George Fox College, in its 104th year, is one of "America's Best Colleges." Six times it has been given that designation by *U.S. News & World Report* magazine. In 1994 GFC was ranked second in academic reputation among Western Regional Liberal Arts Colleges, including colleges and universities from Oklahoma to Hawaii. The magazine in 1993 also named George Fox to its list of "The Nation's Most Efficient Institutions," second in the West.

George Fox College is the outgrowth of a desire by early Willamette Valley Quaker settlers for a Christian education of their children. They established Pacific Academy in 1885, while the college division was organized in 1891 to provide more advanced instruction for students. In 1949, because of the many colleges in the Northwest with Pacific in their name, the College was renamed George Fox in honor of the founder of the Friends (Quaker) Church. GFC is governed by a 42-member Board of Trustees elected by Northwest Yearly Meeting of Friends Church, which comprises nearly 8,000 members in 53 churches in Oregon, Washington and Idaho.

George Fox is one of the nation's fastest-growing colleges. Enrollment has risen from 549 in 1986 to 1,658 in the fall of 1994, a 202 percent increase.

GFC students come from 30 states, one possession and 10 nations. More than 40 religious denominations are represented on campus.

The College's undergraduate program is administered through

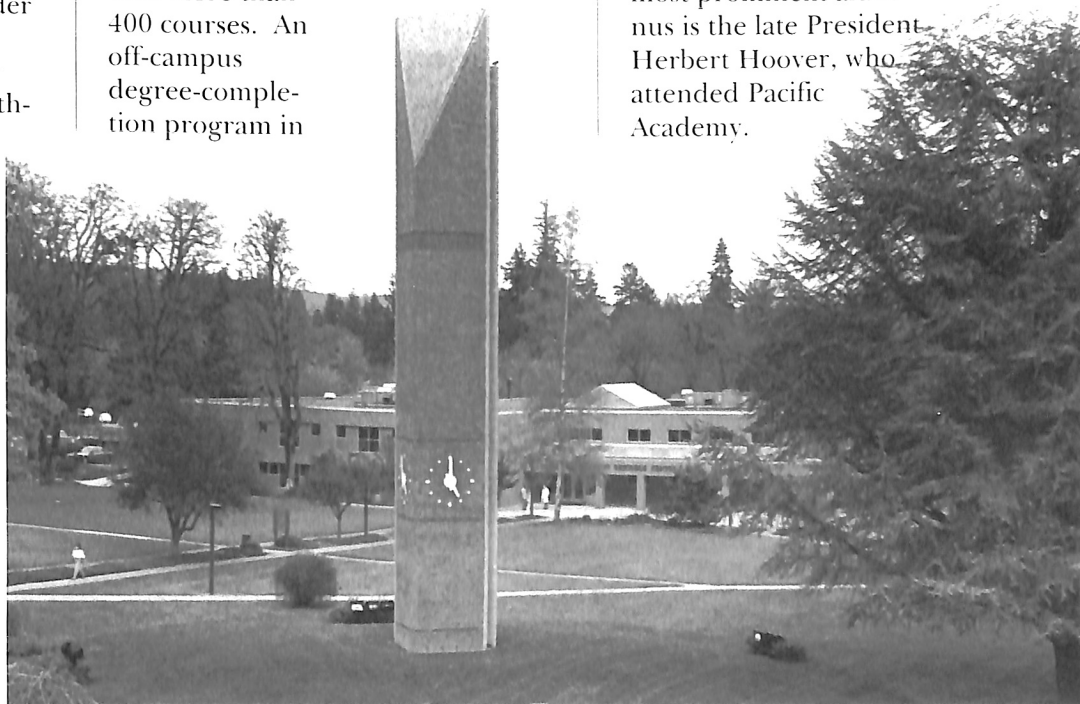

three schools: Humanities, Natural and Behavioral Sciences, and Professional Studies. The 15 departments offer 34 majors with more than 400 courses. An off-campus degree-completion program in

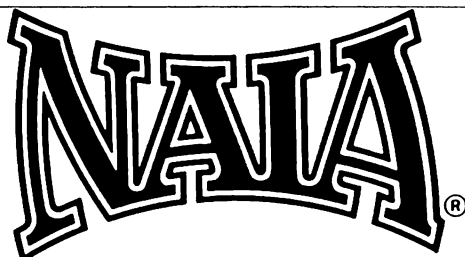
the management of human resources enrolls working adults in an evening program with classes in Portland, Salem and Eugene. The graduate program offers a Doctor of Psychology (Psy.D.) degree in clinical psychology, a Master of Arts in Teaching (M.A.T.), a Master of Education (M.Ed.), a Master of Business Administration (M.B.A.), and a Master of Arts in Christian Studies.

