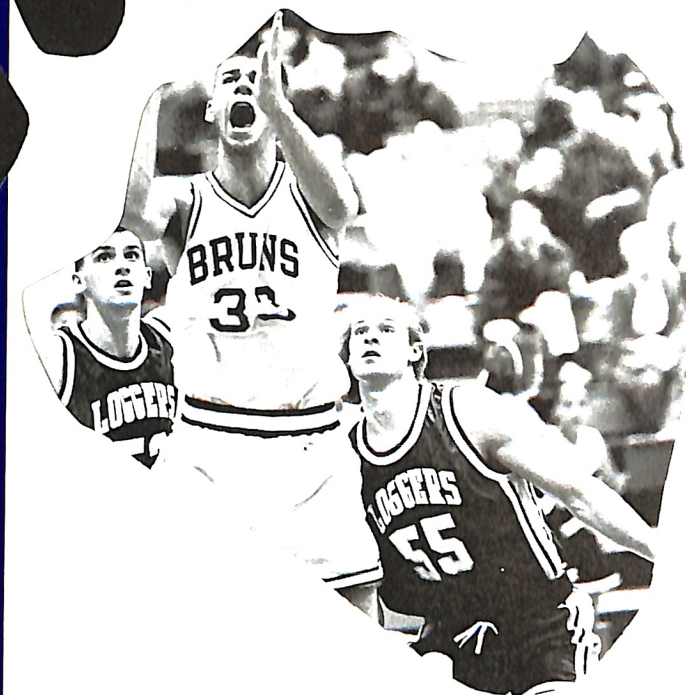

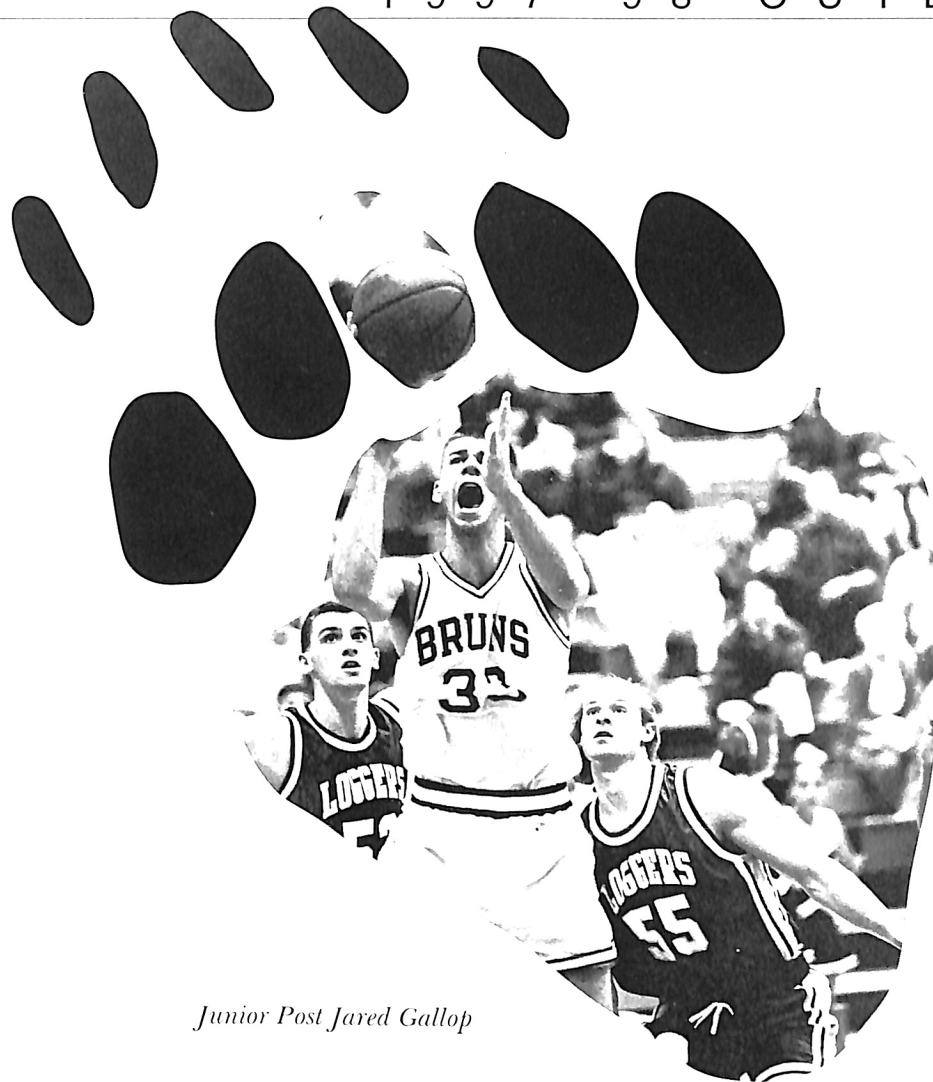

Men's Basketball Outlook 1997-98

Will this be the season George Fox men's basketball fans have been waiting for?

Five of the top 13 returning scorers in the Northwest Conference will be wearing Bruin uniforms this season — including two all-conference big men. Add a solid recruiting class of talented guards and post players and 16th-year Head Coach Mark Vernon will have his deepest team in years.

But Vernon cautions against high expectations following a shorthanded 1996-97 season.

"Coming off eight wins last season, I'd be foolish to say more than 'We're

improved,'" he says. "We'll let our actions speak for themselves."

The Bruins will have two seasons to prove themselves. With no seniors on the roster, George Fox could have the same team next season as well.

Juniors form the core of the squad.

"Our juniors will have to lead us," says Vernon. "What we do this year is dependent on what they do."

Last year's team MVP was point guard Kyle Valentine (Jr., West Linn HS, Ore.), who's quick hands led the Northwest Conference in steals. An honorable mention all-conference selection, he passed out 5.2 assists per game and was the NCIC's top

scoring point guard at 13.5 points a game.

"If you consider scoring, assists and defense, Kyle is one of the best point guards in the conference, if not the best," says Vernon.

Northwest Conference coaches already have honored 6-foot-7 Jared Gallop (Jr., Roseburg HS, Ore.) and 6-foot-8 Mike Faber (Jr., Salem Academy, Ore.) as two of the best players in the league.

Gallop returns after taking 1996-97 off to rest an ailing back. He earned second-team NCIC honors after leading the 1995-96 team in scoring (18.0 ppg) and rebounding (6.7 rpg). In a game against Concordia University, he scored 39 points - the third highest total in Bruin NAIA history.

"Jared is a very gifted offensive player," says Vernon. "He's definitely capable of scoring 20 points a night. We know he's going to score, but we also need him to rebound and defend."

