George Fox College, in its 104th year, is one of America's Best Colleges. Six times it has been given that designation by U.S. News & World Report magazine. In 1994 GFC was ranked second in academic reputation among Western Regional Liberal Arts Colleges, including colleges and universities from Oklahoma to Hawaii. The magazine in 1993 also named George Fox to its list of "The Nation's Most Efficient Institutions," second in the West.

The College also is on the Templeton Foundation Honor Roll of Character Building Colleges, the only Oregon college selected and one of 111 in the United States.

George Fox College is the outgrowth of a desire by early Willamette Valley Quaker settlers for the Christian education of their children. After Pacific Academy was established in 1885, the college division was organized in 1891 to provide more advanced instruction for students. In 1949, because of the many colleges in the Northwest with Pacific in their name, the College was renamed George Fox in honor of the founder of the Friends (Quaker) Church. The College

is governed by a 42-member Board of Trustees elected by Northwest Yearly Meeting of Friends Church, which comprises nearly 8,000 members in 53 churches in Oregon, Washington and Idaho.

George Fox is one of the nation's fastest-growing colleges. Enrollment has risen from 549 in 1986 to 1,658 in the fall of 1994, a 202 percent increase.

GFC students come from 30 states, one U.S. possession and 10 nations. More than 40 religious denominations are represented on campus.

The 73-acre rural, tree-shaded campus, a half-hour drive from Portland, has undergone major expansion in recent years with 12 new buildings constructed. Part of a \$16 million Centennial Campaign, the \$5.3 million Edwards-Holman Science Center opened in the fall of 1994.

Alumni of George Fox are primarily in service-oriented vocations of Christian ministries, education, social work and medical fields. The College's most prominent alumnus is the late President Herbert Hoover, who attended Pacific Academy.

George Fox College maintains one of the Northwest's premier small-college athletic programs. In the past five years, George Fox athletes have earned 52 NAIA All-American awards and 23 academic All-American Scholar-Athlete honors.

In the 1993-94 seasons, all 11 George Fox teams qualified for post-season play, with women's cross country, men's soccer and softball winning NAIA District 2 titles. Men's cross country, women's soccer and baseball finished as district runners-up. George Fox has won district titles in seven different sports during the 1990s.

George Fox's highest national team finish came in the fall of 1992, when the women's cross country team maintained a No. 1 ranking for its entire season before finishing as national runner-up.

Intercollegiate athletics is an integral part of the overall educational program at George Fox. Men's varsity athletic teams represent the College in baseball, basketball, track, cross country and soccer. Women's teams are fielded in volleyball, basketball, track, softball, cross country and soccer.

Entered by crossing a wooded canyon on a 200-foot bridge, the Wheeler Sports Center is a natural place to play basketball.

The sports center was designed by noted architect Pietro Belluschi to sit unpretentiously alongside Hess Creek Canyon. Built using gifts from prominent lumbermen, the building features a two-level oak parquet lobby and a large window area overlooking the adjacent natural terrain.

Completed in June 1977, the \$2.7 million, 55,000-square-foot complex is the College's largest building. It contains the James and Lila Miller Gymnasium.

The Wheeler Center features a 116-by-174-foot gymnasium with three basketball courts and seating for 2,000 spectators. The gymnasium ceilings are 32 feet over the hardwood maple floor.

The building is named for longtime Oregon lumberman Coleman H. Wheeler, former chairman of the board of Willamette Industries. The gymnasium is named for former board member James Miller and his wife, Lila. He is the former president of Cascadia Lumber Co.

George Fox College is represented by the nickname and mascot "Bruin." But it has not always been so, even though it should have been.

