## **12/14 – Bruins 4th Among All NSCAA Team Academic Award Honorees**

**NEWBERG, Ore.** – With a collective grade point average of 3.38, the George Fox University men's soccer team finished fourth among 81 teams earning the Team Academic Award from the National Soccer Coaches Association of America for the 2005-06 academic year, announced recently by the NSCAA.

The Bruins, under the direction of 18-year veteran coach Manfred Tschan, have been honored by the NSCAA for their high academic scores every year since the 2001 season, making it five years in a row. The NSCAA uses an entire academic year as the basis for its awards, and honors all teams with grade averages of 3.0 or higher.

The only men's teams in the country, at any level of athletic competition, with higher grades than George Fox were Carleton College, Case Western Reserve University, and Macalester College, all with GPAs of 3.45. Whitworth College was the only other Northwest Conference team cited with a 3.21 GPA.

"This is an honor our institution and our student-athletes can be justifiably proud of," said Tschan. "It's not always easy to keep grades up in the midst of a very busy season of competition, but our student-athletes have taken the challenge of their studies seriously, and we are gratified that the NSCAA has recognized us for that."

In the past six seasons, four individual Bruins have also been honored for their academic achievements. In 2001, midfielder Merrick Brownlee was named to the NSCAA/adidas Collegiate Scholar All-America Second Team and the CoSIDA/Verizon Academic All-America College Division Second Team. In 2005, defender Ryan McKenzie and goalkeeper Kyle Putnam were named to the CoSIDA/ESPN *The Magazine* Academic All-District VIII College Division First Team, while defender Brian Zaro received that same honor this past fall.

## **11/6 – ACADEMIC ALL-DISTRICT: Bruins' Zaro Named to Academic All-District VIII Men's Soccer Team**

**NEWBERG, Ore.** – Brian Zaro, a fiery four-year starter at defender for the George Fox University Bruins, has been named to the *ESPN The Magazine*/CoSIDA Academic All-District VIII College Division Men's Soccer Team as voted upon by members of the College Sports Information Directors of American (CoSIDA).

Zaro, a senior from Beaverton, Ore., and a graduate of Westview High School, has compiled a grade point average of 3.83 while majoring in Christian ministries. He is the son of Robert and Joyce Zaro of Beaverton, Ore.

Zaro appeared in 17 games this season as the Bruins went 8-9-2, a six-game improvement over the previous year, and finished 7th in the Northwest Conference at 4-9-1. As a freshman, he was Honorable Mention All-Conference, and last year earned Second Team All-Conference honors. As a sophomore, he tied for the team lead in assists with three. In 64 career games at George Fox, he scored three goals and had five assists for 11 points.

All members of the eight All-District teams are automatically submitted to the CoSIDA constituency for consideration for the Academic All-America Team. Joining Zaro on the District VIII team are goalkeeper Kevin Bostock of Whitworth College; midfielders Adam Jensen of Seattle University, J.T. Searles of Biola University, and Ron Smith of Westmont College; defenders Hans Esterhuizen of Seattle, Brett Cook of Sonoma State University, Drew Macha of Seattle Pacific University, and Dustin Tannenhaus of the University of California-San Diego; and forwards Andrew Bailey of Sonoma State, Ross Schunk of the University of Redlands, and James Coggan of Seattle Pacific.

The Academic All-America Teams program honors 816 male and female student-athletes annually who have succeeded at the highest level on the playing field and in the classroom. Individuals are selected through voting by CoSIDA, a 2,000-member organization consisting of sports public relations professionals for colleges and universities in the United States and Canada. To be eligible, a student-athlete must be a varsity starter or key reserve, maintain a cumulative grade point average of 3.20 on a scale of 4.00, have reached sophomore athletic and academic standings at his/her current institution and be nominated by his/her sports information director. Since the program's inception in 1952, CoSIDA has bestowed Academic All-America honors on more than 14,000 student-athletes in Divisions I, II, III and the NAIA. District VIII of CoSIDA consists of all institutions in Oregon, Washington, Alaska, Idaho, Utah, Nevada, Arizona, California, Hawaii, and British Columbia.

Now in its third season of sponsoring the Academic All-America Teams program, *ESPN The Magazine* – winner of the 2003 National Magazine Award for General Excellence – is a provocative and innovative sports publication. ## 11/4 – GEORGE FOX 2, PUGET SOUND 0: Bruins Upset NWC Champ Loggers in Season Finale

NEWBERG, Ore. – Goalkeeper Kyle Putnam led a sterling George Fox University defensive effort with eight saves and the offense scored two goals against a team that had only allowed four all season, giving the Bruins a stunning 2-0 victory over the newly-crowned Northwest Conference men's soccer champion University of Puget Sound Loggers in a rain-soaked game Saturday afternoon here at Morse Field.

Putnam and the George Fox defense faced 20 shots by the Loggers, the highest-scoring team in the conference with an average of 1.94 goals per game, and turned back every effort. The UPS defense only allowed George Fox eight shots in all and only three on goal, but the Bruin offense proved to be highly efficient, scoring on two of them.

The Bruins' first score came at 26:57 in the first half. Dan Potter sent a cross from the right wing just outside the keeper's box to Erich Hangartner streaking in from the left, and Hangartner nailed a shot from 15 yards out into the right corner of the net for a 1-0 lead. It was Hangartner's second goal of the season and the fifth assist for Potter.