Faber was the Bruins' leading scorer (15.9) and rebounder (7.1 rpg) last season as a post player, and was named second-team all-Northwest Conference. This season, Vernon plans to occasionally switch him to the wing position where he can take advantage of his height to post up smaller defenders.

On defense, Faber was the top shot blocker in the NCIC last season, swatting 2.3 shots a game.

"Because of his shot-blocking ability, Mike may be the best all-around defender in the conference," says Vernon. "He's unique, because he can guard a shooting guard or a center."

Moving Faber to wing is a luxury Vernon can afford thanks to his other solid post players.

Ben Kroon (So., Wasilla HS, Alaska) had the best stats of any freshman in the NCIC last year.

recording 11.8 points and 6.6 rebounds a game. The high-flying 6-6 post averaged more than 10 rebounds a contest for the first third of the season. Kroon will earn playing time in the post and wing positions.

Vernon is high on Andrew Coleman (Fr., Richland HS, Wash.) - a 6-6, 200-pounder who led his team to a fourth-place finish in Washington's Class 3A tournament - the state's largest classification.

"Andrew is as well-rounded a freshman big-man as I've had in my program," he says. "He's an excellent passer, great rebounder and a good shooter. He's a really great addition to the front line."

Vernon will have plenty of veterans at the wing position.

Coming back from a knee injury that prematurely ended his sophomore season, wing Aaron Newkirk (Jr., Crater HS, Central Point, Ore.) averaged 12.3 points a game and is the Bruins' best outside shooter. He hit .380 of his 3-point attempts last year.

"Aaron is capable of hitting 50 percent," predicts Vernon.

Also returning are hard working Tony Dohren (Jr., St. Mary's HS, Medford, Ore.) and German big man Tim Buechsel (So., Immanuel HS, Reedley, Calif.).

A new season has brought an influx of gifted guards.

"They're all freshmen, but they have college skills," says Vernon. "They will be used in situations where their specific skills are needed."

