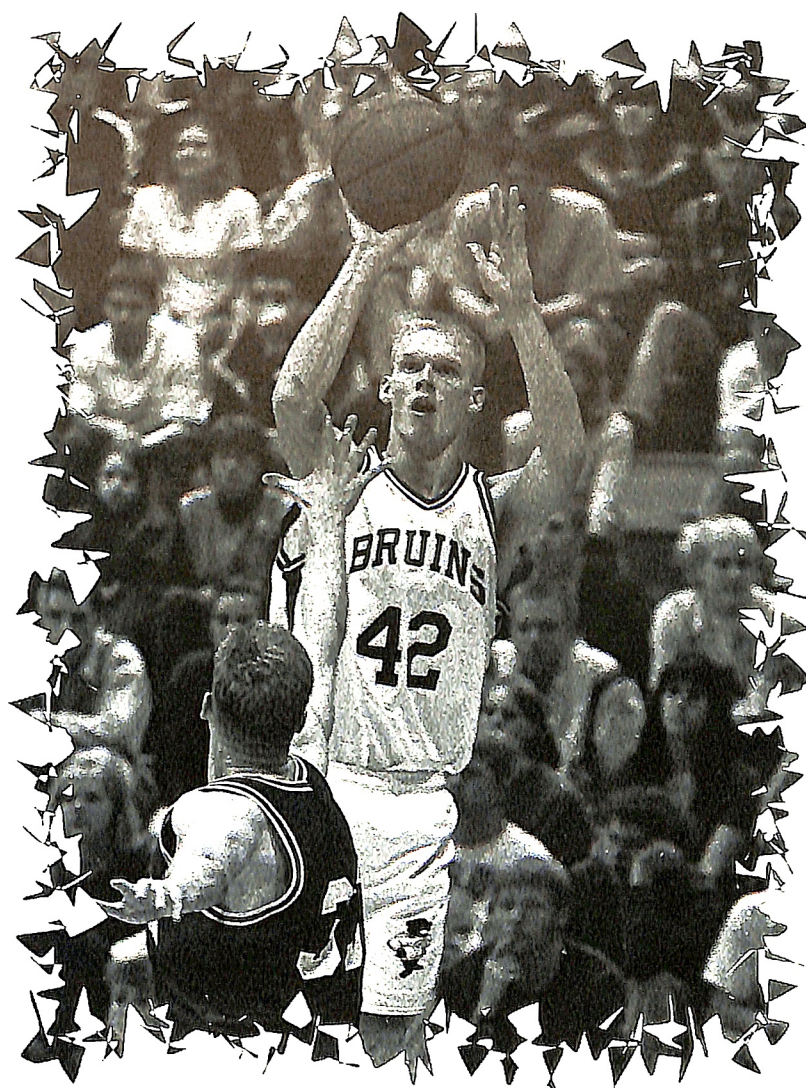

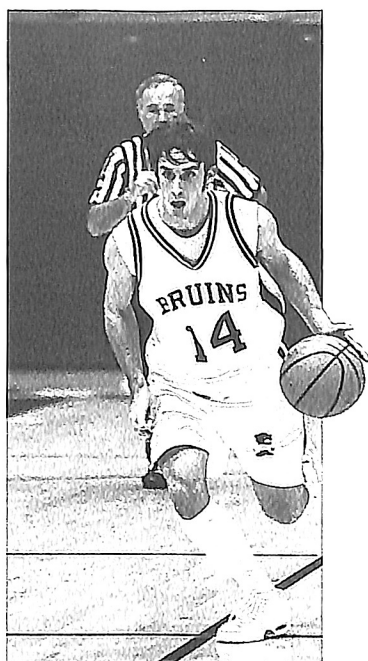

## Sharpshooting Bruins Get the Green Light to Shoot

As he enters his 17th season at George Fox, head coach Mark Vernon has two expectations for his team.

The first: "The majority of our shots will be 3-pointers," he predicts.

The second: "We should be a fun team to watch."

Gearing an offense around the outside shot is a new approach for Vernon, who goes for career win No. 300 this season. He begins the season with a record of 297-190.

"We've got to play to our strength, which is behind the line," he says. "We're not a traditional back-to-the-basket type of team, but we do face the hoop and shoot the ball pretty well."

Post **Mike Faber (Sr., Salem Academy, Ore.)** has proved he can do just that in his three seasons at George Fox, hitting 115 of his 317 career 3-point attempts (36.3). A Northwest Conference second-team selection two years ago, he's the only starter returning from last year's

15-10 team that finished as the conference runner-up.

The 6-foot-8 Faber also will be the focal point of the Bruin defense. He led the Northwest Conference with 2.8 blocks a game last season.

"Depending on the game, we're prepared to play zone or man-to-man—any kind of defense," says Vernon. "But they will all have one thing in common. They'll have Mike Faber around the basket."

Vernon expects to divide playing time among five guards, all who have the green light to launch a three.

**Jordan Green (So., Cashmere HS, Wash.)** developed into George Fox's sixth-man last year and showed the ability to hit from outside while becoming the Bruins' fifth-leading scorer. Voted the team's most improved player by his teammates, Green's best outing came in a 23-point, 9-for-11 shooting performance against Willamette University.