The 73-acre rural, tree-shaded campus a half-hour drive from Portland has undergone major expansion in recent years with 12 new buildings constructed. Part of a \$16 million Centennial Campaign, the \$5.3 million Edwards-Holman Science Center opened in the fall of 1994.

Alumni of George Fox are primarily in service-oriented vocations of Christian ministries, education, social work and medical fields. The College's most prominent alumnus is the late President Herbert Hoover, who attended Pacific Academy.

NAIA

George Fox College joined the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA) in 1965. GFC's men's and women's basketball teams play in NAIA Division II, while the College's other nine sports don't operate under separate divisions.

The NAIA is a completely autonomous association administering programs leading to 13 men's and 11 women's national championships. The NAIA includes 391 accredited four-year colleges and universities in 49 states and Canada. The colleges are grouped in nine regions and 44 conferences.

The NAIA sponsors men's championships in Division I and II basketball, Division I and II football, tennis, outdoor and indoor track, golf, cross country, baseball, swimming and diving, wrestling and soccer.

In 1980, the NAIA initiated championships for women in nine sports: basketball, cross country, softball, indoor and outdoor track, soccer, swimming and diving, and volleyball. Golf and tennis were added later.

George Fox College president Edward F. Stevens has been involved in the NAIA's national leadership, serving as chair of the NAIA Council of Presidents Executive Committee in 1992.

CONFERENCE INFORMATION

George Fox College is playing its second and last season in the Cascade Collegiate Conference (CCC). In 1995-96, GFC is joining the Northwest Conference of Independent Colleges (NCIC).

Six teams will participate in the Cascade Collegiate Conference playoffs held February 23, 25, and March 1 at the sites of the highest-seeded teams. Selection and seeding

are based on conference records, but in cases of ties, head-to-head results and the "Sempert" tie-breaking system will be used. The No. 1- and No. 2-seeded teams receive first-round byes.

Winner of the conference playoffs will advance to the NAIA Division II national tournament, which this year expanded from 24 to 32 teams. Northwest Nazarene College is hosting the tournament in Nampa, Idaho. Berths not going to the 21 conference champions are available to the host institution and at-large selections.

The NAIA Council of Presidents voted in September of 1993 to eliminate the district format, by which teams had qualified for national tournaments since 1965, in favor of the affiliated conference structure. Until this season, GFC was a member of NAIA District 2, which divided into the Cascade Collegiate Conference and Northwest Conference of Independent Colleges.

GFC has advanced to NAIA postseason play 19 of the last 24 years.

George Fox College maintains one of the Northwest's premier small-college athletic programs. In the past five years, George Fox athletes have earned 52 NAIA All-American awards and 23 academic All-American Scholar-Athlete honors.

In the 1993-94 seasons, all 11 George Fox teams qualified for post-season play, with softball, women's cross country and men's soccer winning NAIA District 2 titles. Baseball, men's cross country and women's soccer finished as district runners-up. George Fox has won district titles in seven different sports during the 1990s. At the end of 1993-94, every GFC coach had been named district or conference coach of the year at least once.

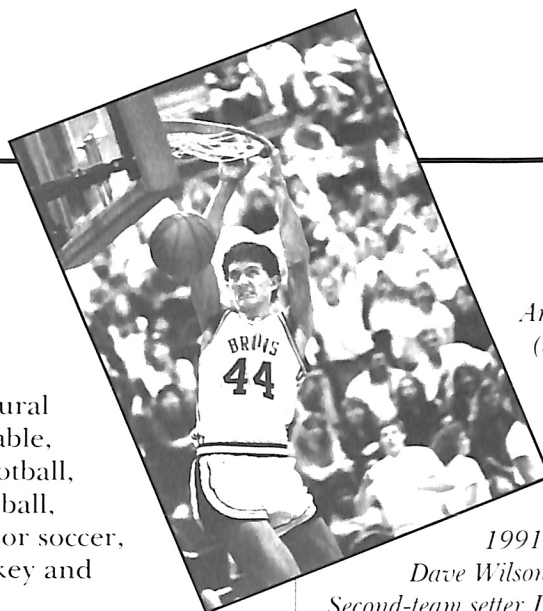
George Fox's highest national team finish came in the fall of 1992, when the women's cross country team maintained a No. 1 ranking for its entire season before finishing as national runner-up.

Intercollegiate athletics is an integral part of the overall education program at George Fox. Men's varsity athletic teams represent the College in baseball, basketball, track, cross country and soccer. Women's teams are fielded in volleyball, basketball, track, softball, cross country and soccer.