Oregon Class 4A Third-Team All-State guard Jared Valentine (Fr., West Linn HS, Ore.) — younger brother of teammate Kyle Valentine — was the

MVP of the state championship game, leading his team to the title. He'll find his way onto the court often when defense is needed.

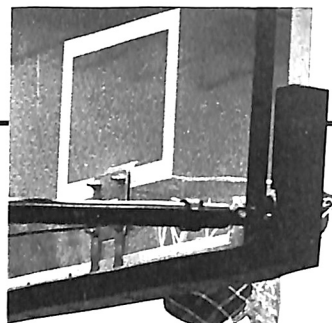
"Jared is as good a defensive guard as we've had at George Fox," says Vernon.

Solid shooting and passing skills will buy Jordan Green (Fr., Cashmere HS, Wash.) playing time. Green earned all-state honors while leading his team to a Washington Class 1A runner-up finish.

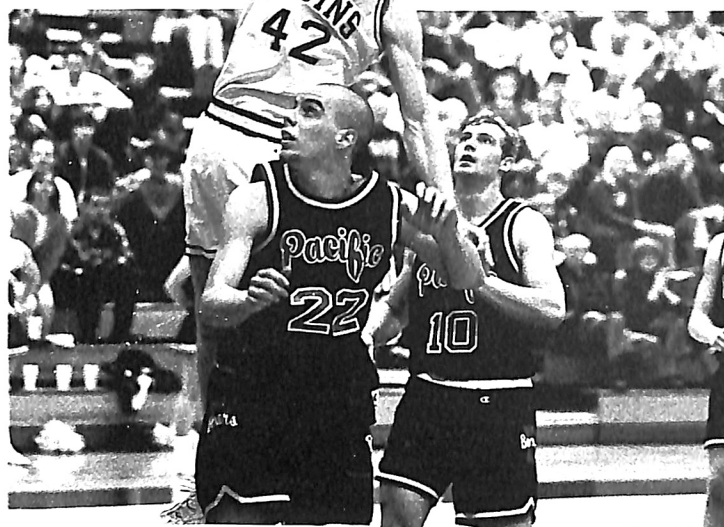
Vernon says he's been pleasantly surprised by the offensive capabilities of Ryan Cruz (Fr., Hillsboro HS, Ore.) and Tyler Kuske (King's West HS, Silverdale, Wash.). Cruz proved he could shoot in the tough Metro League, averaging 12.8 points a game. He also is expected to be a standout tennis player for George Fox. Kuske earned Sea-Tac League MVP and All-State honors after averaging 23.5 points and 8.0 rebounds a game in high school.

Vernon expects the Bruins will fast break.

"We'll be a pretty good running team if we rebound," he says. "But a good team has to play both styles. We'll be good in the half-court offense - especially with Gallop in the low post. He gives us a scoring option every time down."

But stopping Gallop won't shut down the Bruin offense.

"One of our strengths is we can score at every position," says Vernon. "We have five players who averaged in double figures. We have a little of everything: we have a great penetrator in Kyle Valentine, good outside shooting and we can get good low post scoring from Gallop and Coleman. We'll take what the defense will give us."

Four teams will qualify for the NCIC playoffs, held Feb 25 and 28.

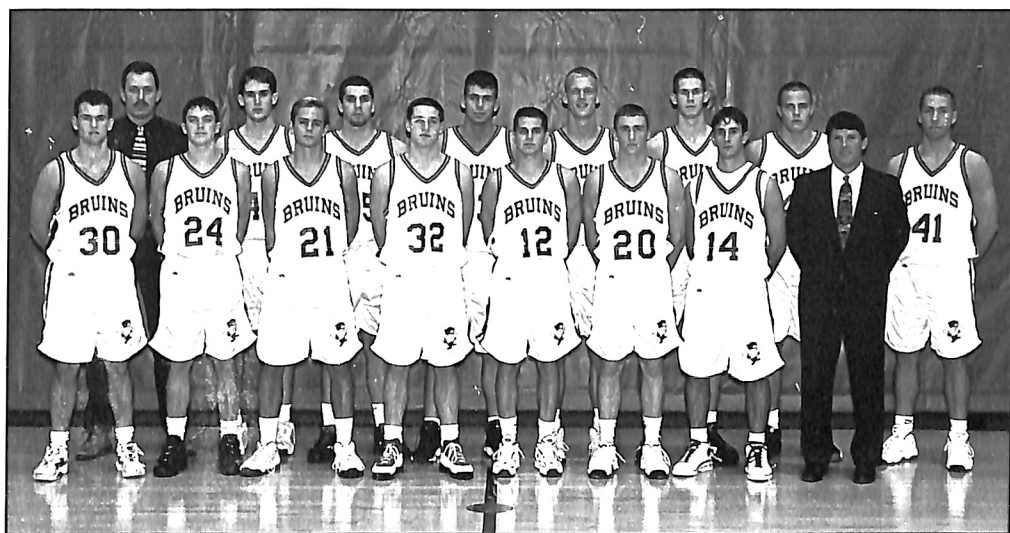
The region proved how tough it was at the NAIA Division II national tournament last year - all five Northwest teams won their first-round games.