George Fox nursed that lead until the waning stages of the game. With Puget Sound pushing everyone forward in an effort to tie the game, Logger keeper Pete Van Sant found himself 10 yards in front of the keeper's box with a loose ball he needed to clear. Bruin forward Matt Gurlides charged the keeper and blocked Van Sant's kick directly back toward the goal, then raced around him and sent an uncontested ball into the wide-open net for his eighth goal of the season, effectively icing the win.

The Bruins end their season with an 8-9-2 overall record and a 4-9-1 mark in the conference. The 17th-ranked Loggers, who had clinched the conference championship and an automatic bid to the NCAA Division III National Tournament with a 1-0 win at Pacific University the day before, are now 13-2-2 overall and 10-2-2 in the NWC. The Loggers will find out who they play and where their first-round game will be when the tournament field is announced Sunday.

## 11/3 – LINFIELD 2, GEORGE FOX 1: Wildcats Break Tie in Second Half and Hang On to Beat Bruins

**NEWBERG, Ore.** – Chris Paradis scored both Linfield College goals, including the tiebreaker with 30 minutes left in the game, and the Wildcats made it stand up for a 2-1 win over the George Fox University Bruins in a Northwest Conference men's soccer matchup of Yamhill County rivals Friday afternoon here at rain-soaked Morse Field.

The Wildcats struck quickly when Paradis scored from 10 yards out into a wide-open goal only 1:19 into the game. Mike Grabast had driven into the left side of the box, and when George Fox keeper Jake Maguire came over to challenge any shot, Grabast centered a deflected pass over to Paradis, who lofted a floater into the midsection of the net just under the crossbar.

The Bruins got the equalizer a little over eight minutes later at 9:44. Erich Hangartner sent a cross from the left sideline into the middle of the box, where Dylan Durrell headed it over to the right side for Dan Potter, whose shot nicked the right post and deflected past Linfield keeper Grant Williams and into the net. It was Potter's first goal of the season.

The game remained tied for 50 more minutes until the Wildcats' Tim Solimano gave a throw-in to Ryan Thomas, who sent a cross from the right into the box for Paradis, who headed it into the left corner for his seventh goal of the season. The Linfield defense did the rest, holding George Fox to 13 shots overall and five on goal in the game. The Wildcats had 23 shots, 10 on goal. Williams had four saves, Maguire six, along with two Bruin team saves.

The score might have been different either way if not for the unusual fact that the keepers stopped all three penalty kick attempts in the game. Williams stopped a shot by Ryan MacKenzie that could have given George Fox a 2-1 lead at 25:02 in the first half. Maguire deflected two in the second half, thwarting Spencer Hunter at 55:51 with the score still 1-1, and Paradis with 20 seconds left in the game.

Both teams end their regular seasons Saturday with 1:30 p.m. games. George Fox (7-9-2, NWC 3-9-1) hosts 17th-ranked and newly-crowned NWC champion University of Puget Sound, while Linfield (9-6-2, NWC 6-5-2) entertains Pacific Lutheran University.

## 10/29 – PACIFIC 2, GEORGE FOX 0: Boxers Shut Out Bruins to Secure a Winning Season

FOREST GROVE, Ore. – Securing their first winning season since 1999, the Pacific University Boxers got a goal in each half and blanked the George Fox University Bruins 2-0 in a very physical Northwest Conference men's soccer match Sunday afternoon here at Tom Reynolds Field.

The Bruins found their offense limited early when starting forward Garrett Blizzard left the game in the sixth minute after a collision with the Boxers' Ricky Shinn that resulted in a yellow card against the Pacific player. Blizzard did not return to the contest due to the injury, which was a low light in a contest that saw 49 fouls called and seven cautions issued between the two sides.

Matt McDonough, the third-leading scorer in the conference, notched his 10th goal of the season in the 25th minute for a 1-0 Pacific lead. After Brandon Porter put a ball into the box off a free kick, Shinn redirected it to McDonough, who crossed the ball past Bruin goalie Jake Maguire into the net.

Pacific capitalized on the physical play in the 65th minute of the second half for an insurance goal, receiving a free kick after the Bruins' Brian Zaro was sent off with his second yellow card. Jared Komo sent a 30-yard free kick in to Kyle Chown, who placed the ball right at the goal line for Sean Healy, who sent the ball across the line for his first goal of the season.

George Fox out-shot Pacific 9-7 overall and held slight advantages of 5-4 in shots on goal and 5-3 in corner kicks. Jory Shene picked up his sixth shutout of the season, making five saves for the Boxers, while Maguire finished with two stops in goal for the Bruins.

The Bruins fell to 7-8-2 overall and 3-8-1 in the NWC, while the Boxers improved to 9-5-1 overall and 6-5-1 in the league. Pacific is assured of its first winning season since going 10-8-2 in 1999.

Both teams conclude the season with home games next weekend, George Fox hosting Linfield College Friday and the University of Puget Sound Saturday while Pacific entertains Puget Sound Friday and Willamette University Saturday. All four games begin at 1:30 p.m.

**NEWBERG, Ore.** – Dylan Durrell scored to break a second-half tie and Kyle Story added an insurance goal that proved crucial as the George Fox University Bruins hung on to defeat the Willamette University Bearcats 3-2 in a Northwest Conference men's soccer game Tuesday afternoon here at Morse Field.