Another player who isn't bashful about firing away is wing **Ryan Cruz**

(So., Hillsboro HS, Ore.), who last year sparked the Bruins to a come-from-behind win over Whitman College by coming off the bench to hit six second-half 3-pointers.

Untested **Tyler Kuske (So., King's West HS, Silverdale, Wash.)**—a Class A all-state guard from Washington—averaged 23.4 points a game in high school. After a redshirt season, he'll get his chance to prove he can score at the collegiate level as well.

After the loss of honorable mention All-American Kyle Valentine, the point guard position is open.

Vernon expects solid, consistent play from redshirt freshman **James Macy (So., Culver HS, Ore.)**, who averaged 20.4 points a game in high school and earned all-tournament honors at the Oregon Class A state championships. Even while redshirting last season, he was so appreciated by his teammates that they voted him the team's Most Inspirational Player.

Oregon Class 3A first-team all-state point guard **Travis Melvin (Fr., Pleasant Hill HS, Ore.)** led Pleasant Hill to the state championship game. The quickest player on the Bruin team, he holds the 3A state tournament record with 17 steals.

Doing the hard work inside will be 6-foot-7 center **Andrew Coleman (So., Richland HS, Wash.)** and 6-foot-6 **Ben Kroon (Jr., Wasilla HS, Alaska)**. Vernon calls Coleman a gifted passer, but says he needs to be one of the best rebounders in the conference. Kroon had the best scoring (11.8 ppg) and rebounding (6.6) stats among all Northwest Conference freshmen in 1996-97, but last year saw less action playing behind first-team All-American center Jared Gallop.

Vernon has two veteran players in their third year in the program: 6-foot-4 wing **Tony Dohren (Sr., St. Mary's HS, Medford, Ore.)** and



6-foot-4 post **Tim Buechsel (Jr., Wettenberg, Germany)**. Dohren is one of just two seniors on the team.

Three newcomers at the wing position will provide depth: **Daron Hernandez (So., Santiam Christian HS, Corvallis, Ore.)**, **Joe Nichols (Fr., Brookings Harbor HS, Ore.)**, and **Sean Linder (So., Glendale HS, Azalea, Ore.)**.

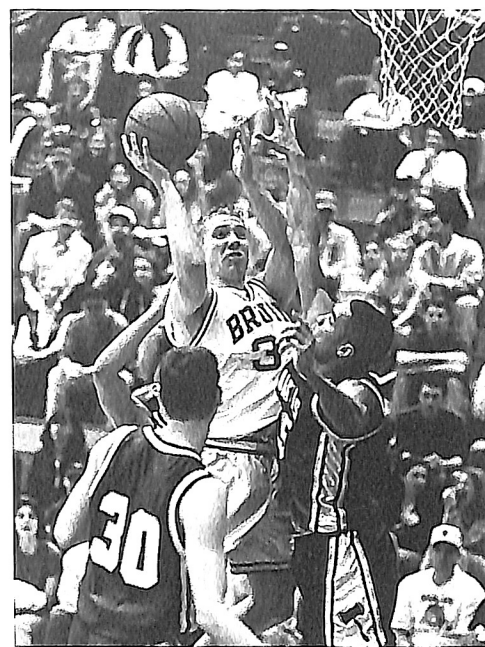
Although the Bruins plan to shoot the 3-pointer, don't expect a wild run-and-gun atmosphere.

"We want to be a team that takes good care of the ball," says Vernon. "One that doesn't turn it over much and takes the high-percentage shot."

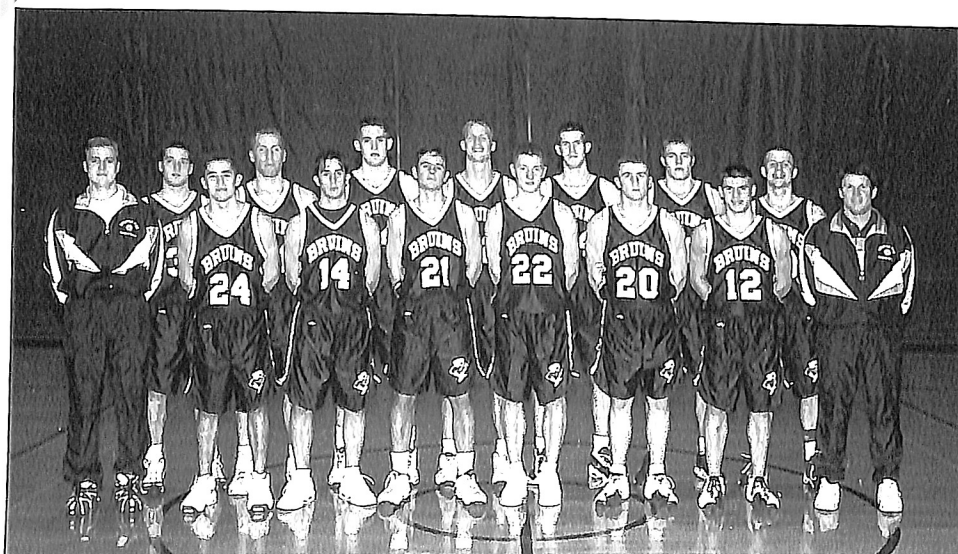
First-year assistant coach Justin Sherwood seems to be a perfect addition for the team. Playing in a similar offense to the one used by the

current Bruins, Sherwood ranks among the nation's leaders in career 3-point shooting. During his four years at Western Baptist College (1989-93), he hit 464 of 1,110 3-pointers.