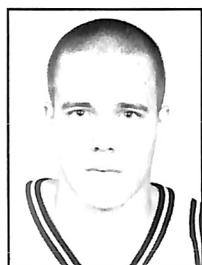

MARK VERNON enters his 16th season directing the George Fox men's basketball team.

It is a tenure that has produced the most coaching wins in team history. His teams have ranked as

high as No. 2 in the national NAIA Division II poll and have made two trips to NAIA national tournaments in the '90s. Six of the seven 20-win seasons in George Fox history have come under his guidance.

Vernon became one of the nation's youngest coaches to surpass the 250-career win milestone, eclipsing it at the age of 40. His 15-year record is 282-180. His career winning percentage has been ranked as high as fifth among active Division II coaches.

Vernon's teams have produced two NBA draft picks, four NAIA All-Americans and one NAIA All-American Scholar-Athlete.

His efforts have not gone unnoticed. In 1985 he was the youngest coach in NAIA District 2 when he was named men's basketball district Coach of the Year for the first time. In 1987 and 1991 he received the same honor. He was named National Christian College Athletic Association National Coach of the Year in 1987.

Vernon, 44, has his entire collegiate coaching career at George Fox, but the tie with the Bruins is longer. He came in 1975 as a student and basketball player, transferring from Seattle's Highline Community College, where he received both Best Defense and Hustle awards. While at West Seattle High School, he was named Outstanding Athlete of the Year as a senior.

As a George Fox guard, he established what was then the Bruins' highest career assist average (3.9). He was named Most Inspirational Player by his teammates his senior year, a year the Bruins were 20-9. In his two years in a George Fox uniform, the Bruins were 39-17.

A 1977 graduate, Vernon was named George Fox's Outstanding Physical Education Major and Outstanding

Young Person in Teacher Education. He remained with Bruin basketball as an assistant for three years (1977-78, '79-80 and '81-82) while working toward a 1982 master's degree in physical education at Linfield College.

In the fall of 1981, he joined the George Fox physical education faculty as volleyball coach and women's tennis coach. Vernon currently teaches physical education classes in addition to his coaching.

He became head coach in 1982 after a nationwide search that began with 70 names.

Vernon and his wife, Denise, were married in 1981 and have three sons: Brett, 6; Brady 4; and Barry, 2.

Q & A WITH MARK VERNON

Q. Your teams average nearly 19 wins a season, are playoff regulars, and your career record at George Fox is 282-180. What reasons can you give for that kind of success?

Mark: "I believe we have had talented players over the years. But maybe just as important as talent, we have had players with character and heart. I have been fortunate to have coached very good players as well as very good people."

Q. Describe your coaching philosophies. How do you coach your teams to play?

Mark: "First and foremost, we want our team to be just that—a team—with team goals placed well above any personal goals players may have. We want to play hard, smart and together every time we step on the floor. I really believe the game is for the players and the fans, and so I believe in playing an up-tempo game that is enjoyable for everyone. Winning is fun no matter what, but winning and putting a lot of points on the board is even more fun."

Q. What do you enjoy most about coaching?

Mark: "I enjoy my players the most. The everyday interaction that goes on between my players and myself makes my job fun. I also like the camaraderie with my fellow coaches. We compete hard against each other during the season but are friends otherwise. I would be remiss if I didn't mention I love the competition. Anyone who knows me knows I compete at everything I do. I have the best job in the world. I really can't think of anything else I would like to do and still get paid."