George Fox struck first 28:45 into the game as Keith Marshall raced down the right sightline, turned the corner, and centered perfectly to Matt Gurlides, who headed the ball into the left corner of the net for his seventh goal of the season. ## 10/21 – PACIFIC LUTHERAN 3, GEORGE FOX 2: Bruins Rally Late but Fall in Overtime to Lutes

TACOMA, Wash. – Down 2-0 with 17 minutes left in regulation, the George Fox University Bruins rallied to tie the game, only to see it slip away in a 3-2 overtime loss to the Pacific Lutheran University Lutes in Northwest Conference men's soccer action Saturday afternoon here at the PLU Soccer Field.

After a scoreless first half, Mike Ferguson put the Lutes on the board in the 58th minute. Henrik Oiseth started the play with a pass to Erik Gracey, who passed from the wing to Ferguson, who struck with his left from eight yards out. The Lutes increased their lead to 2-0 on Oiseth's first goal of the season in the 65th minute as Derek MacLean's long throw in went to Gracey, who flicked the ball to Oiseth for a volley from 20 yards.

The Bruins got back in the match in the 73rd minute when Garrett Blizzard scored on a header from four yards out, and they knotted it at 2-2 on Kyle Story's goal in the 88th minute. Story took Blizzard's long pass on the left side, touched the ball to his right foot, and bent a shot around PLU goalkeeper Andrew Croft.

The Lutes got the game-winner eight minutes into the first overtime when Ferguson took a free kick from 25 yards out on the right side, bending it around the defensive wall and into the upper left corner of the goal past George Fox goalkeeper Jake Maguire. It was Ferguson's 10th goal of the season.

## 10/15 – WHITWORTH 6, GEORGE FOX 2: Pirates Overpower Bruins with Five 2nd-Half Goals

NEWBERG, Ore. – Down 2-1 at the half against an upset-minded George Fox University squad, the defending Northwest Conference champion Whitworth College Pirates exploded for five goals in the second half to defeat the Bruins 6-2 in men's soccer action on a chilly, gray Sunday afternoon here at rain-drenched Morse Field.

Whitworth got on the board quickly in the first half, Chris Johnson crossing from right to left to a wide-open Sean Lambrecht for a goal from eight yards away past sliding Bruin keeper Jake Maguire just 5:30 into the game. The Pirates gave the goal back 10 minutes later, however, when the Bruins' Matt Gurlides hooked a shot from the right side of the keeper's box across the mouth of the goal, and a diving Ben Dixon, trying to block the shot, instead headed it past Whitworth keeper Kevin Bostock for an "own goal".

The Bruins took a 2-1 lead just before the end of the period when Brian Story fed Gurlides streaking down the right side, and the Bruins' leading scorer outraced the Whitworth defense to angle a shot from just inside the top of the box into the left corner of the net at the 44:11 mark. It was Gurlides' sixth goal of the season.

Whitworth tied the game eight minutes into the second half when Seyedali stole the ball near midfield, sped down the middle, and lined a shot into the upper right corner from 20 yards away for his fourth goal. The Pirates then took the lead for good at 58:49 when Jordan Lister passed to Chris Johnson in the left corner, and he sent a pass from the left baseline into a mass of players near the net for Niko Varlamos, who deflected it into the net for his fourth goal of the year.

Lister made it 4-2 Pirates when he secured a loose ball and rifled it home from the left side of the box for his second goal of the season at 60:09. Ali Seyedali and Lambrecht teamed up for Lambrecht's fifth goal at 66:02, and Elly Bulega rounded out the Whitworth scoring with his first goal of the season when he put in a deflected shot by Kenshiro Uki at 85:34.

The Pirates out-shot the Bruins 28-17 overall and 13-9 in shots on goal. Goalkeepers Bostock and Maguire each made seven saves.

With big 6'2" defender Keith Marshall shadowing Matt McDonough all game, the Bruins limited McDonough, the number two scorer in the conference with six goals and three assists, to only two shots all game, none on goal.

The Bruins actually had their best chances to penetrate the goal line in the overtime periods, Shene stopping a line drive by Garrett Blizzard from five yards away in the first extra session and another by Erich Hangartner in the second overtime, and Blizzard put a potential winner just over the crossbar with two-and-a-half minutes left in the final stanza.

With 10 seconds left in the contest, Pacific's Kyle Chown took a corner kick from the left corner that was headed away from the goal by the Bruins. The ball was recovered by Gurlides midway between the keeper's box and the mid-field line, and he turned and fired a shot three-quarters of the length of the field toward a net that was totally unprotected, Shene having moved up near midfield as the clock ran down. The ball bounced twice before rolling into the open net, but the clock had run out just before the ball crossed the line, and the goal was immediately waved off by the official.

Both teams are on the road next Saturday, George Fox (5-3-2, NWC 1-3-1) visiting the University of Puget Sound and Pacific (5-2-1, NWC 2-2-1) going to Willamette University. Both conference matches begin at 2:30 p.m.

## 9/26 – GEORGE FOX 1, WILLAMETTE 0: Bruins Shut Out Bearcats for First NWC Win of Season

SALEM, Ore. – A first-half goal by Erich Hangartner and a stellar defensive effort that produced their fifth shutout of the season combined to give the George Fox University Bruins their first Northwest Conference win of the season, a 1-0 victory over the Willamette University Bearcats, in men's soccer action Tuesday night here at Sparks Field.

The Bruins got the only score they would need at the 29:47 mark in the first half as Hangartner took a pass from the right side by Matt Gurlides and shot it home from 10 yards out past Bearcat keeper Mark Bennett. It was the first goal of the season for Hangartner and second assist by Gurlides.

