Outlook

Quantity and Quality

The Bruin men will rely on many new contributors as they attempt to move up in the conference, while the women's team looks to defend its conference title with a team that is short on numbers but long on talent.

Men

If the Bruin men are to improve upon last year's fourth-place finish in the Northwest Conference and challenge for the conference men's track and field championship, replacements will have to be found for athletes who produced almost 75 percent of the team's point total in the 2000 meet hosted by the Bruins.

"Only 37 of our 127 points are back," notes coach Wes Cook, who is now in his 14th season directing the Bruins, "so we've got 90 points, at least, to replace — more if we want to move up."

The Bruins have 23 letter winners back while losing 13, including NCAA Division III All-Americans Brandon Workman, who was sixth in the national meet in the steeplechase, and Ian Strauss, who placed seventh in the discus. Both were conference champions. Other key losses included All-Conference performers Jon Roberts, who was second in the javelin, and David Plotts, who placed second in the 4x100 and 4x400.

Three All-Conference sprinters return to anchor the team, led by **Tyler Gassaway** (Sr., Oregon City, Ore.), who was second in the NWC in the 4x100,

4x400, and the long jump. **Zach Davidson** (So., Albany, Ore.) posted a second place in the 4x100 and 4x400, and **Eric Costa** (Sr., Beaverton, Ore.) was second in the 4x400. **Ryan Austin** (Jr., Eugene, Ore.) made a good showing with a fifth-place finish in the 800.

"Obviously, we have a very strong relay team," says Cook, "with Gassaway, Costa, and Davidson returning. **Marty McKay** (Fr., Bremerton, Wash.) is a newcomer who makes us strong in places, as does sprinter **Ben Salisbury** (Fr., Bellingham, Wash.). I also like 3A All-State sprinter **Jon Robinson** (Fr., Cannon Beach, Ore.), who tied Gassaway for points in our

intra-squad meet, and who was also an All-State long jumper.

"**Tevin Taylor** (Fr., Portland, Ore.), who took a medical redshirt year last spring, has run very well with a 50.3 split in his leg of the relays, and also gives us help in the intermediate hurdles. With Davidson and **Keith Christiansen** (So., Grass Valley, Ore.) returning, we should be strong in the hurdles, although we have no high hurdler this year.

"**Ryan Sprunger** (Fr., Dundee, Ore.) will also help us on our sprints, as should **Jon Castillo-Miller** (Fr., Nipomo, Calif.).

"A couple of athletes who will help us after basketball season are **Brett Yeager** (Fr., Oakridge, Ore.) in the high jump and **Bryan Wadlow** (Fr., Albany, Ore.) in the triple jump. We also have a talented thrower in **Darin Krueger** (Jr., Portland, Ore.), who is especially strong in the hammer."

In the distance events, one element critical to the team's success will be the availability of **Steve Willmer** (So., Fullerton, Calif.), who won the NWC 800 two years ago but missed all of last season with a back problem. "Steve struggled with that back during cross country season, too," Cook recalls, "and it is still a day-to-day thing, but if he's healthy, he's someone we can rely on."

Providing new strength in the distance events are newcomers **Will Howard** (Fr., Caldwell, Idaho), **Will Vollstedt** (Fr., Portland, Ore.), **Bjorn Doskeland** (Fr., Boise, Idaho) and **Matt Burg** (Fr., Newberg, Ore.), although Burg has been injured since cross country in the fall.

Outlook

Women

With only 21 athletes out for women's track and field at George Fox University this spring, one might think the Bruins will have a hard time successfully defending their 2000 Northwest Conference championship.

Think again. "We have 92 of our 168 points from last year's conference meet returning," points out 13-year veteran coach Wes Cook, who was named the 2000 NWC Women's Coach of the Year for guiding his team to an upset of perennial league favorite Pacific Lutheran University. "Lori Miller (Jr., Aurora, Ore.), who missed last year's conference meet while participating in the Juniors Abroad study program, is back throwing the javelin. And we have some talented newcomers who should step right in to make an impact."

