, and softball teams have played home games on The Curtis and Margaret Morse Athletic Fields since 1989.

Across from Wheeler Sports Center on Fulton Street and Villa Road, the fields were renovated using a donation from Curtis and Margaret Morse. Using labor from Volunteers on Wheels, new dugouts and a press box were constructed for the baseball field.

The Morse family has a long association with George Fox. Four generations have attended the University in Newberg.

The baseball diamond was moved to the current location in the early '80s when construction on Bauman Auditorium displaced the old field.

The baseball facility continues to improve. In 1991, Smurfit Newsprint Corp., Newberg, donated all lumber for an indoor hitting facility located in the northwest corner of the complex.

The baseball Bruins are tough to beat at Morse Field, going 122-31 (.797) in their 11 years at the complex. In the last four years, they've gone 54-7 in Newberg, an .885 winning percentage.

Field dimensions are 340 feet down the left-field line, 375 in the left-center-field alley, 400 to straight-away center, 370 in right center and 335 down the right-field line.

Coaches

Pat Bailey

In just five years, Pat Bailey, the 2000 Northwest Conference Coach of the Year, has established himself as one of the brightest new stars in the college coaching ranks.

With five straight winning records of 25-16, 29-14, 25-13, 32-8, and last year's 31-10, Bailey has a career record of 142-61, a .700 winning percentage, the best of anyone ever to coach the Bruins. That mark ranks 14th among active coaches in Division III with five or more years' experience. His teams were Northwest Conference runners-up



in 1996 and 1998, conference champion in 1997 and co-champion in 1999. Last season the Bruins won a second conference title under Bailey, advancing to the NCAA Division III West Regional in their first year of NCAA eligibility.

In 1997, Bailey was named Northwest Conference Coach of the Year after guiding the Bruins to their eighth conference or district title in a 10-year span. In 1999, he shared the league Co-Conference Coach of the Year crown with rival Linfield College's Scott Carnahan.

Several of Bailey's players have received all-conference and/or all-district recognition, including six

members of last year's team. In 1999, first baseman Nate Barnett became Bailey's first NAIA First Team All-American, and last year, staff ace Ryan Alvis was named to the NCAA All-America Third Team.

Bailey took over the Bruin program immediately after guiding West Linn High School into the Oregon Class 4A state championship game. At West Linn, his teams advanced to the Class 4A state playoffs seven times, and in his final season were edged 2-1 in the 1995 state championship game.

Four times Bailey was named Three Rivers League Coach of the Year. He was at West Linn for 10 years as head baseball coach and assistant football coach. His baseball teams won five league titles and reached the Oregon semifinals in 1989, 1991 and 1995. From 1989 to 1995, his combined record as a high school and American Legion baseball coach was 315-105 (.750).

Prior to West Linn, Bailey taught and coached at Willamette High School in Eugene, Ore., for three years. He has worked at various baseball camps, and served as a pitching coach at the University of Portland in 1992.

"George Fox really matches up with me personality-wise and philosophically," says Bailey. "As a coach, I want to make sure every kid is making the most of his God-given talent. I want them to be a class act in the classroom and the community. I want the kids to match the school and my personality. I stress to my team that we're a family. Family members are more important than themselves. If you're going to be a leader, you must be a servant first."

Bailey is a 1974 graduate of Moscow High School in Idaho, where he played football, basketball, and was the baseball team's MVP. He earned two letters in baseball at North Idaho College in Coeur d'Alene, Idaho, then two more as a starting outfielder and team captain during his senior season at the University of Idaho. He continued playing semiprofessionally until age 28.

In 1978, Bailey completed his business education degree, and earned a master of

education degree in educational administration from the University of Oregon in 1983.

At West Linn, Bailey was also a business instructor, and in 1994 was named to Who's Who Among America's Teachers. In 1995, he was one of 30 outstanding educators honored with an Education Excellence Award, given by Associated Oregon Industries.

At George Fox, Bailey is also associate director of athletics, chair of the school's Sports Hall of Fame Committee, and a teacher in the department of health and human services.

Bailey and his wife, Susan, live in Newberg with their children, Alex, 17, and Ann, 14.