In its last year before gaining full membership in NCAA Div. III, George Fox will have one last shot at the NAIA Div. II national tournament. The Bruins would need to finish ahead of the other two NAIA members of the Northwest Conference—Seattle University and University of Puget Sound. The top NWC team will host a playoff game against either Western Oregon University, The Evergreen State College (Wash.), or Hope International College (Calif.). The winner earns an automatic berth to the national tournament.

## BRUINS EMERGE AS CONTENDERS IN 1997-98

---

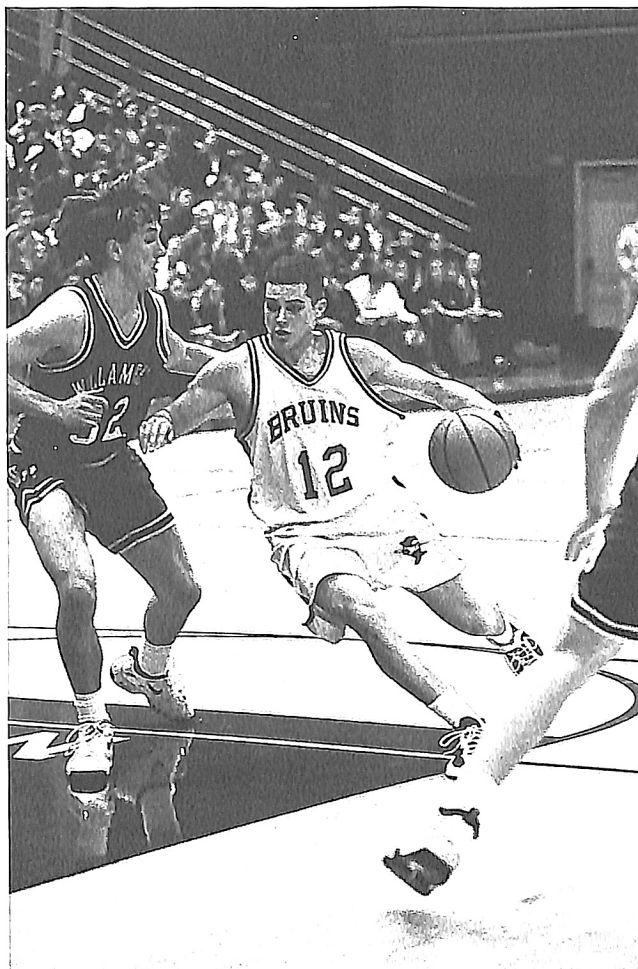
Led by two All-Americans, George Fox ranked in the national top-25 and came within one win of the 1997-98 Northwest Conference title.

The Bruins defeated every conference opponent at least once and had a shot at the league title in the final game of the regular season. Winning seven more games than the previous season, George Fox went 15-10, and finished as the conference runner-up with a 13-5 record. Six of George Fox's losses came against teams ranked in the NAIA Div. II final national poll.

Center Jared Gallop averaged 23.1 points a game and was named Northwest Conference Player of the Year and a first-team All-American. Point guard Kyle Valentine earned All-American honorable mention after he led the conference in steals (3.6 per game) and ranked in the league top-10 in scoring, assists, and 3-point percentage.

Center/forward Mike Faber led the league in blocked shots (2.9 a game) and earned conference honorable mention. He also ranked among the conference leaders in scoring, rebounding, and steals.

George Fox led the nation in free-throw shooting, hitting 77.0 percent of its attempts.



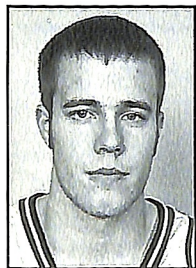

**MARK VERNON**  
George Fox head coach Mark Vernon is on the verge of becoming one of the youngest college coaches in the nation to reach 300 career wins.

Vernon, 45, begins his 17th season with a 297-190 record (.610) — all at George Fox.

He holds the record for most coaching wins in team history and has presided over many of the finest moments in Bruin basketball history.

His teams have ranked as high as No. 2 in the national NAIA Division II poll and have made two trips to NAIA national tournaments in the nineties. Six of the seven 20-win seasons in George Fox history have come under his guidance.

Vernon's teams have produced two NBA draft picks, six NAIA All-Americans and one NAIA All-American Scholar-Athlete.

His efforts have not gone unnoticed. In 1985, he was the youngest coach in NAIA District 2 when he was named men's basketball district Coach of the Year for the first time. In 1987 and 1991 he received the same honor. He was named National Christian College Athletic Association National Coach of the Year in 1987.

In 1998, Vernon was inducted into the Northwest Champions Hall of Fame by the Northwest Athletic Association of Community Colleges.

Although he is the third-youngest coach in the Northwest Conference, no other coach has more wins at their current institution. Last season, he guided George Fox to a runner-up finish in the conference.

Vernon has his entire collegiate coaching career at George Fox, but the tie with the Bruins is longer. He came to the College in 1975 as a student and basketball player. He transferred from Highline Community College in Seattle, where he received both Best Defense and Hustle awards. While at West Seattle

High School, he was named Outstanding Athlete of the Year as a senior.

