## Women's Basketball Outlook 1998-99

How good was the recruiting year for George Fox women's basketball coach Scott Rueck?

Consider this. After losing three starters—including Northwest Conference Player of the Year Nancy Rissmiller—he's using words like "deeper" and "more talented" to describe his 1998-99 team.

Will this group be better than last year's 16-9 squad that ranked in the NAIA Div. II national top 25?

"I feel we can be at least as competitive as last year," says Rueck. "Overall, we have better skill throughout our team. From one through 14, this is the most offensive talent we've had since I've been here. But, there's a lot more youth this year, so there are still questions to be answered."

Last year's squad ranked third in the conference in scoring at 66.7 points per game, but Rueck thinks that number could climb higher.

"I know we can score. We've got several players who can shoot it. We have the potential to have four 3-point shooters on the court at a time. In one year, we went from being a team that struggled to score to having scoring be our strength."

Although the Lady Bruins have added outside shooting, the offense starts inside where George Fox returns three post players. When the ball goes to 6-foot **Katie Greller (So., MOC/Floyd Valley HS, Orange City, Iowa)**, there's a good chance it will find its way into the hoop. Last year—in her first season in a George Fox uniform—she broke the school field-goal percentage record by shooting 58.2 percent. She was the

second-leading scorer on the team at 13.0 points a game and pulled down 7.2 rebounds. Northwest Conference coaches awarded her second-team all-conference honors—making her the highest honored freshman in the conference.

Defense is the forte of 6-foot post **Rachel Powell (Sr., Cascade HS, Turner, Ore.)**, who was one of the conference leaders in blocks (0.9 a game). She also pulled down 6.2 rebounds a contest.

**Trish Rathka (So., Banks HS, Ore.)** was limited to five games last year by a stress fracture, but she may earn more playing time this year thanks to her solid shooting touch inside 15 feet.

Five-foot-11 junior college transfer **Wendy Clark (Jr., Bainbridge HS, Bainbridge Island, Wash.)** played on the Skagit Valley College (Wash.) team that went 32-0 last season. She was named Skagit's Female Athlete of the Year, but won't join the basketball team until her duties with the George Fox volleyball team end.

"Our post position has gotten better," says Rueck. "Our emphasis is inside. Everything revolves around the post and this year it will be tough for other teams to double-down on our posts."

That's because of the shooting threat of his perimeter players.

After losing his two starting guards, Rueck restocked his backcourt.

NAIA Div. I transfer **Christy Brock (Sr., North Eugene HS, Ore.)** is a proven scorer. A 5-9 guard, Brock scored more than 1,400 points in three years at Azusa Pacific Uni-

versity, leaving as their No. 3 career scorer. A three-time all-conference first-team selection, she holds APU records for 3-pointers in a career (153) and game (7).

Rueck has high hopes for 5-10 wing **Nicole Prazeau (Fr., Central Catholic HS, Portland, Ore.)**, a first-team all-Mt. Hood League pick who broke the career-scoring record at Central Catholic with 667 points. He predicts her offensive skills and athletic ability could make her one of the most talented players ever to play at George Fox.

Returners at the wing position are **Melissa Heuberger (Jr., Yamhill-Carlton HS, Yamhill, Ore.)** and hot-shooting **Tabitha Dawson (So., Eagle HS, Idaho)**. Dawson came off the bench to hit 46 of 130 3-pointers (35.4) last year, averaging 8.6 points a game. She led the Northwest Conference with a 88.6 free-throw percentage.

Perhaps the biggest question mark for the team is at the point, where Rueck must find a replacement for graduate Cherish Carroll.

"Cherish's shoes will be tough to fill at the beginning of year, but I'm confident our point guards can meet the challenge," says Rueck. "I think we can be better defensively at the

point. We may not be as good at creating, but we'll be better in perimeter scoring."

Four players will battle for playing time. Last year's back-up was **Michele Fresvik (So., David Douglas HS, Portland, Ore.)**. In limited action, she showed a solid shooting touch.

Oregon Class 2A Player of the Year **Becky Thompson (Fr., Colton HS, Ore.)** has the top credentials of the three freshmen at the position. Thompson averaged 15.1 points, 6.6 assists, 6.4 steals while leading Colton High to a 28-1 season and the state title.

