ABOUT GEORGE FOX COLLEGE

George Fox College, in its 102nd year, is one of America's Best Colleges. Four times it has been given that designation by *U.S. News & World Report* magazine. In 1992 GFC was ranked third in academic reputation among Western Regional Liberal Arts Colleges, including colleges and universities from Oklahoma to Hawaii.

This year, for the fourth time, the College was named to the Templeton Foundation Honor Roll of Character Building Colleges, the only Oregon college selected and one of 111 in the United States.

George Fox College is the outgrowth of a desire by early Willamette Valley Quaker settlers who established Pacific Academy in 1885 for the Christian education of their children. The college division was organized in 1891 to provide more advanced instruction for students. In 1949, because of the many colleges in the Northwest with Pacific in their name, the College was renamed George Fox in honor of the founder of the Friends (Quaker) Church. The College is governed by a 42-member Board of Trustees elected by Northwest Yearly Meeting of Friends Church, which comprises nearly 8,000 members in 51 churches in Oregon, Washington, and Idaho.

George Fox is one of the nation's fastest-growing colleges. Enrollment has risen from 549 in 1986 to 1,439 in the fall of 1992, a 162 percent increase, including an 18 percent growth from the previous year.

GFC students come from 25 states and 14 nations. Nearly 40 religious denominations are represented on campus.

George Fox is accredited by the Northwest Association of Secondary and Higher Schools. The College is one of 13 members of the national Christian College Consortium.

GFC ATHLETICS

Intercollegiate athletics is an integral part of the overall education program at George Fox. Men's varsity athletic teams represent the College in baseball, basketball, track, cross country, and soccer. Women students compete in volleyball, basketball, track, softball, cross country, and soccer.

George Fox is a member of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA), District 2, Division II.

For students not participating in the varsity program, GFC has a complete intramural program including flag football, basketball, volleyball, softball, racquetball, indoor soccer, skiing, swimming, bowling, floor hockey, and tennis.

Athletic facilities include the Coleman H. Wheeler Center for Sports and Physical Education; Colcord Field, which includes an all-weather rubberized track, tennis courts; and the Curtis and Margaret Morse Athletic Field containing baseball diamond, softball field, and soccer field. The complex was opened in 1989.

Wheeler Center, completed in 1977 in a \$2.7 million project, includes the James and Lila Miller Gymnasium with three basketball courts and seating for up to 2,500; multipurpose, class, and weight room; faculty and administrative offices; handball courts; dressing and therapy rooms.

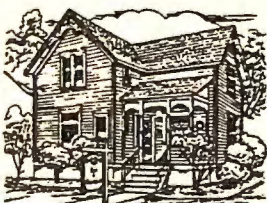

THIS IS WHERE THE GAME IS PLAYED

George Fox College is in its fifteenth year in the Coleman H. Wheeler Center for Sports and Physical Education. Completed in June 1977, the \$2.7 million, 55,000-square-foot complex is the College's largest building. It contains the James and Lila Miller Gymnasium, the Bruin home court.

The sports center was designed by noted architect Pietro Bel-luschi, with a wooded canyon setting chosen as the center's location. The building features wood products and a large win-dow area overlooking the adjacent natural terrain.

Three times larger than Hester Gymnasium, which it replaced, the Wheeler Center features a 116 x 174-foot gym-nasium with three basketball courts and seating for 2,500 spec-tators. The gymnasium ceilings are 32 feet over the hardwood maple floor. The gym provides three volleyball courts and ten badminton courts.

The building is entered on two levels—ground level on the east side through the nine doors for the general public and after crossing a 200-foot bridge; and on the second floor on the west side for campus personnel. There is a two-floor lobby.

Contained on the upper level are athletic administration and faculty offices, staff room, classroom, weight room, and multi-purpose room. The lower level contains a concession area and ticket sales area, dressing rooms, team rooms, laundry, equipment-issuing room, and storage space. An east wing of the building houses two handball courts.

The building is named for long-time Oregon lumberman Cole-man H. Wheeler, former chairman of the board of Willamette Industries. The gymnasium is named for former board member James Miller and his wife, Lila. He is the former president of Cascadia Lumber Co. The building was dedicated in 1977.

A LOOK AT THE PAST

The game of basketball was invented by Dr. James Naismith in 1891, and it took just seven years for it to be brought to George Fox College (then called Pacific College).

College board member and community leader T. W. Hester and others first saw the game played at the Portland YMCA. They were captivated by the new game and secured a ball, which they brought back to the College. The first exhibition game was played shortly thereafter, in the winter of 1898, and the first site was the third floor of the old Commercial Hotel on North Main Street because the College had no adequate space for the new sport.

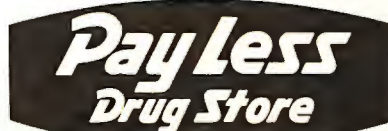
The first gymnasium on the campus was the upper part of one wing of an old academy building (Hoover Hall), built in 1885 and torn down in the mid-1950s. A one-room wood gymnasium building was constructed in 1916 and served until 1946, when the College opened Hester Gymnasium, a concrete block struc-ture built partly by student/faculty labor at a cost of \$40,000. The building served through the 1976-77 season with opening of Wheeler Center.

College athletic affiliation in men's basketball over those years has gone from independent status to membership in the old Willamette Christian College Conference, the Metropolitan Conference, the Oregon Collegiate Conference, and back again to the present status as a major small college independent member of NAIA District 2 (joined in 1965). In 1973 George Fox was the district champion for the first time and has been in the district playoffs 18 of the last 22 years, including the last 9 in a row, winning the championship in 1990. The 1991-92 team produced GFC's highest national finish, advancing to the NAIA Division II quarterfinals with two national tournament wins.