As a George Fox guard, he established what was then the Bruins' highest career assist average (3.9). He was named Most Inspirational Player by his teammates his senior year, a year the Bruins were 20-9. In his two years in a George Fox uniform, the Bruins were 39-17.

A 1977 graduate, Vernon was named George Fox's Outstanding Physical Education Major and Outstanding Young Person in Teacher Education. He remained with Bruin basketball as an assistant for three years (1977-78, 79-80

and 81-82), while working toward a 1982 master's degree in physical education at Linfield College.

In the fall of 1981, he joined the George Fox physical education faculty as volleyball coach and women's tennis coach. Vernon currently teaches physical education classes in addition to his coaching.

He became head coach in 1982 after a nationwide search that began with 70 names.

Vernon lives in Newberg and has three sons: Brett, 7; Brady 5; and Barry, 3.

**JUSTIN SHERWOOD**, the most prolific 3-point shooter in NAIA history, joins the George Fox coaching staff this year as

assistant men's basketball coach.

Sherwood shot 1,110 3-pointers in his career at Western Baptist College—an NAIA national record. He made 464 of them, three fewer than the national record at that point.

Sherwood averaged 18.4 points a game during his 1989-93 career, setting Western Baptist's career scoring record with 2,710. Twice he was named an NAIA All-District 2 selection and NCCAA All-American. He was named Western Baptist's male athlete of the year as a senior.

Sherwood also was the male athlete of the year at McNary High School in Salem where he was named all-league in basketball and played outfielder on the state championship baseball team.

Sherwood currently works for Pauly, Rogers and Co., a CPA firm in Tigard. He and his wife, Jenni, live in Sherwood, Ore.



**CRAIG TAYLOR** is in his 11th year as George Fox University athletic director, but he has been associated with the Bruins for 25 years as player, coach, and

professor.

Taylor, 47, came to George Fox in 1971 as a junior forward for the men's basketball team. In 1972-73, he helped the Bruins to their first-ever NAIA District 2 title.

Taylor graduated from George Fox in 1974, named both Outstanding Man in Teacher Education and Outstanding Physical Education Major. He received a master of science degree in education from Linfield College in 1975. While enrolled in graduate courses, he was a George Fox residence hall director.

From 1976 through 1979, Taylor was the Bruin baseball coach while also serving as assistant basketball coach. He worked at a sporting goods retailing firm in 1979-81.

The A.D. was the coach of the women's basketball team from 1981 to 1993, producing a 162-155 record. He also coached George Fox softball from 1981 to 1988 and again in 1990. His teams compiled a 77-99-1 record, and in 1985 he was named NAIA District 2 Coach of the Year.

At George Fox, the athletic director is responsible for athletic department functions, including eligibility and compliance with George Fox, conference, NAIA and NCAA regulations, budgeting, and department and sports center management.

In 1992 Taylor was named NAIA District 2 Administrator of the year. Taylor has three children: Leah, 24, Bree, 19, and Casey, 9. Taylor and his wife, Kathy, live in McMinnville.



**DALE ISAAK** joined the George Fox staff in 1995 as head trainer and assistant professor in the Health and Human Performance Depart-

ment. He previously was the head athletic trainer for Hopkins High School in Minnetonka, Minn., and athletic trainer for the Institute for Athletic Medicine in Minneapolis. Isaak is a 1990 graduate of Willamette University. He holds a Master of Science degree in physical education/athletic training from Indiana State University and a Master of Education degree in physical education from the University of Minnesota. He and his wife, Marin, live in Wilsonville.



**BYRON SHENK** serves as George Fox's assistant trainer, but that's just one of the many duties he's handled since coming to the

University in 1990. He serves as chairperson of the Department of Health and Human Performance, where he also teaches as associate professor. Shenk also has coached George Fox's eight-year-old varsity women's soccer team from infancy.

In 1998 he was named Northwest Conference Coach of the Year.

He earned a national meritorious service award from the National Christian College Athletic Association for previous service and leadership.

Shenk has an undergraduate degree from Goshen College, a master's from the University of Oregon, and a doctorate in education from the University of Virginia.

Shenk and his wife, Ina, live in McMinnville, where he is active in the Mennonite church.



**ROB FELTON** is in his sixth year as Sports Information Director for George Fox's 13 athletic teams. A 1992 George Fox graduate with a degree in

communication arts, Felton was a sports information student assistant for three years.

The George Fox Sports Information Office has produced 35 national award-winning publications in the last 16 years.

Felton, 27, also has additional responsibilities as Assistant Director of Public Information.

In 1997, he received a "Rising Star" award in the field of communications from the Council for Advancement and Support of Education (CASE) District VIII.

A *magna cum laude* graduate, he was named Outstanding Student in Communication Arts and to "Who's Who Among Students in American Colleges and Universities." He was sports editor for the student newspaper, *The Crescent*, for two years and editor as a sophomore.