For students not participating in the varsity program, a

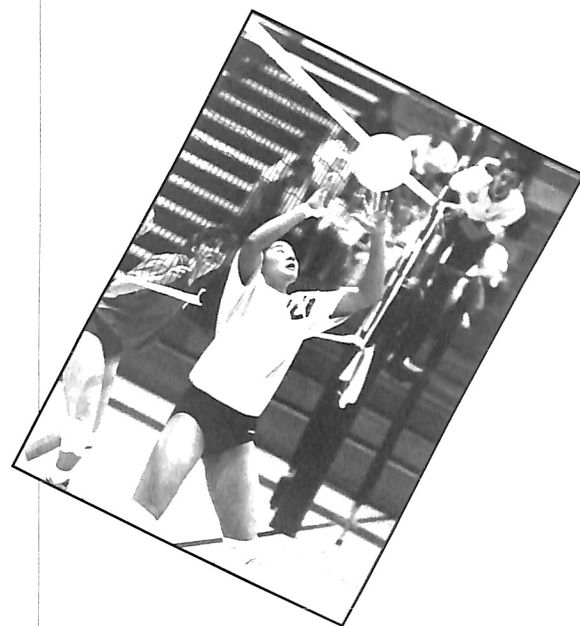
complete intramural program is available, including flag football, basketball, volleyball, racquetball, indoor soccer, skiing, floor hockey and tennis.

Athletic facilities include the Coleman H. Wheeler Center for Sports and Physical Education; Colcord Field, which received a new polyurethane surface in the fall of 1993; and the Curtis and Margaret Morse Athletic Complex containing baseball diamond, softball field and soccer field. In 1994, five tennis courts were installed in preparation for the addition of tennis as a varsity sport.

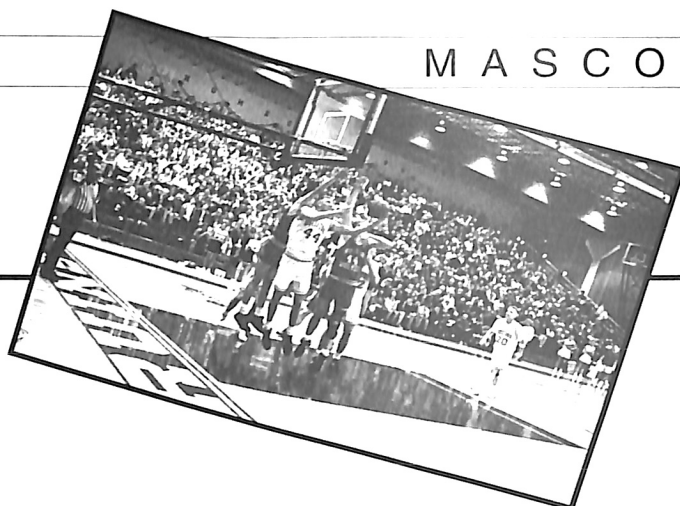


An All-American Trio: (top left) Jill Beals (13-time All-American, 1992 Hayward Award finalist, and Seattle Marathon winner); (left)

WHEELER SPORTS CENTER: a natural place for basketball

Entered by crossing a wooded canyon on a 200-foot bridge, the Coleman H. Wheeler Center for Sports and Physical Education is a natural place to play basketball.

The sports center was designed by noted architect Pietro Belluschi to sit unpretentiously alongside tree-shaded Hess Creek Canyon. Built using gifts from prominent lumbermen, the building features a two-level oak parquet lobby and a large window area overlooking the adjacent natural terrain.

Completed in June 1977, the \$2.7 million, 55,000-square-foot complex is the College's largest building. It contains the James and Lila Miller Gymnasium, the Bruin home court.

Three times larger than Hester Gymnasium, which it replaced, the Wheeler Center features a 116-by-174-foot gymnasium with three basketball courts and seating for 2,000 spectators. The gymnasium ceilings are 32 feet over the hardwood maple floor. The gym provides three volleyball courts and 10 badminton courts.

The building may be entered on two levels. The east-side ground level is accessible from the newly-paved parking lot by crossing the foot bridge. The on-campus community enters on the west-side second floor.

Contained on the upper level are a staff room, multipurpose room, classrooms and athletic administration and faculty offices. A 1,500-

square foot weight room was remodeled in the summer of 1993. The lower level contains a concession area, dressing rooms, team rooms, laundry, equipment-issuing room, and storage space. An east wing of the building houses two racquetball courts.

The building is named for long-time Oregon lumberman Coleman H. Wheeler, former chairman of the board of Willamette Industries. The gymnasium is named for former GFC board member James Miller and his wife, Lila. He is the former president of Cascadia Lumber Co.