The two others were both all-league selections in high school. **Jill Barram (Fr., Salem Academy, Ore.)** is the quickest player on the team, while

Rueck gives high marks to all-league **Karen Glover (Fr., Shoreline Christian HS, Snohomish, Wash.)** as a fierce competitor.

Rueck says George Fox has more than just talent.

"We've got great chemistry on this team," he says. "The chemistry hasn't been this good since the first year I was here. That's absolutely huge."

Although the Lady Bruins should be tough to stop, defense, not offense, may determine the season's outcome. George Fox gave up 61.2 points a game last year—second stingiest in the Northwest Conference.

"This year we have more polished offensive talent, but it is yet to be seen whether this year's team can rise to

the defensive level of last year's team. Our goal is to always hold our opponents under 60 points a game. If we get to a level where we defend as well as last year, we should have a successful season."

This is the last shot George Fox will have for making the NAIA Div. II national tournament since the school is joining NCAA Div. III next season. Achieving that goal will require finishing ahead of the two other NAIA teams in the Northwest Conference—Seattle University and University of Puget Sound—and winning a playoff game against either Western Oregon University, The Evergreen State College (Wash.) or Hope International College (Calif.).

## Conference Runner-up George Fox Returns to Top-25 National Poll

Led by Northwest Conference Player of the Year Nancy Rissmiller, George Fox's 1997-98 team came within one game of the conference title and made its third straight appearance in the NAIA Div. II national top-25 poll.

Rissmiller, a second-team All-American, helped George Fox go 11-1 at home and 16-9 overall. The Lady Bruins had a shot at the Northwest Conference title, but a road loss to the eventual champions on the final day of the regular season dropped them to a tie for second.

George Fox relied upon three senior starters, but two of the Lady Bruins' top four scorers were freshmen. Newcomers Katie Greller and Tabitha Dawson shot themselves into the record book. Greller obliterated the George Fox field-goal shooting percentage season record of 51.8 percent by hitting 58.2 percent of her shots. She was the highest honored freshman in the conference, earning

second-team all-Northwest Conference honors.

Dawson drilled five of five 3-pointers in her first game, tying a school game record. She also led the Northwest Conference in free-throw percentage at 88.6.



In his two years as head coach, **SCOTT RUECK** has guided George Fox's women's basketball team to consecutive playoff appearances and national recognition in the NAIA Div. II top-25 poll.

Rueck earned the head coach position with hard work. After putting in two seasons as assistant coach and one as interim head coach of the women's program, he earned the permanent head coaching job at the beginning of last season. He was selected after a national search yielded four finalists.

Under his direction, George Fox has gone 31-19. In home games, they are 20-4. His players have earned one NAIA All-American and five all-conference awards.

Rueck, 29, has nine years of coaching experience. He was a George Fox women's basketball assistant in 1993-94 and 1994-95 while the Lady Bruins compiled a 37-23 record and made two NAIA postseason appearances. He has head coaching experience at the high school and college level. A Forest Grove native, Warmanen was an all-Northwest League point guard for Portland Adventist before graduating in 1989. He went on to play two seasons at Walla Walla College in Washington. He coached the boys' team at Portland Adventist Academy for three seasons and was head men's coach at Walla Walla College in 1994-95.

In addition to coaching, Warmanen is an athletic goods salesman for AllTeam Image in Portland. He lives in Portland.



**JOCELYN (MCINTIRE) MALVAR**, the starting point guard for the University of Washington team that reached the 1991

NCAA West Regionals, is starting her first year as assistant women's basketball coach at George Fox.

Malvar was an honorable mention Pacific-10 Conference all-academic team selection for the Huskies. At the conclusion of her final season, she ranked second in career 3-point field goal shooting percentage (.394), fourth in Husky career free-throw shooting percentage (.761), and ninth in career assists (270). Malvar ranked second on the Husky single-season assist list (151 in 1991), fourth (.402, 1991) and sixth (.353, 1989) on the season 3-point field-goal percentage list and eighth on the single season free-throw percentage list (.779 in 1991).