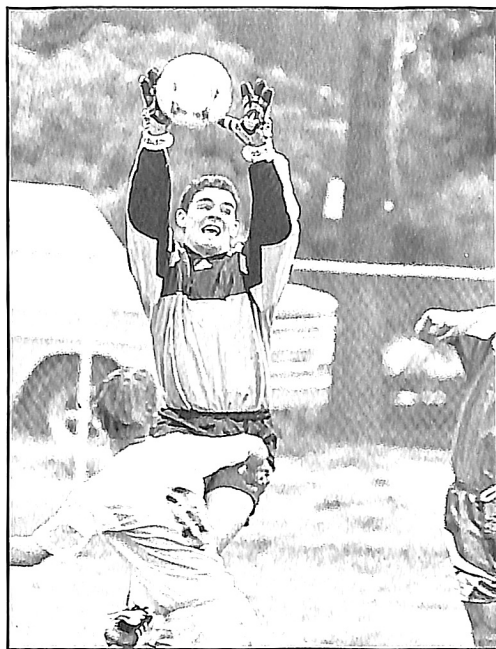

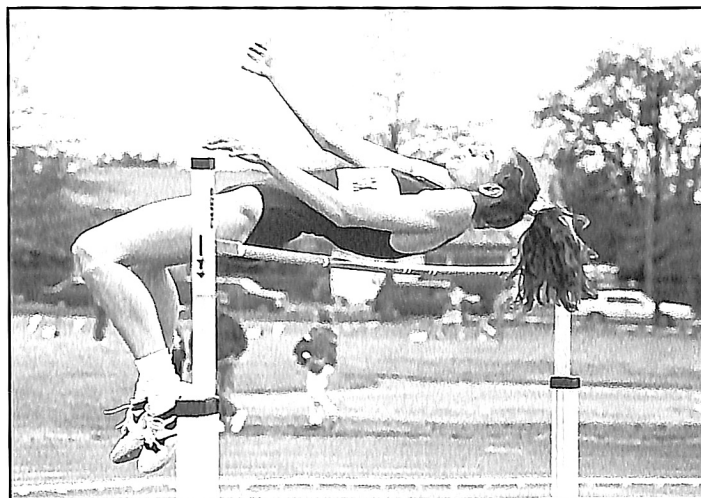

George Fox University maintains one of the Northwest's most successful small-college athletic programs.

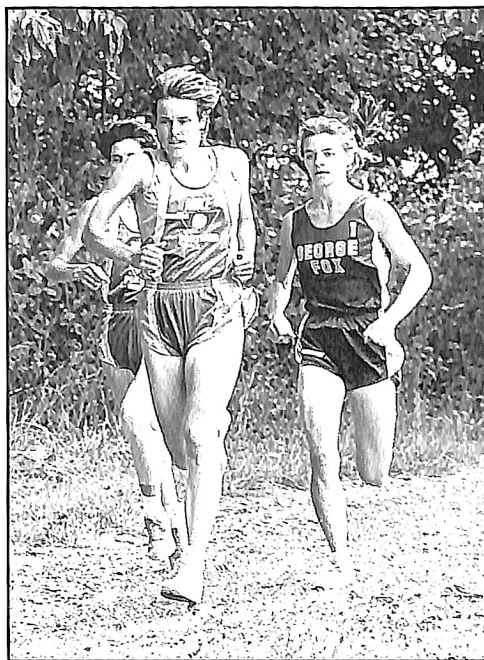
The teams win. George Fox has earned district or conference titles in nine sports during the 1990s.

The athletes are successful. George Fox athletes have earned more than 150 NAIA All-American awards and All-American Scholar-Athlete honors.

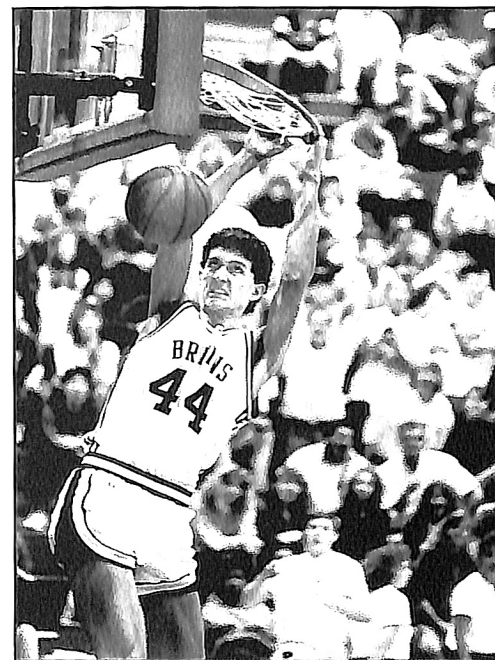
The coaches are award winners as well. Nine of George Fox's 11 head coaches have been named district or conference Coach of the Year at least once.

Intercollegiate athletics is an integral part of the overall education program at George Fox. About 15 percent of the traditional undergraduate student body participates in varsity athletics. Men's varsity athletic teams represent the University in baseball, basketball, track, tennis, cross country and soccer. Women teams are fielded in volleyball, basketball, track, tennis, softball, cross country and soccer.

Athletic facilities include the Coleman H. Wheeler Sports Center,

which includes three basketball or volleyball courts and two racquetball courts. Seating is available for up to 2,500. The track and field teams compete on Colcord Field. The Curtis and Margaret Morse Athletic Complex contains a baseball diamond, softball

field and soccer field. In 1994, five tennis courts were installed in preparation for the addition of tennis as a varsity sport.



## THE UNIVERSITY

George Fox is growing in size and reputation. Enrollment has nearly quadrupled in the last 13 years, increasing from 549 in 1986 to more than 2,300 in the fall of 1998.