George Fox controlled the game offensively, out-shooting Willamette 29-18 and earning eight corner kicks to one for the home team. The Bruins lead the league by a wide margin in shots (179, 52 more than runner-up Linfield College) and corner kicks (53 to 35 for Linfield), and they edged ahead of Linfield for most points this season, 51-49 (17 goals, 17 assists). Twelve of the Bruins' shots at Willamette were on goal, but they were unable to penetrate the net again as Bennett made 11 saves.

The Bruin defense came through in the clutch to preserve the win, though, forcing the Bearcats to take most of their shots from far away. Only four of the home team's 18 shots were on goal, all stopped by Bruin goalie Jake Maguire, who improved to 4-1-1.

George Fox (5-3-1, NWC 1-3), which snapped a three-game losing streak, welcomes Pacific University for a 2:30 p.m. conference contest Saturday, which will be preceded by the women's NWC match at 12 noon. Willamette (1-7-1, NWC 0-3-1), which lost its third in a row, entertains Linfield College Saturday at 2:30 p.m.

## 9/23 – PACIFIC LUTHERAN 4, GEORGE FOX 0: Trio of First-Half Goals Lift Lutes Past Bruins

NEWBERG, Ore. – Exploding for three goals in the first half to take firm control of the game, the visiting Pacific Lutheran University Lutes went on to post a 4-0 victory over the George Fox University Bruins in a Northwest Conference men's soccer match Saturday afternoon here at Morse Field.

All-Conference forward Mike Ferguson got the Lutes going just 6:54 into the game when he came out of group of players with the ball following a corner kick by Erik Gracey and sent it into the net from five yards out for his fourth score of the season. Baard Asker notched his fifth goal of the season when he scored on a shot from right to left from 15 yards away after a pass from Andy Hyres at the 23:54 mark, making it 3-0 PLU at the break. The Lutes added a final goal at the 71:20 mark in the second half on Brennan Brown's first goal past keeper Jake Maguire after a short cross from Scott Parsons.

The Lutes out-shot the Bruins 18-13, with an 11-4 advantage in shots on goal, although George Fox had more corners, 6-4. Putnam had five saves and Maguire two in goal for the Bruins, while Andrew Croft and Joshua Hooley, who worked the final 11-plus minutes, teamed up for the shutout for PLU, with Croft making all four saves the Lutes needed.

Forward **Garrett Blizzard** exploded for a career-high six points in one game, which earned him honorable mention for Northwest Conference Men's Offensive Player of the Week for Sept. 11-17. In a 4-0 win over California State-East Bay on Sept. 11, he scored the Bruins' second and fourth goals and assisted on the first and third ones, including one assist to his cousin, Matt Gurlides, who was the NWC Offensive Player of the Week for Sept. 4-10. Blizzard has only five shots in the game but made them count. He was held pointless as the Bruins dropped their other two games of the week, 3-0 at Whitworth and 4-1 at Whitman.

**\* 4-0-1 Start was Second-Best in History:**

With a 4-0-1 start to the 2006 season, the Bruins had the second-best opening in the 27-season history of the men's soccer program. The 1993 team, which eventually won the NAIA District 2 and Area 1 championships and played in the National Tournament, began the season 7-0 en route to a final 18-5 record. All four of the Bruins' wins were by shutout, tying another mark of the '93 team, which posted shutouts in its first four victories.

**\* What a Difference a Year Makes:**

The 2006 Bruins, at 4-2-1, have already doubled the number of wins from a year ago, when the team went 2-15-1. The biggest reason for the turnaround would have to be the offense, which has already scored 16 goals after totaling only 13 all last year. The Bruins' top scorer last year was Ben Eichenberger, a senior who had four goals and one assist for nine points, but rookie Matt Gurlides has already surpassed that with five goals and an assist for 11 points.

## 9/17 – WHITMAN 4, GEORGE FOX 1: Missionaries Take Big Lead and Coast to Win over Bruins

**WALLA WALLA, Wash.** – An efficient Whitman College offense picked up four goals on only five shots on goal all game, giving the home-standing Missionaries a 4-1 win over the visiting George Fox University Bruins in a Northwest Conference men's soccer match Sunday afternoon here at the Whitman Athletic Fields.

Steven Phillips gave Whitman a 1-0 lead with less than two minutes left in the first half, notching his first goal of the season with assists from Andy Huntington and John Rue at the 43:41 mark. One minute into the second half, Huntington stole a pass in the midfield and beat George Fox keeper Jake Maguire for a 2-0 Missionary lead.

Phillips, assisted by Simon Quay, got his second goal of the game at the 63:37 mark of the second half. With less than four minutes to play, Whitman's Jasper Lipton made it 4-0 when he chipped his first college goal over Maguire's head, with Chris Dorough assisting on the play.

With less than two minutes remaining, George Fox averted a shutout when Bret Hamilton scored after a shot by teammate Erich Hangartner bounced off Whitman keeper James Millikan. Millikan finished with five saves and Maguire had one for the Bruins. Whitman outshot George Fox by a slim 14-12 margin, although it was the Bruins with a 6-5 edge in shots on goal.

George Fox, after starting the season with their second-best start ever at 4-0-1, is now 4-2-1 and 0-2 in the conference. Whitman is 2-0-1 overall and 1-0-1 in NWC play. Both teams play again Saturday, the Bruins hosting Pacific Lutheran University and the Missionaries going to Pacific University. Both games are set for 2:30 p.m. following women's games at 12 noon.