BACKGROUND ON THE BRUIN NICKNAME

George Fox College is represented by the "Bruin" nickname and mascot. But it has not always been so, even though it should have been.

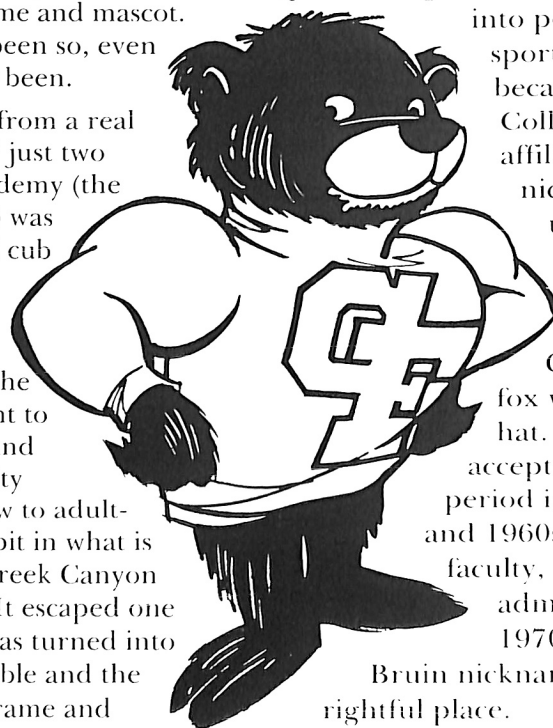
The nickname comes from a real bear captured in 1887 just two years after Pacific Academy (the College's predecessor) was established. The small cub was captured in the Coast Range foothills west of Carlton when its mother was shot. The young cub was brought to campus by a student and later lived with a faculty member. When it grew to adulthood it was kept in a pit in what is now known as Hess Creek Canyon south of the campus. It escaped one too many times and was turned into steak for the dining table and the hide preserved on a frame and

displayed in an early campus museum. When the hide deteriorated several years later, it was taken to a campus furnace room to be destroyed, but the framework proved a problem in dismantling so it was left sitting in a corner. Students found the old Bruin skin later and began skirmishes over ownership, a tradition that continues today. "Bruin Junior," a replica, under a set of guidelines passed down for years, is fought over periodically in class competition, with the class able to physically drag the Bruin replica off campus declared the rightful owner until next "flashed."

Even with the Bruin tradition, somewhere along the line, the "Quaker" tag for athletic teams came

into popularity with sportswriters because of the College's church affiliation, and that nickname was used, along with the mascot "Foxy George," a little fox with a Quaker hat. Both gained acceptance for a period in the 1950s and 1960s until a vote of faculty, students and administration in 1970 reinstated the

Bruin nickname to its rightful place.

BASKETBALL AT GEORGE FOX

The game of basketball was invented by Dr. James Naismith in 1891, and it took just seven years for it to be brought to George Fox College (then called Pacific College).

College board member and community leader T. W. Hester and others first saw the game played at the Portland YMCA. They were captivated by the new game and secured a ball, which they brought back to the College. The first exhibition game was played shortly thereafter, in the winter of 1898. The first site was the third floor of the old Commercial Hotel on North Main Street because the College had no adequate space for the new sport.

The first gymnasium on the campus was the upper part of one wing of an old academy building (Hoover Hall), built in 1885 and torn down in the mid-1950s. A one-room wood gymnasium building was constructed in 1916 and served until 1946, when the College opened Hester Gymnasium, a concrete-block structure built partly by student/faculty labor at a cost of \$40,000. The building, with a single hemlock playing floor and seating for 1,100, served until the opening of the Wheeler Center in 1976-77.

College athletic affiliation in men's basketball has gone from independent status to membership in the old Willamette Christian College Conference, the Metropolitan Conference and the Oregon Collegiate Conference. From 1965 through 1993, George Fox was an independent member of NAIA District 2. In 1993 the NAIA voted to eliminate the district format for national tournament qualification and switched to affiliated conferences. Currently, GFC is in its second and last year in the Cascade Collegiate Conference. In 1995-96, George Fox will join the Northwest Conference of Independent Colleges.

In 1973, George Fox won its first NAIA District 2 title. The Bruins have advanced to NAIA postseason play 19 of the last 24 years, including 10 of the last 11. The 1991-92 team produced GFC's highest national finish, advancing to the NAIA Division II quarterfinals with two national tournament wins.