At Lake Oswego High School, Malvar was an Oregon third-team all-state selection and was named to the state all-tournament second team after helping her team to a sixth-place Class 3A (now 4A) finish. She set school records for most steals (105) and assists (147) in a season.

Since graduating from Washington, she has assisted at summer basketball camps and was assistant for the girl's basketball team at Lake Oswego High School.

Malvar earned her degree in psychology at UW and currently is a science teacher at Sherwood Middle School. She lives in Milwaukie, Ore., with her husband, Caesar, and her two children: Zachary, 3, and Caitlin, 1.

Rueck is perhaps the best shooter in George Fox history.

She set the school record for 3-point accuracy in a season (41.4) and career (38.8). She holds team records for 3-pointers made in a game (5), season (61) and career (119).

A transfer from Skagit Valley Community College, Rueck played on the nationally ranked 1993-94 and 1994-95 teams.

She earned her bachelor of arts degree in elementary education in 1995. She currently teaches fifth grade in the Newberg School District. She and head women's basketball coach Scott Rueck were married in 1996. They live in Newberg.



**MEAGAN WILLIAMS**, assistant junior varsity coach, was George Fox's first-ever NAIA All-American Scholar-Athlete in women's

basketball.

As a senior in 1994-95, she earned conference honorable mention and ranked in the conference top-10 in scoring, rebounding and field-goal percentage.

Williams was George Fox's first female engineering graduate, earning a second bachelor's degree from Oregon State in 1996. She currently works for Tektronix in Wilsonville and lives in Newberg.



**CRAIG TAYLOR** is in his 11th year as George Fox University athletic director, but he has been associated with the Bruins for 25 years as player, coach and

professor.

Taylor, 47, came to George Fox in 1971 as a junior forward for the men's basketball team. In 1972-73, he helped the Bruins to their first-ever NAIA District 2 title.

Taylor graduated from George Fox in 1974, named both Outstanding Man in Teacher Education and Outstanding Physical Education Major. He received a master's degree in education from Linfield College in 1975. While enrolled in graduate courses, he was a George Fox residence hall director.

From 1976 through 1979, Taylor was the Bruin baseball coach while also serving as assistant basketball coach. He worked at a sporting goods retailing firm from 1979 to 1981.

The A.D. was the coach of the women's basketball team from 1981 to 1993, producing a 162-155 record. He also coached George Fox softball from 1981 to 1988 and again in 1990. In 1985 he was named NAIA District 2 Coach of the Year.

At George Fox, the athletic director is responsible for athletic department functions, including eligibility and compliance with George Fox, conference, NAIA and NCAA regulations, budgeting, and department and sports center management.

In 1992 Taylor was named NAIA District 2 Administrator of the year. Taylor has three children: Leah, 24, Bree, 19, and Casey, 9. Taylor and his wife, Kathy, live in McMinnville.

George Fox University maintains one of the Northwest's most successful small-college athletic programs.

The teams win. George Fox has earned district or conference titles in nine sports during the 1990s.

The athletes are successful. George Fox athletes have earned more than 150 NAIA All-American awards and All-American Scholar-Athlete honors.


The coaches are award winners as well. Nine of George Fox's 11 head coaches have been named district or conference Coach of the Year at least once.

Intercollegiate athletics is an integral part of the overall education program at George Fox. About 15 percent of the traditional undergraduate student body participates in varsity athletics. Men's varsity athletic teams represent the University in baseball, basketball, track, tennis, cross country and soccer. Women teams are fielded in volleyball, basketball, track, tennis, softball, cross country and soccer.

Athletic facilities include the Coleman H. Wheeler Sports Center,



field and soccer field. In 1994, five tennis courts were installed in preparation for the addition of tennis as a varsity sport.

## ATHLETIC AFFILIATION

The landscape of small-college athletics is changing in the Northwest and George Fox is in the midst of the transformation.

After decades as an independent, George Fox in 1995 joined the Northwest Conference (NWC)—a league of 10 strong academic institutions. That same year, the conference applied for membership in the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA). Seven NWC schools currently hold full membership in the NCAA Division III. The other three schools—George Fox, University of Puget Sound and Seattle University—are provisional members of the NCAA, but continue to compete nationally in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). In 1999-2000, George Fox and Puget Sound plan to be eligible for NCAA Div. III national championships.