## 9/16 – WHITWORTH 3, GEORGE FOX 0: Defending NWC Champion Pirates Blank Bruins in League Opener

SPOKANE, Wash. – Showing why they are the defending Northwest Conference champions despite a deceptive 1-2-1 record to start the season against a tough slate of opponents, the Whitworth College Pirates effectively shut down the league's highest-scoring offense for a 3-0 win in the NWC men's soccer opener for both teams Saturday afternoon here at the Whitworth soccer field.

The Pirates, who reached the NCAA Division III Final Four last season and are a solid choice to win their third straight NWC title this year, got on the board at the 19:00 mark of the first half when Sean Lambrecht rebounded a deflected shot and put the ball back into the net past Bruin keeper Kyle Putnam. Later in the half, Chris Johnson got inside the box and played Putnam out of position before passing to Ali Seyedali for an easy goal, his first of the season, at 40:37.

Lambrecht iced the win when he notched his second goal of the game and third of the season at 57:17 off a cross from Caleb Barnhill. Meanwhile, the Whitworth defense held the Bruins, who had scored 15 goals in their first five games, to five shots total and four on goal, all saved by Kevin Bostock. The Pirates took 18 shots, 10 on goal, with Putnam saving seven.

George Fox, off to the second-best start in team history, suffered its first loss of the season, falling to 4-1-1 and 0-1 in the conference. Whitworth, now 2-2-1 overall and 1-0 in the league, has not lost in its last 20 NWC matches. The last Whitworth loss in NWC play was 2-0 at George Fox on Oct. 17, 2004.

Both teams play again Sunday, George Fox at Whitman College and Whitworth hosting Willamette University at 2:30 p.m. following women's games at 12 noon.

### BRUIN BITS:

#### \* Rookie Forward Gurlides First NWC Offensive Player of the Week

It was obvious from the start that **Matt Gurlides** would have an impact on the George Fox University Bruins this season. Now he is making an impact on the whole Northwest Conference.

Gurlides, an academic sophomore but athletic freshman from Las Vegas, Nev., was named the first NWC Offensive Player of the Week for men's soccer in 2006 while leading the Bruins to a 2-0-1 week Sept. 4-10. He had four goals in the three games, scoring the Bruins' second goal in a 4-0 win over Walla Walla College on Monday, the first goal in a 2-2 tie at Corban College on Thursday, and a pair of goals in a 4-0 win over Northwest Christian College on Saturday.

With 11 points on four goals and one assist thus far, Gurlides is both the George Fox and conference leader in points and goals. He also ranks second in the league to teammate Garrett Blizzard, who happens to be his cousin, in shots attempted with 25 (to 27 for

Blizzard). His scoring ability has helped the Bruins to a 4-0-1 record, the second-best start in team history.

Gurlides prepped at Palo Verde High School before attending the University of Nevada-Las Vegas for a semester, but he did not play soccer during his freshman year. He transferred to George Fox at the semester break last year.

**\* Second-Best Start in History**

With a 4-0-1 record, the 2006 Bruins are off to the second-best start in the 27-season history of the men's soccer program. The 1993 team, which eventually won the NAIA District 2 and Area 1 championships and played in the National Tournament, began the season 7-0 en route to a final 18-5 record. All four of the Bruins' wins this year have been by shutout, tying another mark of the '93 team, which posted shutouts in its first four victories.

**\* What a Difference a Year Makes:**

The 2006 Bruins, at 4-0-1, have already doubled the number of wins from a year ago, when the team went 2-15-1. The biggest reason for the turnaround would have to be the offense, which has already scored 15 goals after totaling only 13 all last year - and the Bruins still have the 14-game Northwest Conference schedule to play. The Bruins' top scorer last year was Ben Eichenberger, a senior who had four goals and one assist for nine points, but GFU rookie Matt Gurlides has already surpassed that with five goals and an assist for 11 points.

**\* All in the Family:**

The Bruins' **Kyle and Brian Story** from Graham, Wash., are twins. **Matt Gurlides** and **Garrett Blizzard**, both from Las Vegas, Nev., are cousins. In the Bruins' 4-0 over Northwest Christian on Sept. 9, each pair of relatives teamed up for two goals and an assist. Kyle Story scored the game-winning first goal of the game, then later assisted on the third goal which was scored by his brother Brian. Gurlides had the second and fourth goals of the game, with Blizzard assisting on the final score.

**\* NWC Stats: Bruins Early Leaders in Every Offensive Category**

It's early, of course, but the Bruins have jumped out to the conference lead in every offensive category - shots (120), shots per game (24.00), points (46), points per game (9.20), goals (15), goals per game (3.00, tie), assists (16), and assists per game (3.20). ## 9/11 – GEORGE FOX 4, CSU-EAST BAY 0: Blizzard Buries Pioneers as Bruins Off to 2nd-Best Start Ever

NEWBERG, Ore. – With Garrett Blizzard scoring two goals and assisting on two others, the George Fox University Bruins raised their record to 4-0-1, the second-best start in school history, with a 4-0 win over the California State University-East Bay Pioneers in a non-conference men's soccer match Monday afternoon here at Morse Field.

The Bruins set a blistering pace offensively in the opening minutes, getting four corner kicks in the first four minutes. They scored their first goal off one of them just 2:17 into the game as Dan Potter centered the ball from the right corner to Blizzard, who flicked a quick pass to Jon Maroni coming down the middle for a shot to center of the net. It was Maroni's first goal of the season.