"Our greatest basketball year," according to a College publication, *The First Fifty Years* (published in 1941), "was reached in 1917 when Pacific College won the [Willamette Valley] league championship and defeated Oregon State College 34-25." There have, of course, been many significant wins, seasons and players since 1898. Much of that history, however, has been lost because of the lack of available information and incomplete records prior to NAIA membership in 1965. Highlights and records since that time appear in the records section. Pre-NAIA statistics available show these marks: Bill Hopper with a 42-point game and 1,737 career points in 1954-1958, and Cub Grimm in the 1952-53 season with a 21.0-points-per-game average and 26 free throws in a contest with the Oregon Medical School in 1953.

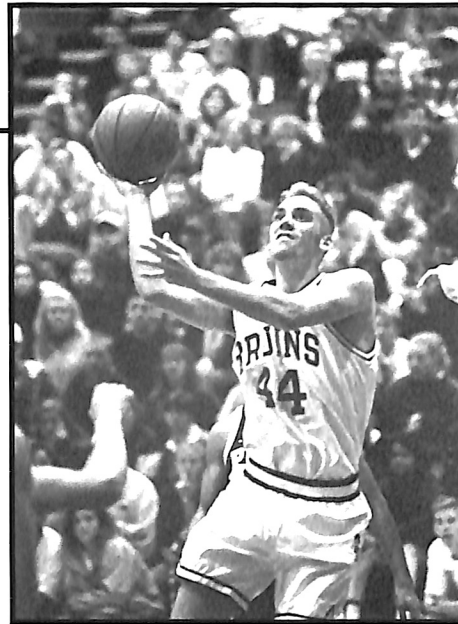

The basketball Bruins went behind the 3-point line in 1993-94 to collect their 10th winning season in the last 11 years.

George Fox broke school records by averaging almost 10 treys a game, sinking 328 of 893 3-pointers. The Bruins also tied national NAIA Division II records in a game against Northwest Christian College, going 18 of 46 beyond the stripe.

High expectations arrived early after a fast start. Going into the new year, GFC ranked as high as 27th in the national NAIA Division II poll and peaked with a 13-5 record. The momentum faded and George Fox's roller coaster 17-16 season squealed to a halt in the first round of the Cascade Collegiate Conference playoffs, when Eastern Oregon State College held off the visiting Bruins 104-97.

The unique 1993-94 season will be remembered for some glistening road wins and disappointing home showings. Outside of Newberg, GFC was the conference's best regular-season road team, winning 12 times — one short of the school record.

Early in the season, the Bruins curtailed the 19-game home win streak of Willamette University, the defending NAIA Division II national champion. GFC also marched into Caldwell, Idaho, and handed defending conference champion Albertson College its first home conference loss in two years. On the downside, GFC was a frustrating 5-8 in Newberg, tied for fewest home wins in the conference.

In his 12th year, head coach Mark Vernon moved his career record

over the 250-win plateau. Vernon's career record stands at 251-132 (.655).

Three GFC players earned conference kudos. Senior forward Jamie Boutin repeated as a Cascade Collegiate all-conference selection and won NAIA Division II All-American honorable mention. Boutin earned MVP honors at Willamette and Western Baptist tournaments and finished as the conference's most accurate regular-season 3-point shooter at 48 percent.

Sophomore guard Nick Haij and senior guard/forward Justin Paola earned conference honorable mention. Haij led the conference in 3-pointers made and holds GFC single-game, season and career records for 3-point makes and attempts. He finished his second season with 110 3-pointers, the 10th highest season total in conference history. Paola finished in the conference top 10 in scoring, rebounding, free throw percentage, steals and blocks. Against Northwest Christian he corralled 26 rebounds, a school record.

Theme for 1994-95: Overachieve

The NAIA Division II preseason poll calls the 1994-95 George Fox College basketball Bruins the 28th-ranked team in the nation, but who are these unfamiliar fellows in blue and gold?

They bear little resemblance to last year's talented, but inconsistent, 17-16 squad. Eight newcomers — five already slated for significant minutes — dot the Bruin roster.

Perhaps they are the dark-horse challengers in what may be the toughest conference in NAIA Division II. Three Cascade Collegiate Conference opponents are ranked in the top-25 poll.

Head coach Mark Vernon is giving his team accolades for hustle, heart and unselfishness, but wants nothing to do with lofty preseason expectations.

"We're not really big or athletic, but we have a good work ethic," he says. "We will have success because we're an overachieving team. Most teams we play this year will have better talent, but we hope to make up for it through hard work, defense and heart."

Although their faces may be fresh to Newberg, college basketball isn't new to most of Vernon's recruits. Five are transfers and GFC's roster is a veteran one, listing 10 upperclassmen.