NCAA Division III All-American (7th in the nationals) and NWC champion pole vaulter **Heather Hunt** (Sr., Turner, Ore.) and defending NWC high jump champion **Amy Forbes** (Sr., Jackson, Wyo.) head a list of 11 returning athletes, five of them All-Conference performers. Also making All-NWC were **Kelsey Baron** (So., Nehalem, Ore.), who was second in the long jump and third in the triple jump; **Tori Taylor** (Jr., Portland, Ore.), who was third in the 3,000 and fourth in the 5,000; and **Jamie McElwain** (Sr., Tigard, Ore.), who was third with the 4x400 relay team and fourth in the 1,500. **Helena Telfer** (So., Monmouth, Ore.) made a

strong showing with a fifth-place finish in the pole vault.

Marisa Merritt (Sr., Portland, Ore.) and **Kirsten Norgaard** (Jr., Everett, Wash.) give the Bruins a pair of top-notch distance runners, although Norgaard will probably miss the conference meet during her absence with the Juniors Abroad program. **Christina Davis** (Jr., Edmonds, Wash.) is a quality sprinter who has scored in the 400. **Heidi Smith** (Jr., Lakeside, Ore.) gives the Bruins strength in both the triple jump and the javelin, but her work has been very limited recently due to a sore knee.

"Almost everyone who is back is capable of scoring at the conference meet," says Cook with satisfaction, "and I am very impressed with several of our new-

comers as well."

Expected to have an immediate impact is **Sarah Zempel** (Fr., Rogue River, Ore.), a double 3A state champion in both the shot put (40-7) and the discus (140-7). **Deveny West** (Fr., Klamath Falls, Ore.) gives the Bruins yet another budding pole vault threat, having finished second in the state last year and with a personal best vault of 10-4. Soccer players **Sara Oates** (Fr., Grover Beach, Calif.) and **Brooke Pitner** (Fr., Vancouver, Wash.) are outstanding sprinters, Oates typically running a sub-60-second time in her leg of the relays, and Pitner having placed in the Washington state

meet in the 4x200.

"We don't have any true hurdlers this year like we had last year," Cook admits, pointing to the loss of key hurdlers Sharon Barnett, who ran in the NCAA national meet in the 100 hurdles, and All-NWC racer Karrie Nelson. "We have a good pool of jumpers and sprinters, though, almost every one of them capable of scoring at the conference meet. We are a relatively young squad that is working hard and has a very positive attitude, and that is encouraging — they are all very coachable.

"Will all this translate into another conference title? I have no idea, but I'm eager to find out."

The rest of the conference might not be so eager.

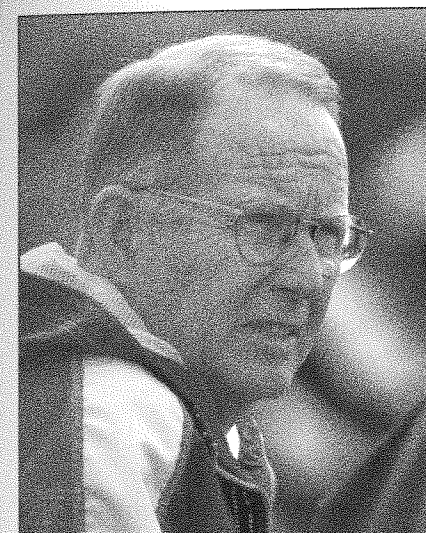

Head Coach

Wes Cook, a veteran of 13 track and field seasons at George Fox University, returns for a 14th year with a new title to defend — Northwest



Conference Women's Coach of the Year for leading the 2000 Bruins women's team to the conference title in a stunning upset of heavily-favored Pacific Lutheran University.

Such accolades are nothing new for Cook. In his first 13 years as head coach of the George Fox University men's and women's cross country and track and field teams, the Bruins became a nationally-recognized powerhouse in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). Now, with a year under their belts as full-time members of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA), there is every reason to expect such success to continue with Cook at the helm.

All four programs under Cook's leadership regularly participated in NAIA national meets and often finished among the top 15 teams in the nation. In 1992, following the men's fifth-place and women's second-place finishes at the national meet, *Cross Country Express* mag-

azine declared his cross country program best in the nation at the NAIA level. In George Fox's final year in the National Christian College Athletic Association (NCCAA), his women's cross country team won the 1988 national title with a record low score of 19.

Cook's athletes won 80 NAIA All-American awards and 53 NAIA All-American Scholar-Athlete awards. In 1995, George Fox was the only school to put men's *and* women's teams in the top five of the NAIA cross country national meet team scholastic competition.