Q. You are entering your 16th year as George Fox head coach. What is it about the University that has kept you here all these years?

Mark: "I believe in the values and Christian education that students receive at George Fox. I believed in the University enough to come as a student-athlete, and I still believe in it after 15 years of coaching. George Fox stands up for its convictions, and I like being associated with a college that has integrity and a Christ-centered foundation."



TOM KETELSEN returns to George Fox for his third year as assistant coach. Ketelsen played center for George Fox from 1983-85. He came from

Grants Pass High School, where he was an Honorable Mention All-State selection. He transferred to play his junior and senior years at Western Baptist College and won National Christian College Athletic Association All-American and First-Team NAIA District 2 honors. He returned to George Fox to earn an interdisciplinary degree in 1994 and a master of arts in teaching in 1995.

He played with Meadowlark Lemon's Shooting Stars in 1988-90. Ketelsen now is a substitute teacher in the West Linn School District and is a partner with Quick Handle Basketball Camps in Seattle and Portland.

He and his wife, Teresa, a 1986 George Fox graduate, live in Newberg. They have two children: five-year-old daughter Jordin, and two-year-old son Cade.



CRAIG TAYLOR is in his tenth year as George Fox University Athletic Director, but he has been associated with the Bruins for 24 years as player, coach and

professor.

Taylor, 46, came to George Fox in 1971 as a junior forward for the men's basketball team. In 1972-73, he helped the Bruins to their first-ever NAIA District 2 title.

Taylor graduated from George Fox in 1974, named both Outstanding Man in Teacher Education and Outstanding Physical Education Major. He received a Master of Science degree in education from Linfield College in 1975. While enrolled in graduate courses, he was a George Fox residence hall director.

From 1976 through 1979, Taylor was the Bruin baseball coach while also serving as assistant basketball coach. He worked at a sporting goods retailing firm from 1979-81.

The A.D. was the coach of the women's basketball team from 1981-93, producing a 162-155 record. He also coached George Fox softball from 1981-88 and again in 1990. His teams compiled a 77-99-1 record, and in 1985 he was named NAIA District 2 Coach of the Year.

At George Fox, the athletic director is responsible for athletic department functions, including eligibility and compliance with George Fox, conference, NAIA and NCAA regulations, budgeting, and department and sports center management.

Taylor has three children: Leah, 23, Bree, 18, and Casey, 8. Taylor and his wife, Kathy, live in McMinnville.



HAL ADRIAN became Associate Director of Athletics at George Fox in 1994. In that position, he is responsible for the Bruin Club and general fund

raising, as well as special projects including the George Fox Sports Hall of Fame and sports banquet.

A 1956 graduate of Lewis & Clark College, Adrian taught and coached

in the Beaverton School District until 1961 when he joined North Pacific Insurance. In 1994, he retired as Vice President of Human Resources. For more than 40 years he has been involved in church music leadership, chairing the 1992 Billy Graham Crusade music committee. Adrian also has been active in United Way leadership.

He and his wife Audrey have three sons: Jay, Greg, and Dave, who currently is George Fox's Associate Vice President for Development of Major Gifts.



ROB FELTON is in his sixth year as Sports Information Director for George Fox's 13 athletic teams. A 1992 George Fox graduate with a degree in

communication arts, Felton was a sports information student assistant for three years.

The George Fox Sports Information Office has produced 35 national award-winning publications in the last 16 years.

Felton, 27, also has additional responsibilities as Assistant Director of Public Information.

In 1997, he received a "Rising Star" award in the field of communications from the Council for Advancement and Support of Education (CASE) District VIII.

A *magna cum laude* graduate, he was named Outstanding Student in Communication Arts and to "Who's Who Among Students in American Colleges and Universities." He was sports editor for the student newspaper, The Crescent, for two years and editor as a sophomore.

MIKE WIRTA is in his 27th year as George Fox basketball statistician. Called "Biggs" by his friends, Wirta is a 1974 George Fox

graduate and one of the most loyal Bruin fans. At the end of the 1996-97 season, he had kept stats for 346 straight George Fox men's basketball contests and 338 in a row at home. The last home game he missed was in 1972. A member of the University's plant services staff, Wirta, 48, has the upkeep of the sports center as his major responsibility. He devotes many volunteer hours to compiling statistics and records for the players and teams recorded in this book.