Vernon intends to spread playing time among 10 players and throw intense pressure defense at opponents to fuel George Fox's fast break. When the Bruins have the ball, stopping one leading scorer won't be enough. George Fox boasts an arsenal of outside shooters, each capable of going for 25 points or more on a given night. Vernon says this could be his best passing team

and predicts the Bruins will be one of the highest-scoring teams in the conference.

"We definitely will be an up-tempo team, which is our tradition," he says. "We shoot very well but have added players who can drive to the basket and three recruits who can score around the basket. I feel like we're a complete offensive team, with shooting ability, driving ability and inside scoring."

Still, he warns winning will hinge on defense, rebounding and the post play GFC gets from its three new inside players.

A freshman with a shot at the starting lineup is 6-6 Jared Gallop, a USA Today Honorable Mention All-American from Roseburg, Ore. Vernon calls him his best freshman recruit since All-Americans Dave Wilson and Kenny Stone.

Nique Stewart, a 6-6 senior transfer from NCAA Division II Regis University in Colorado, also is a potential starter. A graduate of Crenshaw High School in Los Angeles, Nique is a talented shot blocker, play maker and rebounder.

Vernon says Troy Holmes, a junior transfer from Everett Community, is as good around the basket as anyone he's coached in his 13 years. Although just 6-3, Holmes' tenacity will win him minutes on the court.

The Bruins can bring on a couple of other posts, both in their second year in the George Fox program. Junior Mitch Ratzlaff is a 6-3 spark plug who works well under the boards, and 6-6 sophomore Jon Strauss can contribute a powerful presence on the court.

"Rebounding is a real key this season," says Vernon. "We're a small team that needs to battle on the boards and hold our own if we expect to have a good year. We are a small team in size, but a team that plays big in desire and heart."

While George Fox may be short up front, it is deep in the wing and point-guard positions. In his career, Vernon says he's never had a better group of perimeter players. Three are returning starters.

Junior Nick Haij was decorated last year as a Cascade Collegiate Conference honorable mention selection. The 6-1 wing holds every George Fox game, season and career 3-point record, but Vernon says he's become a more complete offensive player by improving his drive to the basket. With 827 points in his first two years, Haij is on target to finish in GFC's top-10 in career scoring.

Junior wing Grant Hartenstein is a fiery 5-10 converted point guard who isn't bashful about barreling at the basket through traffic. He already is ninth on GFC's career assist list with 350.

Vernon plucked 6-2 junior wing Travis Orick from Clackamas Community, the Northwest community college team champion. Bruin fans might remember him as a hot-shooting freshman guard who in 1992 tallied 27 points in leading Oregon Tech to a 89-90 road win over then No. 2-ranked George Fox.

Junior Aaron Downs was GFC's backup point guard last season and gives the Bruins intelligent play and defensive toughness.

Because of the depth at the wing position, freshman Aaron Newkirk, an Oregon 4A all-state honorable mention selection from Crater High School, and senior James Homolka might see limited action this season. Notre Dame football might claim "Rudy," but George Fox basketball has Homolka. The persistent 6-1 Idaho native made the team after being cut in 1991, 1992 and 1993.

Vernon is putting the ball in the hands of three point guards who weren't in the George Fox program last year.

The Bruins have regained 6-1 point guard Rick Gardea, who sat out a season after averaging 5.1 assists and 13.5 points in 1992-93. An excellent ballhandler under pressure, Gardea is the team leader and captain.

Brent Fulk, a 24-year-old junior who started at NCAA Division I Northeastern Illinois University, is battling

for a starting role. Vernon calls Fulk a fierce competitor and a superior defender.

A special recruit for Vernon was freshman point guard Kyle Valentine of West Linn High School. George Fox's coach has maintained a friendship with Kyle's father, West Linn coach Bart Valentine, since the two attended college together 20 years ago. Vernon projects Valentine as the future Bruin starting point guard.

This season's initial goals? A home playoff game and a 20-win season — both almost routine occurrences in Vernon's successful 13-year tenure.

Our goal always is to win 20 games," he says. "This team will have to play to its fullest potential to obtain that goal. This may be the hardest-working team I have coached. Win, lose or draw, our opponent will know they've been in a contest."

MARK VERNON not only is the winningest men's basketball coach in George Fox College history, but he also ranks among the winningest men's basketball coaches in NAIA Division II.

In 1992, after George Fox returned from its second trip to an NAIA national tournament in three years, his career winning percentage ranked fifth among active Division II coaches.

He's one of the nation's youngest coaches to surpass the 250-career-win milestone, eclipsing it last year at the age of 40. His 12-year record is 251-132.