Cook was named National Coach of the Year in women's cross country by the NCCAA in 1988 and the NAIA in 1992. In the West Coast region (NAIA Area I), he won Coach of the Year honors for men's cross country in 1990 and 1992. At the district and conference level, he has earned Coach of the Year honors 12 times, at least once in each sport he coaches. In 1992-93, he was named NAIA District 2 Coach of the Year for all women's sports. He was involved as an NAIA national rater and served on the NAIA women's track and field games committee.

A Nebraska native, Cook rose to the rank of Eagle in the Boy Scouts of America before becoming a four-time conference track scorer at the University of Northern Colorado. He set the UNC record in the 800 meters and helped the mile relay team to four consecutive conference titles. He was the national winner of the Holmes Award, given to the most outstanding senior in Alpha Kappa Lambda, a national collegiate fraternity. In 1961, he graduated from UNC with a degree in physical education and history, and earned a master of arts in teaching at Lewis & Clark College in 1975.

Cook served 26 years as a head coach at five high schools in three states. In 15 years at Gladstone (Ore.) High School, his track and cross country teams finished as state champion or runner-up 10

times. His boys' cross country team went undefeated for 51 straight dual meets, and he was named Oregon 2A (now 3A) High School Coach of the Year for all sports three times. In 1983, his son Toby set the Oregon 3A state record in the 1,500-meter race.

Cook, a member of the U.S. Track Coaches Association, has served as president of the Oregon Track and Cross Country Coaches Association and the Oregon Association of The Athletics Congress (now U.S. Track and Field). Active in Fellowship of Christian Athletes and summer track and basketball camps, he has led four international tour teams and traveled to 15 countries. A frequent speaker at national clinics and seminars, he has also authored articles in various state and national publications.

Cook is associate professor of health and human performance at George Fox, and has three adult children: Tammy, Toby, and Brad.

Scott Brown

Assistant Coach

Scott Brown came to George Fox in 1987, the same year Wes Cook took the head coaching position. He was a



four-year letter winner in track and cross country, qualified for the NAIA national decathlon and 400-meter hurdles, and three times was the leading point scorer

on the track team.

Brown earned his bachelor's degree in math teaching in 1991 and his master of education in 1998 from George Fox. After serving as an assistant at Clackamas Community College in 1992, he joined the George Fox coaching staff. His responsibilities are the hurdles, vertical jumps, and combined

events. In eight years, he has coached 24 athletes who became NAIA All-Americans, including three national champions.

In 1998-99, Brown served as the NAIA national women's track and field ranker, and was the same for the Northwest Conference in 1998. He has written an article on hurdling titled *Hurdling 101* in *Sprinting and Hurdling* by Keeba Tolbert. He has also collaborated on a book for middle school coaches on organizing their track and field programs.

The Portland, Ore., native was a member of Madison High School's 1986 state championship track team, and earned first-team all-state honors in the 4x400-meter relay in 1987. He lives in Newberg, Ore., and is a math and science teacher at Fred Patton Middle School in the McMinnville School District.

Kevin Carr

Assistant Coach

Kevin Carr begins his second season as a volunteer assistant for the Bruins. He was the ninth-ranked U.S. discus



thrower in 1997 with a personal best of 61.38 meters (201-4). A 1986 NCAA Division I All-American for the University of Oregon, he competed in the

Olympic Trials. After earning his bachelor's degree in physics at Oregon, he earned his master's degree in physics and a Ph.D. in science education at the University of Idaho. He continues to throw for Oregon International, and has qualified for the U.S. Track and Field Championships five times.

Carr, with a background in athletics and Christian ministry, has led a Fellowship of Christian Athletes group in Roseburg, Ore., and traveled to

Scandinavia with an Athletes In Action European Ministry Team in 1990. He is an assistant professor of education at George Fox, and he and his wife, Lisa, have a two-year-old daughter, Anna, all living in Woodburn, Ore.

Dave Guzman

Assistant Coach

Dave Guzman became the George Fox sprints and relay coach in 1994 after a dozen years guiding Salem Academy's



sprinters to state prominence. In his eight seasons prior to joining the George Fox staff, 30 of his relay teams qualified for the Oregon Class 2A state meet, 29

scored points, and 17 took state titles. Six athletes won individual state titles.