In 1988 the University's alumni association named Wirta its Volunteer of the Year, just the second person to receive the designation. In 1994 he received an NAIA District 2 Meritorious Service Award.



DALE ISAAK joined the George Fox staff in 1995 as head trainer and assistant professor in the Health and Human Performance Department. He previously was the head athletic trainer for Hopkins High School in Minnetonka, Minn., and athletic trainer for the Institute for Athletic Medicine in Minneapolis. Isaak is a 1990 graduate of Willamette University. He holds a Master of Science degree in physical education/athletic training from Indiana State University and a Master of Education degree in physical education from the University of Minnesota. 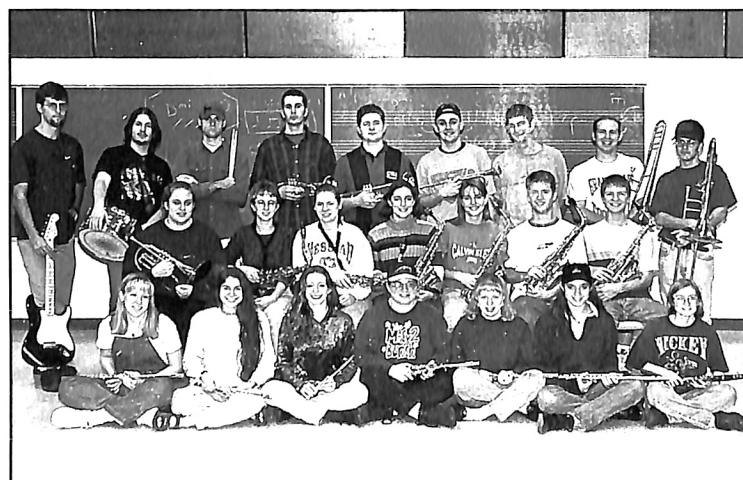

THE UNIVERSITY

Founded in 1885 as Friends Pacific Academy, George Fox University is a Christian liberal arts university growing in size and reputation. In the last 10 years enrollment has quadrupled to more than 2,200 students and *U.S. News and World*

Report in 1997 ranked the school second in academic reputation in its western regional liberal arts colleges category.

The magazine also has listed the university in its "Top Teaching Schools" and "Most Efficient" categories.

George Fox offers innovative programs. Each freshman undergraduate is provided a computer to use and keep upon graduating. Students reaching their junior year are eligible for an international study trip for which the university pays transportation costs.

George Fox offers 36 undergraduate and nine graduate degree programs, as well as a degree-completion program for working

adults. Classes also are offered in Portland, Salem, Eugene and Boise, Idaho. George Fox became a university in 1996 when it merged with Western Evangelical Seminary in Portland.

The school is named in honor of the founder of the Friends (Quaker) Church.

The University's most prominent alumnus is the late President Herbert Hoover, who attended Friends Pacific Academy.

ATHLETIC AFFILIATION

The landscape of small-college athletics in the Pacific Northwest is undergoing sweeping changes, and George Fox University is in the midst of the transformation.

In the fall of 1994, the University joined the Northwest Conference of Independent Colleges (NCIC), a league of 10 strong academic institutions in Oregon and Washington. That winter, the NCIC applied for membership in the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) Division III. The move meant leaving the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA), an association George Fox had held membership in since 1965.

George Fox and the NCIC members have provisional membership in the NCAA but continue to compete

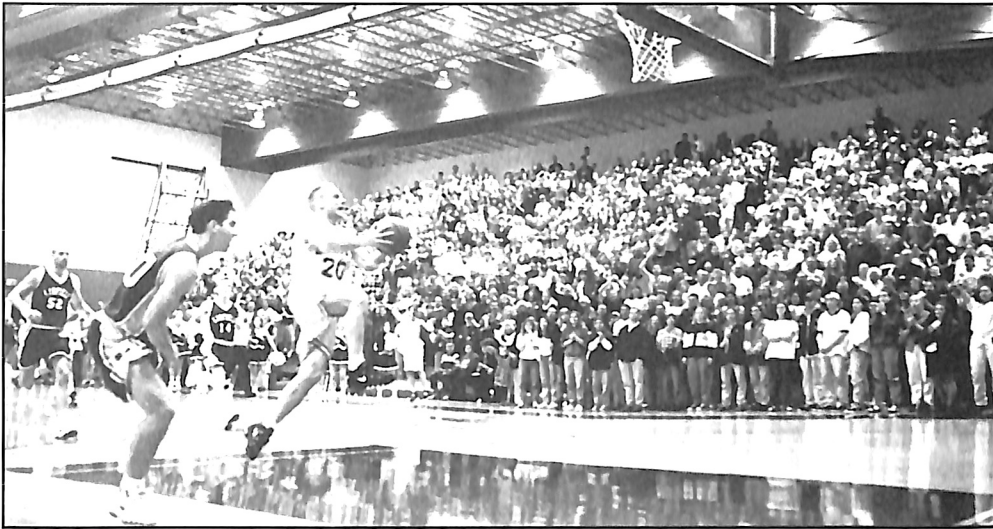
in NAIA national championships. George Fox expects to be eligible for NCAA national championships by 1999-2000.