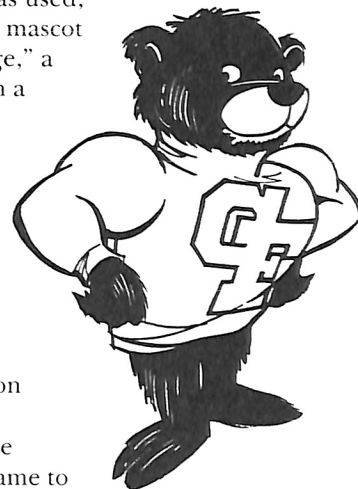
The nickname comes from a real bear captured in 1887 just two years after Pacific Academy (the College's predecessor) was established. The small cub was captured in the coast range foothills west of Carlton when its mother was shot. The young cub was brought to campus by a student and later lived with a faculty member. When it grew to adulthood it was kept in a pit in what is now known as Hess Creek Canyon south of the campus. It escaped one too many times and was turned into steak for the dining table and the hide preserved on a frame and displayed in an early campus museum.

When the hide deteriorated several years later, it was taken to a campus furnace room to be destroyed, but the framework proved a problem in dismantling, so it was left sitting in a corner. Students found the old Bruin skin later and began skirmishes over ownership, a tradition that continues today.

"Bruin Junior," a replica, under a set

of guidelines passed down for years, is fought over periodically in class competition, with the class able to physically drag the Bruin replica off campus declared the rightful owner until next "flashed."

Even with the Bruin tradition, somewhere along the line, the "Quaker" tag for athletic teams came into popularity with sports writers because of the College's church affiliation, and that nickname was used, along with a mascot "Foxy George," a little fox with a Quaker hat. Both gained acceptance for a period in the 1950s and 1960s until a vote of faculty, students and administration in 1970 reinstated the Bruin nickname to its rightful place.

NAIA

CONFERENCE

George Fox College joined the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) in 1965. GFC's men's and women's basketball teams play in NAIA Division II, while the College's other nine sports are not divided into divisions.

The NAIA is a completely autonomous association administering programs leading to 13 men's and 11 women's national championships. The NAIA includes 391 accredited four-year colleges and universities in 49 states and Canada. The colleges are grouped in nine regions and 44 conferences.

The NAIA sponsors men's championships in Division I and II basketball, Division I and II football, tennis, outdoor and indoor track, golf, cross country, baseball, swimming and diving, wrestling and soccer.

In 1980, the NAIA initiated championships for women in nine sports: basketball, cross country, softball, indoor and outdoor track, soccer, swimming and diving, and volleyball. Golf and tennis were added later.

George Fox president Edward F. Stevens has been involved in the NAIA's national leadership, serving as chairman of the NAIA Council of Presidents Executive Committee in 1992.

George Fox College is playing its second and last season in the Cascade Collegiate Conference (CCC). In 1995-96, GFC is joining the Northwest Conference of Independent Colleges (NCIC).

Six teams will participate in the Cascade Collegiate Conference playoffs held February 23, 25, and March 1 at the sites of the highest-seeded teams. Selection and seeding is based on conference record, but in cases of ties, head-to-head results and the "Sempert" tie-breaking system will be used. The No. 1- and No. 2-seeded teams receive first-round byes.

Winner of the conference playoffs will advance to the NAIA Division II national tournament, which this year expanded from 24 to 32 teams. Northwest Nazarene College is hosting the tournament in Nampa, Idaho. Berths not going to the 21 conference champions are available to the host institution and at-large selections.

The NAIA Council of Presidents voted in September of 1993 to eliminate the district format by which teams had qualified for national tournaments since 1965 in favor of the affiliated conference structure. Until this season, GFC was a member of

NAIA District 2, which divided into the Cascade Collegiate Conference and Northwest Conference of Independent Colleges.

GFC has advanced to NAIA postseason play 19 of the last 24 years.

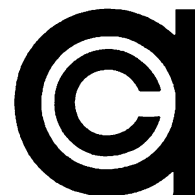

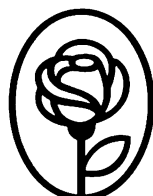

Mark Vernon not only is the winningest men's basketball coach in George Fox College history, but he also ranks among the winningest men's basketball coaches in NAIA Division II.

In 1992, after George Fox returned from its second trip to an NAIA national tournament in three years, his career winning percentage ranked fifth among active Division II coaches.

He's one of the nation's youngest coaches to surpass the 250-career-win milestone, passing it last year at the age of 40. His 12-year record is 251-132.