In six seasons at George Fox, Guzman has coached 11 relay teams to NAIA national meets, five of them scoring points with top-eight finishes.

Guzman has 22 years of track and field coaching experience, including three years as co-founder and president of the Santiam Striders Track Club. A graduate of Linfield College, Guzman owns an insurance business in Salem, Ore. He and his wife, Judy, live in Keizer, Ore., and have four children.

Chad Riddle

Assistant Coach

Chad Riddle begins his second year as a full-time assistant coach after serving as a volunteer assistant in 1999, with primary responsibilities to the athletes who compete in the various throwing events. A two-time national qualifier for Linfield College in the hammer at the NAIA national track meet, he has a personal best of 177-8. He also threw the discus 153-4 and shot put (P.R. 48-10).



He earned his bachelor's degree in exercise science in 1998.

Riddle, a graduate of Molalla (Ore.) High School, works for 24-Hour Fitness in Beaverton, Ore., as

a personal trainer. His wife, Jenny (Bonnell), is a George Fox graduate. They live in Canby, Ore.

John Smith

Assistant Coach

Now in his third year of coaching at George Fox, John Smith is one of the top decathletes in the country, with a



No. 34 ranking after scoring a personal-record 7,311 in 1997. Smith competes for Oregon International, and has won the University of Oregon Invitational decathlon

and took second at the Rocky Mountain Invitational-Decathlon.

Smith, a 1996 graduate of George Fox, twice won NAIA All-American titles in the decathlon. He holds top-10 marks in eight events at George Fox, including second-best in the pole vault.

A graduate of North Bend (Ore.) High School, where he earned all-state honors and set a school record in the triple jump, he earned his bachelor's degree in health and human performance (fitness management emphasis). He has been an assistant track coach at Cascade College, and a personal trainer at Gold's Gym. He currently is a special education assistant for Newberg Public Schools and is pursuing a master of arts degree in teaching from George Fox.

He and his wife, former track and cross country All-American Dawn Hartwig, live in Newberg, Ore. They have a son, Davis, and are expecting their second child this August.

Although George Fox's track and cross country programs have achieved most of their national success in the last few decades, they follow an impressive tradition. George Fox student-athletes have been earning distinction since the late 1800s.

Roy Heater (1898-1902) may have been the finest athlete in the Pacific Northwest at the beginning of the 1900s. In 1902, *The Oregonian* newspaper wrote that Heater was "recognized as the best all-around athlete ever turned out in the Northwest."

He beat the world record holder at the 1905 National Amateur Athletic Union (AAU) Track and Field Championships to win the pole vault competition. Using a wood pole, he cleared 11 feet 6 inches.

At track meets attended by colleges of all sizes, he would win multiple events, in one meet finishing first in seven events.

In 1902, *The Oregonian* listed him as the owner of four Pacific Northwest track records.

He became one of the leading track mentors in the Northwest, coaching at George Fox, Willamette University, Pacific University, and Oregon State. Among his students were Slat Gill and A.C. Gilbert, who went on to break the world pole vault record at Yale University.

Janet (Johnson) McClurg (1961-65) was a world-class athlete, winning the 1964 U.S. Track and Field Federation 100- and 220-yard national championships.

She finished sixth in the pentathlon at the 1967 Pan Am Games and her 1967 400-yard time of 53.6 ranked ninth in the world.

Bob Hadlock (1965-70) was George Fox's first NAIA track All-American and the first to be selected in a professional

draft. Hadlock made it to the NAIA national meet three times, finishing third in the 1968 shot put. After being named a football All-American in 1970, the 6-foot-6 defensive tackle and center was drafted by the Detroit Lions of the National Football League.

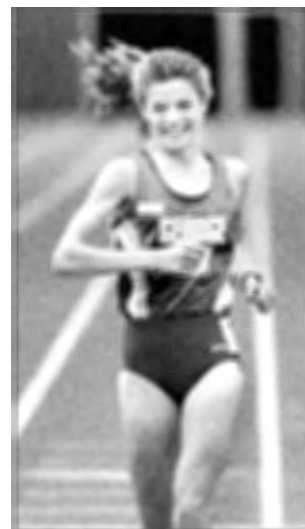
Curt Ankeny (1970-74) was one of the Northwest's top athletes in the early '70s. He was named 1973 NAIA District 2 Athlete of the Year for all sports. He was a three-time track and field NAIA national meet competitor, finishing third in the 1974 marathon. He twice finished 17th at the national cross

country meet. Ankeny set NAIA District 2 records in winning the district marathon and six-mile races. He also captured the three-mile title and the cross country championship twice. He was inducted into the 1984 NAIA District 2 Players Hall of Fame.