George Fox's men's and women's basketball teams compete in NAIA Division II, while the 11 other sports the University competes in are not divided into divisions by the NAIA.

The NAIA is an autonomous association administering programs leading to 13 men's and 11 women's championships. The NAIA includes about 350 four-year colleges and universities in 49 states and Canada. They are grouped in nine regions and 44 conferences.

The NCAA administers 80 championships in 21 sports for its 1,201 member institutions, involving nearly 21,000 men and women scholar-athletes. There are more than 350 schools in Division III.





WHEELER SPORTS CENTER: A natural place for basketball

Entered by crossing a wooded canyon on a 200-foot bridge, the Coleman H. Wheeler Center for Sports and Physical Education is a natural place to play basketball.

The sports center was designed by noted architect Pietro Belluschi to sit unpretentiously alongside tree-shaded Hess Creek Canyon. Built using gifts from prominent lumbermen, the building features a two-level oak parquet lobby and a large window area overlooking the adjacent natural terrain.

Completed in June 1977, the \$2.7 million, 55,000-square-foot complex is the University's largest building. It contains the James and Lila Miller Gymnasium, the Bruin home court.

Wheeler Center features a 116-by-174-foot gymnasium with three basketball courts and seating for 2,750 spectators. The gymnasium ceilings are 32 feet over the hardwood maple floor. The gym provides three volleyball courts and 10 badminton courts.

The building may be entered on two levels. The east-side ground level is accessible from the parking lot by crossing the foot bridge. The on-campus community enters on the west-side second floor.

Contained on the upper level are a staff room, multipurpose room, classrooms, and athletic administration and faculty offices. A 1,500-square-foot weight room was remodeled in the summer of 1993. The lower level contains a concession area, dressing rooms, team rooms, laundry, equipment-issuing room, and storage space. An east wing of the building houses two racquetball courts.

The building is named for longtime Oregon lumberman Coleman H. Wheeler, former chairman of the board of Willamette Industries. The gymnasium is named for former George Fox board member James Miller and his wife, Lila. He is the former president of Cascadia Lumber Co.

BACKGROUND ON THE BRUIN NICKNAME

George Fox's Bruin nickname comes from a real bear captured in 1887 just two years after Pacific Academy (the University's predecessor) was established. The small cub was found in the Coast Range foothills west of Carlton when its mother was shot. The young cub was

brought to campus by a student and later lived with a faculty member.

When it grew to adulthood, it was kept in a pit in what is now known as Hess Creek Canyon south of the campus. It escaped one too many times and was turned into steak for the dining table and the hide preserved on a frame and displayed in an early campus museum. When the hide deteriorated several years later, it was taken to a campus furnace room to be destroyed, but the framework proved a problem in dismantling so it was left sitting in a corner.

Students found the old Bruin skin later and began skirmishes over ownership, a tradition that continues today. "Bruin Junior," a replica, under a set of guidelines passed down for years, is fought over periodically in class competition, with the class able to physically drag the Bruin replica off campus declared the rightful owner until next "flashed."

Even with the Bruin tradition, somewhere along the line, the "Quaker" tag for athletic teams came into popularity with sportswriters because of the University's church affiliation, and that nickname was used, along with the mascot "Foxy

George," a little fox with a Quaker hat.

Both gained acceptance for a period in the 1950s and 1960s until a vote of faculty, students and administration in 1970 reinstated the Bruin nickname to its rightful place.