Vernon's teams have averaged more than 20 wins a season and produced four NAIA All-Americans and one academic All-American. He's become the only GFC coach to post a winning road record: His teams are 119-91 outside of Newberg.

His efforts have not gone unnoticed. In 1985, he was the youngest coach in NAIA District 2 when he was named men's basketball district Coach of the Year for the first time. In 1987 and 1991 he received the same honor. He was named National Christian College Athletic Association National Coach of the Year in 1987.

Vernon, 41, has his entire collegiate coaching career at George Fox, but the tie with the Bruins is longer. He came to the College in 1975 as a student and basketball player. He transferred from Seattle's Highline Community College, where he received both Best Defense and Hustle awards.

As a GFC guard, he established what was then the Bruins' highest career assist average (3.9). He was named Most Inspirational Player by his teammates his senior year, a year the Bruins were 20-9.

A 1977 graduate, Vernon was named GFC's Outstanding Physical Education Major and Outstanding Young Person in Teacher Education. He remained with GFC basketball as an assistant for three years (1977-78, 79-80 and 81-82), while working toward a 1982 master's degree in physical education at Linfield College.

In the fall of 1981, he joined the GFC physical education faculty as volleyball coach and women's tennis coach. Vernon currently teaches physical education classes in addition to his coaching.

He became head coach in 1982 after a nationwide search that began with 70 names.

Vernon and his wife, Denise, were married in August 1981 and have two sons: Brett, born June 19, 1991, and Brady, born July 17, 1993.

TONIGHT'S GAME

Tonight, in what may be a playoff preview, the Bruins play their final home game of the season.

17th-ranked Western Oregon State College is George Fox's final guest in a game with playoff implications. The Wolves have clinched a Cascade Conference playoff spot, but GFC is clinging to the sixth and final position. If the playoffs began tonight, these teams would be first-round opponents.

WOSC took the first contest with George Fox, 96-78, Jan. 24 in Monmouth and has won 15 of its last 20 games. Saturday, Western Oregon prevailed 81-63 over visiting Eastern Oregon State College.

The Wolves are led by their big men Jason Ball and Ramiro Ramirez. Ball is scoring 17.0 points a game and grabbing 7.0 rebounds. Ramirez is averaging 15.4 points and 7.7 rebounds.

Western Oregon has the third-most stingy defense in the conference. The Wolves are giving up 76.8 points a game. George Fox has one of the nation's highest-scoring offenses — averaging 87.1 points a game.

The Bruins are back from a tough trip to Southern Oregon, where Oregon Tech and Southern Oregon State College extended GFC's losing streak to six. Friday, Oregon Tech blew open a two-point contest in the second half and sent GFC away with a 96-78 loss. George Fox likely won't return often to Klamath Falls after the Bruins next year leave the Cascade Conference for the Northwest Conference. The Bruins have won just once since 1969 at Oregon Tech, eight times losing playoff games at Klamath Falls.

Saturday, Southern Oregon State College broke a seven-year 11-game losing streak to the Bruins with an overtime 107-102 victory. Point guard Ricky Acoff — the conference's leading scorer — scored a career-high 39 points to beat GFC. Three George Fox players fouled out.

The loss was a continuation of the 1994-95 Bruins' struggle to win close games. George Fox this season has lost 10 games by six points or fewer. The Bruins are 1-4 in overtime.

Four Bruins are scoring in double figures, led by the 17.5 average of 3-point specialist Nick Haij. Haij ranks fifth in the conference in scoring, eighth in free throw percentage (.840) and 14th in steals (1.4).

Wing Travis Orick is 11th in conference scoring at 15.7 points a game.

Post Nique Stewart continues to collect more rebounds than points. His 8.64 rebounding average is tops on the team and second in the conference. A part-time starter, Stewart also ranks third in field goal percentage (.628) and second in blocks (1.2).

Guard Rick Gardea is fifth in 3-point accuracy (.456), 11th in free throw percentage (.831), and sixth in assists (4.3).

Wing Aaron Downs is 10th in steals with 1.5 a game.

Tonight is the final home game for three George Fox seniors: Stewart, Gardea and James Homolka.