Steve Blikstad (1975-79) was George Fox's first NAIA national champion. He won NAIA All-American awards three times in track and once in cross country. After taking second as a sophomore and third as a junior, he took the steeplechase national title his senior season. In track, Blikstad broke five school records and helped set two school relay records. He competed at the NAIA national cross country meet four times, earning All-American honors for his 19th place finish in 1976.

Jill (Jamison) Beals (1988-92) was George Fox's first student-athlete to be inducted into the NAIA Hall of Fame. She was a three-time 10,000-meter national NAIA champion and set the national meet record. She also ran to

NAIA national runner-up finishes in the 5,000-meter race and the cross country race. She helped George Fox's women's cross country team to its

first-ever No. 1 national ranking.

In her track and cross country career, she won a dozen NAIA All-American awards and also made the GTE Academic All-American At-Large First Team. She was twice named NAIA District 2 Female Athlete of the Year and went on to win the 1992 Seattle Marathon in her first try. At George Fox, she set records in six events.

In 1992, she was a finalist for the Hayward Award, given to the top amateur athlete in Oregon.

Aaron Young (1991-92; 93-96) saved his best for last, winning the NAIA national triple jump with a career-best and school record 48-11 effort his senior season. Young, as a

junior, had finished sixth in the triple jump. He also was a national high jump competitor, an event he had won at the Oregon Class 4A high school meet.

Becci Harper (1995-97) won back-to-back NAIA national javelin titles and was an all-conference basketball player at George Fox. She set the school record with a javelin throw of 156-11 as a junior.

Ryan Chaney (1993-97) won the 1997 indoor and outdoor NAIA 400-meter titles and was named the spring at-large GTE Academic All-American of the Year.

Chaney's best 400-meter time of 45.98 was the fastest by an Oregon col-

lege athlete — at all levels.

He finished his collegiate track career with eight NAIA All-American awards and seven school records. He was named co-athlete of the meet at the 1997 NAIA Northwest Regional Meet.

Chaney qualified and went on to compete in the 1997 USA Track and Field Championships.

Nancy Rissmiller (1994-98) was named the 1996 NAIA Female Athlete of the Year for all sports by *College Sports* magazine. During her four-year career, she won two NAIA national high jump titles and earned 11 All-American awards as a track and basketball athlete. She earned four high jump NAIA All-American honors, two 4x400 relay NAIA All-American awards, three NAIA All-American Scholar-Athlete honors, one NAIA Div. II basketball All-American listing, and a place on the GTE Academic All-American Spring At-Large Team.

About the University

George Fox is growing in size and reputation. Enrollment has more than quadrupled in the last 15 years, increasing from 549 in 1986 to 2,636 in the fall of 2000.

In the same time span, George Fox has been named one of "America's Best Colleges" 13 times by *U.S. News & World Report*. In 2000, George Fox ranked second overall and first in acad-

emic reputation among Western regional liberal arts colleges. The magazine also named the University one of the region's best values among schools in its category.

George Fox offers unique programs to its students. Every incoming freshman is given a computer to use and keep upon graduation. When students reach their third year, they are eligible for the

Juniors Abroad program, in which the University pays transportation costs for an overseas study tour.

Early Willamette Valley Quaker settlers established Pacific Academy in 1885. The college division was organized in 1891 to provide more advanced instruction. In 1949, because of the many colleges in the Northwest with "Pacific" in their name, Pacific College was renamed George Fox College in honor of the founder of the Friends (Quaker) Church.

In 1996, with the addition of Western Evangelical Seminary, George Fox became a university, offering students a Christ-centered education and the choice of 35 undergraduate majors and nine graduate degrees. On Jan. 1, 2000, the seminary name was changed to George Fox Evangelical Seminary.

George Fox's most prominent alumnus is the late President Herbert Hoover, who attended the school while it was known as Pacific Academy.