In the same time span, George Fox has been named one of "America's Best Colleges" 11 times by *U.S. News*

& *World Report*. In 1998, George Fox ranked third in academic reputation among Western regional liberal arts colleges. The magazine also named the University one of the region's best values among schools in its category.

George Fox offers unique programs to its students. Every incoming freshman is given a computer to use and keep upon graduation. When students reach their third year, they are eligible for the Juniors Abroad program, in which the University pays transportation costs for an overseas study tour.

Early Willamette Valley Quaker settlers established Pacific Academy in 1885. The college division was organized in 1891 to provide more advanced instruction. In 1949,

because of the many colleges in the Northwest with "Pacific" in their name, Pacific College was renamed George Fox College in honor of the founder of the Friends (Quaker) Church. In 1996, with the addition of Western Evangelical Seminary, George Fox became a university, offering students a Christ-centered education and the choice of 35 undergraduate majors and nine graduate degrees.

George Fox's most prominent alumnus is the late President Herbert Hoover, who attended Pacific Academy.

## ATHLETIC AFFILIATION

The landscape of small-college athletics is changing in the Northwest and George Fox is in the midst of the transformation.

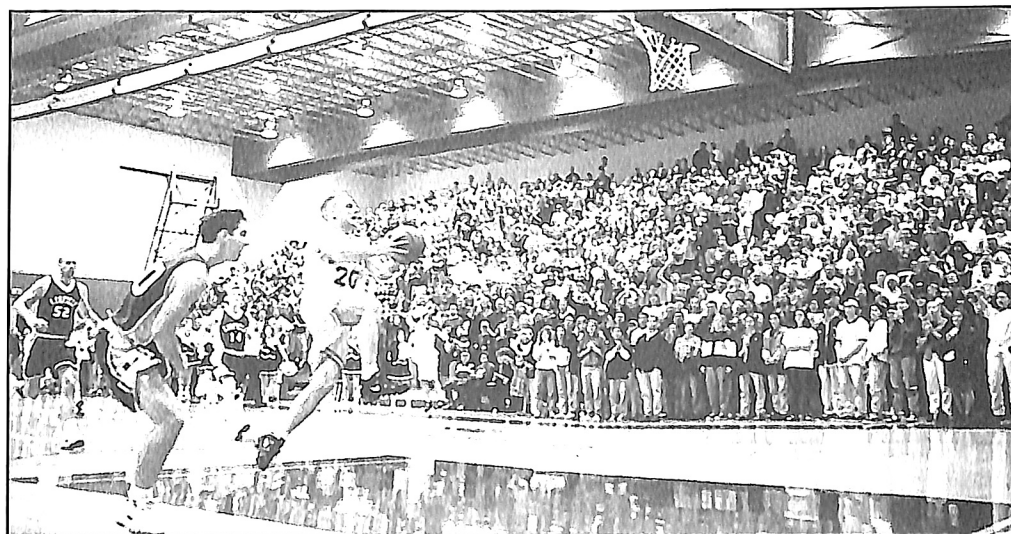
After decades as an independent, George Fox in 1995 joined the Northwest Conference (NWC)—a league of 10 strong academic institutions. That same year, the conference applied for membership in the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA). Seven NWC schools currently hold full membership in the NCAA Division III. The other three schools—George Fox, University of Puget Sound and Seattle University—are provisional members of the NCAA, but continue to compete nationally in the National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics (NAIA). In 1999-2000, George Fox and Puget Sound plan to be eligible for NCAA Div. III national championships.

### WHEELER SPORTS CENTER: A natural place for basketball

Entered by crossing a wooded canyon on a 200-foot bridge, the Coleman H. Wheeler Center for Sports and Physical Education is a natural place to play basketball.

The sports center was designed by noted architect Pietro Belluschi to sit unpretentiously alongside tree-shaded Hess Creek Canyon. Built using gifts from prominent lumbermen, the building features a two-level oak parquet lobby and a large window area overlooking the adjacent natural terrain.

Completed in June 1977, the \$2.7 million, 55,000-square-foot complex is the University's largest building. It contains the James and Lila Miller Gymnasium, the Bruin home court.

Wheeler Center features a 116-by-174-foot gymnasium with three basketball courts and seating for 2,500 spectators. The gymnasium ceilings are 32 feet over the hardwood maple floor. The gym provides three volleyball courts and 10 badminton courts.

The building may be entered on two levels. The east-side ground level is accessible from the parking lot by crossing the foot bridge. The on-campus community enters on the west-side second floor.

Contained on the upper level are a staff room, multipurpose room, classrooms, and athletic administration and faculty offices. A 1,500-square-foot weight room was remodeled in the summer of 1993. The lower level contains a concession area, dressing rooms, team rooms, laundry, equipment-issuing room, and storage space. An east wing of the building houses two racquetball courts.

The building is named for longtime Oregon lumberman Coleman H. Wheeler, former chairman of the board of Willamette Industries. The gymnasium is named for former George Fox board member James Miller and his wife, Lila. He is the former president of Cascadia Lumber Co.

### BACKGROUND ON THE BRUIN NICKNAME

George Fox's Bruin nickname comes from a real bear captured in 1887 just two years after Pacific Academy (the University's predecessor) was established. The small cub was found in the Coast Range foothills west of Carlton when its mother was shot. The young cub was

brought to campus by a student and later lived with a faculty member.