The teams battled on virtually even terms from then on until the Bruins exploded for three scores in the final 16 minutes. Blizzard made it 2-0 at 74:02 when he looped a shot from 10 yards out over the head of East Bay keeper Sergio Valle after a pass from his cousin, Matt Gurlides. Blizzard returned the favor two minutes later at 76:16 when he fed Gurlides on a fast break for his fifth goal of the season from the left side of the box. The Bruins' final score came with only 16 seconds left as Blizzard took a pass from Dylan Durrell, outraced two defenders, and shot the ball in from left to right by Valle for his second goal of the game and the season.

The Bruin defense recorded its fourth shutout of the season while facing 20 shots, eight on goal. Kyle Putnam had three first-half saves in goal and picked up his first win of the season, while Jake Maguire defended the net in the second half and stopped five shots. Valle had two saves for the Pioneers while facing 15 shots, six on goal.

The Bruins' 4-0-1 start is surpassed only by a 7-0 start by the 1993 team. This is the 27th season of men's soccer at George Fox. The Pioneers dropped to 1-2.

George Fox begins Northwest Conference play Saturday at 2:30 p.m., visiting defending NWC champion and pre-season league favorite Whitworth College, ranked 9th nationally. The women's NWC game precedes the men's game at 12 noon. California State-East Bay visits Pacific University in Forest Grove, Ore., Wednesday at 1 p.m.

## 9/9 – GEORGE FOX 4, NORTHWEST CHRISTIAN 0: It's All Relative as Bruins Blank First-Year Beacons

**NEWBERG, Ore.** – Twin brothers Kyle and Brian Story combined for two goals and an assist and cousins Matt Gurlides and Garrett Blizzard did the same, leading the George Fox University Bruins to a 4-0 win over the Northwest Christian College Beacons in a non-conference men's soccer match Saturday afternoon here at Morse Field.

After taking 17 shots in the first 32 minutes with none of them going in, the Bruins finally broke through at the 35:13 mark when Dan Potter crossed from the right corner to Kyle Story near the left post, and Story headed it over Beacon keeper Shaun DeBow for his first goal of the season. The Bruins added another goal before the half at 39:00 when Dylan Durrell passed ahead to Gurlides on a fast break down the middle and he drilled it home.

In the second half, the Storys teamed up for a goal at 56:33. Kyle crossed from the left side of the box to Tony Zamora, who tapped it to the top of the box, where brother Brian trapped the ball and then kicked it into the middle of the net just under the crossbar for his first goal. The Bruins' final goal came at 83:03 as the cousins combined for the score, Blizzard passing from the center front of the box to Gurlides coming in from the right, and he sent the ball into the left corner of the net for his fourth score of the season.

The Bruins were in total control against the Beacons, who are in their first year of intercollegiate competition and have only two upperclassman and 15 freshmen on the roster. Offensively, George Fox held a 10-to-1 ratio in shots, taking 41 shots with 16 on goal. Defensively, the Bruins held the Beacons, who had scored at least once in each of their first three games, to only four shots, two on goal, and shut them out for the first time this season. GFU keepers Jake Maguire and Kyle Putnam had one save each, with Maguire getting the win by working the first half. DeBow took the loss while making 12 saves for the Beacons.

The Bruins' 3-0-1 start equals the second-best record for a George Fox team after four games in the 27-year history of the program - the 1998 team also began the year 3-0-1, topped only by a 7-0 start in 1993.

## 9/7 – GEORGE FOX 2, CORBAN 2 (2 OT): Bruins and Warriors Fight Tooth and Claw to a Draw

**SALEM, Ore.** – In their first and only non-conference road game of the season, the George Fox University Bruins tied the score with eight minutes left in regulation, then battled the home-standing Corban College Warriors to a 2-2 double-overtime standoff in men's soccer action Thursday afternoon here at Warrior Field.

George Fox struck first in the 19th minute when Matt Gurlides gathered a rebound off Corban goalkeeper Aaron Franklin and rifled a shot into the back of the net for his second goal of the season. The Warriors knotted the game in the 39th minute when James Young gathered a ball at the midfield stripe and lofted a shot from 55 yards out toward the Bruin net. With Corban's Tyler Grove running onto the ball, George Fox keeper Kyle Putnam misplayed the ball and allowed it to roll into the goal for the game-tying score.

Corban took the lead in the 77th minute when Andrew Brown struck a corner kick towards the goal and Grove headed home his first goal of the season. With the clock winding down to the last ten minutes of regulation, George Fox's Keith Marshall - brother of Corban senior Scott Marshall - flipped a throw-in over the out-stretched arms of Franklin to Ryan MacKenzie, who headed the ball in for the tying goal and his second score of the season in the 82nd minute.

Each team had numerous chances to end the game in both extra periods, but neither team could crack the net in the final 20 minutes. It was the second straight tie between the two teams, who last met in 2001 when the game ended in a 5-5 tie, snapping a streak of 13 games in a row that the Bruins had won in the series.

Franklin ended with four saves, while George Fox's goalkeeping duo of Putnam and Jake Maguire combined for nine saves, three by Putnam in 45 minutes and six by Maguire in 65 minutes.

George Fox (2-0-1) returns home Saturday to take on Northwest Christian College at 2:30 p.m., while Corban (1-2-1) visits cross-town rival Willamette University Tuesday at 7 p.m.