Background on the Bruin Nickname

George Fox's Bruin nickname comes from a real bear captured in 1887 just two years after Pacific Academy (the University's predecessor) was established. The small cub was found in the Coast Range foothills west of Carlton when its mother was shot. The young cub was brought to campus by a student and later lived with a faculty member.

When it grew to adulthood, it was kept in a pit in Hess Creek Canyon south of the campus. It escaped one too many times and was turned into steak for the dining table and the hide preserved on a frame and displayed in an early campus museum. When the hide deteriorated several years later, it was taken to a campus furnace room to be destroyed, but the framework proved a problem in dismantling so it was left sitting in a corner.

Students found the old Bruin skin later and began skirmishes over ownership, a tradition that continues today. "Bruin Junior," a replica, under a set of guidelines passed down for years, is fought over periodically in class competition, with the class able to physically drag the Bruin replica off campus declared the rightful owner until next "flashed."

Even with the Bruin tradition, somewhere along the line, the "Quaker" tag for athletic teams came into popularity with sportswriters because of the University's church affiliation, and that nickname was used, along with the mascot "Foxy George," a little fox with a Quaker hat. Both gained acceptance for a period in the 1950s and 1960s until a vote of faculty, students, and administration in 1970 reinstated the Bruin nickname to its rightful place.



George Fox University Bruin Athletics

Intercollegiate athletics are an important part of George Fox University, home to one of the Northwest's most successful small-college sports programs. Winning programs, however, are accompanied by a proper balance between academics and athletics: George Fox teams are members of the Northwest Conference and compete in Division III of the National Collegiate Athletic Association, in which need and academic ability, not athleticism, determine scholarships and financial aid.

At George Fox University, intercollegiate athletic competition provides a practical application of what is learned in classrooms and practices. Student-athletes compete for conference and national titles at a Christ-centered university where professors and coaches help them grow in mind, body and spirit. The values of athletics are integrated with the goals of Christian higher education in a process that includes

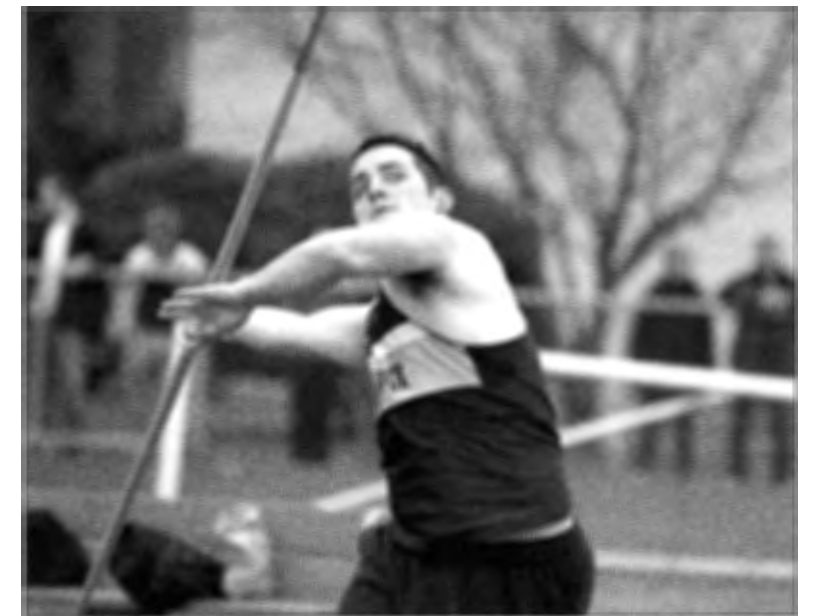
- physical conditioning
- managing emotions
- courage
- teamwork
- cooperation
- being gracious in winning and losing

More than 15 percent of George Fox's traditional undergraduate students participate in the school's 13 varsity sports, seven for women and six for men. Their records over the years serve as shining testimonies to the administration's conviction that an institution can play for the glory of God, follow the rules and ethics of its governing organizations, and be successful on the fields and courts of competition.

Consider that:

- George Fox has earned district or conference titles in nine sports during the 1990s.

- George Fox athletes have earned more than 250 All-American and All-American Scholar-Athlete honors.
- Nine of the 11 coaches on staff have been named district or conference Coach of the Year at least once.
- George Fox coaches have held their positions for an average of nearly eight years, and together have accumulated more than 1,000 collegiate wins.