Background on the Bruin Nickname

George Fox's Bruin nickname comes from a real bear captured in 1887 just two years after Pacific Academy (the University's predecessor) was established. The small cub was found in the Coast Range foothills west of Carlton when its mother was shot. The young cub was brought to campus by a student and later lived with a faculty member.

When it grew to adulthood, it was kept in a pit in Hess Creek Canyon south of the campus. It escaped one too many times and was turned into steak for the dining table and the hide preserved on a frame and displayed in an early campus museum. When the hide deteriorated several years later, it was taken to a campus furnace room to be destroyed, but the framework proved a problem in dismantling so it was left sitting in a corner.



Students found the old Bruin skin later and began skirmishes over ownership, a tradition that continues today. "Bruin Junior," a replica, under a set of guidelines passed down for years, is fought over periodically in class competition, with the class able to physically drag the Bruin replica off campus declared the rightful owner until next "flashed."

Even with the Bruin tradition, somewhere along the line, the "Quaker" tag for athletic teams came into popularity with sportswriters because of the University's church affiliation, and that nickname was used, along with the mascot "Foxy George," a little fox with a Quaker hat. Both gained acceptance for a period in the 1950s and 1960s until a vote of faculty, students and administration in 1970 reinstated the Bruin nickname to its rightful place.

Coaches

Derek Birley

Derek Birley, a slugging catcher on last year's Northwest Conference championship and NCAA Division III Tournament team, remains at his alma mater this year as an assistant coach of the



George Fox University baseball team. He will have primary responsibilities of working the the Bruins' young catching corps.

Birley was a First Team All-Conference and Honorable Mention All-West Region performer for the 2000 team that went 31-10, won the conference, was seeded No. 1 in the regional tournament, and ended with a No. 26 national ranking. He batted .343, led the conference with 10 home runs and 47 RBI, and tied a team and NCAA Division III national record by slamming four home runs in one game, against Whitworth in Newberg on May 12.

Signed originally by Portland State in 1998 after two juco years at Centralia (Wash.) College, Birley turned down other Division I offers to come to George Fox after PSU dropped baseball. In his junior year in 1999, he was one of five Bruin regulars to bat over .400, hitting .436 with 13 home runs and 50 RBI. His .793 slugging percentage that year contributed to the team's overall slugging mark of .692, an NAIA record and third-best in college baseball history — at any level!

Birley attended Evergreen High School in Battle Ground, Wash., where he was Second Team All-Greater St. Helens League in baseball and a Second Team All-State quarterback in football. He is currently teaching health and physical education at Sherwood (Ore.) High School while completing his degree in physical education this spring. He is single and resides in Tualatin, Ore.

Mike Thompson

Former NAIA All-American outfield-



er Mike Thompson returns to his alma mater for his first year as an assistant coach, where he will have main responsibilities with the

George Fox University outfielders and also assist head coach Pat Bailey with hitting instruction for Bruin batters.

Thompson, a native of Bellevue, Wash., came to George Fox after two years at Edmonds (Wash.) Community College. He was an Honorable Mention All-American center fielder during his junior year in 1994 under former coach Pat Casey, now the head coach at Oregon State, but missed the 1995 season with a medical redshirt year. As a senior in 1996 in Bailey's first year as coach, he earned All-Northwest Conference honors. He graduated in 1996 with a B.S. degree in fitness management.

After leaving George Fox, Thompson coached at Ingomar High School in Bothell, Wash., for two years, and also coached American Legion ball. He returned to Oregon in August 2000 to open his own private hitting instruction business.

Thompson is married to former George Fox athlete Liz Stevens, an NAIA All-American in the 400 and an All-Conference basketball player in 1996 and now a firefighter in the Portland area. The Thompsons reside in southeast Portland.

Reed Rainey

Reed Rainey comes aboard the



George Fox University baseball program this year as the team's new pitching coach, charged with taking a group of young arms and

molding it into the image of last year's record-setting staff.

A native of Albany, Ore., Rainey graduated from West Albany High School in 1980, then went on to an outstanding career as a pitcher at Washington State University. He compiled a four-year record of 10-5 and set a Cougar record with 26 career saves. He graduated from WSU in 1985 with a degree in business administration.