## 8/30 – PREVIEW: Improved Depth Key to Bruins' Hopes for Unlocking Improvement in 2006

**NEWBERG, Ore.** – With a deeper and more talented roster than in the past few years, veteran George Fox University men's soccer coach **Manfred Tschan** has high hopes that the Bruins will show significant improvement in the upcoming 2006 season.

"We were competitive in most of our games last year," notes Tschan, pointing to seven one-goal losses in a 2-15-1 season, "but our lack of depth hurt us when we had injuries to some key people and had to reshuffle things. For the first time in two or three years, however, we've got good competition at every position; even our returning starters are going to have to work hard to retain their spots, and that's good for the whole team."

The Bruins return 13 of 16 letterwinners, including nine starters. One of the losses was top scorer Ben Eichenberger, who had four goals and one assist to lead a team that scored only 13 goals all season.

"Our offense had the most room for improvement, and we should be able to create more danger for the opponents' defenses this time around," predicts Tschan. "In turn, that puts less pressure on our defense, which had to work extremely hard last year, and keeps the other team a lot more honest."

Number two scorer **Garrett Blizzard** (So., Las Vegas, Nev. / Bonanza HS), who had three goals and two assists, returns at one forward position. He could be paired up front with his cousin, **Matt Gurlides** (Fr., Las Vegas, Nev. / Palo Verde HS), who transferred to George Fox last January from the University of Nevada-Las Vegas. "Garrett and Matt have played together and know each other's moves, and they could create some exciting opportunities for us," says Tschan.

Two newcomers who are also expected to see plenty of action at forward are **Bret Hamilton** (Fr., Medford, Ore. / South Medford HS) and **Tony Zamora** (San Salvador, El Salvador / Newberg HS).

A quartet of returning players gives the Bruins plenty of experience at midfield. **Dan Potter** (Sr., Medford, Ore. / South Medford HS), a four-year starter, had one goal last year, while **Greg Hoiland** (Sr., West Linn, Ore. / West Linn HS) had one assist. **Erich Hangartner** (Jr., Central Point, Ore. / Crater HS), the team's number three scorer with two goals and two assists, can also play forward if needed. **Joshua Smith** (So., Central Point, Ore. / Crater HS) started as a freshman and had one assist.

The Bruins' most versatile athlete, **Ryan MacKenzie** (Jr., Redmond, Ore. / Redmond HS), is also ticketed for midfield this year. As a freshman, he led the team in scoring at forward because that was where he was needed, although it was not his normal position, and last year he had one goal as a defender. "No question Ryan will be on the field somewhere," says Tschan, "playing wherever we need him."

Three newcomers who will push hard for playing time at midfield are **Brian Story** (Fr., Graham, Wash. / Bethel HS), **Dylan Durrell** (Fr., Sherwood, Ore. / Sherwood HS), and **Kyle Milnes** (Fr., West Linn, Ore. / West Linn HS).

On defense, **Brian Zaro** (Sr., Beaverton, Ore. / Westview HS) is the Bruins' mainstay. A fiery player, Zaro had one goal and one assist and earned Second Team All-Northwest Conference honors for his efforts in marking the other teams' best scorers. Joining him on the back line are returning starters **Jon Maroni** (Jr., Redmond, Ore. / Redmond HS), who scored one goal, and **Matt Chang** (Jr., Bend, Ore. / Mountain View HS), who had one assist.

**Joel Morgan** (Fr., Portland, Ore. / De La Salle North Catholic HS), who was with the Bruins last year but received a medical hardship waiver from the NCAA after being injured in the pre-season, is back to challenge for a defender role. Tschan will also give a long look to newcomers **Keith Marshall** (Fr., Redmond, Ore. / Redmond HS), Rouge Community College transfer **Bobby Divine** (So., Grant Pass, Ore. / Grants Pass HS), **Zach Sanders** (Fr., Puyallup, Wash. / Emerald Ridge HS), and **Kyle Story** (Fr., Graham, Wash. / Bethel HS), Brian's twin brother. **Caleb Martin** (Fr., Dayton, Ore. / Amity HS) is another defender who is recovering from a stress fracture and may not be available until mid-season.

Rangy goalkeeper **Kyle Putnam** (Jr., Bend, Ore. / Mountain View HS) had 72 saves despite missing five games in mid-season due to injury and was third in the NWC in saves per game (5.54). Rookie **Jake Maguire** (Fr., Aurora, Ore. / North Marion HS) is a big, strong goalie who has been impressive in the pre-season. "Jake has strengthened that position and I will be comfortable no matter who is in goal," says Tschan.

The Bruins tied for seventh in the Northwest Conference in 2005 with a 1-12-1 league mark, and have been picked to finish eighth in pre-season balloting by the NWC coaches. Tschan smiles when he considers such predictions.

"Most pre-season votes are based on last year," he points out, "and who really knows about this year? Some teams will be better, and some will not be as good, depending on who was lost and who was recruited. I think we'll be one of the improved teams, but what did the other teams do in the off-season? We'll see."

"The one thing we can control is how we approach each game. We must focus on our own strengths and cut down on the mental mistakes that hurt us at critical moments last year. If we can do that, I like our chances almost every time out."

Tschan enters the 2006 season with a career coaching record of 176-142-16 (.551) in 17 years at George Fox, and 240-171-24 (.579) in 23 total years that include four years at Concordia University-Portland and two years as the women's coach at the University of Oregon.