GEORGE FOX BASKETBALL 1898-1998

George Fox celebrates 100 years of basketball this season. The game of basketball was invented by Dr. James Naismith in 1891 and it took just seven years for it to be brought to George Fox (then called Pacific College)

University board member and community leader T. W. Hester and others first saw the game played at the Portland YMCA. They were captivated by the new game and secured a ball, which they brought back to the University. The first recorded exhibition game was played Feb. 10, 1908 when the Pacific Academy boys beat the Pacific College sophomores 12-6. The first intercollegiate game was played between the Pacific

women and Chemawa Indian School. Men were barred from viewing the game, which was won by Chemawa 28-12.

The first games were played on the third floor of the old Commercial Hotel on North Main Street because the

School had no adequate space for the new sport.

The first gymnasium on the campus was the upper part of one wing of an old academy building (Hoover Hall), built in 1885 and torn down in the mid-1950s. A one-room wood gymnasium building was constructed in 1916 and served until 1946, when George Fox opened Hester Gymnasium, a concrete-block structure built partly by student/faculty labor at a cost of \$40,000. The building, with a single hemlock playing floor and seating for 1,100, served until the opening of the Wheeler Center in 1976-77.

George Fox's athletic affiliation in men's basketball has gone from independent status to membership in six different conferences. From 1965 through 1993, George Fox was an independent member of NAIA District 2. After two years in the Cascade Collegiate Conference, George Fox joined the Northwest Conference of Independent Colleges in 1995-96.

In 1973, George Fox won its first NAIA District 2 title. The Bruins have advanced to NAIA postseason play 20 of the last 27 years, including 11 of the last 14. The 1991-92 team produced George Fox's highest national finish, advancing to the NAIA Division II quarterfinals with two national tournament wins.

"Our greatest basketball year," according to a University publication, *The First Fifty Years* (published in 1941), "was reached in 1917 when Pacific College won the [Willamette Valley] league championship and defeated Oregon State College 34-25." Few pre-NAIA statistics are available although the following are noteworthy: Delbert Replogle scored 43 points versus North Pacific (Dec. 18, 1915) and 40 versus Philomath (Jan. 29, 1916). Bill Hopper compiled 1,737 career points from 1954-58 and scored 42 versus Greenleaf (March 3, 1956). Cub Grimm averaged 21.0 points a game in 1952-53 and hit 26 free throws in a game with Oregon Medical School.

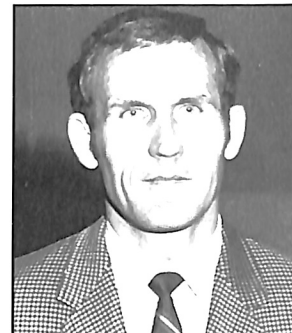

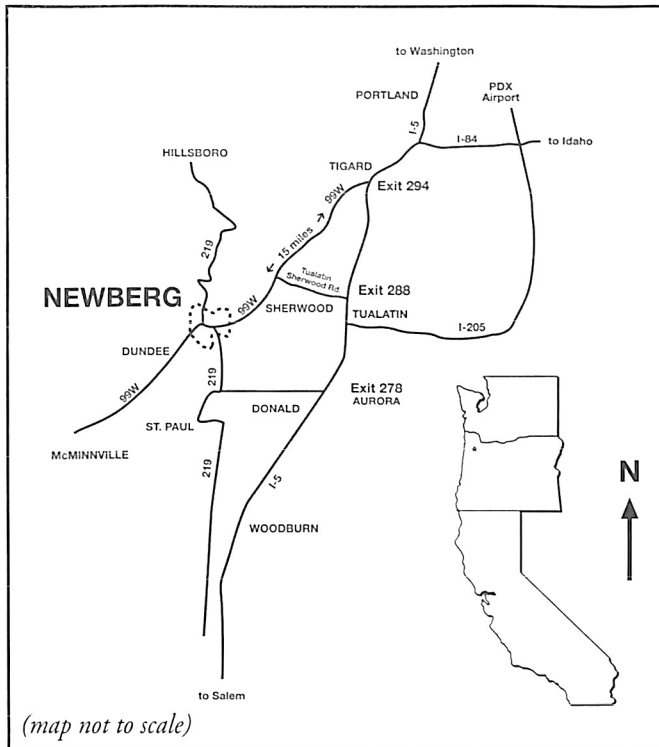