Beginning his baseball coaching career immediately upon graduation, Rainey was an assistant coach at the University of Nevada for four years, then served as head coach at Reno (Nev.) High School for a year. He left coaching for three years to work for Nike, but returned to the game in 1994 as head coach at Western Oregon University. After a year there, he joined the staff of Portland State University as an assistant baseball coach and assistant athletic director. He left PSU in 1998 when the Vikings dropped baseball as an intercollegiate sport.

For the past three years, Rainey has worked as director of parks and recreation of the city of Sherwood, Ore., where he lives with his wife, Marzi; son, Matthew (age 12); and daughters, Megan (10) and Madison (3).

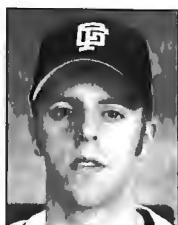

About the University

George Fox University, an evangelical Christian liberal arts college, is expanding, both in size and in reputation. One of the fastest-growing institutions of higher learning in the United States, George Fox has seen its enrollment more than quadruple in the past 14 years, increasing from 549 in 1986 to 2,636 in the fall of 2000.

Since 1986, George Fox has been named one of "America's Best Colleges" 12 times by *U.S. News & World Report*. In October 2000, George Fox ranked first in academic reputation and second overall among Western regional liberal arts colleges. The magazine also named the University one of the region's best values among schools in its category.

George Fox offers unique programs to its students. Every incoming freshman is given a computer to use and keep upon graduation. When students reach their third year, they are eligible for the Juniors Abroad program, in which the University pays transportation costs for

an overseas study tour.

The school's history began in 1885 when Willamette Valley Quaker settlers established Pacific Academy. It was during those early days that George Fox's most prominent alumnus attended the school — Herbert Hoover, who later became the 30th president of the United States.

The college division was organized in 1891 to provide more advanced instruction, and the name was changed to Pacific College. In 1949, because of the many schools in the West with "Pacific" in their title, another change was made, this time to George Fox College, honoring the founder of the Friends (Quaker) Church.

In 1996, with the addition of Western Evangelical Seminary, George Fox became a university, offering students a Christ-centered education and the choice of 35 undergraduate majors and nine graduate degrees. On Jan. 1, 2000,



the seminary was renamed George Fox Evangelical Seminary.

George Fox University is located in Newberg, Oregon (pop. 17,355), 25 miles southwest of Portland, the state's largest metropolitan center of 1.7 million, and 32 miles northwest of Salem, the state capital.



George Fox University Bruin Athletics

Intercollegiate athletics are an important part of George Fox University, home to one of the Northwest's most successful small-college sports programs. Winning programs, of course, are accompanied by a proper balance between academics and athletics. Accordingly, George Fox teams are members of the Northwest Conference and compete in Division III of the National Collegiate Athletic Association, in which need and academic ability, not athleticism, determine scholarships and financial aid.

At George Fox University, student-athletes compete for conference and national titles at a Christ-centered university where professors and coaches help them grow in mind, body, and spirit. Intercollegiate athletic competition provides for practical application of what is learned in the classroom and at practice. At George Fox, the values of athletics are integrated with the goals of Christian higher education in a process that includes

- physical conditioning
- managing emotions
- courage
- teamwork
- cooperation
- being gracious in winning and losing

The University fields teams in 13 varsity sports, seven for women (volleyball, soccer, cross country, basketball, softball, track and field, and tennis) and six for men (soccer, cross country, basketball, baseball, track and field, and tennis). More than 15 percent of George Fox's traditional undergraduate students participate in these sports. Their records over the years serve as shining testimonies to the administration's conviction that an institution can play for the glory of God, follow the rules and ethics of its governing organizations, and be successful on the fields and courts of competition at the same time. Consider the growing legacy:

- George Fox teams won district or conference titles in 10 sports during the past decade.
- George Fox athletes have earned almost 300 All-American and All-American Scholar-Athlete awards.
- Seven of the 10 coaches on staff have been named district or conference Coach of the Year at least once.
- George Fox coaches have held their positions for an average of more than eight years, and together have accumulated more than 1,000 collegiate wins.