Vernon's teams have averaged more than 20 wins a season and produced four NAIA All-Americans and one academic All-American. He's become the only GFC coach to post a winning road record: His teams are 119-91 outside of Newberg.

His efforts have not gone unnoticed. In 1985 he was the youngest coach in NAIA District 2 when he was named men's basketball district Coach of the Year for the first time. In 1987 and 1991 he received the same honor. He was named National Christian College Athletic Association National Coach of the Year in 1987.

Vernon, 41, has his entire collegiate coaching career at George Fox, but the tie with the Bruins is longer. He came to the College in 1975 as a student and basketball player. He transferred from Seattle's Highline Community College, where he received both Best Defense and Hustle awards. While at West Seattle High School, he was named Outstanding Athlete of the Year as a senior.

As a GFC guard, he established what was then the Bruins' highest career assist average (3.9). He was named Most Inspirational Player by his teammates his senior year, a year the Bruins were 20-9. In his two years in a GFC uniform, the Bruins were 39-17.

A 1977 graduate, Vernon was named GFC's Outstanding Physical Education Major and Outstanding Young Person in Teacher Education. He remained with GFC basketball as an assistant for three years (1977-78, 79-80 and 81-82), while working toward a 1982 master's degree in physical education at Linfield College.

In the fall of 1981, he joined the GFC physical education faculty as volleyball coach and women's tennis coach.

He became head coach in 1982 after a nationwide search that began with 70 names.

Vernon currently teaches physical education classes in addition to his coaching.

Vernon and his wife, Denise, were married in August 1981 and have two sons: Brett, born June 19, 1991, and Brady, born July 17, 1993.

Q & A WITH MARK VERNON

Q. Your teams average more than 20 wins a season, are playoff regulars, and your career record at George Fox is 251-132. What reasons can you give for that kind of success?

Mark: "I believe we have had talented players over the years. But maybe just as important as talent, we have had players with character and heart. I have been fortunate to have coached very good players as well as very good people."

Q. Describe your coaching philosophies. How do you coach your teams to play?

Mark: "First and foremost, we want our team to be just that—a team—with team goals placed well above any personal goals players may have. We want to play hard, smart, and together every time we step on the floor. I really believe the game is for the players and the fans, and so I believe in playing an up-tempo game that is enjoyable for everyone. Winning is fun no matter what, but winning and putting a lot of points on the board is even more fun."

Q. What do you enjoy most about coaching?

Mark: "I enjoy my players the most. The everyday interaction that goes on between my players and myself makes my job fun. I also like the camaraderie with my fellow coaches. We compete hard against each other during the season, but are friends otherwise. I would be remiss if I didn't mention I love the competition. Anyone who knows me knows I compete at everything I do. I have the best job in the world, I really can't think of anything else I would like to do and still get paid."

Q. You are entering your 13th year as George Fox head coach. What is it about the College that has kept you here all these years?

Mark: "I believe in the values and Christian education that students receive at GFC. I believed in the College enough to come as a student-athlete, and I still believe in it after 12 years of coaching. George Fox College stands up for its convictions, and I like being associated with a college that has integrity and a Christ-centered foundation."



STEVE GRANT is in his 13th year with the Bruins, both as men's basketball assistant coach and head volleyball coach.

Grant, 48, replaced Mark Vernon as volleyball coach in 1982 when Vernon moved to the head basketball position. The Bruins' assistant is a 1969 graduate of Biola University, where he was a three-sport athlete. As a guard for the basketball team, he was named team MVP both his junior and senior years. He earned first team all-conference, all-district and all-Far West honors as an Eagle defender on the soccer team and played baseball his freshman and junior years.

After graduation, Grant stayed two years as a basketball and soccer assistant coach. In 1971, Grant moved to Salem, Ore., to become head boys' basketball coach and head baseball coach at Salem Academy. In 1975, he switched from baseball to women's volleyball.

He served a one-year stint at Western Baptist College in 1981-82, coaching the women's basketball and men's soccer teams.

During his 13 years as a GFC coach, his volleyball teams have compiled a 310-204 record. In 1984 and 1987, the Lady Bruins won National Christian College Athletic Association national championships, and both times he was named NCCAA national Coach of the Year. NAIA District 2 Coach of the Year honors came to him in 1984 and 1990.

Grant earned a master's degree in education from Linfield College in 1985.

He and his wife, Kathleen, live in Salem. They have two children: Jeff, 22, and Bryan, 19.

STEVE CURTIS is in his eighth year as trainer for the basketball Bruins. A 1982 GFC graduate with a degree in physical education, Curtis

received a master's degree in teaching from Portland State University in 1987. He is a certified athletic trainer by the Board of Certification of the National Athletic Trainers Association.