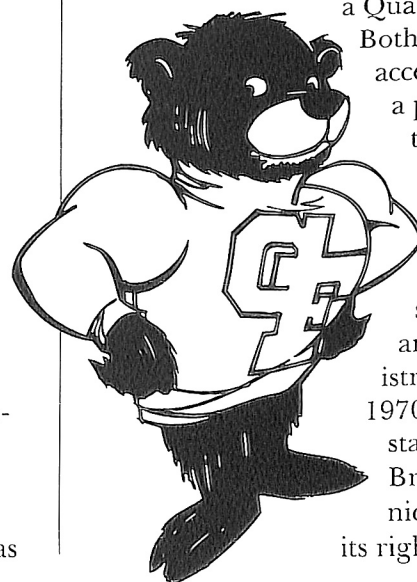
When it grew to adulthood, it was kept in a pit in what is now known as Hess Creek Canyon south of the campus. It escaped one too many times and was turned into steak for the dining table and the hide preserved on a frame and displayed in an early campus museum. When the hide deteriorated several years later, it was taken to a campus furnace room to be destroyed, but the framework proved a problem in dismantling so it was left sitting in a corner.

Students found the old Bruin skin later and began skirmishes over ownership, a tradition that continues today. "Bruin Junior," a replica, under a set of guidelines passed down for years, is fought over periodically in class competition, with the class able to physically drag the Bruin replica off campus declared the rightful owner until next "flashed."

Even with the Bruin tradition, somewhere along the line, the "Quaker" tag for athletic teams came into popularity with sportswriters because of the University's church affiliation, and that nickname was used, along with the mascot "Foxy

George," a little fox with a Quaker hat.

Both gained acceptance for a period in the 1950s and 1960s until a vote of faculty, students and administration in 1970 reinstated the Bruin nickname to its rightful place.

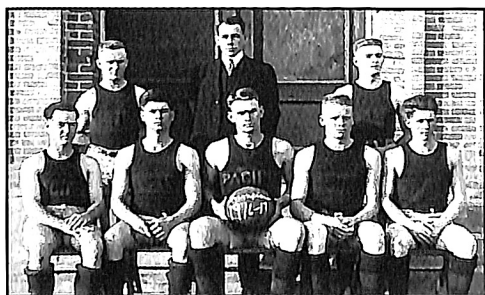

## GEORGE FOX BASKETBALL 1898-1998

George Fox celebrates 101 years of basketball this season. The game of basketball was invented by Dr. James Naismith in 1891 and it took just seven years for it to be brought to George Fox (then called Pacific College)

University board member and community leader T. W. Hester and others first saw the game played at the Portland YMCA. They were captivated by the new game and secured a ball, which they brought back to the University. The first recorded exhibition game was played Feb. 10, 1898 when the Pacific Academy boys beat the Pacific College sophomores 12-6. The first intercollegiate game was played between the Pacific

women and Chemawa Indian School. Men were barred from viewing the game, which was won by Chemawa 28-12.

The first games were played on the third floor of the old Commercial Hotel on North Main Street because the

School had no adequate space for the new sport.

The first gymnasium on the campus was the upper part of one wing of an old academy building (Hoover Hall), built in 1885 and torn down in the mid-1950s. A one-room wood gymnasium building was constructed in 1916 and served until 1946, when George Fox opened Hester Gymnasium, a concrete-block structure built partly by student/faculty labor at a cost of \$40,000. The building, with a single hemlock playing floor and seating for 1,100, served until the opening of the Wheeler Center in 1976-77.

George Fox's athletic affiliation in men's basketball has gone from independent status to membership in six different conferences. From 1965 through 1993, George Fox was an independent member of NAIA District 2. After two years in the Cascade Collegiate Conference, George Fox joined the Northwest Conference in 1995-96.

In 1973, George Fox won its first NAIA District 2 title. The Bruins have advanced to NAIA postseason play 20 of the last 27 years, including 11 of the last 14. The 1991-92 team produced George Fox's highest national finish, advancing to the NAIA Division II quarterfinals with two national tournament wins.

"Our greatest basketball year," according to a University publication, *The First Fifty Years* (published in 1941), "was reached in 1917 when Pacific College won the [Willamette Valley] league championship and defeated Oregon State College 34-25." Few pre-NAIA statistics are available although the following are noteworthy: Delbert Replogle scored 43 points versus North Pacific (Dec. 18, 1915) and 40 versus Philomath (Jan. 29, 1916). Bill Hopper compiled 1,737 career points from 1954-58 and scored 42 versus Greenleaf (March 3, 1956). Cub Grimm averaged 21.0 points a game in 1952-53 and hit 26 free throws in a game with Oregon Medical School.