BRUINS PARTICIPATE IN NAIA



The National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) is a completely autonomous association administering programs leading to 23 national championships in 13 events. The NAIA includes 40 percent of America's collegiate athletic programs, representing 411 accredited four-year colleges and universities in 32 geographical districts spread over 49 states and Canada. The colleges have a total enrollment of more than 800,000, including approximately 65,000 varsity athletes.

Established in 1940 as the National Association of Intercollegiate Basketball the NAIB evolved from the institution of a "National Small College Basketball Tournament" that was inaugurated in 1937. In 1952 the NAIB was renamed the NAIA.

NAIA national headquarters and staff are located in Kansas City, Missouri, but will move in July to Tulsa, Oklahoma. The NAIA is governed by two bodies. The Council of Presidents, composed of one president from each district, is responsible for fiscal matters and supervision of the national staff. George Fox College president Edward F. Stevens represents NAIA District 2 and is one of five U.S. college presidents selected to serve on the NAIA Council of Presidents Executive Committee, serving as chairman in 1992. The national Coordinating Council,

elected by the membership, is responsible for organizing championship events, academic standards, and overseeing the committees and associations.

The NAIA clearly outlines its own responsibilities and those of its members: a sound athletic program, administered and controlled by those responsible for the administration of the college or university. The NAIA's basic premise is that the athletic program is a basic component of the overall general educational process, and not an entity apart.

George Fox College competes in District 2 of the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA), Division II. Thirteen teams make up the district, 11 within Oregon.

The district has two scheduling pools. George Fox plays in the independent "Cascade" division along with Albertson College, Concordia College, Eastern Oregon State College, Northwest Nazarene College, Oregon Institute of Technology, Southern Oregon State College, Western Baptist College, and Western Oregon State College. Members of the Northwest Conference of Independent Colleges (NCIC) are Lewis & Clark College, Linfield College, Pacific University, and Willamette University. Three institutions in Washington—Pacific Lutheran University, Whitman College, and Whitworth College—are members of the conference, but members of NAIA District 1. They are assigned to District 2 for national playoff competition.

An eight-team district tournament will be held February 25, 27, and March 3 at the sites of the highest seeded teams. The top four independent teams and the top three NCIC teams receive automatic berths in the district playoffs. Using the "Sempert" system, the eighth team is selected between the fourth-place NCIC team and the fifth-place independent team.

TONIGHT'S GAME

Expect more than a few 3-pointers in tonight's contest between Willamette Valley rivals George Fox College and Western Baptist College. Both teams are sinking around eight a game, ranking fourth and fifth in NAIA District 2.

The Warriors have hit 84 of their 238 tries (8.4 a game), while GFC is 71 for 183 (7.9 a game).

The Bruins' top long-distance shooter, freshman wing Nick Haij, is the district's seventh-leading 3-point shooter. He's hit 27 of his 75 attempts, 2.8 a game.

GFC and WBC feature the district's fourth and fifth top scorers. The Bruins' Jamie Boutin is averaging 22.2 points a game and Western Baptist's Justin Sherwood comes in with a 21.8 scoring average. He's averaging 2.9 3-pointers a game.

The Bruins have district leaders in other areas as well. Senior post Mike Rasmussen leads the district with 9.1 rebounds a game and freshman point Grant Hartenstein is second in district assists at 6.8 a game.

As a team, George Fox is scoring 86.5 points a game, third best in District 2. Tonight's game is the Bruins' second at home this week. On Monday they downed visiting Occidental College, 90-64. GFC broke open a game that was tied 40-40 at half time by holding the Tigers scoreless for nearly 10 minutes.

George Fox is 4-6 this season, 0-2 in the Cascade Conference after last weekend falling twice in Idaho—to Albertson College (86-81) and Northwest Nazarene College (103-67).

Western Baptist also is 0-2 in conference. Overall the Warriors are 3-7, but have won two straight. Last weekend they downed Northwest College 76-69 and University of Puget Sound 74-71. In head-to-head NAIA play, George Fox leads 39-20, but the Warriors won both contests last year. In climactic finishes, Western Baptist won a 74-71 contest in Salem, then edged the Bruins 72-71 in Newberg.

THE BRUIN NICKNAME

George Fox College is represented by the nickname and mascot "Bruin." But it has not always been so, even though it should have been.

The nickname comes from a real bear captured in 1887 just two years after Pacific Academy (the College's predecessor) was established. The small cub was captured in the coast range foothills west of Carlton when its mother was shot. The young cub was brought to campus by a student and later lived with a faculty member. When it grew to adulthood it was kept in a pit in what is now known as Hess Creek Canyon south of the campus. It escaped one too many times and was turned into steak for the dining table and the hide preserved on a frame and displayed in an early campus museum. When it deteriorated several years later, it was taken to a campus furnace room to be destroyed, but the framework proved a problem in dismantling, so it was left sitting in a corner. Students found the old Bruin skin later and began skirmishes over ownership, a tradition that continues 104 years later. "Bruin Junior," a replica, under a set of guidelines passed down for years, is fought over periodically in class competition, with the class able to physically drag the Bruin replica off campus declared the rightful owner until next "flushed."

Even with the Bruin tradition, somewhere along the line, the "Quaker" tag to athletic teams came into popularity with sports writers because of the College's church affiliation, and that nickname was used, along with a mascot "Foxy George," a little fox with a Quaker hat. Both gained acceptance for a period in the 1950s and 1960s until a vote of faculty, students, and administration in 1970 reinstated the Bruin nickname to its rightful place.