The Bruins have a favorable pre-conference schedule, opening with four of five non-league games at home. The season gets under way Saturday, Sept. 2, with a home contest against Warner Pacific College at Morse Field at 2:30 p.m., followed quickly by a home match with Walla Walla College on Monday, Sept. 4, at 4:30 p.m. Northwest Conference play begins on Sept. 16 at defending conference champion Whitworth College.

## 8/15 – NWC POLL: Veterans Give Bruins Hope to Better 8th-Place Prediction in NWC Men's Soccer Poll

**NEWBERG, Ore.** – With a foundation of nine returning starters and 13 letterwinners, the George Fox University Bruins have high hopes of finishing higher than the eighth-place finish predicted for them in 2006 by the eight Northwest Conference men's soccer coaches in their annual pre-season prognostication of the conference race.

The Bruins, coming off a 2-15-1 overall record and 1-12-1 NWC mark that landed them in a tie for seventh in the league standings, received 13 points in the voting. Veteran coach Manfred Tschan, who has a 176-142-16 record in 17 seasons at George Fox and is 240-171-224 in 23 total years as a college coach, expects a turnaround to begin this season because of the experience his young team gained in 2005.

The Bruins have two starters to replace, including top scorer Ben Eichenberger (4 goals, 1 assist). Second Team All-Conference defender Brian Zaro, one of only four seniors on the roster, leads a defensive line that includes juniors Ryan MacKenzie, Jon Maroni, and Matt Chang. Goalkeeper Kyle Putnam was third in the league in saves per game (5.54). Offensively, Garrett Blizzard (3 goals, 2 assists) made an immediate impact as a freshman and will be called upon for increased scoring, as will number three scorer Erich Hangartner (2 goals, 2 assists).

Whitworth College has been tabbed to become the first three-peat men's soccer champion in the NWC since 1990. The two-time champion Pirates return three All-NWC selections from the 2005 squad that advanced to the NCAA Final Four. Whitworth picked up six of eight possible first-place votes and 68 points, finishing ahead of 2005 runner-up Linfield College. Forward Niko Varlamos and midfielder Ali Seyedali will lead Whitworth in 2006. The Pirates, who finished 19-2-1 overall and 13-0-1 in the NWC, return a total of seven starters from last season.

Linfield picked up one first-place vote and 53 points. The Wildcats will have a strong attack behind forward Chris Paradis and a strong defense with Grant Williams in goal. Linfield (10-1-3) finished just ahead of Puget Sound (10-2-2) in last fall's standings. The University of Puget Sound finished third in the poll with 46 points. The Loggers graduated four All-NWC selections from a year ago, including goalkeeper Brian Lawson and defender Jim Fioretti, from a defense that allowed only five goals in 16 matches.

Only one point behind UPS in the preseason poll, Pacific Lutheran University (45 points) picked up the final first-place vote. The Lutes return All-NWC forward Mike Ferguson from last season after finishing 12-8 overall and 8-6 in the NWC in 2005. Whitman College finished fifth in the poll with 33 points. The Missionaries (8-11 overall, 6-8 NWC) welcome back Second Team All-NWC forward Andy Huntington.

Pacific University is sixth in the poll with 20 points after finishing tied for seventh (2-15-1 overall, 1-12-1 NWC). Honorable Mention All-NWC forward Matt McDonough returns to lead the Boxers. Willamette University (18 points) edged George Fox for seventh. The Bearcats hope to rebound from last season's 5-13 record and 3-11 league mark.

The Bruins will be the first George Fox team to play at home in 2006, opening up at Morse Field on Saturday, Sept. 2, at 2:30 p.m. with Warner Pacific College, followed on Monday, Sept. 4, by a 4:30 p.m. home match with Walla Walla College.

Entering his 18th year as the head men's soccer coach at George Fox University, Manfred Tschan has established the Bruins as one of the most competitive programs in the Pacific Northwest and the nation.

Tschan's Bruin teams have gone 176-142-16 in his 17 seasons, a .551 winning percentage. From 1991-98, the Bruins' last eight seasons in the NAIA, they were ranked in the Top 25 at some point in six of those years. Under his guidance, George Fox has finished first or second in its district or conference 10 times. The team also received national exposure with two National Christian College Athletic Association national championships (1988 and 1990) and one NAIA National Tournament appearance (1993). In 1993, he won NAIA District 2 and NAIA Area 1 Coach of the Year honors. Nine of his players earned NAIA All-American awards.

A former player in the Swiss First Junior and First Amateur divisions, the 50-year-old Tschan has 23 years of coaching experience, including head coaching positions at Concordia University-Portland (1984-87) and the University of Oregon (1980-81). During his two seasons at Oregon, the native of Switzerland guided the fledgling women's program to a No. 4 Intercollegiate Soccer Association of America national ranking and into the 1981 AIAW National Tournament. With a 27-3-3 record at Oregon and a 37-26-5 mark at Concordia along with his George Fox record, he has an overall record of 240-171-24 and career percentage of .579.

An assistant professor of health and human performance at George Fox, Tschan earned a bachelor of science degree in education in 1976 from The Teachers' College of Hofwil, Switzerland, a master of science degree in motor learning from the University of Oregon, and has completed Ph.D. course work in sports psychology. He is fluent in German, French and English, and has been published in numerous journals and newspapers in Switzerland and the United States.

Tschan and his wife Vicki, the student loans coordinator at George Fox, reside in Newberg and have two children: Twila, 16, and Heidi, 14.