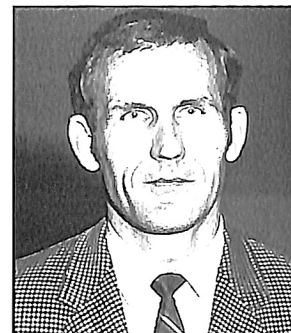

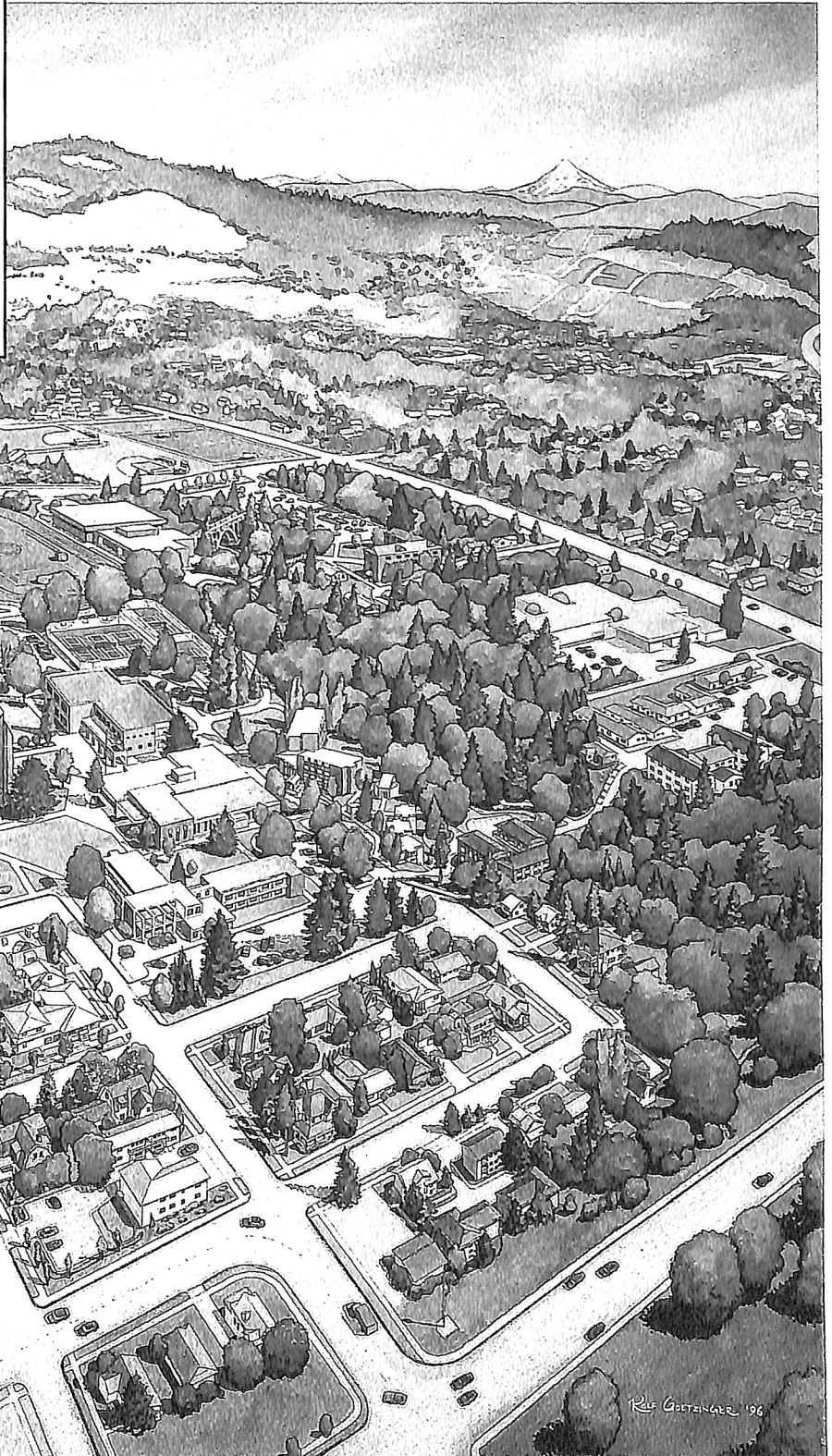
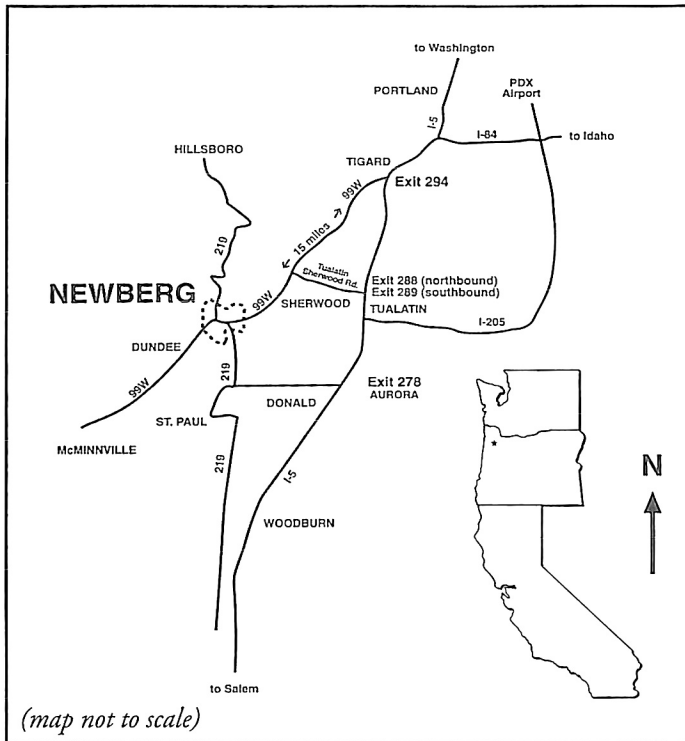
## ROUTES TO THE CAMPUS