Curtis, 35, was head trainer, teacher and activities director at Portland's Franklin High School prior to joining the GFC athletic staff. He is a native of Monmouth, Oregon, and a graduate of Salem Academy. While student teaching at GFC, he served as assistant coach for the track Bruins in the 1982-83 school year.

As a student he was the NAIA District 2 hammer throw champion

for three consecutive years, 1980-82, finishing 11th and 12th nationally in the event. He also was third in the district in the discus his senior year, when he was named the Bruin MVP.

During the last two summers, Curtis has been the trainer for Portland's professional roller hockey team, The Rage.

At GFC, Curtis also is an instructor in physical education, teaching athletic training classes and the exercise science classes. He and his wife, Karen, live in Portland and have three children: Christopher, 8, Kendall, 5, and Caitlin, born June 6, 1993.



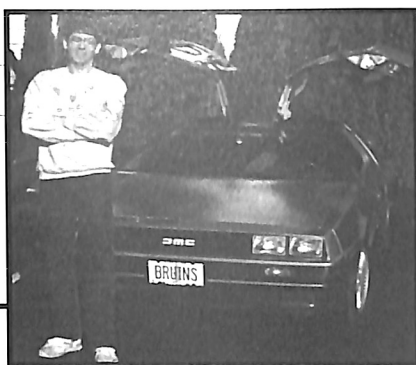
BART VALENTINE, head boys' basketball coach at West Linn High School, assisted the Bruins for the first time this year in preseason practice. Valen-

CRAIG TAYLOR is in his seventh year as George Fox College Athletic Director, but he has been associated with the Bruins for 21 years as player,

coach and professor. Taylor, 43, came to George Fox in 1971 as a junior forward on the men's basketball team. In 1972-73, he helped the Bruins to their first-ever NAIA District 2 title.

The AD was the coach of the women's basketball team from 1981 to 1993, producing a 162-155 record. He also coached GFC softball from 1981 to 1988, and again in 1990. His teams compiled a 77-99-1 record, and in 1985 he was named NAIA District 2 Coach of the Year.

At George Fox, the athletic director is responsible for athletic department functions, including eligibility and compliance with GFC and NAIA regulations, budgeting, and department and sports center management.

Taylor has three children: Leah, a 20-year-old junior at GFC, Bree, 15, and Casey, 5. Taylor and his wife, Kathy, live in McMinnville.



HAL ADRIAN became Associate Director of Athletics at George Fox in 1994. In that position he is responsible for the Bruin Club and general fund-

raising, as well as for special projects such as the George Fox Athletic Hall of Fame and sports banquet.

A 1956 graduate of Lewis & Clark College, Adrian taught and coached in the Beaverton School District until 1961 when he joined North Pacific Insurance. Last year he retired as Vice President of Human Resources. For 40 years he has been involved in church music leadership, chairing the 1992 Billy Graham Crusade music committee. Adrian also has been active in United Way leadership.

Hal and his wife, Audrey, have three sons: Jay, Greg and Dave, who currently is George Fox's Vice President for Development.



ROB FELTON is in his third year as Sports Information Director for George Fox's 11 athletic teams. A 1992 GFC graduate with a degree in communication

arts, Felton was a GFC sports information student assistant for three years. Felton, 24, replaced Barry Hubbell, who held the position since 1970. Hubbell remains in a supervisor role as Executive Assistant to the President.

The GFC Sports Information Office has produced 27 national award-winning publications in the last 13 years. Most recently, the 1994 baseball media guide earned fourth in a national contest sponsored by the College Sports Information Directors of America.

Felton also has additional responsibilities as Assistant Director of Public Information.

A magna cum laude graduate, he was named Outstanding Student in Communication Arts and to Who's Who Among Students in American

Colleges and Universities. He was sports editor for the student newspaper, The Crescent, for two years and editor as a sophomore.



MIKE WIRTA is in his 23rd year as George Fox basketball statistician. Called "Biggs" by his friends, Wirta is a 1974 George Fox graduate and one

of the most loyal Bruin fans. At the end of the 1993-94 season, he had kept stats for 267 straight GFC men's basketball contests and 303 in a row at home. A member of the College's physical plant staff, Wirta, 45, has the upkeep of the sports center as his major responsibility. A Newberg native, he devotes many volunteer hours to compiling statistics and records for the players and teams recorded in this book.

In 1988 the College's alumni association named Wirta its Volunteer of the Year, just the second person to receive the designation. In 1994 he received an NAIA District 2 Meritorious Service Award.
